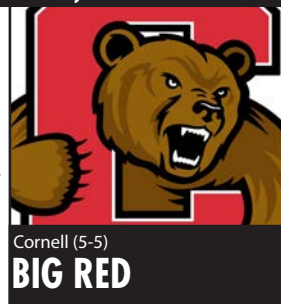

STORYLINES

- Delaware closes out its non-conference schedule today against Cornell.
- With a win, the Blue Hens would post consecutive non-conference winning records for the first time since 2002-03 and 2003-04. (Delaware finished 7-6 in non-league play a year ago.)
- Cornell has won two of the previous three meetings between the schools, although the Blue Hens took the last matchup, 74-62, on Nov. 22, 2011 at the Bob Carpenter Center.
- Delaware is looking for its third consecutive victory after recording a 76-62 triumph over CSU Bakersfield on Dec. 20. A win today would even the Blue Hens' home record at 3-3.
- Kevin Anderson scored a team-high 22 points against the Roadrunners, and earned his second straight CAA Rookie of the Week award on Tuesday. Anderson went 7 of 11 from the field including four three-pointers, and added six rebounds.
- Ryan Daly contributed 20 points, nine rebounds and five assists, reaching the 20-point mark for the fifth time this season and scoring in double figures for the 10th game in a row.
- Eric Carter posted his third double-double of the season with 15 points and a game-high 10 rebounds.
- The Blue Hens recorded a 39-24 rebounding advantage, their second highest margin of the season.
- Delaware opens CAA play on Saturday with a 7 p.m. game at two-time defending league champion UNCW.

Last Time Out

Delaware jumped out to an 11-point halftime cushion and led comfortably throughout the second half as the Blue Hens posted an impressive 76-62 victory over CSU Bakersfield on December 20 at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Kevin Anderson led Delaware with 22 points and knocked down four three-pointers, while backcourt mate Ryan Daly added 20 points, nine rebounds and five assists. Eric Carter posted his third double-double of the year with 15 points and 10 rebounds for the Blue Hens, who enjoyed a 39-24 rebounding edge.

Jarkel Joiner scored a game-high 23 points for the Roadrunners who had their three-game winning streak snapped.

Delaware led 22-19 with 8:39 left in the first half, but then scored the next seven points to go up double figures at 29-19 on a Daly free throw at the 4:11 mark. The Roadrunners closed within 35-27, before a Darian Bryant layup and a Carter free throw gave the Blue Hens a 38-27 advantage at the break.

CSU Bakersfield opened the second half with a basket, but Anderson countered with consecutive three-pointers to extend the margin to 44-29 with 18:24 to play. The Blue Hens led by at least 13 points the rest of the way, going up as much as 24 points at 64-40 with 6:43 on the clock.

Anderson Named CAA Rookie of the Week Again

Kevin Anderson earned his second consecutive CAA Rookie of the Week honor on Tuesday.

Anderson led Delaware with 22 points and tied his season-high with four three-pointers in Delaware's 76-62 home victory over CSU Bakersfield last Wednesday. He went 7 of 11 from the field while adding six rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a steal in 35 minutes of action.

Anderson, who reached double figures for the eighth time this season including the last three contests, finished one point shy of his season-high.

Anderson scored 12 points and led the Blue Hens with a season-high 12 rebounds to post his first career double-double in Delaware's 68-59 overtime win at Delaware State on Dec. 17. He added two steals and an assist in 41 minutes of action, and scored the first basket of the extra session that put the Blue Hens in front for good.

Hens Rack UP CAA Rookie of the Week Honors

Delaware players have earned nine CAA Rookie of the Week honors in the last 19 weeks, dating back to Dec. 12, 2016.

Ryan Daly earned the award six times in the final 12 weeks of the regular season last year. The Blue Hens have earned three of seven Rookie of the Week awards this year: Ryan Allen on Dec. 4, and Kevin Anderson on Dec. 18 and Dec. 26.

Injury Update

Jacob Cushing is out indefinitely with a broken nose suffered in practice on Dec. 7. Anthony Mosley missed the CSU Bakersfield game with an eye infection but is expected to play this afternoon.

UD Looking For Consecutive Winning Non-Con Marks

A win today would give Delaware consecutive winning non-conference records for the second straight year, as the Blue Hens also finished 7-6 in non-league play last season.

The last time UD posted back to back winning non-league records was 2002-03 and 2003-04.

