• Delaware plays the first of three games in three days in Greensboro Monday in the UNCG Spartan Classic.

• The Blue Hens will take on UNCG and North Carolina Wesleyan at the Greensboro Coliseum, before facing Longwood at UNCG's Fleming Gymnasium.

• Delaware won its home opener for the third consecutive season by defeating local Division III opponent Wesley College, 93-78, Friday night at the Bob Carpenter Center. UD improved to 18-8 in its 26 Bob Carpenter Center openers.

• The Blue Hens posted a school record 72 points in the paint, and recorded their highest point total since Jan. 30, 2016.

• Delaware handed out 24 assists, the most since dishing out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.

• The Blue Hens enjoyed a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage over Wesley, their highest rebounding margin since a 46-26 edge over Delaware State on Dec. 2, 2016.

• Six UD players reached double figures for the fifth time in school history (seven Blue Hens have scored double digits twice). The last time the Blue Hens had six double figure scorers was during an 88-78 victory over Florida in the San Juan Shootout on Dec. 1, 1996.

• Delaware leads the all-time series with UNCG, 3-2, although the teams have not faced each other since 2006. The Spartans have won both matchups in Greensboro, with victories in 2001 and 2006.

Allen Set To Make UD Debut

Freshman guard Ryan Alan is expected to make his Blue Hen debut tonight, after missing the first three games of the year for a suspension due to a violation of team rules.

Blue Hens Win Third Straight Home Opener

With Friday's 93-78 win over Wesley, Delaware improved to 18-8 in home openers at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware posted a 73-72 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Nov. 24, 2015 and a 64-56 win over Goldie-Beacom on Nov. 11, 2016, prior to Friday's victory over the Wolverines.

Delaware Dominates Wesley in Home Opener

Delaware dominated in the paint and led comfortably over the final 30 minutes as the Blue Hens posted a 93-78 win over Wesley College during the Blue Hens' home opener Friday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Delaware scored 72 points in the paint and held a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage, including 16 offensive boards. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the floor, shooting over 55 percent in both halves.

Six Blue Hens reached double figures led by sophomore guard Ryan Daly, who finished with team-highs of 23 points and nine boards. Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods each contributed 11 points while Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all added 10 apiece.

Brian Cameron paced Wesley with 30 points, while Evan Anderson added 16 of his own.

Delaware led for the final 37 minutes of the game, and was up double figures during the last 25 minutes of the contest. The Blue Hens led by as many as 18 points in the opening half, before settling for a 51-36 advantage at the break.

The Wolverines got within 59-49 with 14:16 to play but would get no closer, as the lead eventually grew to a game-high 20 at 86-66 at the 3:09 mark.

Delaware Puts Six in Double Figures vs. Wesley

Delaware had six players reach double figures in Friday's win over Wesley. Ryan Daly led the Blue Hens with 23 points, while Anthony Mosley and Derrick Woods added 11 apiece. Eric Carter, Chyree Walker and Skye Johnson all contributed 10 points.

Delaware has had seven players reach double figures twice in school history, while Friday was the fifth time UD had six players score in double digits. The last time the Blue Hens had six double figure scorers was during an 88-78 victory over Florida in the San Juan Shootout on Dec. 1, 1996.

Delaware Dominates Paint vs. Wesley

Delaware scored an incredible 72 points in the paint vs. Wesley, which is believed to be a school record. The Blue Hens shot 56.7 percent from the field, including 37 of 55 (67.3 percent) inside the three-point line.

Hens Shooting Well Inside Arc, Not Outside

Delaware leads the CAA with a 51.6 field goal percentage this season, but is last in the league with a 19.5 three-point percentage.

The Blue Hens are just 8 of 41 (19.5%) from behind the arc through three games, but are 75 of 120 (62.5%) inside the arc.

Three Hens Set Season-Highs vs. Wolverines

Derrick Woods scored six points through the first two games of the season, but tied his career-high by scoring 11 to go with five rebounds vs. Wesley. Chyree Walker scored a season-best 10 points while Skye Johnson, who did not appear in the first two games of the year, also scored 10 points on 4 of 5 shooting.

Unselfish Blue Hens

Delaware handed out 24 assists on its 38 baskets vs. Wesley. That marked the Blue Hens' highest assist total since dishing out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.

