2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

3 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 96-3 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

3 (The sequel) - The number of times Delaware has lost consecutive home games since the BCC opened in December 1992.

10 - The number of Blue Hens that have had at least one double-figure scoring game this season.

32 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

70 - Delaware has won 47 straight home games when scoring 70 or more points.

110 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons (incl. this year). UD is 110-21 when leading at the half during that span.

113 - The number of games Delaware has won in the 10-plus seasons at the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 113-29 (.796 pct) at "The Bob" since its opening back on Dec. 1, 1992. More recently, UD is 64-12 at "The Bob" over the last five seasons.

367 - UD has made at least one three-pointer in 367 consecutive games. The Blue Hens haven't been shutout from behind the arc since Nov. 28, 1990 at Bucknell.

2000 - Delaware could play its 2000th game this season. UD has to play two games in the CAA Tourn. to get the milestone.

RICHMOND, VA - New conference, but the same impressive results...No. 5 seed Delaware bombed away for 11 three-pointers and committed just five turnovers to down Drexel in the CAA quarterfinals...the win was Delaware's fourth-straight post-season victory over the Dragons...Hens won their season-high fourth straight game and won a league tournament opener for the sixth-straight season...UD placed five scorers in double figures as Mike Ames delivered 15 points on five three-pointers and Ryan Iversen came off the bench to add 14 points, six rebounds and six assists...Mike Slattery chipped in with 11 points and a career-high eight assists...Dave Hindenlang contributed 10 points and five rebounds...Delaware matched a season-high with 24 assists, while committing their lowest turnover total in the last 463 games (five vs. Washington State back on Dec. 6, 1986)...All-CAA center Robert Battle led the way with 16 points and nine rebounds while Eric Schmieder added 13 points...Dragons shot just 36.2 percent from the field (21 of 58) and made just 3 of 13 three-pointers...Delaware used a 11-4 run to end the half and take a 42-33 lead into the lockerroom...the Dragons slowly chipped away at the lead in the second half and pulled to within two at 45-43 early in the second half...UD then sped away, using a 19-2 run over a span of six minutes to put the game away...Drexel missed 11-straight field goal attempts during the run.

As Simple as Making Shots

Delaware's success has really just depended on making baskets lately.

In David Henderson's two-plus seasons, Delaware is 43-32. In that span, **20 of 32 losses have come with UD shooting under 40% from the field (5-20 when shooting less than 40%). In five of Delaware's six losses this season, UD has shot less than 40%.**

At the other end of the spectrum, when UD shoots better than 50%, it is 15-1 under Henderson.

This season, UD has shot 45.2% in its nine wins, but just 36.2% in its six losses.

Delaware's Oldest Rival

Delaware and Drexel meet tonight for the 125th time. The two teams first met on January 13, 1912 at Pearson Hall in Newark. Drexel won that game, 28-24.

The two teams are meeting for the 43rd consecutive season dating back to the 1960-61 campaign.

The rivalry spans three conferences - the East Coast Conference, America East (also known as the North Atlantic Conference) and, currently, the CAA. Three times during the America East/NAC stint, the two teams met in the conference title game.

Delaware has won the last six meetings at the BCC. Drexel hasn't won here since January 21, 1997 when a Bill Herrion coached team held on for a 77-73 win behind Chuck Guittar's 22 points.

No matter the records, no matter what is on the line, the series has always been close, however. **Of the 124 meetings, 71 have been decided by single-digit margins, including 15 of the last 21 and 25 of the last 34.**

Seven of the 124 meetings have been decided in overtime, the most overtime games of any Delaware opponent.

It Starts with Slattery

Mike Slattery took over the starting point guard slot the second half of last season. The move started paying dividends almost immediately.

Slattery, a native of Philadelphia and product of Germantown Academy, had 94 assists as a freshman, while playing just 19.7 minutes per game. **In the final 12 games last season, Slattery had 58 assists and just 22 turnovers as the starting point guard.**

Slattery has continued that play this season, while his minutes have nearly doubled (from 19.7 to 34.7). He leads the CAA in assists per game at 5.9, and also ranks third in steals (1.9), third in assist/TO ratio (2.15) and fifth in three-point field goal percentage (38.8%).

Since taking over the starting slot last season, in 27 starts Slattery has 140 assists and just 63 turnovers... a 2.22 ast./TO ratio.

Slattery has five or more assists in 15 of his last 21 games, including 10 times this season.

Against UNC Greensboro, Slattery had a career-high 15 assists. It was the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years and tied for the second-highest single-game total in school history. It was also a Bob Carpenter Center record.

In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of a CAA record.

Slattery, however, did not stop there. He had 17 points and 10 assists at Siena. In his 38 minutes, he had just three turnovers.

In UD's nine wins, he has 61 assists (6.8 apg).

Slattery can score, too. He has scored in double-figures in 10 of the last 12 games. He had a career-high 18 points against Saint Joseph's, and later topped that mark with 22 points against UW-Green Bay.