Delaware Starts Three Freshmen vs. Bakersfield

Ryan Allen, Kevin Anderson and Chyree Walker all started vs. CSU Bakersfield, the first time Delaware had three freshmen in the starting lineup since a 68-40 win over Widener on Jan. 2, 1989.

True freshmen Alex Coles (14 points), Denard Montgomery (3 points) and Rob Jackson (2 points) all started for the Blue Hens, along with redshirt freshman Mark Murray (12 points).

Tim Morrissey, UD's current Director of Student Services for Athletes, started for Widener that night, finishing with six points and three rebounds.

Leave Me In, Coach

Delaware has used just seven scholarship players during each of the last two games; the Blue Hens are expected to have eight available with the return of Anthony Mosley from an eye injury.

Ryan Daly has played at least 36 minutes in each of the last seven games, averaging 38.9 minutes during that stretch.

Kevin Anderson has played at least 32 minutes in each of the last five games, averaging 36.8 minutes during that stretch.

Ryan Allen has played at least 30 minutes in eight of his nine games. Eric Carter has played at least 28 minutes in each of the last four contests.

Five Blue Hens Reach Double Figures at DSU

Five Blue Hens scored in double figures during the win at Delaware State. That marked the second time this season at least five players reached double digits, as six players scored at least 10 points against Wesley.

Bryant Posts Season-Highs in Return

Darian Bryant missed the Buffalo and Notre Dame games with a concussion, but returned in a big way at Delaware State. He posted season-highs of 12 points and six rebounds vs. the Hornets, while playing a season-best 37 minutes of action.

Hens Improve Defense vs. Delaware State

Delaware had allowed four consecutive opponents to shoot at least 50 percent from the floor before holding Delaware State to 39.2 percent shooting, the second lowest percentage by a UD opponent this year.

Allen Knocking Down Threes

Ryan Allen drilled four three-pointers in consecutive games vs. Notre Dame and Delaware State. He has hit at least one triple in all nine games in which he has appeared this year.

Allen ranks second on the team with 21 three-pointers made, and is sixth in the CAA with 2.3 threes made per game.

Hens Taking Care of the Ball

Delaware currently is tied for 27th in the nation and ranks second in the CAA by averaging just 11.3 turnovers per game.

The Blue Hens have committed single digit turnovers in three of the last six games, including a season-low seven against Notre Dame.

Hens With Tough Non-League Stretch

On November 27 Delaware hosted Yale, which was picked second in the preseason Ivy League poll. Four days later the Blue Hens traveled to Navy, which was picked third in the Patriot League. On Dec. 6 UD faced a Buffalo squad that was picked to win the MAC East Division, and on Dec. 9 the Hens hosted ninth-ranked Notre Dame.

Last Wednesday Delaware defeated a CSU Bakersfield squad that advanced to the Postseason NIT semifinals last March.

UD Freshmen Impressing

Kevin Anderson has started all 11 games in which he has appeared, ranking second on the team with 13.7 points and 32 assists. Ryan Allen had reached double figures in six straight games before scoring eight points vs. CSU Bakersfield, and now ranks third on the team with a 12.3 scoring average. Chyree Walker scored a season-high 12 points vs. Buffalo, before adding eight in 37 minutes of action against Notre Dame.

Anderson Shines vs. Irish

Kevin Anderson led Delaware with a season-high 23 points against Notre Dame, and handed out seven assists while not committing a turnover in 40 minutes on the floor.

Daly, Allen, Anderson Earn CAA Honors

Ryan Daly was named the CAA Player of the Week on Nov. 13, after leading the Blue Hens with 22 points in the season-opening win at Richmond.

Ryan Allen was selected CAA Rookie of the Week on Dec. 4 after averaging 13.5 points against Yale and Navy. Kevin Anderson has earned Rookie of the Week honors during each of the last two weeks.

Daly Ties Season-High at Navy

Ryan Daly tied his season-high by scoring 23 points at Navy, and tied his career-best by knocking down five three-pointers. He has reached double figures in 10 consecutive games, and has led the Blue Hens in scoring four times this year.

Daly has reached double digits in 34 of the last 37 contests, dating back to Dec. 11, 2016.

Hens Allowing 30-Point Scorers

Four Blue Hen opponents have scored at least 30 points this season: Brian Cameron of Wesley (30), Francis Alonso of UNCG (32), Bryce Dulin of Navy (30), and CJ Massinburg of Buffalo (30). Last year UD did not allow a single 30-point scorer.

Mosley Reaches Season-Highs vs. Yale

Anthony Mosley posted season-highs of 23 points and nine rebounds in the Nov. 27 loss to Yale. He knocked down 9 of 10 free throw attempts, handed out two assists and made a steal in 35 minutes of action.

