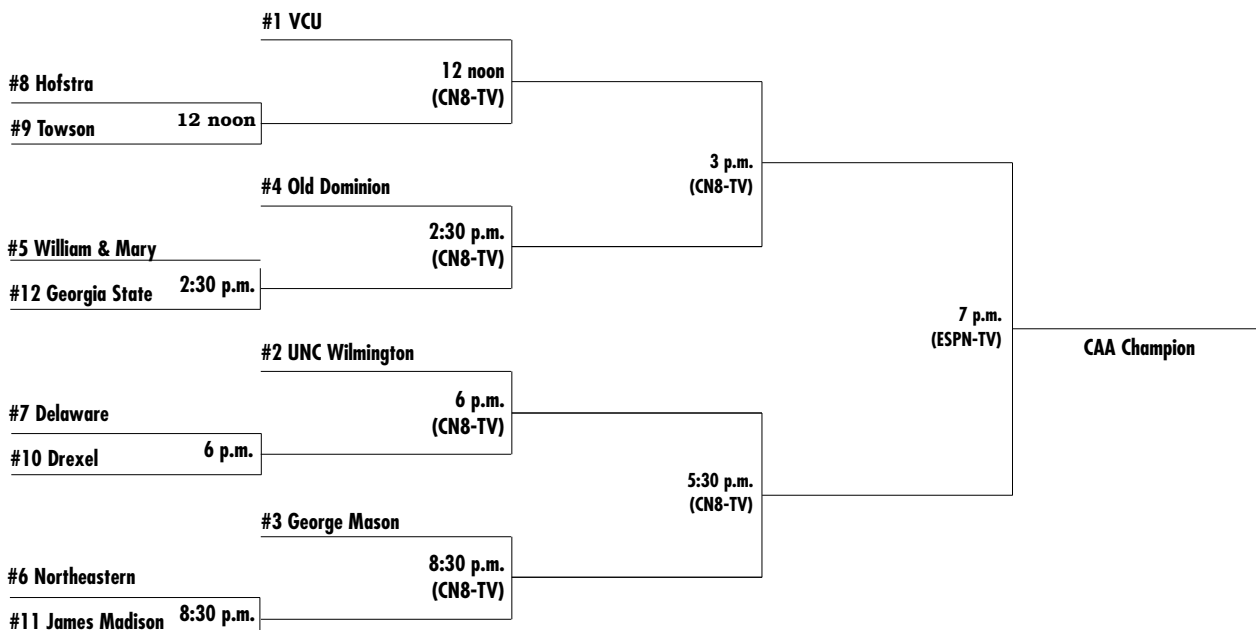

# HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



## HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS

Winston-Salem State '92  
Second Season at Delaware  
18-42 Overall and at Delaware

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his second season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2007-08. He guided Delaware to a 5-26 record in 2006-07 and led the Blue Hens to a 72-68 win over preseason league favorite Hofstra on January 29.

Prior to coming to Delaware Ross, 37, had served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. My first priority will be to the players we have coming back. They all came here to the University of Delaware with a dream and they all have goals. I want to make sure that their experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and

create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Phil Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated

and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season. Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West. Nelson currently plays for the Orlando Magic while West and Dwayne Jones are members of the Boston Celtics. Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, PA with their son Justin, 8, and daughter Lauren, 6.

R.C. Kehoe begins his second season on the University of Delaware men's basketball coaching staff in the 2007-08 season.

Kehoe spent his first year on the Blue Hen bench in 2006-07 as Delaware went 5-26 under first-year head coach Monté Ross.

Kehoe came to Delaware after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County in 2005-06. A native of Philadelphia, the 29-year-old Kehoe joined the UMBC staff under head coach Randy Monroe in the summer of 2005 and helped the Retrievers post a record of 10-19. He earned his bachelor's degree in speech communications from NCAA Division II Shippensburg University in 2004 after competing collegiately at Clarion University in 1997-99 and East Stroudsburg University in 1999-2001.

The former point guard led Clarion in assists and steals in both his seasons there and broke the school record for three-point field goals made in a season (66) at ESU, where he served as team captain. He played his high school basketball at Roman Catholic High School in Philadelphia and was part of nationally-ranked teams all four seasons.