Of course, distributing the ball is nothing new to Slattery. When he was at Germantown Academy, a big part of his role was getting the ball to a couple of guys by the names of **Matt Walsh**, who is already making a name for himself as a freshman at University of Florida, **Ted Skuchas**, a freshman who is redshirting at Vanderbilt, and **Lee Melchioni**, who is in his freshman season at Duke.

Three-point Facts

As mentioned previously, Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 367 games dating back to Nov. 28, 1990. Bucknell was the last team to hold Delaware without a three-pointer. The Bison held Delaware to 0-for-2 in a 71-62 Bucknell win in East Coast Conference play.

Putting that into proper perspective, sophomore Mike Slattery was age 7 when UD last had a game without a three-point field goal.

In all, Delaware has made at least one three-pointer in all but five games (477 out of 482 games) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. (Some conferences had an experimental line before that.)

One of the five games that UD failed to make a three-point field goal was the very first game the rule was in effect. It wasn't until Delaware's second game against Washington College (MD) that Brad Heckert made the first-ever 3-pt. field goal by a Blue Hen. (It came on Dec. 3, 1986 with 13:43 left in the first half.)

The current streak of 367 games was started by Mark Houghton on Dec. 5, 1990 against St. Francis (PA). He hit a three-pointer from the left wing with 4:22 remaining in the first half. UD lost the game, 72-70. That shot, however, began UD's current string.

Furthermore, UD has connected on 200 or more three-pointers in each of the last four seasons. The Blue Hens hit for 251 in 2000-01, breaking the record of 243 from the season before. When they hit 243 trifectas in 1999-2000, that broke the team record of 207 set in 1998-99. Last year, UD connected from behind the arc 214 times.

UD has made 10 or more 35 times since the rule was implemented, including four times last year and once this year.

In fact, UD has made five or more three-pointers in 93 of its last 106 games, including 19 of the last 21. (UD had its streak of 13 straight games with five or more three-pointers snapped in the win over E. Washington.)

Second Half "D"

In UD's wins this season, it allowed 30.7 ppg in the second half. In the losses, the number jumped to 42.8 ppg.

No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens certainly love to play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nicknamed "The Bob" by the UD student body, Delaware has won 61 of its last 71 games on its home floor and is 113-29 at home in "The Bob's" 10-plus seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson. Delaware is 24-8 at home during Henderson's tenure.

For the first time in four years, Delaware lost consecutive home games last season.

UD hadn't lost consecutive home games since the last home game of the 1996-97 season and the 1997-98 home opener (a loss to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997). UD has lost consecutive home games just three times since the BCC opened in December 1992 - a string that is on the line tonight.

While a member of America East, UD was 72-18 against America East members at home. In its first CAA season, UD was 6-3 against conference foes.

However, The Fightin' Blue Hens are successful out of the league, too. UD is 34-7 against non-conference foes at "The Bob", including 20 of the last 23 going back to December 1995 (the losses coming in the aforementioned game with Virginia, nationally-ranked Saint Joseph's last year and Rider this season).

UD has won 47 straight home games when it scores 70 points or more dating back to Jan. 16, 1998.

Not Just Any 6th Man

Tonight's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. However, that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen had appeared in all 65 games of his UD career before missing the UNC Greensboro game with back spasms. In his career, Iversen has only started seven games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in 67 career games off of the bench and has played 20 or more minutes in 53 of those 67 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made his performance against LIU this season that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker (at U. of Minnesota) recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

Iversen ranks eighth in steals (1.8) in the CAA and is also sixth in rebounding and free throw shooting.

Ready, Ames... Fire!

Mike Ames led the CAA in three-point field goal shooting last season. Ames hit 73 of 160 from behind the arc (45.6%).

Although he missed several weeks during the pre-season due to a torn meniscus, which contributed to his slow start this season (9-35 from three-point range in the first five games), Ames had a streak of 18 straight games with at least one three-point field goal before being shutout by Rider on Dec. 14. The 18-game string tied for the third-longest in UD history.

He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games.

Ames looks like he has started to find his stroke again. In the last 10 games, he has averaged 16.9 ppg, shooting 37.9% from three-point range and hitting at least one three-pointer in 10 straight games.

Ames had started to get to the foul line more often, although that has started to drop again. After going eight straight games without an attempt, Ames got there 39 times in the next seven. However, he hasn't gotten to the line just once in the last four games. He has made 31 straight attempts and leads the CAA in free throw percentage and is No. 2 in the nation (95.0%).

Ames is 126-305 from 3-pt. range in 70 career games at Delaware (41.3%), which would rank No. 2 in 3-pt. field goal pct. in school history. His 126 career three-pointers rank him No. 7 in UD history.

Kanga-ROO

No wonder Rulon Washington's nickname is "Roo". It might be short for Kanga-ROO.

Washington, a native of Jacksonville, FL, comes to Delaware with a 40-inch vertical leap. He proved that with an ally-oop dunk in UD's exhibition win over a team from Ukraine.

Washington graduated from Edward White HS in the spring of 2001. However, he wasn't recruited by Division I schools (partially because he had four HS coaches in four years), so he chose to stay in Jacksonville and play in Grayson Marshall's midnight league. Marshall, a former Clemson player (1985-88), called Henderson and put him onto "Roo."

