## You want numbers?

So you say you're a numbers freak? Try these numbers on for size.

2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Freshman Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

3 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 92-3 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

6 - Players that return from UD's regular playing rotation last season (averaging 15 min. per game).

32 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

70 - Delaware has won 46 straight home games when scoring 70 or more points.

107 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons (incl. this year). UD is 107-20 when leading at the half during that span.

110 - The number of games Delaware has won in the 10 seasons of the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 110-27 (.803 pct) at "The Bob" since its opening back on Dec. 1, 1992. More recently, UD is 61-10 at "The Bob" over the last five seasons.

354 - UD has made at least one three-pointer in 354 consecutive games. The Blue Hens haven't been shutout from behind the arc since Nov. 28, 1990 at Bucknell.

2000 - Delaware could play its 2000th game this season. UD would have to advance to the CAA semifinals to get to the milestone.

**PHILADELPHIA** - A cold-shooting night and a flurry that came too late doomed the Hens at the fabled Palestra...UD made just four of its first 31 shots from the field and the 44 points was UD's lowest output since being held to 41 points in a loss at Princeton on Jan. 3, 1990...Sean Knitter came off the bench to lead UD in scoring for the second-straight game with 11 points while Penn's Ugonna Onyekwe had 15 points, six rebounds, and four blocks to pace the Quakers...both teams struggled early but Penn used a 7-0 run to go up 21-13 at intermission as UD shot just 4-24 from the field in the half...the Blue Hens, who lost for the 23rd time in 24 visits to The Palestra (0-8 against Penn), missed their first seven shots of the second half and Penn took advantage...Penn stretched its lead to 14 points, 27-13, and it wasn't until the 13:52 mark that UD ended its drought...the Hens made things interesting with a late flurry...Robin Wentt hit three-straight jumpers to pull UD to within 42-34 with 3:09 left and Ryan Iversen hit a layup with 31 seconds left to cut the lead to 47-43...Iversen hit a free throw at :21 to cut the lead to 48-44, but missed his second attempt and Penn rebounded to end the threat...Penn helped UD by hitting just 11 of 20 free throws in the second half, but Andrew Toole iced the game with two free throws with nine seconds left...UD's leading scorer, Mike Ames, was held without a field goal for the second straight game.

## Shoulder Sidelines Wentt

**Robin Wentt** is likely lost for the remainder of the season due to a left shoulder injury.

On Wednesday, it was announced that Wentt, a 6-7 junior from Silver Spring, MD, would undergo the identical surgery that he had on his right shoulder this past summer. Wentt has suffered from multiple subluxations (partial dislocations) of his left shoulder over the past several weeks, the same condition Wentt battled last season in his right shoulder.

The surgery date had not been set as of Wednesday.

## That's more like it...

Delaware's 26 turnovers in the opener were uncharacteristic of the Blue Hens.

The Blue Hens bounced back on Sunday, however. The Blue Hens had just eight turnovers in the win over LIU.

**The 26 turnovers versus La Salle were the most by Delaware during David Henderson's tenure. It was also the most since November 14, 1997 -- a 77-73 season-opening win over Siena.**

## Happy Birthday BCC...

Sunday was the 10th birthday of basketball at "The Bob".

On December 1, 1992, Rutgers' Chuck Weiler won the opening tap and basketball at "The Bob" was born. Weiler scored on a put back for the arena's first bucket at 19:50, but Delaware went on to win, 77-69, in the first basketball game at the Bob Carpenter Center 10 years ago today.

The Blue Hens are 110-27 in the Carpenter Center and have had 586,951 fans in the 137 games..

## Kanga-ROO

No wonder **Rulon Washington's** nickname is "Roo". It might be short for Kanga-ROO.

Washington, a native of Jacksonville, FL, comes to Delaware with a 40-inch vertical leap. He proved that with an ally-ooop dunk in UD's exhibition win over a team from Ukraine.

Washington graduated from Edward White HS in the spring of 2001. However, he wasn't recruited by Division Schools (partially because he had four HS coaches in four years), so he chose to stay in Jacksonville and play in Grayson Marshall's midnight league. Marshall, a former Clemson player (1985-88), called Henderson and put him onto "Roo."

## Home Openers

On Sunday, Delaware opened its 11th home season since the opening of the BobCarpenter Center.