Kehoe, who is the nephew of Saint Joseph's University men's basketball head coach Phil Martelli, began his coaching career as an assistant at Shippensburg during the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons under head coach Dave Springer, and moved up to the NCAA Division I ranks in 2004-05 when he helped St. Francis (PA) University post a 15-13 record for head coach Bobby Jones. Kehoe and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Tyler (below, standing) and Jaxon.

Stephen Stewart begins his second season as an assistant coach with the University of Delaware men's basketball team in the 2007-08 season.

A native of Philadelphia, Stewart spent his first year on the Blue Hen bench in 2006-07 as Delaware went 5-26 under first-year head coach Monté Ross.

Stewart served as an assistant coach on head coach Jim Patsos' staff at Loyola in 2005-06, leading the Greyhounds to a record of 15-13. A standout player at Coppin State in 1991-95, Stewart earned All-American honors three years for the Eagles as he led CSU to the NCAA Tournament in 1993 and to the National Invitation Tournament in 1995. He was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Player of the Year three times and ranks No. 7 all-time at Coppin State in both scoring (1,393 points) and rebounding (546). He played professionally for the Donor Rams in Holland and for the Melbourne Tigers in Australia.

Stewart, 35, earned his degree in liberal arts from Coppin State in 2002. He began his college coaching career as an assistant for two seasons at his alma mater under head coach Fang Mitchell in 2001-03, coached at the University at Albany in 2003-04 under coach Will Brown, and served on the staff at La Salle under Billy Hahn prior to the 2004-05 season before returning to Baltimore.

In September, 2006, Stewart and UD head coach Monté Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Stewart's brother, Larry, was a standout at Coppin State who went on to play for the Washington Bullets and Seattle Supersonics in the National Basketball Association, while his brother, Lynard, played at Temple University in 1995-99. Stephen and his wife, Lashelle, have three children: Tia, Stephen Jr., and Sidney.

First Season at Delaware

Jeff Rafferty begins his first season as an assistant coach on the University of Delaware men's basketball staff during the 2007-08 season.

Rafferty spent the last two years at the University of New Hampshire under head coach Bill Herrion. The Wildcats went 12-17 overall and 8-8 in the America East during Rafferty's first year in Durham in 2005-06, and followed with a 10-20 mark including a 6-10 conference record last season.

Prior to arriving at New Hampshire, Rafferty spent four seasons as the top assistant coach at UMass-Lowell. The River Hawks went 94-30 in Rafferty's four seasons in Lowell, capturing both the Northeast-10 Conference regular season and tournament championships in 2003 and 2004 while making back-to-back trips to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight.

Rafferty spent the 2000-01 season at Union College, and was an assistant coach at Division III Springfield College for two seasons from 1998-2000. While at Springfield, Rafferty helped his alma mater go 40-17 including a 16-8 mark in the New England Women's and Men's Athletics Conference (NEWMAC) while earning his master's degree in sports management. During Rafferty's second season Springfield went 21-9, captured the NEWMAC Tournament championship, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

Rafferty, who graduated from Springfield in 1997, served one season as an assistant coach at Texas-Pan American in 1997-98 and began his career by serving an internship with the NBA's Boston Celtics.

Rafferty and his wife, Whitney, have two sons Patrick and Brendan.

First Season at Delaware

Saul Rafel-Frankel begins his first season as University of Delaware director of men's basketball operations in the 2007-08 season.

Rafel-Frankel's responsibilities include coordinating team travel, coordinating recruiting visits, handling business operations, serving as staff liaison to UD compliance, business, and equipment rooms, and assisting in scheduling of practices and competition.

Rafel-Frankel, a 2006 Delaware graduate, returns to the Blue Hen men's basketball program after serving one season as the video coordinator at La Salle University. While at La Salle he handled opponent scouting tapes, edited Explorers game and practice tapes, and assisted the Director of Basketball Operations.

Rafel-Frankel was a four-year manager with Delaware from 2002-06, managing a team of seven student managers. He assisted in a variety of ways with UD practices, and assisted with the planning and organization of team travel and meals. As a senior Rafel-Frankel also served as a community relations intern with the Philadelphia 76ers of the National Basketball Association, coordinating player appearances at charity events, manning a charity table during home games, and assisting in camps.

Rafel-Frankel has also served as head assistant coach for the New Heights AAU Basketball Team for the last four summers, and this past summer served as director of the Monté Ross Basketball Camp. He graduated from Delaware with a bachelor of science degree in health behavior management, majoring in sport management with a minor in coaching science and a business of finance certificate. He was named the Myles Brand Student of the Year in 2006, an award voted on by faculty and given to a senior sport management major.

