### STORYLINES

• Delaware looks to snap a three-game losing skid Saturday when the Blue Hens host No. 9/8 Notre Dame at the Bob Carpenter Center.

• The Blue Hens are welcoming back Irish head coach Mike Brey, who led UD for five seasons from 1995-2000. Brey, a member of the UD Athletics Hall of Fame, guided the Hens to America East titles in 1998 and 1999.

• UD head coach Martin Ingelsby played his senior season for Brey at Notre Dame in 2000-01, and later served 13 seasons on the Irish staff.

• Tonight's game is just the second time Delaware has hosted an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent in the 26-year history of the Bob Carpenter Center. The Blue Hens dropped a 64-57 decision to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997.

• UD has never defeated a ranked opponent in men's basketball history. The Blue Hens are 0-32 against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including 0-17 against teams ranked in the top 10.

• Ninth-ranked Notre Dame is the highest ranked opponent in BCC history, and just the fourth top 10 opponent to ever visit Newark. The Blue Hens hosted third-ranked Virginia at the Delaware Field House on Jan. 5, 1981, sixth-ranked Temple at the Carpenter Sports Building on Jan. 28, 1956, and 10th-ranked Saint Joseph's in the BCC in 2003.

• Notre Dame won the only previous matchup between the schools, an 80-75 victory at Purcell Pavilion on Dec. 7, 2013. The teams are scheduled to play again next year in South Bend.

**Series Matchup**

Notre Dame won the only previous matchup between the two schools, an 80-75 victory at Purcell Pavilion on Dec. 2013. That game was part of the Gotham Classic.

Jarvis Threatt led the Blue Hens in that game with 23 points and 10 assists, while Kyle Anderson and Davon Usher added 19 points apiece.

Jerian Grant scored a game-best 25 points for Notre Dame, Pat Connaughton added a double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds, and Garrick Sherman chipped in 19 points.

Delaware closed within a point at 70-69 with 2:09 remaining, but Grant answered with two jumpers to help the Irish seal the victory.

Delaware and Notre Dame are scheduled to play again next season in South Bend.

**Delaware vs. the ACC**

Delaware is just 1-11 in its 12 games against ACC schools since 1995, but has stayed within 10 points in eight of the 11 losses.

**Rare Home Game vs. ACC Opponent**

Tonight's game is just the second time in the 26-year history of the Bob Carpenter Center that Delaware has hosted an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. UD dropped a 64-57 decision to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997 under head coach Mike Brey.

Virginia has visited Newark three times (in 1978, 1981 and 1997) - the Cavaliers are the only ACC school to play a road game at Delaware prior to Notre Dame tonight.

**Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents**

Delaware has never defeated a ranked opponent in men's basketball history. The Blue Hens are 0-32 against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including 0-17 against teams ranked in the top 10.

Delaware's last game against a ranked team was a 78-48 loss at No. 17 Villanova on Dec. 22, 2015.

**Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents at Home**

Ninth-ranked Notre Dame is highest ranked opponent in BCC history, and just the fourth top 10 opponent to ever visit Newark. The Blue Hens hosted third-ranked Virginia at the Delaware Field House on Jan. 5, 1981, sixth-ranked Temple at the Carpenter Sports Building on Jan. 28, 1956, and 10th-ranked Saint Joseph's in the BCC in 2003.

Tonight's game is the eighth time UD has hosted a ranked opponent - in addition to the three listed above, the others are #15 Virginia on Jan. 11, 1978, #17 Temple on Jan. 22, 1979, #19 Rutgers on Jan. 21, 1975, and #19 Saint Joseph's on Nov. 28, 2001.

**Carpenter Center Sold Out**

Tonight's game will be the 39th men's basketball sellout in the 26-year history of the Bob Carpenter Center, and the first since the home contest vs. Drexel on Feb. 23, 2014 that was part of a men's and women's doubleheader. The last single game men's basketball sellout came against 10th-ranked Saint Joseph's on Dec. 30, 2003.

Twenty-two of the 38 men's basketball sellouts at Delaware since the Carpenter Center opened in 1992-93 came when Mike Brey was the Blue Hens' coach from 1995-2000.