Delaware is now 10-1 in home openers at the BCC. The lone smudge on the record came in November 1997 when the Blue Hens lost to Virginia in the home opener. Since then, Delaware has won five straight home openers.

Under David Henderson, UD is 3-0 in home openers, defeating Delaware State in November 2000, La Salle in November 2001 and LIU this season.

Since 1970, Delaware is 24-9 in home openers, including wins in 17 of the last 19.

## Not the First from the Island

**Anwar Rohan** earned a walk-on spot with the squad in pre-season practice.

Rohan, a 6-2 freshman guard, is from St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. However, he is NOT the first UD basketball player from the American Territory. **Elsworth Bowers**, who lettered three seasons at UD (1986-89), hailed from St. Croix, VI.

## Three-point Facts

As mentioned previously, Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 354 games dating back to Nov. 28, 1990. Bucknell was the last team to hold Delaware without a three-pointer. The Bison held Delaware to 0-for-2 in a 71-62 Bucknell win in East Coast Conference play.

Putting that into proper perspective, sophomore Mike Slattery was age 7 when UD last had a game without a three-point field goal.

In all, Delaware has made at least one three-pointer in all but five games (464 out of 469 games) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. (Some conferences had an experimental line before that.)

One of the five games that Delaware failed to make a three-point field goal was the very first game the rule was in effect. It wasn't until Delaware's second game against Washington College (MD) that Brad Heckert made the first-ever 3-pt. field goal by a Blue Hen. (It came on Dec. 3 with 13:43 left in the first half).

The current streak of 354 games was started by Mark Haughton on Dec. 5, 1990 against St. Francis (PA). He hit a three-pointer from the left wing with 4:22 remaining in the first half. UD lost the game, 72-70. That shot, however, began UD's current string.

Furthermore, Delaware has connected on 200 or more three-pointers in each of the last four seasons. The Blue Hens hit for 251 in 2000-01, breaking the record of 243 from the season before. When they hit 243 trifectas in 1999-2000, that broke the team record of 207 set in 1998-99. Last year, UD connected from behind the arc 214 times.

UD has made 10 or more 34 times since the rule was implemented, including four times last year.

In fact, UD has made five or more three-pointers in 82 of its last 93 games.

## No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens certainly love to play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nicknamed "The Bob" by the UD student body, Delaware has won 58 of its last 66 games on its home floor and is 110-27 at home in "The Bob's" 10-plus seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson. Delaware is 21-6 at home during Henderson's tenure.

For the first time in four years, Delaware lost consecutive home games last season. Delaware hadn't lost consecutive home games since the last home game of the 1996-97 season and the 1997-98 home opener (a loss to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997).

While a member of America East, UD was 72-18 against America East members at home. In its first CAA season, UD was 6-3 against conference foes.

However, The Fightin' Blue Hens are successful out of the league, too. Delaware is 32-6 against non-conference foes at "The Bob", including 18 of the last 20 going back to December 1995 (the losses coming in the

aforementioned game with Virginia and to nationally-ranked Saint Joseph's last year). UD had won 11 straight home non-conference games before last year's loss to Saint Joseph's.

UD has won 46 straight home games when it scores 70 points or more dating back to Jan. 16, 1998.

## Not Just Any 6th Man

Tonight's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. But that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen has appeared in all 62 games of his Delaware career. In that span, Iversen has only started seven games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in those 55 games off of the bench and has played 20 or more minutes in 41 of those 55 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made Sunday's performance against LIU that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he actually got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

## 40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 96-13 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 27-5 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 69-7 when leading at the half since the arena opened. Delaware has won 58 of the last 62 at home when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 17-2 when leading at the half at home.

## Ready, Ames... Fire!

Mike Ames led the CAA in three-point field goal shooting last season. Ames hit 73 of 160 from behind the arc (45.6%).

Ames, who missed several weeks during the preseason due to a torn meniscus, has a streak of 16 straight games with at least one three-point field goal. He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games.

That string was broken with consecutive games in which he was shutout, but has since started anew.

Ames shot 7-for-11 from three-point range in two CAA Tournament games last March. Over the final 10 games last season, Ames was 36-for-66 (54.5%) from beyond the three-point line.

