So you say you're a numbers freak? Try these numbers on for size.

2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Freshman Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

3 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 92-3 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

6 - Players that return from UD's regular playing rotation last season (averaging 15 min. per game).

32 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

70 - Delaware has won 46 straight home games when scoring 70 or more points.

107 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons (incl. this year). UD is 107-20 when leading at the half during that span.

111 - The number of games Delaware has won in the 10 seasons of the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 111-27 (.804 pct) at "The Bob" since its opening back on Dec. 1, 1992. More recently, UD is 62-10 at "The Bob" over the last five seasons.

355 - UD has made at least one three-pointer in 355 consecutive games. The Blue Hens haven't been shutout from behind the arc since Nov. 28, 1990 at Bucknell.

2000 - Delaware could play its 2000th game this season. UD would have to advance to the CAA semifinals to get to the milestone.

NEWARK, DE - All-American guard Marvin O'Connor scored a game-high 21 points in 22 minutes and guard Na'im Crenshaw added 16 points as No. 19 Saint Joseph's overwhelmed the Blue Hens...Hawks (3-1) broke a tie two minutes into the game and rolled on to the victory, expanding on a 20-point halftime lead to post their third-straight victory...guard Jameer Nelson added 12 points and six assists as the Saint Joseph's starters outscored Delaware 64-19....Delaware (2-3), which remained winless in 24 tries all-time vs. Top 25 opponents, got 11 points and six rebounds off the bench from Sean Knitter and 10 more from Mike Ames...No Blue Hen starter scored more than nine points...Hens got a solid effort off the bench from Ioannis Xenakis who hit on four of five shots from the field for eight points and pulled two rebounds in 15 minutes of action...Crenshaw, O'Connor, and Nelson combined for 36 of Saint Joseph's points on the way to a 48-28 halftime lead...Saint Joseph's downed the Hens for the 16th time in the last 17 meetings...Delaware played its first nationally-ranked opponent at home since falling to No. 3 Virginia in 1981.

No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens certainly love to play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nicknamed "The Bob" by the UD student body, Delaware has won 59 of its last 67 games on its home floor and is 111-27 at home in "The Bob's" 10-plus seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson. Delaware is 22-6 at home during Henderson's tenure.

For the first time in four years, Delaware lost consecutive home games last season.

Delaware hadn't lost consecutive home games since the last home game of the 1996-97 season and the 1997-98 home opener (a loss to Virginia on Nov. 25, 1997).

While a member of America East, UD was 72-18 against America East members at home. In its first CAA season, UD was 6-3 against conference foes.

However, The Fightin' Blue Hens are successful out of the league, too.

Delaware is 33-6 against non-conference foes at "The Bob", including 19 of the last 21 going back to December 1995 (the losses coming in the aforementioned game with Virginia and to nationally-ranked Saint Joseph's last year). UD had won 11 straight home non-conference games before last year's loss to Saint Joseph's.

UD has won 46 straight home games when it scores 70 points or more dating back to Jan. 16, 1998.

Not Just Any 6th Man

Tonight's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. But that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen has appeared in all 63 games of his Delaware career. In that span, Iversen has only started seven games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in those 56 games off of the bench and has played 20 or more minutes in 42 of those 56 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made his performance against LIU that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he actually got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

Entering tonight's game, Iversen leads the CAA in assist/turnover ratio, is third in rebound, four in assists and fourth in three-point FG percentage.

40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 96-13 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 27-5 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 69-7 when leading at the half since the arena opened. Delaware has won 58 of the last 62 at home when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 17-2 when leading at the half at home.

Ready, Ames... Fire!

Mike Ames led the CAA in three-point field goal shooting last season. Ames hit 73 of 160 from behind the arc (45.6%).

Ames, who missed several weeks during the preseason due to a torn meniscus, has a streak of 17 straight games with at least one three-point field goal. He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games. That string was broken with consecutive games in which he was shutout, but has since started anew.

Ames shot 7-for-11 from three-point range in two CAA Tournament games last March. Over the final 10 games last season, Ames was 36-for-66 (54.5%) from beyond the three-point line.