**Brey Returns To Newark**

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey returns to the Bob Carpenter Center tonight, the site of his first head coaching position. Brey coached the Blue Hens for five years from 1995-2000, leading UD to a pair of America East titles in 1997-98 and 1998-99. Brey compiled a 99-52 record in Newark, while his 65.6 winning percentage is the highest in UD men's basketball history. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

**Notre Dame/Delaware Connections**

Martin Ingelsby was a senior point guard on Mike Brey's first Notre Dame team in 2000-01, and later served as a director of operations and assistant coach for the Irish for 13 seasons.

Current UD assistant coach Torrian Jones played for the Irish from 2000-04, and served as team captain during his final two years. Current UD director of men's basketball operations Pat Rogers was a student manager for two seasons before graduating from Notre Dame in 2010.

Matt Farrell and Eric Carter grew up about 20 minutes apart in New Jersey, and have been friends since their high school days. They briefly played on the same AAU team prior to their senior year of high school. Freshmen D.J. Harvey and Ryan Allen were high school teammates at DeMatha Catholic.

**Tough Stretch Continues**

Last Monday Delaware hosted Yale, which was picked second in the preseason Ivy League poll. Last Friday the Blue Hens traveled to Navy, which was picked third in the Patriot League. Wednesday UD faced a Buffalo squad that was picked to win the MAC East Division, and tonight the Hens host ninth-ranked Notre Dame.

**Last Time Out**

Delaware battled back from a 14-point deficit to get within four late, but Buffalo never relinquished the lead to post a 75-72 victory on Wednesday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ryan Daly led Delaware with 22 points and hit four three-pointers, while grabbing five rebounds on the night. Ryan Allen reached double figures for the fourth straight game with 16 points, while Chyree Walker was the third Blue Hen in double figures with a season-high 12 points to go with five rebounds.

Kevin Anderson contributed eight points and a game-high five assists, while Eric Carter grabbed a team-leading 11 rebounds for Delaware.

CJ Massinburg paced the Bulls with 28 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Davonta Jordan added a season-best 20 points, while Nick Perkins chipped in nine points and eight rebounds.

Buffalo led the entire first half, and went up as many as nine before Daly swished a shot from halfcourt as time expired to bring the Blue Hens within 38-32 at the break. Delaware closed within a pair at 45-43 with 14:20 left, but the Bulls responded to go up a game-best 14 at 69-55 with 5:52 on the clock.

Delaware answered back by scoring the next 10 points and was

within four three other times down the stretch, including 75-71 in the final seconds. Walker hit the first of two free throws with 0.5 left, but time expired as Carter grabbed the offensive rebound.

### **Injury Report**

Darian Bryant missed the Buffalo game with a concussion suffered in Sunday's practice, and is questionable for tonight's game.

### **Ryan Allen Named CAA Rookie of the Week**

Ryan Allen was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Rookie of the Week on Monday.

Allen averaged 13.5 points during the Blue Hens' two games last week, and has now reached double figures in four straight games after scoring 16 points Wednesday vs. Buffalo.

Allen made his first career start last Monday vs. Yale, scoring 16 points and hitting all six of his free throw attempts. He then added 11 points and three rebounds last Friday at Navy. Allen added an assist and a steal vs. the Midshipmen, and played all but nine minutes during the week.

Allen currently ranks second on the team by averaging 12.3 points per game, and is tied for second with 11 three-pointers.

### **UD Freshmen Impressing**

Ryan Allen has reached double figures in four straight games, and now ranks second on the team with a 12.3 scoring average. Kevin Anderson has started all eight games in which he has appeared, ranking third on the squad with 11.8 points per game and second with 21 assists. Chyree Walker enjoyed his most impressive game of the season Wednesday vs. Buffalo by scoring a season-high 12 points and grabbing five rebounds in 27 minutes of action.

### **Daly Ties Season-High at Navy**

Ryan Daly tied his season-high by scoring 23 points at Navy, and tied his career-best by knocking down five three-pointers. Daly added 22 points vs. Buffalo, and has reached double figures in each of the last seven games. He has led the Blue Hens in scoring four times this year, while five other players have led UD in scoring one game each.

### **Blue Hens Increasing Long Distance Aim**

Delaware went just 30 of 111 (27.0%) from three-point range over the first seven games of the season, but has gone 18 of 38 (47.4%) over the last two games vs. Navy and Buffalo.

