**Last Meeting:** **Johnathon Smith** enjoyed his biggest night as a Blue Hen, scoring three touchdowns and running for 101 yards to lead the No. 6 ranked University of Delaware to an easy 48-20 football win over West Chester in UD's home opener at sold out Delaware Stadium last Sept. 13.

Smith, a senior and a first-year starter in the Delaware backfield, scored all three of his touchdowns in the first half, including a 62-yard burst down the left sideline early in the second quarter as the Hens (1-1) jumped out to a 34-6 lead at the break and never looked back in posting a win over their NCAA Division II rivals for the 15th straight time, including the third straight year in the home opener.

The game was played before a sold out crowd of 22,029 that saw the Blue Hens, last season's NCAA Division I FCS runner-up, unveil a brand new video scoreboard.

Smith led a balanced rushing attack that churned out 308 yards and scored four touchdowns on the ground. Smith enjoyed his first career 100-yard effort while **Jerry Butler** rushed for 92 yards on 12 carries, including a 53-yard scoring jaunt in the final quarter, and **Jared Bradley** gained 78 yards on 10 carries.

Delaware QB **Robby Schoenhoff**, a first-year transfer from Ohio State, earned his first career win as he completed 14 of 26 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns, an 18-yard toss to All-American tight end **Robbie Agnone** in the opening quarter and a 14-yard strike to a diving **Kervin Michaud** in the final stanza.

West Chester (1-1), ranked No. 23 in the NCAA Division II poll and an NCAA Tournament qualifier the previous four seasons, managed to throw for three touchdowns but the Hens stuffed their run game all night, holding the Rams to just 16 yards on 17 carries without the benefit of a sack. The Hens also held down West Chester All-American wide receiver Mike Washington to just one catch for no yards. Washington entered the game averaging 22 yards per catch with three touchdowns this season.

In addition to holding the Rams to just 256 total yards, the Hens also intercepted two passes and blocked a punt on the Rams' first possession that resulted in a first quarter touchdown. The Hens came out strong, scoring on six of their first seven possessions to take the big lead.

## GAME PREVIEW:

The University of Delaware will finally hit the field for action that counts this evening as the Blue Hens play host to neighboring rival West Chester at Delaware Stadium. Delaware, which has won 15 straight games over the Golden Rams, is looking to rebound from a tough 2008 season that saw the Blue Hens post an uncharacteristic 4-8 mark, establishing an unwanted school record for losses in a season. The four wins were the fewest for the Hens since posting a mark of 4-6 in 2001. West Chester, which has advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament each of the last five seasons, enters with a 1-0 mark after opening its 2009 campaign with a convincing 43-0 win over Lock Haven on last Thursday night.

## LAST WEEK FOR DELAWARE:

The Hens will be playing their 2009 season opener. Delaware dropped its final two games of the 2008 season, falling to eventual national champion Richmond 31-14 and to NCAA quarterfinalist Villanova 21-7 to close out the campaign.

## LAST WEEK FOR WEST CHESTER:

The Rams, coming off a 9-3 record in 2008 that resulted in a berth in the NCAA Division II quarterfinals, opened the 2009 season last Thursday and posted a convincing 43-0 road win over Lock Haven. Joe Wright threw for 186 yards and one touchdown, and West Chester's defense posted the team's first shutout on the road since 2006. West Chester's defense held Lock Haven to seven yards of total offense in the second half as it increased its 16-0 lead at the break to 36-0 by the end of the third quarter. The Golden Rams outgained the Bald Eagles by a whopping 460-52 for the entire game. Jackson Fagan scored on a 61-yard run at the 7:10 mark of the third quarter, and junior transfer Cordero Newkirk returned an interception 61 yards for a score in the final minute of the frame to open up that 36-0 advantage. Dan DePalma ran in from the 5-yard line for his second touchdown of the day in between Fagan's and Newkirk's scores. Brian McDermott closed out the scoring with a 24-yard scamper with 42 seconds left in the game.

## DELAWARE TOUGH IN HOME OPENERS:

Delaware is 45-11 (.8-3) in home openers since Delaware Stadium opened in 1952 with the Blue Hens having won four straight and 17 of their last 20 home debuts in the friendly confines entering tonight's West Chester game. Delaware is 6-1 in home openers under **K.C. Keeler** with the lone loss a 24-21 setback to New Hampshire in 2004. Delaware will take on West Chester in the home opener for the fourth straight season and for the 16th time in Delaware Stadium history. The Hens are 13-2 in those 15 home openers vs. the Rams with the losses setbacks of 10-7 in 1956 and 35-27 in 1983. Delaware has now won eight straight home openers.

