STORYLINES

- Delaware is playing at Bradley for the second straight season, and is looking to defeat the Braves for the third year in a row.
- Last year the Blue Hens posted a 63-49 victory at Carver Arena, behind a game-high 16 points from Anthony Mosley. Delaware jumped out to a 34-15 advantage at the half and led by at least 14 points the rest of the way.
- The Blue Hens are coming off an impressive 76-63 victory at Richmond in the season opener last Friday. Delaware used a 29-2 run to eventually take a 33-point first half lead, before settling for a 49-20 cushion at the break. UD led by at least nine points during the second half.
- Ryan Daly led the way with a game-high 22 points, while Eric Carter added a double-double with 12 points and a game-best 12 rebounds.
- Kevin Anderson scored 11 points in his Blue Hen debut, while Mosley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures with 10 points.
- Delaware shot 56.5 percent (26 of 46) from the field, and has shot over 55 percent in each of its last three games dating back to last year.
- Daly was named the CAA Player of the Week on Monday, earning the award for the first time in his career.
- The Blue Hens will play their home opener on Friday when they welcome local Division III opponent Wesley to the Carpenter Center. That game is the only one of UD's first six games that will be played in Newark.

Delaware vs. Bradley Last Year

Delaware shut down Bradley in the opening half to build a big lead and was never seriously threatened in the second period as the Blue Hens posted a 63-49 victory over the Braves at Carver Arena on Nov. 13, 2016.

Anthony Mosley led the Blue Hens with a game-high 16 points, while Devonne Pinkard contributed 14 points on the day. Cazmon Hayes grabbed career-high 12 rebounds while Darian Bryant chipped in with eight points and nine boards for the Blue Hens, who dominated the glass with a 45-27 advantage.

Alex Foster paced Bradley with 12 points off the bench, while Darrell Brown added 11 and JoJo McGlaston contributed 10. However the Braves shot just 32.0 percent from the field, and were limited to only 4 of 25 shooting from behind the arc by the Blue Hens.

Delaware controlled the opening 20 minutes, shooting 46.9 percent from the field while holding the Braves to just 5 of 25 shooting including 0 of 12 from three-point range.

The Blue Hens led 9-1 just over four minutes into the game, and took a double digit lead at 15-5 when Hayes found Ryan Daly for a bucket at the 12:16 mark.

Brown hit two free throws to bring the Braves within 21-12 with 5:42 on the clock, but the Blue Hens closed the half with a 13-3 spurt, as Chivarsky Corbett just beat the halftime buzzer with a deep three-pointer to give UD a 34-15 advantage at the break.

Delaware led by as many as 21 early in the second half, and after Bradley closed within 44-30, Pinkard converted a three-point play to make it a 17-point game with 12:49 on the clock. The Braves never got closer than 14 the rest of the way.

Delaware vs. Missouri Valley Conference

Today's contest is just the Blue Hens' sixth game in school history against a team currently in the Missouri Valley Conference, as UD holds a 3-2 record in those contests. Delaware lost 85-59 at Bradley on Dec. 1, 1952 and fell 89-70 to Illinois State on Dec. 3, 1977 at the Charlotte Invitational.

The Blue Hens defeated Wichita State 62-47 on Nov. 16, 2001 at the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, and has topped Bradley in each of the last two seasons.

Blue Hens Win Opener at Richmond

Delaware jumped out to a 33-point lead in the first half and held off a Richmond charge down the stretch as the Blue Hens never trailed in posting an impressive 76-63 season-opening road victory over the Spiders Friday night at the Robins Center.

Delaware used a 29-2 run during the first half and eventually went up 45-12 with 3:05 to play in the stanza. Richmond rallied twice but never got closer than nine in the second half.

Ryan Daly led the way with 22 points, while Eric Carter notched a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Freshman Kevin Anderson contributed 11 points in his UD debut, while Anthony Mosley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures with 10 points to go with five assists.

DeMonte Buckingham paced the Spiders with 18 points and six rebounds, while Jacob Gilyard chipped in 17 points and four assists.

Delaware scored 10 consecutive points to jump out to an early 12-2 lead, and after Richmond pulled within 12-8, the Blue Hens exploded for an incredible 29-2 run to extend the advantage to 41-10 on a Jacob Cushing three-pointer at the 4:46 mark. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware took a 49-20 cushion into the break.