Second Season at Delaware

Cheikh Sarr is in his second year as a graduate assistant coach with the University of Delaware men's basketball team. Sarr is currently enrolled in his second year as the Educational Leadership Master Program while also taking independent studies classes in sport management.

Sarr graduated from Malick Sy High School in Thies, Senegal in 1991 and earned his Master of Sciences and Techniques of Sports and Physical Activities in 1996. He taught physical education for 10 years at a high school in Dakar, when he played basketball, soccer and volleyball.

Sarr completed a certification in Psychology of Sport at the Sport Faculty of the University of

Leipzig in Germany in 2003, and later taught Psychology of Sport in the Hight Institute of Sport at the University of Dakar prior to arriving in the United States in 2006.

Sarr holds a third degree certificate, the highest level in Senegal, delivered by the Senegalese Ministry of Sport in 1998 and a second degree certificate of coaching delivered by the Senegalese Basketball Federation in 1999. He has participated in and run several basketball camps for kids, and was also head coach of the US Goree Club in Senegal that won five championships and Senegalese National Cups.

Sarr was in charge of the framing of Senegalese coaches in the Technical Direction of the Senegalese Basketball Federation prior to arriving in the United States. He also held a coaching position with the Senegalese Women's National Under 20 Team in 2004, and recently was an assistant coach with the Senegalese Women's National Team that won the silver medal at the 2007 African Championships held in Dakar.

## Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference outside the UD locker room approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

Selected players will also be available outside the locker room as well, usually while Coach Ross is conducting his radio interview. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

## Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

## Delaware vs. Drexel This Year

Delaware defeated Drexel, 67-63, on January 5 in Philadelphia to snap a seven-game losing streak at the Daskalakis Center. The Blue Hens got 14 points and seven rebounds from Herb Courtney while Marco Copoer posted 10 points and seven rebounds, easily his best game of the season. Frank Elegar led Drexel with career-highs of 33 points and 17 rebounds.

Drexel answered by defeating Delaware, 62-60, on February 16 at the Carpenter Center. Randy Oveneke scored his only basket of the game with 1:01 left to break a tie and give the Dragons the lead for good, and Courtney's off-balance three-point attempt at the buzzer bounced off the rim.

## Egerson Heats Up

Blue Hen junior Marc Egerson has been a force during Delaware's final three regular season games. He recorded his second career double-double with game-highs of 22 points and 12 rebounds last at Toledo, and went 5 of 6 from three-point range. Egerson followed up that performance by posting team-highs of 24 points, 11 rebounds and nine assists against Hofstra, narrowly missing what would have been the third triple-double in school history.

Egerson scored 14 points, hit 4 of 6 three-point attempts, and dished out a team-high seven assists at Towson.

In his last three games Egerson has averaged 19.3 points, 9.3 rebounds and 7.0 assists per game, and is shooting 58.1 percent (18 of 31) from the field including 64.7 percent (11 of 17) from three-point range.

## Blue Hens Scorch Nets at Toledo

Delaware shot a season-high 58.7 percent at Toledo, going 27 of 46 from the field including 9 of 16 from behind the arc. UD shot 64 percent (16 of 25) while scoring 41 first half points, its highest first half total of the season. Marc Egerson went 7 of 11 from the field including 5 of 6 from three-point range, while Herb Courtney was 7 of 8 from the floor and Alphonso Dawson was 5 of 8.

The Blue Hens made it two consecutive games shooting at least 50 percent when Delaware shot 24 of 48 against Hofstra on Wednesday. Egerson was 6 of 10 from the field against the Pride, while Dawson was 5 of 9, Courtney was 6 of 12, and Johnson was 4 of 7.

## Blue Hens Improve Win Total

Delaware has won 13 games this season, its highest total since the 2003-04 Blue Hens finished 16-12. Delaware finished 9-9 in the CAA, tied for the second best finish in UD's seven years in the league. The Blue Hens' six road victories this season are also the most since the 2003-04 season.

## Boney Contributes off Bench

Freshman D.J. Boney scored eight points off the bench for Delaware at George Mason. He added six points at Toledo, scoring on a tip-in and adding two free throws in the final 1:33.

Boney scored five points against Hofstra while playing 20 minutes, his most time on the floor since December 22. He scored nine points at Towson on Saturday, his third highest output of the season.