## BLUE HENS PICK 2009 CAPTAINS:

University of Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler** went a different route this season when selecting his team captains for the 2009 season. In the past, the team would vote for captains at the end of spring practice. This season, however, Keeler waited until the final week of pre-season drills to have his team make the choice. A trio of seniors in offensive lineman **Corey Nicholson**, senior safety **Charles Graves**, and senior linebacker **Matt Marcorelle** were selected from a vote of the team on Saturday. Marcorelle, from Fort Pierce, Fla., becomes the first three-time team captain in school history. Graves (Raleigh, N.C.) and Marcorelle have each earned All-American honors during their careers while Nicholson (Frederick, Md.) will be a third-year starter this fall.

**SEASON TICKET COUNT IMPRESSIVE ONCE AGAIN:**

University of Delaware football fans continued to show their loyalty during the off-season as they once again surpassed the 10,000 mark by purchasing 10,121 season ticket packages as of last Friday. Delaware Stadium has drawn an average of 20,000 fans per regular season home game each of the last 10 seasons (capacity is 22,000), becoming the only NCAA FCS school to accomplish that feat. This week vs. West Chester, the Hens will be looking to extend their streak of consecutive regular season games drawing at least 20,000 fans to 40 straight games since the 2002 campaign.

**MEN'S TENNIS ALUMNI TO GATHER TO CELEBRATE 100TH ANNIVERSARY:**

The University of Delaware will celebrate a special milestone this weekend with the 100th Anniversary of Blue Hen men's tennis program. Current UD head coach Laura LeRoy, who will begin her 17th season at the helm of the UD netters this season, will welcome men's tennis alumni from as far back as the 1950's in a pre-game tailgate. The group will also be honored at half-time of tonight's game against West Chester. The program began in 1909 and the Blue Hens have gone on to post 605 dual victories, a winning percentage of 58 percent, conference titles in 1974 and 1997, and winning records 17 times in the last 20 seasons.

**FORMER HENS RETURN TO DELAWARE STADIUM:**

Three former University of Delaware football players will return to Delaware Stadium this evening - this time in purple and gold instead of gold and blue - after transferring from UD to West Chester. Sophomore QB Scott Bradish, junior RB Corey Broyles, and sophomore wide receiver Bob Sabol all play for the Rams now after starting their careers as Blue Hens. In addition to those three, Delaware natives such as QB Joe Wright, LB Sam Scott, and DB Zach Woods also play key roles for West Chester.

**FIVE BLUE HENS IN THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE:**

Delaware could have as many as five former standouts competing in the National Football League this fall. In addition to quarterback **Joe Flacco**, who will enter his second season as the Ravens' starting quarterback after leading the team to the AFC title game, tight end **Ben Patrick** returns for his third season as a backup with the Super Bowl runner-up Arizona Cardinals, and **Mike Adams** begins his sixth NFL season as a part-time starting safety, including his third year with the Cleveland Browns. In addition to those three, tight end **Robbie Agnone** (Washington Redskins) and defensive end **Ronald Talley** (Green Bay Packers) were still fighting for roster spots as free agents as of Monday.

**FORMER BLUE HEN ALL-AMERICAN RECEIVER EDDIE CONTI TO SERVE AS HONORARY CAPTAIN TONIGHT:** One of the most exciting players in University of Delaware football history returns to Delaware Stadium this evening as Eddie Conti is on hand to serve as tonight's Honorary Captain and take part in the pre-game coin toss.

The UD Honorary Captain program is our chance to pay tribute to those who have made outstanding contributions to the UD football team and to the Blue Hen Athletics Program.

During his career that spanned the 1994-98 seasons, Eddie thrilled the UD fans with his scintillating kick returns and long pass receptions. He set a staggering 43 school, conference, and NCAA records during his career and was a consensus All-American in 1998 when he caught 91 passes for a then NCAA I-AA record 1,712 yards. In one memorable game vs. Connecticut, he caught 15 passes for 354 yards and three touchdowns.

He now resides in New Jersey and is a personal trainer for golf fitness, game improvement, as well as physical fitness for youth and adult individual and group classes. He previously worked as an assistant golf professional. He spends his time with his parents George and June Conti, his sister Tina, brother in law Ode, and two nieces, Talia and Tiana.
