So you say you're a numbers freak? Try these numbers on for size.

2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

3 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 94-3 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

3 (The sequel) - The number of times Delaware has lost consecutive home games since the BCC opened in December 1992. UD lost the last game in 1996-97 and the home opener in 1997-98, along with consec. home games in 1994-95 and last season.

32 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

70 - Delaware has won 47 straight home games when scoring 70 or more points.

108 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons (incl. this year). UD is 108-20 when leading at the half during that span.

112 - The number of games Delaware has won in the 10 seasons of the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 112-28 (.800 pct) at "The Bob" since its opening back on Dec. 1, 1992. More recently, UD is 63-11 at "The Bob" over the last five seasons.

359 - UD has made at least one three-pointer in 359 consecutive games. The Blue Hens haven't been shutout from behind the arc since Nov. 28, 1990 at Bucknell.

2000 - Delaware could play its 2000th game this season. UD has to play two games in the CAA Tourn. to get the milestone.

Each Monday, the David Henderson Show will come from the legendary Deer Park Tavern on Main Street in downtown Newark.

Coach Henderson is joined by the voice of the Blue Hens Mike Corey for a review of the past week's games, a preview of upcoming action, and a series of questions both from the restaurant audience and listeners via call-in.

During the 2002-03 season, live shows are scheduled for Nov. 18, Nov. 25, Dec. 2., Dec. 16, Dec. 30, Jan. 6, Jan. 13, Jan. 20, Jan. 27, Feb. 3, Feb. 10, Feb. 17, Feb. 24 and Mar. 3.

There will be no show on Dec. 9 because UD plays at Saint Joseph's that evening. The show will also break for the holidays on Dec. 23.

Who Packed the Road Map?

Delaware is on the road for one of its longest road trips.

The Fightin' Blue Hens leave the friendly confines of the Carpenter Center for nearly a month and play six consecutive games away from home.

Delaware flew back home from Albany immediately after the Siena game for the Christmas break. However, the team flies to Green Bay for the Oneida Bingo and Casino Classic on December 26. Following that trip, Delaware begins the New Year and the CAA portion of the schedule with three straight road games.

The six-game road trip is Delaware's longest since 1998-99 when it played seven straight away from home.

It Starts with Slattery

Mike Slattery took over the starting point guard slot the second half of last season. The move started paying dividends almost immediately.

Slattery, a native of Philadelphia and product of Germantown Academy, had 94 assists as a freshman, while playing just 19.7 minutes per game. **In the final 12 games last season, Slattery had 58 assists and just 22 turnovers as the starting point guard.**

Slattery has continued that play this season. **He leads the CAA in assists per game at 7.7, and also ranks No. 9 in the CAA in steals (1.8). He is also the league leader in the CAA in assist/turnover ratio (54 vs. 21 = 2.47).**

If you add last year's numbers to this year's start, in his last 19 games, Slattery has 112 assists and just 43 turnovers... a 2.60 ast./TO ratio.

Slattery has five or more assists in 12 of his last 13 games, including all seven this season. (The exception in the string is UD's CAA semifinal loss to UNC Wilmington last March.) The last Blue Hen to put together a comparatively consistent string of assist numbers was Rob Garner (1995-96), who had five or more assists in 13 of his last 16 games (incl. 10 of his last 12) as a senior.

Against UNC Greensboro, Slattery had a career-high 15 assists. It was the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years and tied for the second-highest single-game total in school history. It was also a Bob Carpenter Center record.

In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. That boosted him to first in the CAA in ast./TO ratio (+ 2.44).

Slattery, however, did not stop there. **He had 17 points and 10 assists at Siena. In his 38 minutes, he had just three turnovers.**

In UD's four wins, Slattery has 39 assists (9.8 apg).

Slattery can score, too. **He has scored in double-figures in each of the last four games.** In that span, Slattery is averaging a team-best 14.8 ppg and has an assist/TO ratio of 4.38. He had a career-high 18 points against Saint Joseph's earlier this month.