The Blue Hens shot 75.0 percent from the field during the opening 20 minutes, and assisted on 15 of their 21 field goals.

Richmond reeled off a 14-2 spurt in the second half to pull within 56-42 and eventually got as close as 12, but Daly buried a contested three-pointer and Mosley added two free throws to push the margin back to 17.

The Spiders used a quick eight-point spurt to pull within 67-58 with 2:08 on the clock, but Delaware countered with a 7-0 run to put the game away.

Blue Hens Win Third Straight Season Opener

Delaware lost nine consecutive season openers from 2006-14, but has now won its last three games to open its season. The Blue Hens opened 2-0 last year, and are looking to begin two straight seasons with at least two wins for the first time since 1998-99 (8-0) and 1999-00 (4-0).

Delaware Gets Road Win Over Atlantic 10 Foe

Friday's win at Richmond was the Blue Hens' first road victory over an Atlantic 10 opponent since a 58-56 triumph at La Salle on Dec. 29, 2006.

Homecoming Game For Cushing

Blue Hen sophomore Jacob Cushing is playing his second "homecoming" game in as many years at Bradley. Cushing's hometown of Naperville, Ill. is located just 143 miles from Peoria.

Allen Suspended For First Three Games

Freshman guard is serving a three-game suspension to open the season for a violation of team rules.

Daly Named CAA Player of the Week

Ryan Daly was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Monday after leading the Blue Hens to their season-opening win at Richmond.

Daly scored a game-high 22 points on 9 of 14 shooting during the 76-63 triumph over the Spiders on Friday, while adding four rebounds and two assists in 37 minutes of action.

Daly, last year's CAA Rookie of the Year and a Preseason Second Team All-CAA pick this year, earned his first career CAA Player of the Week award. He was named the league's Rookie of the Week six times last season.

Blue Hens Dominate Spiders in First Half

Delaware led Richmond 12-8 with 13:12 remaining in the first half, but proceeded to explode for a 29-2 run over the next eight and a half minutes, taking a commanding 41-10 advantage with 4:46 on the clock.

The Blue Hens scored 14 straight points, and after a Spiders bucket, then ran off 15 more in a row. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware settled for a 49-20 halftime cushion.

UD connected on 21 of 28 (75.0%) field goal attempts in the first half, assisting on 15 of those baskets. Eric Carter and Ryan Daly each had five field goals in the opening 20 minutes, while Richmond had just four as a team.

Delaware had a 15/2 assist/turnover ratio in the first half, but a 0/9 ratio in the second. However the Blue Hens never led by less than nine in the second stanza.

Hens Shoot Well At Richmond

Delaware shot 56.5 percent from the field at Richmond, connecting on 26 of 46 field goal attempts.

The Blue Hens have shot over 55 percent during each of their last three games, dating back to last year. Delaware shot 55.6 percent in the CAA Tournament First Round win over Hofstra, before shooting 57.7 percent in the CAA Quarterfinal loss to UNCW.

Mosley, Bryant Return For Opener

Guards Anthony Mosley (fractured toe) and Darian Bryant (back) both missed the exhibition game at Mount St. Mary's on Nov. 1 and the scrimmage vs. Lafayette on Nov. 3.

However both players returned to the floor during the win at Richmond. Mosley scored 10 points and handed out a game-high five assists in 27 minutes of action while Bryant contributed two points, two assists and a steal while playing 18 minutes.

Mosley appeared in all 33 games while making 29 starts a year ago, ranking second in the CAA with 1.7 steals per game, ninth with a 77.7 free throw percentage, and 15th with 2.5 assists per game. He led the Blue Hens with 55 steals and 83 assists during the year.

Mosley ranked second on the team with a 10.0 scoring average, and reached double figures in 16 games.

Bryant saw action in all but one game while starting 18 last year during his first season with the Blue Hens, averaging 7.6 points and 2.8 rebounds.

Bryant was fourth on the team in scoring and reached double figures in 10 games, including six times in a seven-game stretch from Jan. 26 through Feb. 16. He hit a game-winning three-pointer with 5.5 seconds left during the 58-57 win at James Madison on Feb. 11.