Delaware Holds Big Rebound Edge vs. Wesley

Delaware enjoyed a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage over Wesley, its highest rebounding margin since a 46-26 edge over Delaware State on Dec. 2, 2016. The Blue Hens' 16 offensive boards were the most since also grabbing 16 vs. Marist on Dec. 20, 2016.

Hens Fall At Bradley

Bradley used a late seven-point run to break open a close game as the Braves posted a 61-53 victory over Delaware Tuesday night at Carver Arena.

Bradley led by just a point at 48-47 with 4:54 to play but Nate Kennell buried a three-pointer, Donte Thomas added a layup and Luuk van Bree hit two free throws to put the Braves up eight with 2:46 to play. The Blue Hens could not get closer than six the rest of the way.

Eric Carter recorded game-highs of 18 points and 12 rebounds to notch his second consecutive double-double, while Kevin Anderson contributed 15 points and eight boards. Anthony Mosley came off the bench to score 13 points, but the rest of the Blue Hens combined for just seven points.

van Bree paced Bradley with 15 points off the bench, while Darrell Brown scored 11 and Thomas grabbed 10 rebounds.

The Blue Hens got off to another solid start by taking an early 15-6 lead, but then converted just one basket over the next eight minutes. Bradley took advantage by going on a 16-2 run, surging in front 22-17 on a JoJo McGlaston three-pointer with five minutes left in the half.

Delaware countered with six consecutive points, but Bradley responded to take a 31-27 cushion into the break.

Delaware went down as much as eight at 38-30 but then scored nine straight points, going in front 39-38 on a Derrick Woods basket with 11 minutes remaining.

It was still just a one-point game six minutes later, before the Braves went on their pivotal run to take control.

Blue Hens Win Opener at Richmond

Delaware jumped out to a 33-point lead in the first half and held off a Richmond charge down the stretch as the Blue Hens never trailed in posting an impressive 76-63 season-opening road victory over the Spiders on Nov. 10 at the Robins Center.

Delaware used a 29-2 run during the first half and eventually went up 45-12 with 3:05 to play in the stanza. Richmond rallied twice but never got closer than nine in the second half.

Ryan Daly led the way with 22 points, while Eric Carter notched a double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Freshman Kevin Anderson contributed 11 points in his UD debut, while Anthony Mosley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures with 10 points to go with five assists.

De'Monte Buckingham paced the Spiders with 18 points and six rebounds, while Jacob Gilyard chipped in 17 points and four assists.

UD scored 10 consecutive points to jump out to an early 12-2 lead, and after Richmond pulled within 12-8, the Blue Hens exploded for an incredible 29-2 run to extend the advantage to 41-10 on a Jacob Cushing three-pointer at the 4:46 mark. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware took a 49-20 cushion into the break.

The Blue Hens shot 75.0 percent from the field during the opening 20 minutes, and assisted on 15 of their 21 field goals.

Richmond reeled off a 14-2 spurt in the second half to pull within 56-42 and eventually got as close as 12, but Daly buried a contested three-pointer and Mosley added two free throws to push the margin back to 17.

The Spiders used a quick eight-point spurt to pull within 67-58 with 2:08 on the clock, but Delaware countered with a 7-0 run to put the game away.

Carter With Consecutive Double-Doubles

Eric Carter has opened the season in impressive fashion, and posted double-doubles in each of the Blue Hens' first two games at Richmond and Bradley.

Carter scored 12 points, hitting 5 of 7 shots from the floor, and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds at Richmond. He also led all players with four steals in the victory. He then recorded game-highs of 18 points and 12 boards at Bradley, going 7 of 9 from the field.

Carter is the first Blue Hen to post double-doubles in the first two games of the season since Marc Egerson in 2008-09.

Carter added 10 points and eight rebounds vs. Wesley, and now leads the team with 10.7 rebounds and ranks second with 13.3 points.

Anderson Impressing Early On

Kevin Anderson has gotten his Blue Hen career off to an impressive start through three games, as he is tied for the team lead with 11 assists, ranks second with 6.0 rebounds, and is third with 11.7 points per game.

After posting 11 points and four rebounds at Richmond, he added 15 points and eight boards during 39 minutes on the floor at Bradley. Anderson scored nine points, grabbed six rebounds and handed out six assists vs. Wesley.