### **Hens Allowing 30-Point Scorers**

Four Blue Hen opponents have scored at least 30 points this season: Brian Cameron of Wesley (30), Francis Alonso of UNCG (32), Bryce Dulin of Navy (30), and CJ Massinburg of Buffalo (30). Last year UD did not allow a single 30-point scorer.

Shawn Anderson added 20 points for Navy, while Davonta Jordan contributed 20 for Buffalo, as Delaware has allowed a 30- and a 20-point scorer in each of the last two contests.

### **Daly Reaching Double Figures**

Ryan Daly has scored in double figures in eight of nine games this season, including seven straight. Daly has reached double digits in 31 of the last 34 contests, dating back to Dec. 11, 2016.

### **Mosley Second in CAA in Steals Again**

Anthony Mosley ranked second in the CAA last year in steals, and currently ranks second again this year with 16, an average of 1.8 per game.

### **Mosley Reaches Season-Highs vs. Yale**

Anthony Mosley posted season-highs of 23 points and nine rebounds in last Monday's loss to Yale. He knocked down 9 of 10 free throw attempts, handed out two assists and made a steal in 35 minutes of action.

### **Allen Breaks Out vs. Longwood, Yale**

Freshman guard Ryan Allen scored six points in his first two collegiate games, but exploded for a team-high 19 points in the win over Longwood, going 8 of 13 from the field and grabbing five rebounds. He added 16 points while making his first career start last Monday vs. Yale, and contributed 11 points at Navy.

### **Woods Makes Most Of Starts**

With Eric Carter sidelined with an ankle injury, Derrick Woods made his first career UD starts vs. North Carolina Wesleyan and Longwood, and the sophomore took advantage of his opportunity.

Woods led Delaware with career-highs of 19 points and 10 rebounds in the win over North Carolina Wesleyan, going 7 of 8 from the field and hitting a three-pointer. He then added 11 points and a team-high nine boards in the victory over Longwood.

### **Blue Hens Win Third Straight Home Opener**

With the 93-78 win over Wesley, Delaware improved to 18-8 in home openers at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware posted a 73-72 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Nov. 24, 2015 and a 64-56 win over Goldey-Beacom on Nov. 11, 2016, prior to the victory over the Wolverines.

### **Delaware Dominates Wesley in Home Opener**

Delaware dominated in the paint and led comfortably over the final 30 minutes as the Blue Hens posted a 93-78 win over Wesley College during the Blue Hens' home opener at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware scored 72 points in the paint and held a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage, including 16 offensive boards. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the floor, shooting over 55 percent in both halves.

Six Blue Hens reached double figures led by Ryan Daly, who finished with team-highs of 23 points and nine boards. Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods each contributed 11 points while Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all added 10 apiece.

Brian Cameron paced Wesley with 30 points, while Evan Anderson added 16 of his own.

Delaware led for the final 37 minutes of the game, and was up double figures during the last 25 minutes of the contest. The Blue Hens led by as many as 18 points in the opening half, before settling for a 51-36 advantage at the break.

The Wolverines got within 59-49 with 14:16 to play but would get no closer, as the lead eventually grew to a game-high 20 at 86-66 at the 3:09 mark.

### **Delaware Puts Six in Double Figures vs. Wesley**

Delaware had six players reach double figures in the win over Wesley. Ryan Daly led the Blue Hens with 23 points, while Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods added 11 apiece. Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all contributed 10 points.

Delaware has had seven players reach double figures twice in school history, while the Wesley game was the fifth time UD had six players score in double digits. The last time the Blue Hens had six double figure scorers was during an 88-78 victory over Florida in the San Juan Shootout on Dec. 1, 1996.

**Delaware Dominates Paint vs. Wesley**

Delaware scored an incredible 72 points in the paint vs. Wesley, which is believed to be a school record. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the field, including 37 of 55 (67.3 percent) inside the three-point line.

**Unselfish Blue Hens**

Delaware handed out 24 assists on its 38 baskets vs. Wesley. That marked the Blue Hens' highest assist total since dishing out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.