Blue Hens Win Third Straight Home Opener

With the 93-78 win over Wesley, Delaware improved to 18-8 in home openers at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware posted a 73-72 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Nov. 24, 2015 and a 64-56 win over Goldey-Beacom on Nov. 11, 2016, prior to the victory over the Wolverines.

Delaware Dominates Wesley in Home Opener

Delaware dominated in the paint and led comfortably over the final 30 minutes as the Blue Hens posted a 93-78 win over Wesley College during the Blue Hens' home opener at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware scored 72 points in the paint and held a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage, including 16 offensive boards. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the floor, shooting over 55 percent in both halves.

Six Blue Hens reached double figures led by Ryan Daly, who finished with team-highs of 23 points and nine boards. Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods each contributed 11 points while Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all added 10 apiece.

Brian Cameron paced Wesley with 30 points, while Evan Anderson added 16 of his own.

Delaware led for the final 37 minutes of the game, and was up double figures during the last 25 minutes of the contest. The Blue Hens led by as many as 18 points in the opening half, before settling for a 51-36 advantage at the break.

The Wolverines got within 59-49 with 14:16 to play but would get no closer, as the lead eventually grew to a game-high 20 at 86-66 at the 3:09 mark.

Delaware Puts Six in Double Figures vs. Wesley

Delaware had six players reach double figures in the win over Wesley. Ryan Daly led the Blue Hens with 23 points, while Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods added 11 apiece. Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all contributed 10 points.

Delaware has had seven players reach double figures twice in school history, while the Wesley game was the fifth time UD had six players score in double digits. The last time the Blue Hens had six double figure scorers was during an 88-78 victory over Florida in the San Juan Shootout on Dec. 1, 1996.

Delaware Dominates Paint vs. Wesley

Delaware scored an incredible 72 points in the paint vs. Wesley, which is believed to be a school record. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the field, including 37 of 55 (67.3 percent) inside the three-point line.

Unselfish Blue Hens

Delaware handed out 24 assists on its 38 baskets vs. Wesley. That marked the Blue Hens' highest assist total since dishing out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.

Delaware Holds Big Rebound Edge vs. Wesley

Delaware enjoyed a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage over Wesley, its highest rebounding margin since a 46-26 edge over Delaware State on Dec. 2, 2016. The Blue Hens' 16 offensive boards were the most since also grabbing 16 vs. Marist on Dec. 20, 2016.

Blue Hens Win Opener at Richmond

Delaware jumped out to a 33-point lead in the first half and held off a Richmond charge down the stretch as the Blue Hens never trailed in posting an impressive 76-63 season-opening road victory over the Spiders on Nov. 10 at the Robins Center.

Delaware used a 29-2 run during the first half and eventually went up 45-12 with 3:05 to play in the stanza. Richmond rallied twice but never got closer than nine in the second half.

Ryan Daly led the way with 22 points, while Eric Carter notched a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Freshman Kevin Anderson contributed 11 points in his UD debut, while Anthony Mosley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures with 10 points to go with five assists.

UD scored 10 consecutive points to jump out to an early 12-2 lead, and after Richmond pulled within 12-8, the Blue Hens exploded for an incredible 29-2 run to extend the advantage to 41-10 on a Jacob

Cushing three-pointer at the 4:46 mark. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware took a 49-20 cushion into the break.

The Blue Hens shot 75.0 percent from the field during the opening 20 minutes, and assisted on 15 of their 21 field goals.

Richmond reeled off a 14-2 spurt in the second half to pull within 56-42 and eventually got as close as 12, but Daly buried a contested three-pointer and Mosley added two free throws to push the margin back to 17.

The Spiders used a quick eight-point spurt to pull within 67-58 with 2:08 on the clock, but Delaware countered with a 7-0 run to put the game away.

Carter Opens With Consecutive Double-Doubles

Eric Carter opened the season in impressive fashion, posting double-doubles in each of the Blue Hens' first two games at Richmond and Bradley.

Carter scored 12 points, hitting 5 of 7 shots from the floor, and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds at Richmond. He also led all players with four steals in the victory. He then recorded game-highs of 18 points and 12 boards at Bradley, going 7 of 9 from the field.

Carter is the first Blue Hen to post double-doubles in the first two games of the season since Marc Egerson in 2008-09. He added his third of the year against CSU Bakersfield with 15 points and 10 rebounds.