Of course, distributing the ball is nothing new to Slattery. When he was at Germantown Academy, a big part of his role was getting the ball to a couple of guys by the names of **Matt Walsh**, who is already making a name for himself as a freshman at University of Florida, **Ted Skuchas**, a freshman at Vanderbilt, and **Lee Melchioni**, who is in his freshman season at Duke.

As Simple as Making Shots

Delaware's success has really just depended on making baskets lately.

In David Henderson's three-plus seasons, Delaware is 37-29. In that span, **18 of 29 losses have come with Delaware shooting under 40% from the field (4-18). In all three of Delaware's losses this season, Delaware has shot less than 40%.**

At the other end of the spectrum, when **UD shoots better than 50%, it is 14-1 under Henderson.**

This season, UD has shot 45.5% in its four wins, but just 33.2% in its three losses.

Shoulder Sidelines Wentt

Robin Wentt is likely lost for the remainder of the season due to a left shoulder injury.

Wentt, a 6-7 junior from Silver Spring, MD, will undergo the identical surgery that he had on his right shoulder this past summer. Wentt suffered from multiple subluxations (partial dislocations) of his left shoulder over a period of several weeks, the same condition Wentt battled last season in his right shoulder.

Wentt had his surgery on December 19. The 90-minute procedure went without complication.

Taking Care of the Rock

Delaware's 26 turnovers in the season-opener against La Salle were uncharacteristic of the Blue Hens.

The Blue Hens bounced back against Long Island University, however. The Blue Hens had just eight turnovers in the win over LIU.

Turnovers keyed the win over Penn, as well. **UD had 12 turnovers in the first 23 minutes and found itself trailing by eight. Over the next 16 minutes, Delaware turned the ball over just five times and rallied to take the lead,** eventually holding the Quakers off in the final seconds.

Against UNC Greensboro, turnovers helped Delaware tremendously, as well. **Delaware committed just seven turnovers for the game, and did not have a turnover in the first 11 minutes of the second half,** which helped Delaware build a 10-point lead at that point.

The 26 turnovers versus La Salle were the most by Delaware during David Henderson's tenure. It was also the most since November 14, 1997 -- a 77-73 season-opening win over Siena.

In Delaware's four wins, it averaged 12.3 turnovers. In the three losses, UD averaged 18.3 turnovers.

Kanga-ROO

No wonder **Rulon Washington's** nickname is "Roo". It might be short for Kanga-ROO.

Washington, a native of Jacksonville, FL, comes to Delaware with a 40-inch vertical leap. He proved that with an ally-oop dunk in UD's exhibition win over a team from Ukraine.

Washington graduated from Edward White HS in the spring of 2001. However, he wasn't recruited by Division I schools (partially because he had four HS coaches in four years), so he chose to stay in Jacksonville and play in Grayson Marshall's midnight league. Marshall, a former Clemson player (1985-88), called Henderson and put him onto "Roo."

Washington began to find his rhythm at Siena. He had a season-high 10 points, snapping out of a shooting slump. Washington had made his first collegiate three-point attempt in the opener at La Salle, and missed 19 straight after that.

However, against Siena, Washington 3-of-6 from the field in 15 second-half minutes, including 2-for-3 from three-point range, to help the Blue Hens rally for the win.

de Man Returns Home

Freshman forward **Machiel de Man** has been granted a leave of absence by head coach David Henderson.

"Machiel felt he needed to step away to take care of some personal business and we will respect his wishes," said Henderson.

de Man had not appeared in UD's first seven games.

Gotta' Score 60

With the CAA known as one of the top defensive leagues around, points are at a premium.

With that said, Delaware is 2-18 over the last four seasons (including 0-2 this season) when held to less than 60 points.

Three-point Facts

As mentioned previously, Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 359 games dating back to Nov. 28, 1990. Bucknell was the last team to hold Delaware without a three-pointer. The Bison held Delaware to 0-for-2 in a 71-62 Bucknell win in East Coast Conference play.