Daly Back At It

Ryan Daly, a third team All-CAA selection and the CAA Rookie of the Year last season, picked up where he left off at Richmond. Daly scored a game-high 22 points, going 9 of 14 from the field, in 37 minutes of action. It was the 10th 20-point game of his career.

Carter Seeing Double

For the second straight year, Eric Carter posted a double-double in the Blue Hens' season opener. Carter scored 12 points, hitting 5 of 7 shots from the floor, and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds at Richmond. He also led all players with four steals in the victory.

Anderson, Walker Impress in UD Debuts

Kevin Anderson and Chyree Walker each started in the season opener, as Delaware started two freshmen in its opener for the first time since 2011. Anderson finished with 11 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals while not committing a turnover in 31 minutes on the floor. Walker played 18 minutes, finishing with seven points on 3 of 4 shooting and grabbing a pair of boards.

Cushing Impresses In Opener

Sophomore Jacob Cushing got the start in the season opener at Richmond, and took advantage of the opportunity. Cushing scored eight points and collected five rebounds in a career-high 30 minutes on the floor.

Woods Makes Blue Hen Debut

Sophomore forward Derrick Woods made his Blue Hen debut at Richmond after sitting out last season as a transfer from St. Bonaventure. Woods scored four points, grabbed a rebound and handed out an assist in eight minutes of action.

Delaware Signs Ithiel Horton To NLI

Martin Ingelsby announced on Monday that Ithiel Horton has signed a National Letter of Intent with UD and will begin playing for the Blue Hens next fall.

Horton, a 6-3 combo guard from Vauxhall, N.J., is currently in his first season at Roselle Catholic High School. He averaged 10 points, three rebounds and three assists per game as a junior at St. Anthony, which closed last spring.

"We are very excited to welcome Ithiel into the Delaware basketball family," Ingelsby said. "Ithiel is a young man we targeted early in the recruiting process and fits the type of perimeter players we want to have in our program. He is a big-time shooter who also has a high basketball IQ and feel for the game. He comes to us having played for two of the best high school basketball programs in the state of New Jersey and we look forward to him making an immediate impact when he arrives in Newark."

Busy Stretch To Open Season

Friday began a busy stretch for the Blue Hens to open the season featuring six games, all but one on the road, in 13 days.

Delaware opened the season last Friday at Richmond, and following tonight's game, the Blue Hens host Wesley in Friday's home opener. UD will then play three games in three days at the UNCG Spartan Classic, facing UNCG, North Carolina Wesleyan and Longwood on Nov. 20-22.

Following that stretch, Delaware will play five of its final seven non-conference games at the Bob Carpenter Center. One of those two road games will be a short trip to Dover, Del. to face Delaware State.

Daly Looks To Build On Stellar Freshman Year

Blue Hen sophomore guard Ryan Daly is looking to build on his outstanding freshman campaign in which he was named CAA Rookie of the Year and to the All-CAA third team.

Daly set UD freshman single season records with 511 points and 171 rebounds, and led all conference freshmen in scoring and rebounding.

Daly was sixth in the CAA and paced the Blue Hens with 16.0 points per game, and was fifth in the league while leading the team with 7.4 rebounds per contest. He notched six double-doubles on the year, and reached double figures in 21 of the last 23 games including nine straight.

Daly's nine 20-point games were the most ever by a UD freshman, and he was named to the CAA All-Tournament Team after averaging 25.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in a pair of double-doubles vs. Hofstra and UNCW.

Carter Returns To Anchor Blue Hen Frontcourt

Eric Carter was one of three players to appear in every game a season ago while making 24 starts, ranking second on the team with a 5.4 rebounding average and shooting a team-best 50.6% from the field.

Carter scored in double figures eight times, including three straight from Feb. 23 through Mar. 3. He posted double-doubles in the season opener vs. Goldkey-Beacom (14 points, 15 rebounds) and the CAA Tournament win over Hofstra (19 points, 10 rebounds).

Goss Redshirting Season As Transfer

Collin Goss is sitting out this season as a redshirt after he transferred to Delaware from George Washington over the summer, and will have two years of eligibility with the Blue Hens beginning in the 2018-19 season.