Mosley in Double Figures

Senior guard Anthony Mosley missed the preseason action with a fractured toe, but the injury has not affected him in the early portion of the regular season. Mosley is averaging 11.3 points and 4.3 rebounds in 29.7 minutes, and is tied for the team lead with 11 assists. He has reached double figures in scoring in all three games.

Blue Hens Win Third Straight Season Opener

Delaware lost nine consecutive season openers from 2006-14, but has now won its last three games to open its season.

Delaware Gets Road Win Over Atlantic 10 Foe

Last Friday's win at Richmond was the Blue Hens' first road victory over an Atlantic 10 opponent since a 58-56 triumph at La Salle on Dec. 29, 2006.

Daly Named CAA Player of the Week

Ryan Daly was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Monday after leading the Blue Hens to their season-opening win at Richmond.

Daly scored a game-high 22 points on 9 of 14 shooting during the 76-63 triumph over the Spiders last Friday, while adding four rebounds and two assists in 37 minutes of action.

Daly, last year's CAA Rookie of the Year and a Preseason Second Team All-CAA pick this year, earned his first career CAA Player of the Week award. He was named the league's Rookie of the Week six times last season.

Blue Hens Dominate Spiders in First Half

UD led Richmond 12-8 with 13:12 remaining in the first half, but then exploded for a 29-2 run over the next eight and a half minutes, taking a commanding 41-10 advantage with 4:46 on the clock.

The Blue Hens scored 14 straight points, and after a Spiders bucket, then ran off 15 more in a row. The lead grew to as much as 33 at 45-12, before Delaware settled for a 49-20 halftime cushion.

UD connected on 21 of 28 (75.0%) field goal attempts in the first half, assisting on 15 of those baskets. Eric Carter and Ryan Daly each had five field goals in the opening 20 minutes, while Richmond had just four as a team.

Delaware had a 15/2 assist/turnover ratio in the first half, but a 0/9 ratio in the second. However the Blue Hens never led by less than nine in the second stanza.

Anderson, Walker Both Start As Freshmen

Kevin Anderson and Chyree Walker each started in the season opener, as Delaware started two freshmen in its opener for the first time since 2011. Anderson finished with 11 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals while not committing a turnover in 31 minutes on the floor. Walker played 18 minutes, finishing with seven points on 3 of 4 shooting and grabbing a pair of boards.

Cushing Impresses In Opener

Sophomore Jacob Cushing got the start in the season opener at Richmond, and took advantage of the opportunity. Cushing scored eight points and collected five rebounds in a career-high 30 minutes on the floor.

Delaware Signs Ithiel Horton To NLI

Martin Ingelsby announced on Monday that Ithiel Horton has signed a National Letter of Intent with UD and will begin playing for the Blue Hens next fall.

Horton, a 6-3 combo guard from Vauxhall, N.J., is currently in his first season at Roselle Catholic High School. He averaged 10 points, three rebounds and three assists per game as a junior at St. Anthony, which closed last spring.

"We are very excited to welcome Ithiel into the Delaware basketball family," Ingelsby said. "Ithiel is a young man we targeted early in the recruiting process and fits the type of perimeter players we want to have in our program. He is a big-time shooter who also has a high basketball IQ and feel for the game. He comes to us having played for two of the best high school basketball programs in the state of New Jersey and we look forward to him making an immediate impact when he arrives in Newark."

Delaware is opening its season with a busy stretch that is featuring six games, all but one on the road, in 13 days.

Delaware opened the season on Nov. 10 at Richmond, and traveled to Bradley last Tuesday. UD played its home opener on Friday vs. Wesley, and will now play three games in three days at the UNCG Spartan Classic, facing UNCG, North Carolina Wesleyan and Longwood.

Following this stretch, Delaware will play five of its final seven non-conference games at the Bob Carpenter Center. One of those two road games will be a short trip to Dover, Del. to face Delaware State.

Daly Looks To Build On Stellar Freshman Year

Blue Hen sophomore guard Ryan Daly is looking to build on his outstanding freshman campaign in which he was named CAA Rookie of the Year and to the All-CAA third team.

Daly set UD freshman single season records with 511 points and 171 rebounds, and led all conference freshmen in scoring and rebounding.

Daly was sixth in the CAA and paced the Blue Hens with 16.0 points per game, and was fifth in the league while leading the team with 7.4 rebounds per contest. He notched six double-doubles on the year, and reached double figures in 21 of the last 23 games including nine straight.