## Mason Dominates Inside vs. Hens

Led by Will Thomas' 24 points and 14 rebounds, George Mason posted a 40-31 rebounding advantage and a 52-20 margin in points in the paint in the Patriots' win over Delaware.

## UD Reaches Double Digit Wins

Delaware is now 13-15 on the season and has reached double digits in wins for the first time since the 2004-05 season. The Blue Hens, who went just 5-26 a year ago, are currently one of eight teams in Division I that have doubled their win total from 2006-07.

## UD Puts Five in Double Figures vs. Drexel

All five Delaware starters scored in double figures on February 16 against Drexel, the first time five Blue Hens reached double digits since an 81-78 overtime win over George Mason on January 12, 2005.

## Dawson Sets Season-High vs. VCU

Alphonso Dawson scored a season-high 25 points against VCU, tied for the fourth most points scored by a UD freshman in a game in school history. Dawson, who went 9 of 13 from the field and 5 of 6 from the foul line, also pulled down eight rebounds and dished out a season-best four assists versus the Rams.

## Blue Hens Dominate Boards Against Rams

Delaware, which entered the VCU home game having won the rebounding battle just four times on the season, recorded a commanding 43-26 edge on the boards over the Rams. The 43 rebounds were a season-high for the Blue Hens, whose previous best showing on the boards was a nine-rebound advantage over Drexel on January 5.



# CAA TOURNAMENT NOTES

## Dawson CAA Rookie of the Week Four Times

Alphonso Dawson earned his fourth Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Rookie of the Week award on February 11.

Dawson averaged 16.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in the Blue Hens' two games on the week.

Dawson scored eight points, pulled down three rebounds and had one steal in Delaware's 68-67 victory over UNC Wilmington on February 6. He scored a career-high 25 points, tied for the fourth most by a UD freshman in a game in school history, while pulling down eight rebounds and dishing out a career-best four assists against VCU on February 9. Dawson shot 9 of 13 from the field against the Rams including 2 of 4 from three-point range, and was 5 of 6 from the free throw line.

Dawson currently ranks third on Delaware with 10.9 points per game and fourth with 4.6 rebounds per game. Dawson has also posted 34 assists and 26 steals on the year.

The Rookie of the Week award is the fourth of the season for Dawson, who also earned the honor on December 10, December 24 and January 7. The four Rookie of the Week awards are the most by a UD player in a season in school history.

## UD Loses Turnover Battle in Loss to VCU

Delaware committed 19 turnovers while VCU committed just six during the 83-73 Rams victory on February 9, leading to a 27-2 VCU edge in points off turnovers. The Blue Hens did not record a steal in the game for the first time since a 99-87 victory at Maine on February 24, 1995.

## Courtney Continues Strong Year

Herb Courtney continued his strong senior season by scoring 21 points against VCU. Courtney, who went 6 of 10 from the field and a perfect 8 of 8 from the foul line, also grabbed six rebounds for the Blue Hens. He has now reached the 20-point mark five times this season and has scored in double figures in 23 of the 29 games this year including eight consecutive games.

Courtney is tied for the team lead and ranks 12th in the CAA with 13.9 points per game, while his 6.1 rebounds per game are second on the team and 10th in the league. Courtney also ranks sixth in the CAA with 1.45 blocks per game, seventh with 4.55 defensive rebounds per game, 12th with 33.38 minutes played per game, and 14th with a 44.2 field goal percentage.

## A Tale of Two Games

Virginia Commonwealth held the Blue Hens to their fewest point total in nearly 25 years in the 60-39 win over the Blue Hens on January 16.

Delaware was held to its lowest point total since also scoring 39 points in a 46-39 setback to Rider on February 19, 1983.

The Blue Hens scored just 17 first half points, its fewest total in a first half since scoring 15 at Loyola (MD) on November 29, 2006.

Delaware's 13 field goals made were the fewest since the Blue Hens also made 13 at UNC Wilmington on February 9, 2006, while its 27.1 field goal percentage was the lowest since UD shot 26.9 percent in a 72-47 season-opening loss at seventh-ranked Alabama on November 24, 1990.

The Rams then recorded a high-scoring 83-73 victory over Delaware on February 9. The Blue Hens scored 39 points in the first half, equaling their total from the entire first game with VCU. UD's 73 points were the second most allowed this season by the Rams, who lead the CAA in scoring defense. However Delaware's 83 points allowed were its most since giving up 89 to Marist in the Blue Hens' season opener.