Washington began to find his rhythm at Siena. He had a season-high 10 points, snapping out of a shooting slump. Washington went 3-of-6 from the field in 15 second-half minutes, including 2-for-3 from three-point range, to help UD rally for the win.

Not the First from the Island

Anwar Rohan earned a walk-on spot with the squad in pre-season practice.

Rohan, a 6-2 freshman guard, is from St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. However, he is NOT the first UD basketball player from the American Territory. Elsworth Bowers, who lettered three seasons at UD (1986-89), hailed from St. Croix, VI.

Dragon Slayers

Last year against Drexel, Delaware made 30 three-pointers in three games (30-77, 39.0%).

Mike Ames was 12-for-28 from three-point range in those three meetings, including a 33-point performance in the loss at Drexel (21 pts. in the first half on a UD record six first-half 3-pt. FGs).

Daddy's Little Girl

UD assistant coach Billy Martin's daughter, Chantel, is a key member of the Campbell University women's basketball team this season.

Chantel, a sophomore guard, is the Camels' first player off the bench, averaging 6.1 ppg (fourth on the team) and 2.5 rpg through the first 14 games of the season. She had a season-high 10 points in 19 minutes in Campbell's loss at Jacksonville State on Saturday, and followed that up with eight points in a loss at Georgia State on Monday.

CU (5-9) hosts Samford tonight.

40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 99-14 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 30-6 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. **At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 70-7 when leading at the half since the arena opened.** Delaware has won **59 of the last 63 at home** when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 18-2 when leading at the half at home.

No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, **the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 70 of 75 games. Currently, Delaware's bench has scored in double-figures in 45 consecutive games.** Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

In six of UD's wins, the Blue Hens scored 32 or more bench points (32, 35, 39, 39, 40, 42).

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

This season, 10 players have scored in double-figures for Delaware at least once. The only player that has seen action and not scored in double-figures this year is Robin Wentt, who played in just one game before undergoing season-ending shoulder surgery.

Houdini-like Hens

As of late, the Blue Hens have made some great escapes.

In five of Delaware's wins this season, including each of the last three, the Blue Hens have trailed by five points or more in the second half, only to come from behind for the win.

This season, Delaware is 5-0 in games decided by four points or less. Last year, UD was just 2-4 in those games, including three losses in conference play.

Earlier this season, Delaware won three consecutive games by two points or less (at William & Mary, home vs. VCU, and at Old Dominion) - a first in UD's 98 seasons of basketball.

Delaware almost got another one in the loss to UNC Wilmington on Saturday. Delaware rallied from an 11-point deficit to within 50-49, before the Seahawks pulled away.

UD Inks Four to NLIs Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-8 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, will enroll at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference honors and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

Gotta' Score 60

With the CAA known as one of the top defensive leagues around, points are at a premium.

With that said, Delaware is 3-18 over the last four seasons (including 1-2 this season) when held to less than 60 points.

Good Start in the League

Delaware is off to a 4-2 in conference play. That is Delaware's best start since starting 5-1 in America East in 1998-99. That team finished 15-3 in conference play under Mike Brey, winning the league title.

Feelin' Like Old Times

Before Saturday's loss to UNC Wilmington, Delaware held sole possession of first place in the CAA.

It was the first time since January 25, 2001 that Delaware has sole possession of first place. On that date, Delaware beat New Hampshire, 88-74, and held the top spot by itself for one day, before Drexel and Hofstra won to forge a three-way tie atop America East.

Charitable Turnaround

After the UNC Greensboro game, Delaware coach David Henderson was furious with his squad for their horrific foul shooting. That has since changed, however.

Following the UNCG game, in which Delaware shot just 13-26 from the line, UD was shooting just 59.6% from the foul line (62-104).

Since then, over the last eight games, UD is shooting 77.8% from the line (140-180) to raise the season mark up to 71.1%.

Working Overtime

All-time, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 38-30 in overtime games, 23-9 in Newark. (A complete list can be found in the UD media guide.)

Delaware is 6-1 in overtime games all-time at the BCC.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 3-1 in overtime games.

The Blue Hens have not had consecutive overtime games since Feb. 3 & 7, 1973.

Telling Stats

So much of last season's 14-16 mark came down to just making baskets, which hurts when you consider seven losses last year were by six points or less.

In Delaware's 14 wins last season, UD held the opponent to 39.8% from the field, including 32.2% from three-point range. Meanwhile, Delaware shot 44.1% from the field, including 37.8% from three-point range.

On the other side of the ledger, in UD's 16 losses, the opposition shot 45.2% from the field, including 38.2% from behind the three-point line. Meanwhile, UD shot just 38.4% from the field and just 30% from three-point range in losses.

UD was 3-11 last season when it shot under 40% from the field. Under Henderson, UD is 5-20 when shooting 40% or less from the field (incl. 1-5 this season).

Last season, Delaware averaged 73.8 ppg in its 14 wins, but just 60.6 ppg in its 16 losses.

UD was 10-3 when it scored 70 or more points last season.

UD averaged just 11.9 turnovers in its 14 wins. That number, however, jumped to 14.6 per game in its 16 losses.