Daly's nine 20-point games were the most ever by a UD freshman, and he was named to the CAA All-Tournament Team after averaging 25.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in a pair of double-doubles vs. Hofstra and UNCW.

Goss Redshirting Season As Transfer

Collin Goss is sitting out this season as a redshirt after he transferred to Delaware from George Washington over the summer, and will have two years of eligibility with the Blue Hens beginning in the 2018-19 season.

Goss, a 6-11 forward from Manassas, Va., appeared in 13 games as a sophomore last season for the Colonials, who finished with a 20-15 record and competed in the College Basketball Invitational. He finished the year with 20 points and 14 rebounds, while averaging 6.2 minutes per contest. Goss scored a career-high five points in a win over Harvard on Nov. 29, and added four points in a season-opening victory over Siena. He played a career-high 19 minutes against Florida State, and blocked a career-best two shots vs. Howard.

Goss saw action in 18 games during his freshman year, totaling nine rebounds and a point for a George Washington team that went 28-10 and captured the Postseason NIT title.

Delaware Names Mosley, Carter Team Captains

Blue Hen head coach Martin Ingelsby has named senior guard Anthony Mosley and junior forward Eric Carter 2017-18 team captains.

Mosley was Delaware's starting point guard a year ago, when he ranked second in the CAA with 1.7 steals per game and second on the team with a 10.0 scoring average. Carter also appeared in all 33 games last season, ranking second on the team and 16th in the CAA with 5.4 rebounds per game. Carter shot a team-high 50.6% from the field, and scored a career-high 20 points on 9 of 10 shooting at UNCW.

Number Changes

Three Blue Hens have changed their jersey number from last year. Skye Johnson has switched from #25 to #23, Jacob Cushing has switched from #35 to #22, and Curtis Lochner has switched from #25 to #15.

Martin Ingelsby is currently in his second season as University of Delaware men's basketball head coach during the 2017-18 season.

After spending the previous 13 years on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first season in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament.

Ingelsby's first recruit, Ryan Daly, was named the CAA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the All-CAA third team while setting UD freshman records for scoring and rebounding.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby, 38, helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I really believe this is a great fit for me," Ingelsby said at the time of his hiring. "Coming from Notre Dame, to have the opportunity to be the head coach at a place like the University of Delaware is something I could not pass up. This is a great academic institution and a great community and we will be able to recruit young men who will excel in the classroom and on the basketball court. We want to win and we want to win the right way. It all starts with high character and highly competitive kids who will represent this basketball program and this University in a first-class manner on and off the basketball court. I can't wait to get started.

"We want to dream big dreams and talk about winning CAA championships and getting into the NCAA Tournament. There is a process that goes into place in building a basketball program and we will work hard to get there. Together, with the student body, faculty, alumni, community and fans, we can accomplish great things."

"I am incredibly excited for our student-athletes, our university and all of Blue Hen Nation to welcome Coach Ingelsby," said University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissy Rawak. "Martin demands excellence in all that he does and has a keen focus on getting young men to go beyond their limits academically, athletically, and in the community. He will have an immediate impact not only on our basketball program, but on our entire department."

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

During Ingelsby's lone season at Wagner in 2002-03, he was part of the most successful season in school history as the Seahawks finished 21-11, won both the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament titles, and earned the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01 he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore, and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May, 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate (7), and sons Jack (3) and Benjamin (1).

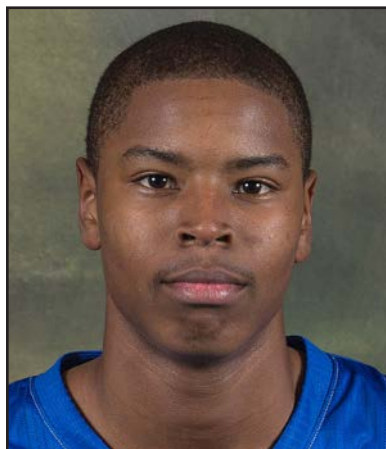

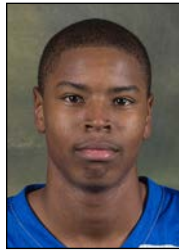

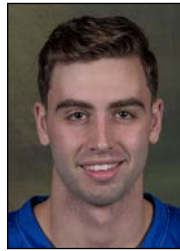