## Egerson Sets Season-High At Hofstra

Marc Egerson scored a season-high 26 points at Hofstra, going 3 of 4 from three-point range and 9 of 11 from the free throw line. Egerson, who scored 18 of his points in the first half, also pulled down seven rebounds for the Blue Hens.

Egerson had another big game against Hofstra on February 27 by posting 24 points, 11 rebounds and nine assists.

## UD Drops Pair of Low-Scoring Games

Delaware lost two low-scoring home games in a row, falling to Georgia State 54-53 on January 26 and dropping a 53-49 decision to Northeastern on January 30. The last time the Blue Hens lost two games in a row despite not allowing more than 54 points in either contest was on February 20, 1946 (L 50-51 at Haverford) and on February 23, 1946 (L 41-43 at Pennsylvania Military College - now Widener).

## Hens Record Dramatic Win at James Madison

Delaware trailed James Madison 57-47 with 6:51 remaining on January 23 in Harrisonburg, but five points from D.J. Boney and a layup by Brian Johnson pulled Delaware within 57-54 at the 4:35 mark.

The Blue Hens eventually got within one point, but two free throws by the Dukes' Pierre Curtis put JMU ahead 65-62 with 11.8 seconds remaining. However Herb Courtney was fouled while shooting a three-pointer with 2.4 seconds on the clock. Courtney made the first free throw but missed the second, prompting the Dukes to call a timeout.

Courtney intentionally missed the third free throw, and the Blue Hens retained possession when the ball went out of bounds off James Madison with 1.5 seconds left.

Following a Delaware timeout Brian Johnson found Marc Egerson, who quickly scored a layup while being fouled by the Dukes' Juvann James with five tenths of a second to play. Egerson then calmly hit the ensuing free throw to put Delaware ahead by a point, and James Madison could not get off a desperation shot at the buzzer.

## Dawson Averaging Double Figures

Blue Hen freshman guard Alphonso Dawson is currently averaging 10.9 points per game and should become the first Delaware freshman to average double figures since Brian Pearl averaged 10.5 points during the 1991-92 season. The UD freshman record is held by Tim Tompkins who averaged 11.9 points during the 1979-80 season.

## Hens Working Overtime

From January 9 through January 19, Delaware played three overtime games in a four-game stretch, just the second time in UD history that the Blue Hens had gone the extra session three times in four games.

UD defeated George Mason, 73-68, on January 9 in overtime, and three days later posted an 81-74 double overtime victory over Old Dominion. After a 60-39 setback at Virginia Commonwealth, Delaware dropped a 73-69 overtime decision at Northeastern on January 19.

The only other time Delaware played three overtime games in four contests was in 1973: W at Bucknell, 91-83 (2OT); W at Rider, 77-66 (OT); L at Lehigh, 70-72; W at Gettysburg, 93-89 (OT).

## Courtney Records Two Double-Doubles

Herb Courtney led Delaware with season-highs of 27 points and 11 rebounds versus Old Dominion to record his first double-double of the season. He added his second with 17 points and 11 rebounds at Towson on March 1, and now has 16 double-doubles in his career.

## Delaware Basketball on Television

The Blue Hens will have nine games televised this season. Delaware's game at Maryland on December 28 will be broadcast by Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, while the home game against Georgia State on January 26 will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Philadelphia, and Southeast. UD's game at Northeastern on January 19 and home games against Virginia Commonwealth on February 9 and Drexel on February 16 will be televised by CN8. The Blue Hens' home game against George Mason on January 9 will be broadcast by ESPN Regional and MASN, while the home game versus UNC Wilmington on February 6 will also be televised by MASN.

The Blue Hens' home game against Old Dominion on January 12 will be broadcast by WSKY4 in Hampton Roads, VA.

Additionally, CN8 will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games and both semifinal games, while ESPN will broadcast the conference championship game.

# CAA TOURNAMENT NOTES

## Streaks & Stuff

• Delaware won its first five league games for the first time in its seven seasons in the CAA and for the first time since the 1991-92 Blue Hens went a perfect 14-0 in the North Atlantic Conference.

• The Blue Hens' 5-0 start in CAA play was the first time in Delaware's seven years in the league that UD had won five consecutive CAA games. Delaware had won four straight league games twice.

• Delaware defeated William & Mary and Drexel on the road on January 2 and January 5 to win consecutive CAA road games for the first time since January 8 and January 15, 2003 when UD defeated William & Mary and Old Dominion.