Goss, a 6-11 forward from Manassas, Va., appeared in 13 games as a sophomore last season for the Colonials, who finished with a 20-15 record and competed in the College Basketball Invitational. He finished the year with 20 points and 14 rebounds, while averaging 6.2 minutes per contest. Goss scored a career-high five points in a win over Harvard on Nov. 29, and added four points in a season-opening victory over Siena. He played a career-high 19 minutes against Florida State, and blocked a career-best two shots vs. Howard.

Goss saw action in 18 games during his freshman year, totaling nine rebounds and a point for a George Washington team that went 28-10 and captured the Postseason NIT title.

Delaware Names Mosley, Carter Team Captains

Blue Hen head coach Martin Ingelsby has named senior guard Anthony Mosley and junior forward Eric Carter 2017-18 team captains.

Mosley was Delaware's starting point guard a year ago, when he ranked second in the CAA with 1.7 steals per game and second on the team with a 10.0 scoring average. Carter also appeared in all 33

games last season, ranking second on the team and 16th in the CAA with 5.4 rebounds per game. Carter shot a team-high 50.6% from the field, and scored a career-high 20 points on 9 of 10 shooting at UNCW.

Number Changes

Three Blue Hens have changed their jersey number from last year. Skye Johnson has switched from #25 to #23, Jacob Cushing has switched from #35 to #22, and Curtis Lochner has switched from #25 to #15.

Martin Ingelsby begins his second season as University of Delaware men's basketball head coach during the 2017-18 season.

After spending the previous 13 years on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first season in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament.

Ingelsby's first recruit, Ryan Daly, was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the All-CAA third team while setting UD freshman records for scoring and rebounding.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby, 38, helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I really believe this is a great fit for me," Ingelsby said at the time of his hiring. "Coming from Notre Dame, to have the opportunity to be the head coach at a place like the University of Delaware is something I could not pass up. This is a great academic institution and a great community and we will be able to recruit young men who will excel in the classroom and on the basketball court. We want to win and we want to win the right way. It all starts with high character and highly competitive kids who will represent this basketball program and this University in a first-class manner on and off the basketball court. I can't wait to get started.

"We want to dream big dreams and talk about winning CAA championships and getting into the NCAA Tournament. There is a process that goes into place in building a basketball program and we will work hard to get there. Together, with the student body, faculty, alumni, community and fans, we can accomplish great things."

"I am incredibly excited for our student-athletes, our university and all of Blue Hen Nation to welcome Coach Ingelsby," said University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissy Rawak. "Martin demands excellence in all that he does and has a keen focus on getting young men to go beyond their limits academically, athletically, and in the community. He will have an immediate impact not only on our basketball program, but on our entire department."

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

During Ingelsby's lone season at Wagner in 2002-03, he was part of the most successful season in school history as the Seahawks finished 21-11, won both the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01 he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore, and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May, 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate (7), and sons Jack (3) and Benjamin (1).

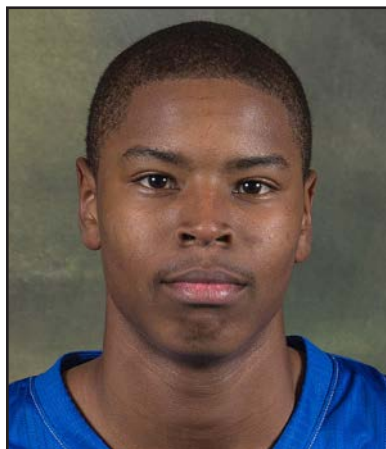

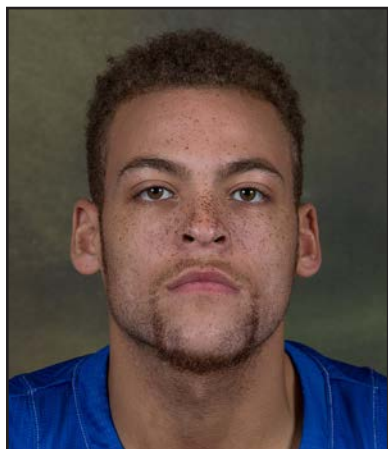

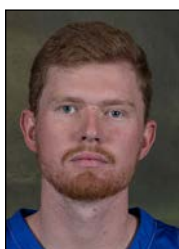