He is now 95-220 from 3-pt. range in 55 career games at Delaware (43.2%), which would rank as the top three-point field goal percentage in school history. His 95 career three-pointers already rank him No. 12 in UD history.

## No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his first two seasons at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 57 of 62 games. Currently, Delaware has scored in double-figures in 32 consecutive games (all of last season). Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

Sunday against LIU, Delaware's bench outscored LIU's bench, 40-20.

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

## No Slow Starts

Sunday's win over LIU averted a rare 0-2 start for the Blue Hens.

Delaware has not started a season with back-to-back losses since 1990-91. Delaware began that season 0-6 under then-coach Steve Steinwedel, but rebounded to finish 16-13.

## Gotta' Score 60

With the CAA known as one of the top defensive leagues around, points are at a premium.

With that said, Delaware is 2-17 over the last three seasons when held to less than 60 points. UD scored just 56 points in the season-opening loss at La Salle.

## UD Inks Four to NLI's Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-9 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, will enroll at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference honors and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

## Telling Stats

- So much of last season's 14-16 mark came down to just making baskets, which hurts when you consider seven losses last year were by six points or less.

In Delaware's 14 wins last season, UD held the opponent to 39.8% from the field, including 32.2% from three-point range. Meanwhile, Delaware shot 44.1% from the field, including 37.8% from three-point range.

On the other side of the ledger, in UD's 16 losses, the opposition shot 45.2% from the field, including 38.2% from behind the three-point line. Meanwhile, UD shot just 38.4% from the field and just 30% from three-point range in losses.

- UD was 3-11 last season when it shot under 40% from the field. Under Henderson, UD is 4-15 when shooting 40% or less from the field.

- Last season, Delaware averaged 73.8 ppg in its 14 wins, but just 60.6 ppg in its 16 losses.

- UD was 10-3 when it scored 70 or more points last season.

- UD averaged just 11.9 turnovers in its 14 wins. That number, however, jumped to 14.6 per game in its 16 losses.

## Another road opener

Delaware opened its 98th season of men's basketball... and once again it was on the road.

**The Blue Hens have not played a season opener at home since the 1996-97 season** (a 91-63 win over Delaware St. on Nov. 22, 1996).

**All-time, the Blue Hens are 48-50 in season openers.** The Blue Hens defeated Wichita State, 66-49, last year in Fairbanks, AK at the BP Top of the World Classic to open the regular season.

**In the last 10 season openers, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 7-3.**

It was the second time in three seasons that a David Henderson team has opened in Philadelphia. The Blue Hens lost to Temple in Henderson's first game as Delaware's coach, 56-49.

In fact, the Blue Hens have opened the season in Philadelphia seven times, but the City of Brotherly Love hasn't been so friendly. **UD is now 0-7 in season-openers in Philadelphia.**

With the win over Wichita State, UD avoided losing consecutive season openers. Delaware last lost consecutive season openers in 1992-93 and 1993-94 (a loss at Seton Hall in the Pre-season NIT in Nov. 1992 and a loss at Monmouth in Nov. 1993).

## UD blows out Ukraine

Senior forward **Maurice Sessoms** exploded for 15 of his team-high 26 points in the first half and pulled nine rebounds and guard **Ryan Iversen** and **Mike Slattery** combined for 31 points in the backcourt as Delaware defeated Nikolaev, Ukraine 83-63 in a men's basketball pre-season exhibition game November 6.

Sessoms connected on 8 of 14 shots from the field and was 10 of 12 from the foul line, including a perfect seven for seven in the opening 20 minutes, for his 26 points. He also pulled nine rebounds and blocked one shot in 30 minutes of action.

Sessoms was one of four UD players in double figures as Iversen added 16 points and nine rebounds, Slattery chipped in with 15 points and seven assists, and **Dave Hindenlang** came off the bench to score 10 points. Forward **Robin Wentt** led all rebounders with 10 as the Hens outrebounded the taller Ukraine team, 43-29.

UD never led by more than eight points in a hard-fought first half and went into intermission up 37-34 thanks to Sessoms' 15 points.

But the Hens came out strong in the second half, scoring the first eight points of the stanza to go up 45-34. The Hens later built the lead to as much as 21 points at 67-46 with 9:49 left to play. Nikolaev did cut the lead to 12 points at 73-61 with 3:41 left but the Hens outscored them 8-1 to finish off the game.