• Delaware snapped a five-game losing streak to George Mason with the 73-68 overtime win on January 9. The Blue Hens rallied from a 19-point second half deficit, the largest second half comeback win in school history.

• Delaware also snapped a five-game losing streak to Old Dominion with the 81-74 double overtime win on January 12. Those two games marked the third time in Blue Hen history that Delaware has played consecutive overtime games. The other two times were February 19 and 22, 1966 and February 3 and 7, 1973.

## Comeback Kids

Delaware trailed Drexel 35-28 at the half on January 5 and was down 42-32 with 17:34 remaining, but the Blue Hens pulled even at 52-52 with 10:01 left and went on to post the 67-63 victory.

Delaware trailed George Mason 47-28 with 16:01 remaining on January 9, but exploded on a 27-8 run over the next 11 and a half minutes to tie the game at 55-55 with 4:35 left. The Patriots answered to take a three-point lead, but Brian Johnson drained a three-pointer to tie the game at 61-61 with 51 seconds left. After both teams missed in the final minute the game went into overtime, and the Blue Hens hit 10 of 12 free throws in the extra session to earn the 73-68 victory. The 19-point comeback represents the largest second half comeback victory in Delaware history.

The Blue Hens were down 30-25 at the half to Old Dominion on January 12 and trailed by as much as seven early in the second period before battling back to tie the game at 46-46 at the 8:50 mark. The Monarchs were up three points in the final seconds, but Marc Egerson drained a three-pointer with four seconds left to force overtime.

This stretch is believed to be the first time in Delaware history that the Blue Hens have won three consecutive games after trailing at the half in all three.

Delaware trailed James Madison, 57-47, on January 23 before rallying for a 66-65 win. After falling behind by double digits the Blue Hens scored seven straight points, and a free throw by Egerson made it a 59-58 game with 2:27 to play. UD was down 65-62 with 11.8 seconds to play but Herb Courtney was fouled shooting a three-pointer. He made the first but missed the next two free throws, the third intentionally, and Delaware got the ball back when it went out of bounds off James Madison. Egerson then scored while being fouled with five tenths of a second remaining, and hit the free throw to seal the win for the Blue Hens.

Delaware trailed UNC Wilmington 64-55 with 3:23 remaining before closing the game on a 13-3 run, pulling out the victory when Herb Courtney hit a three-pointer with 1.2 seconds to play. The Blue Hens were down as many as 12 points in the first half and trailed 26-16 at the half at Georgia State before rebounding to post a 51-48 win.

Delaware won six games this season after trailing at the half.

## Clutch Shots

Delaware has hit numerous clutch shots this season.

• Delaware led Drexel 64-61 on January 5, but Aphonso Dawson hit a 19-foot jumper with 19 seconds left to increase the lead to five.

• UD trailed George Mason 61-58 in the final minute of regulation, but Brian Johnson hit a three-pointer with 51 seconds left to tie the game and force overtime.

• The Blue Hens led the Patriots 70-68 in overtime, but Egerson hit two free throws with 24 seconds left and added another with seven seconds to go to ice the win.

• Old Dominion led Delaware 62-59 at the end of regulation but Egerson drained a three-pointer from the left corner with four seconds remaining to force overtime.

• The Monarchs were up 65-62 in the first overtime period, but Courtney hit a three-pointer to tie the game with 1:18 to play.

• After an Old Dominion three-pointer, Courtney nailed another three-pointer with 40 seconds to go to knot the game at 68-68 and force double overtime.

• Delaware trailed James Madison by two points with 1.5 seconds remaining on January 23, but Marc Egerson converted a layup while being fouled and hit the subsequent free throw with five tenths of a second on the clock to give the Blue Hens a 66-65 win.

• UD was down two points to UNC Wilmington on February 6, but Herb Courtney drained a three-pointer with 1.2 seconds to play to give the Blue Hens a 68-67 victory.

• Delaware led Georgia State 47-45 when Herb Courtney hit a baseline jumper with 58 seconds left to put the Blue Hens up by four points.

## Delaware Continues Domination of Tribe

Delaware entered this season just 13-41 all-time in Colonial Athletic Association road games, including 6-30 over the previous four years. However the Blue Hens went 4-5 on the road in the CAA this season after wins at William & Mary, Drexel, James Madison and Georgia State. The Blue Hens have been especially successful in Williamsburg, as Delaware has won five straight at Kaplan Arena since a 59-53 defeat in the 2001-02 season.