**Delaware Holds Big Rebound Edge vs. Wesley**

Delaware enjoyed a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage over Wesley, its highest rebounding margin since a 46-26 edge over Delaware State on Dec. 2, 2016. The Blue Hens' 16 offensive boards were the most since also grabbing 16 vs. Marist on Dec. 20, 2016.

**Blue Hens Win Opener at Richmond**

Delaware jumped out to a 33-point lead in the first half and held off a Richmond charge down the stretch as the Blue Hens never trailed in posting an impressive 76-63 season-opening road victory over the Spiders on Nov. 10 at the Robins Center.

Delaware used a 29-2 run during the first half and eventually went up 45-12 with 3:05 to play in the stanza. Richmond rallied twice but never got closer than nine in the second half.

Ryan Daly led the way with 22 points, while Eric Carter notched a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Freshman Kevin Anderson contributed 11 points in his UD debut, while Anthony Mosley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures with 10 points to go with five assists.

UD scored 10 consecutive points to jump out to an early 12-2 lead, and after Richmond pulled within 12-8, the Blue Hens exploded for an incredible 29-2 run to extend the advantage to 41-10 on a Jacob Cushing three-pointer at the 4:46 mark. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware took a 49-20 cushion into the break.

The Blue Hens shot 75.0 percent from the field during the opening 20 minutes, and assisted on 15 of their 21 field goals.

Richmond reeled off a 14-2 spurt in the second half to pull within 56-42 and eventually got as close as 12, but Daly buried a contested three-pointer and Mosley added two free throws to push the margin back to 17.

The Spiders used a quick eight-point spurt to pull within 67-58 with 2:08 on the clock, but Delaware countered with a 7-0 run to put the game away.

**Carter Opens With Consecutive Double-Doubles**

Eric Carter opened the season in impressive fashion, posting double-doubles in each of the Blue Hens' first two games at Richmond and Bradley.

Carter scored 12 points, hitting 5 of 7 shots from the floor, and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds at Richmond. He also led all players with four steals in the victory. He then recorded game-highs of 18 points and 12 boards at Bradley, going 7 of 9 from the field.

Carter is the first Blue Hen to post double-doubles in the first two games of the season since Marc Egerson in 2008-09.

**Blue Hens Win Third Straight Season Opener**

Delaware lost nine consecutive season openers from 2006-14, but has now won its last three games to open its season.

**Daly Named CAA Player of the Week**

Ryan Daly was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Nov. 13 after leading the Blue Hens to their season-opening win at Richmond.

Daly scored a game-high 22 points on 9 of 14 shooting during the 76-63 triumph over the Spiders, while adding four rebounds and two assists in 37 minutes of action.

Daly, last year's CAA Rookie of the Year and a Preseason Second Team All-CAA pick this year, earned his first career CAA Player of the Week award. He was named the league's Rookie of the Week six times last season.

**Blue Hens Dominate Spiders in First Half**

UD led Richmond 12-8 with 13:12 remaining in the first half, but then exploded for a 29-2 run over the next eight and a half minutes, taking a commanding 41-10 advantage with 4:46 on the clock.

The Blue Hens scored 14 straight points, and after a Spiders bucket, then ran off 15 more in a row. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware settled for a 49-20 halftime cushion.

UD connected on 21 of 28 (75.0%) field goal attempts in the first half, assisting on 15 of those baskets. Eric Carter and Ryan Daly each had five field goals in the opening 20 minutes, while Richmond had just four as a team.

Delaware had a 15/2 assist/turnover ratio in the first half, but a 0/9 ratio in the second. However the Blue Hens never led by less than nine in the second stanza.

**Anderson, Walker Both Start As Freshmen**

Kevin Anderson and Chyree Walker each started in the season opener, as Delaware started two freshmen in its opener for the first time since 2011. Anderson finished with 11 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals while not committing a turnover in 31 minutes on the floor. Walker played 18 minutes, finishing with seven points on 3 of 4 shooting and grabbing a pair of boards.

**Delaware Signs Ithiel Horton To NLI**

Martin Ingelsby announced on Monday that Ithiel Horton has signed a National Letter of Intent with UD and will begin playing for the Blue Hens next fall.

Horton, a 6-3 combo guard from Vauxhall, N.J., is currently in his first season at Roselle Catholic High School. He averaged 10 points, three rebounds and three assists per game as a junior at St. Anthony, which closed last spring.