Putting that into proper perspective, sophomore Mike Slattery was age 7 when UD last had a game without a three-point field goal.

In all, Delaware has made at least one three-pointer in all but five games (469 out of 474 games) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. (Some conferences had an experimental line before that.)

One of the five games that Delaware failed to make a three-point field goal was the very first game the rule was in effect. It wasn't until Delaware's second game against Washington College (MD) that Brad Heckert made the first-ever 3-pt. field goal by a Blue Hen. (It came on Dec. 3, 1986 with 13:43 left in the first half).

The current streak of 359 games was started by Mark Haughton on Dec. 5, 1990 against St. Francis (PA). He hit a three-pointer from the left wing with 4:22 remaining in the first half. UD lost the game, 72-70. That shot, however, began UD's current string.

Furthermore, Delaware has connected on 200 or more three-pointers in each of the last four seasons. The Blue Hens hit for 251 in 2000-01, breaking the record of 243 from the season before. When they hit 243 trifectas in 1999-2000, that broke the team record of 207 set in 1998-99. Last year, UD connected from behind the arc 214 times.

UD has made 10 or more 35 times since the rule was implemented, including four times last year and once this year.

In fact, UD has made five or more three-pointers in 87 of its last 98 games, including 13 straight dating back to last season.

Second Half "D"

In Delaware's four wins, it allowed an average of 33.5 points in the second half. In the three losses, the number jumps to 43.3 points.

No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens certainly love to play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nicknamed "The Bob" by the UD student body, Delaware has won 60 of its last 69 games on its home floor and is 112-28 at home in "The Bob's" 10-plus seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson. Delaware is 23-7 at home during Henderson's tenure.

For the first time in four years, Delaware lost consecutive home games last season.

UD hadn't lost consecutive home games since the last home game of the 1996-97 season and the 1997-98 home opener (a loss to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997). UD has lost consecutive home games just three times since the BCC opened in December 1992.

While a member of America East, UD was 72-18 against America East members at home. In its first CAA season, UD was 6-3 against conference foes.

However, The Fightin' Blue Hens are successful out of the league, too. UD is 34-7 against non-conference foes at "The Bob", including 20 of the last 23 going back to December 1995 (the losses coming

in the aforementioned game with Virginia, nationally-ranked Saint Joseph's last year and Rider this season).

UD has won 47 straight home games when it scores 70 points or more dating back to Jan. 16, 1998.

Not Just Any 6th Man

Today's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. If he's healthy today, though, that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen had appeared in all 65 games of his UD career before missing the UNC Greensboro game with back spasms. In his career, Iversen has only started seven games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in 59 career games off of the bench and has played 20 or more minutes in 45 of those 59 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made his performance against LIU this season that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he actually got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

Iversen is fourth in the CAA in assist/TO ratio, tied for fifth in rebounding, fifth in assists, and second in three-point FG percentage.

Although he missed several weeks during the pre-season due to a torn meniscus, which has contributed to his slow start this season (9-35 from three-point range in the first five games), Ames had a streak of 18 straight games with at least one three-point field goal before being shutout by Rider on Dec. 14. The 18-game string tied for the third-longest in UD history.

He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games.

Ames looks like he has started to find his stroke again. In the last two games, he averaged 21.0 ppg, hitting 8-14 from three-point range (57.1%).

Ames has gone through a shooting slump before. Last year, during a six-game span that included the end of his 14-game three-pointer streak, he shot 11-50 from the field, including 6-28 from three-point range (Jan. 12-26).

Ames shot 7-for-11 from three-point range in two CAA Tournament games last March. Over the final 10 games last season, Ames was 36-for-66 (54.5%) from beyond the three-point line.

He is now 109-256 from 3-pt. range in 64 career games at Delaware (42.6%), which would rank No. 2 in three-point field goal percentage in school history. His 109 career three-pointers already rank him No. 11 in UD history. (Mark Houghton is tenth with 110.)