With its win at William & Mary on January 2, Delaware snapped a nine-game CAA road losing streak; its last conference road win had been a 57-52 overtime victory at the Tribe on February 15, 2006, the Blue Hens' final CAA road game of that season.

## Sure-Handed Johnson Leads Hens At Drexel

Sophomore point guard Brian Johnson dished out a career-high 11 assists and did not commit a turnover in 39 minutes of action at Drexel. The game marked the second time that Johnson has reached double figures in assists, as he handed out 10 assists against William & Mary on January 13, 2007.

Johnson's 11 assists were the most by a Blue Hen since Mike Slattery dished out 15 assists versus William & Mary on February 1, 2003.

## Terps Dominate Boards vs. Hens

Maryland posted a 57-25 rebounding advantage against Delaware on December 28, as the Terrapins nearly recorded as many offensive rebounds (22) as the Blue Hens had total rebounds.

The 57 rebounds were the most allowed by Delaware since giving up 59 to Virginia Tech on December 21, 1978.

## UD Regaining Home Court Advantage

After opening its home season with a 51-50 loss to Hampton, Delaware reeled off five straight home wins against Towson (70-63), Albany (71-60), Boston University (73-55), George Mason (73-68 in OT) and Old Dominion (81-74 in 2OT). That represented the Blue Hens' first five-game home winning streak in the same season since a seven-game winning streak from January 3 through February 16, 2004.

## Egerson Gives Hens Scoring Punch

Junior Marc Egerson has provided instant offense for the Blue Hens since becoming eligible on December 16 at Central Connecticut. Egerson, who has started all 22 games, leads the team with 6.9 rebounds per game, is tied for the team lead with 13.9 points per game, and has led the team in scoring in 10 of his 22 games.

Egerson led UD with 14 points and also pulled down two rebounds in a team-high 34 minutes of action at CCSU in his Blue Hen debut. He had 14 points and eight rebounds in the victory over Boston University, and led the Blue Hens with 17 points at Maryland. Egerson tied for the team lead with 15 points and led UD with nine rebounds at William & Mary. He set his career-high in rebounds for the second straight game by pulling down a team-high 10 boards at Drexel and narrowly missed a double-double with nine points.

Egerson was the catalyst in Delaware's comeback win over George Mason, as he led the Blue Hens with 23 points and eight rebounds while tying from the team lead with three steals in 44 minutes of action. He scored 11 points in the victory over Old Dominion, and tied the game by hitting a three-pointer with four seconds remaining in regulation.

Egerson scored 15 points at James Madison and converted a game-winning three-point play with five tenths of a second remaining. He led the Blue Hens with 12 points against Georgia State and scored a season-high 26 points at Hofstra.

Egerson continued his strong play against UNC Wilmington when he grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds and added 11 points to record his first career double-double. He led the Blue Hens with 15 points at George Mason, and recorded a double-double with game-highs of 22 points and 12 rebounds at Toledo.

Egerson narrowly missed a triple double with 24 points, 11 rebounds and nine assists in the win over over Hofstra.

## Ledsome Provides Blue Hens Inside Presence

Like Marc Egerson, junior transfer Jim Ledsome has also made an immediate impact for the Blue Hens, starting his first 22 contests. He scored nine points, grabbed three rebounds and dished out a team-high three assists in his debut at Central Connecticut, and contributed four points, two rebounds and a block at Vermont. Ledsome scored a career-high 14 points while adding four rebounds and three blocks against Boston University, and led the team with eight rebounds and blocked seven shots, two shy of the school record, at Maryland. He had six rebounds and four points at William & Mary, and added four points, four boards and two blocks against George Mason.

Ledsome had eight points and seven rebounds in the win over Old Dominion, and punctuated the victory with a free throw and slam dunk with nine seconds remaining in the second overtime period. He scored four points while leading the team with seven rebounds at Northeastern, and again led the team with seven boards while adding six points in the home game against the Huskies.

Ledsome again led the Hens with eight rebounds at Hofstra, and also scored four points against the Pride. He scored 10 points and pulled down a season-high nine rebounds against VCU, and reached double figures for the second time in three games by scoring 12 points against Drexel on February 16.