"We are very excited to welcome Ithiel into the Delaware basketball family," Ingelsby said. "Ithiel is a young man we targeted early in the recruiting process and fits the type of perimeter players we want to have in our program. He is a big-time shooter who also has a high basketball IQ and feel for the game. He comes to us having played for two of the best high school basketball programs in the state of New Jersey and we look forward to him making an immediate impact when he arrives in Newark."

**Goss Redshirting Season As Transfer**

Collin Goss is sitting out this season as a redshirt after he transferred to Delaware from George Washington over the summer, and will have two years of eligibility with the Blue Hens beginning in the 2018-19 season.

Goss, a 6-11 forward from Manassas, Va., appeared in 13 games as a sophomore last season for the Colonials, who finished with a 20-15 record and competed in the College Basketball Invitational. He finished the year with 20 points and 14 rebounds, while averaging 6.2 minutes per contest. Goss scored a career-high five points in a win over Harvard

on Nov. 29, and added four points in a season-opening victory over Siena. He played a career-high 19 minutes against Florida State, and blocked a career-best two shots vs. Howard.

Goss saw action in 18 games during his freshman year, totaling nine rebounds and a point for a George Washington team that went 28-10 and captured the Postseason NIT title.

### **Delaware Names Mosley, Carter Team Captains**

Blue Hen head coach Martin Ingelsby has named senior guard Anthony Mosley and junior forward Eric Carter 2017-18 team captains.

Mosley was Delaware's starting point guard a year ago, when he ranked second in the CAA with 1.7 steals per game and second on the team with a 10.0 scoring average. Carter also appeared in all 33 games last season, ranking second on the team and 16th in the CAA with 5.4 rebounds per game. Carter shot a team-high 50.6% from the field, and scored a career-high 20 points on 9 of 10 shooting at UNCW.

Martin Ingelsby is currently in his second season as University of Delaware men's basketball head coach during the 2017-18 season.

After spending the previous 13 years on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first season in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament.

Ingelsby's first recruit, Ryan Daly, was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the All-CAA third team while setting UD freshman records for scoring and rebounding.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby, 38, helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I really believe this is a great fit for me," Ingelsby said at the time of his hiring. "Coming from Notre Dame, to have the opportunity to be the head coach at a place like the University of Delaware is something I could not pass up. This is a great academic institution and a great community and we will be able to recruit young men who will excel in the classroom and on the basketball court. We want to win and we want to win the right way. It all starts with high character and highly competitive kids who will represent this basketball program and this University in a first-class manner on and off the basketball court. I can't wait to get started.

"We want to dream big dreams and talk about winning CAA championships and getting into the NCAA Tournament. There is a process that goes into place in building a basketball program and we will work hard to get there. Together, with the student body, faculty, alumni, community and fans, we can accomplish great things."

"I am incredibly excited for our student-athletes, our university and all of Blue Hen Nation to welcome Coach Ingelsby," said University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissy Rawak. "Martin demands excellence in all that he does and has a keen focus on getting young men to go beyond their limits academically, athletically, and in the community. He will have an immediate impact not only on our basketball program, but on our entire department."

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

During Ingelsby's lone season at Wagner in 2002-03, he was part of the most successful season in school history as the Seahawks finished 21-11, won both the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01 he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore, and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May, 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate (7), and sons Jack (3) and Benjamin (1).

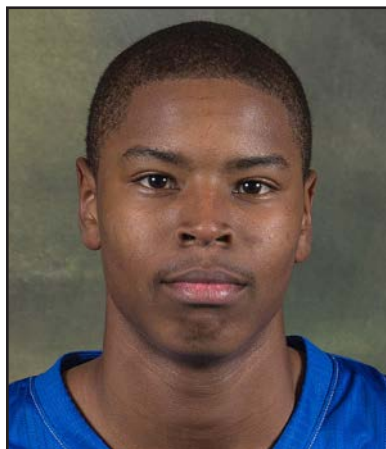

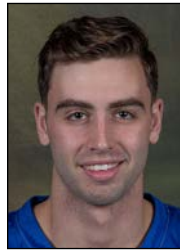