Blue Hens Dominate Spiders in First Half

UD led Richmond 12-8 with 13:12 remaining in the first half, but then exploded for a 29-2 run over the next eight and a half minutes, taking a commanding 41-10 advantage with 4:46 on the clock.

The Blue Hens scored 14 straight points, and after a Spiders bucket, then ran off 15 more in a row. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware settled for a 49-20 halftime cushion.

UD connected on 21 of 28 (75.0%) field goal attempts in the first half, assisting on 15 of those baskets. Eric Carter and Ryan Daly each had five field goals in the opening 20 minutes, while Richmond had just four as a team.

Delaware had a 15/2 assist/turnover ratio in the first half, but a 0/9 ratio in the second. However the Blue Hens never led by less than nine in the second stanza.

Delaware Signs Ithiel Horton To NLI

Martin Ingelsby announced on November 13 that Ithiel Horton has signed a National Letter of Intent with UD and will begin playing for the Blue Hens next fall.

Horton, a 6-3 combo guard from Vauxhall, N.J., is currently in his first season at Roselle Catholic High School. He averaged 10 points, three rebounds and three assists per game as a junior at St. Anthony, which closed last spring.

"We are very excited to welcome Ithiel into the Delaware basketball family," Ingelsby said. "Ithiel is a young man we targeted early in the recruiting process and fits the type of perimeter players we want to have in our program. He is a big-time shooter who also has a high basketball IQ and feel for the game. He comes to us having played for two of the best high school basketball programs in the state of New Jersey and we look forward to him making an immediate impact when he arrives in Newark."

Goss Redshirting Season As Transfer

Collin Goss is sitting out this season as a redshirt after he transferred to Delaware from George Washington over the summer, and will have two years of eligibility with the Blue Hens beginning in the 2018-19 season.

Goss, a 6-11 forward from Manassas, Va., appeared in 13 games as

a sophomore last season for the Colonials, who finished with a 20-15 record and competed in the College Basketball Invitational. He finished the year with 20 points and 14 rebounds, while averaging 6.2 minutes per contest. Goss scored a career-high five points in a win over Harvard on Nov. 29, and added four points in a season-opening victory over Siena. He played a career-high 19 minutes against Florida State, and blocked a career-best two shots vs. Howard.

Goss saw action in 18 games during his freshman year, totaling nine rebounds and a point for a George Washington team that went 28-10 and captured the Postseason NIT title.

Delaware Names Mosley, Carter Team Captains

Blue Hen head coach Martin Ingelsby has named senior guard Anthony Mosley and junior forward Eric Carter 2017-18 team captains.

Mosley was Delaware's starting point guard a year ago, when he ranked second in the CAA with 1.7 steals per game and second on the team with a 10.0 scoring average. Carter also appeared in all 33 games last season, ranking second on the team and 16th in the CAA with 5.4 rebounds per game. Carter shot a team-high 50.6% from the field, and scored a career-high 20 points on 9 of 10 shooting at UNCW.

Martin Ingelsby is currently in his second season as University of Delaware men's basketball head coach during the 2017-18 season.

After spending the previous 13 years on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first season in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament.

Ingelsby's first recruit, Ryan Daly, was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the All-CAA third team while setting UD freshman records for scoring and rebounding.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby, 38, helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I really believe this is a great fit for me," Ingelsby said at the time of his hiring. "Coming from Notre Dame, to have the opportunity to be the head coach at a place like the University of Delaware is something I could not pass up. This is a great academic institution and a great community and we will be able to recruit young men who will excel in the classroom and on the basketball court. We want to win and we want to win the right way. It all starts with high character and highly competitive kids who will represent this basketball program and this University in a first-class manner on and off the basketball court. I can't wait to get started.

"We want to dream big dreams and talk about winning CAA championships and getting into the NCAA Tournament. There is a process that goes into place in building a basketball program and we will work hard to get there. Together, with the student body, faculty, alumni, community and fans, we can accomplish great things."

"I am incredibly excited for our student-athletes, our university and all of Blue Hen Nation to welcome Coach Ingelsby," said University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissy Rawak. "Martin demands excellence in all that he does and has a keen focus on getting young men to go beyond their limits academically, athletically, and in the community. He will have an immediate impact not only on our basketball program, but on our entire department."

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

During Ingelsby's lone season at Wagner in 2002-03, he was part of the most successful season in school history as the Seahawks finished 21-11, won both the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01 he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore, and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May, 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate (7), and sons Jack (3) and Benjamin (1).