## Johnson Takes Care of the Rock

Brian Johnson currently leads the CAA and ranks 37th in Division I with a 2.18 assist/turnover ratio. Johnson has handed out 144 assists this season (he is second in the league with 5.14 assists per game), and has committed just 66 turnovers in 37.42 minutes played per game. On January 5 Johnson dished out a career-high 11 assists while not committing a turnover in the victory at Drexel.

Johnson is currently 45th in Division I with 5.2 assists per game.

## A High-Scoring Affair

The 78 points scored by Delaware against Marist tied for the most under head coach Monté Ross, matching a 78-69 win over UNC Wilmington on February 7. Conversely, the Blue Hens' 89 points allowed to the Red Foxes also tied for the most under Ross, matching George Mason's 89 versus UD on January 31.

Delaware scored a season-high 81 points in the double overtime victory over Old Dominion and has reached the 70-point mark in 12 of the 29 games of the year. UD scored over 70 points just four times in 31 games a year ago.

## Young Out For Season After Preseason Surgery

Delaware junior Brian Young is out for the season after undergoing emergency surgery for acute compartment syndrome in his upper left arm during the preseason.

Young, who sat out the 2006-07 season after transferring from Lafayette, had surgery on October 13 after participating in the Blue Hens' practice earlier in the day.

Young enrolled at Lafayette in the fall of 2005 but missed the entire season after undergoing open heart surgery prior to his freshman year. He then transferred to Delaware during the summer of 2006.

Young's injury is the same one suffered by then Blue Hen assistant coach Ryan Iversen, who suffered acute compartment syndrome in his leg during a practice last December. Ironically, Young was the player that bumped into Iversen during that practice.

The Blue Hens have four players on their roster that played high school basketball in the state of Delaware: Marc Egerson (Glasgow), Jawan Carter (Tatnall), D.J. Boney (Tatnall), and Edwin Santiago (Sanford). In fact, Carter is the leading scorer in Delaware history with 2,464 career points.

The last time a UD team featured four players who played high school basketball in Delaware was in 1985-86. Three of those players were Donald Dutton, a junior from Wilmington, DE (Howard Career HS), Steve Jennings, a sophomore from Claymont, DE (Claymont HS), and Oscar Jones, a senior from Wilmington, DE (A.I. duPont HS). The fourth, freshman Stan Waterman from Wilmington, DE (Howard Career HS), is currently the head coach at Sanford School where Edwin Santiago played.

## Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 529 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (638 of 643) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87.

The Blue Hens' streak was in serious jeopardy on January 16 at Virginia Commonwealth, but Marc Egerson banked home a three-pointer in the final seconds to extend the streak.

## St. Joseph's Transfer Jawan Carter Redshirts

Sophomore guard Jawan Carter transferred to UD from Saint Joseph's during the offseason and will sit out this season due to NCAA transfer regulations. Carter will redshirt this season and will have three years of eligibility remaining beginning in the 2008-09 season.

Carter appeared in 32 games while starting 26 for the Hawks last season and was named to Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. He ranked fourth on the team with 7.6 points per game, was second with 74 assists, and ranked third on the team with 38 three-pointers made and a 35.8 three-point field goal percentage. Carter, who averaged 25.7

minutes per game for Saint Joseph's, scored a career-high 20 points in a win over Xavier on January 21 and added 18 in a victory over Lafayette on November 17. He scored in double figures in three consecutive games in late December and hit a career-high five three-pointers against Ohio University.

Carter was named the 2006 Delaware State Player of the Year while playing at the Tatnall School, and is the state's all-time leading scorer with 2,464 career points. An all-state selection in 2005 and 2006, Carter averaged 29.4 points, 5.0 rebounds and 7.0 assists as a senior. Carter, an EA Sports Second Team All-American as a senior, led Tatnall to the 2006 state championship, scoring 31 points in the title game. He was named high honorable mention on Street & Smith's All-America Team four times.

## Blue Hens Sign Adam Pegg

University of Delaware second-year men's basketball head coach Monté Ross has announced the signing of high school standout Adam Pegg, who will enroll at UD in the fall and begin playing for the Blue Hens in the 2008-09 season.

Pegg signed his National Letter of Intent in November, making him UD's first player from the Class of 2008.

Pegg, a 6-9, 235-pound forward, is currently a senior at Clearwater High School in Florida. He averaged 17 points and 12 rebounds per game as a junior at Palm Harbor University High School. Pegg transferred to Clearwater from Palm Harbor University prior to his senior season.