Milestones & Streaks

Mike Ames...

- Had a streak of 18 consecutive games with at least one three-point FG snapped against Rider. He tied with Robbie Johnson for the third longest streak in UD history. Peca Arsic (1994-96) holds the UD record with 36 straight games.

- Has started 32 consecutive games... the longest among active UD players.

- At Saint Joseph's, became the 12th Blue Hen to record 100 career three-pointers (61st career game). He needs one three-pointer to move into a tie for tenth on the all-time three-point field goal list at UD.

Ryan Iversen...

- Had appeared in all 65 games since becoming a Blue Hen before missing the UNC Greensboro game due to back spasms.

- Ranks 14th at UD in career steals with 111.

- Has led UD in rebounding in 12 of his last 17 games and 19 of his last 26.

Maurice Sessoms...

- Has appeared in all 67 games since becoming a Blue Hen. (He has started 60 of those.)

Mike Slattery...

- Has recorded five or more assists in all seven games this season and 12 of the last 13. He has 35 assists and eight turnovers in the last four games (148 minutes).

- Recorded his 100th career assist in just his 32nd career game (vs. LIU this season).

UD Team...

- Has won 47 straight home games when scoring 70 or more points (dating back to Jan. 16, 1998).

- Has made at least one 3-pt. FG in 359 consecutive games. UD has at least five 3-pt. FGs in 13 straight games.

Rohan, a 6-2 freshman guard, is from St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. However, he is NOT the first UD basketball player from the American Territory. **Elsworth Bowers**, who lettered three seasons at UD (1986-89), hailed from St. Croix, VI.

UD Inks Four to NLI's Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-9 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, will enroll at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference honors and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his first two seasons at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, **the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 62 of 67 games. Currently, Delaware's bench has scored in double-figures in 37 consecutive games.** Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

In three of Delaware's four wins, the Blue Hens have scored 40, 39 and 42 points.

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

Daddy's Little Girl

UD assistant coach Billy Martin's daughter, Chantel, is a key member of the Campbell University women's basketball team this season.

Chantel, a sophomore guard, is the Camels' first player off the bench, averaging 5.4 ppg and 3.0 rpg through the first five games of the season. She did not play in Campbell's last game, a 67-55 loss at Western Carolina, due to a sprained ankle.

40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 97-13 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 28-5 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. **At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 70-7 when leading at the half since the arena opened.** Delaware has won **59 of the last 63 at home** when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 18-2 when leading at the half at home.

Another road opener

Delaware opened its 98th season of men's basketball... and once again it was on the road.

The Blue Hens have not played a season opener at home since the 1996-97 season (a 91-63 win over Delaware St. on Nov. 22, 1996).

All-time, the Blue Hens are 48-50 in season openers. The Blue Hens defeated Wichita State, 66-49, last year in Fairbanks, AK at the BP Top of the World Classic to open the regular season.

In the last 10 season openers, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 7-3.

It was the second time in three seasons that a David Henderson team has opened in Philadelphia. The Blue Hens lost to Temple in Henderson's first game as Delaware's coach, 56-49.

In fact, the Blue Hens have opened the season in Philadelphia seven times, but the City of Brotherly Love hasn't been so friendly. **UD is now 0-7 in season-openers in Philadelphia.**

With the win over Wichita State, UD avoided losing consecutive season openers. Delaware last lost consecutive season openers in 1992-93 and 1993-94 (a loss at Seton Hall in the Pre-season NIT in Nov. 1992 and a loss at Monmouth in Nov. 1993).

Historical Plus

History is on Delaware's side when it comes to success in regular season tournaments.

The Fightin' Blue Hens have now picked up at least one win in 21 straight regular season tournaments (not including Pre-season NITs). Delaware last went winless in a regular season tournament back in December 1984, when Ron Rainey's club was held winless in two tournaments.

Last year, Delaware won its opening round game against Wichita State at the season-opening BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, AK.