He is now 97-226 from 3-pt. range in 55 career games at Delaware (42.9%), which would rank No. 2 in three-point field goal percentage in school history. His 97 career three-pointers already rank him No. 12 in UD history.

No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his first two seasons at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 58 of 63 games. Currently, Delaware has scored in double-figures in 33 consecutive games (all of last season). Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

In Delaware's last two wins, the Blue Hens have outscored the opposition 79-34 off the bench, scoring 40 and 39 points, respectively.

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

Climbing the Hill

Tonight, Delaware will try to do something it has never done before.

Beat Saint Joseph's on Hawk Hill.

Delaware is 0-14 all-time at Alumni Fieldhouse. The Blue Hens' eight wins over the Hawks have all come away from Hawk Hill - seven in Newark and one on a neutral floor.

Delaware's last win in the series came on December 30, 1989, a 68-50 win over the Hawks in Hartford, CT. SJU has won four straight meetings since then.

Hindenlang's New Talent

Dave Hindenlang has a new found talent.

Theivery.

Hindenlang has eight steals in the last two games. He enters action tonight as the leader in the CAA in that category.

Prior to this season, however, Hindenlang had just 10 steals in three seasons (70 games).

UD Inks Four to NLI's Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-9 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, will enroll at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference honors and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

- So much of last season's 14-16 mark came down to just making baskets, which hurts when you consider seven losses last year were by six points or less.

In Delaware's 14 wins last season, UD held the opponent to 39.8% from the field, including 32.2% from three-point range. Meanwhile, Delaware shot 44.1% from the field, including 37.8% from three-point range.

On the other side of the ledger, in UD's 16 losses, the opposition shot 45.2% from the field, including 38.2% from behind the three-point line. Meanwhile, UD shot just 38.4% from the field and just 30% from three-point range in losses.

- UD was 3-11 last season when it shot under 40% from the field. Under Henderson, UD is 4-15 when shooting 40% or less from the field.

Another road opener

Delaware opened its 98th season of men's basketball... and once again it was on the road.

The Blue Hens have not played a season opener at home since the 1996-97 season (a 91-63 win over Delaware St. on Nov. 22, 1996).

All-time, the Blue Hens are 48-50 in season openers. The Blue Hens defeated Wichita State, 66-49, last year in Fairbanks, AK at the BP Top of the World Classic to open the regular season.

In the last 10 season openers, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 7-3.

It was the second time in three seasons that a David Henderson team has opened in Philadelphia. The Blue Hens lost to Temple in Henderson's first game as Delaware's coach, 56-49.

In fact, the Blue Hens have opened the season in Philadelphia seven times, but the City of Brotherly Love hasn't been so friendly. **UD is now 0-7 in season-openers in Philadelphia.**

With the win over Wichita State, UD avoided losing consecutive season openers. Delaware last lost consecutive season openers in 1992-93 and 1993-94 (a loss at Seton Hall in the Pre-season NIT in Nov. 1992 and a loss at Monmouth in Nov. 1993).

UD blows out Ukraine

Senior forward **Maurice Sessoms** exploded for 15 of his team-high 26 points in the first half and pulled nine rebounds and guard **Ryan Iversen** and **Mike Slattery** combined for 31 points in the backcourt as Delaware defeated Nikolaev, Ukraine 83-63 in a men's basketball pre-season exhibition game November 6.

Sessoms connected on 8 of 14 shots from the field and was 10 of 12 from the foul line, including a perfect seven for seven in the opening 20 minutes, for his 26 points. He also pulled nine rebounds and blocked one shot in 30 minutes of action.

Sessoms was one of four UD players in double figures as Iversen added 16 points and nine rebounds, Slattery chipped in with 15 points and seven assists, and **Dave Hindenlang** came off the bench to score 10 points. Forward **Robin Wentt** led all rebounders with 10 as the Hens outrebounded the taller Ukraine team, 43-29.

UD never led by more than eight points in a hard-fought first half and went into intermission up 37-34 thanks to Sessoms' 15 points.

But the Hens came out strong in the second half, scoring the first eight points of the stanza to go up 45-34. The Hens later built the lead to as much as 21 points at 67-46 with 9:49 left to play. Nikolaev did cut the lead to 12 points at 73-61 with 3:41 left but the Hens outscored them 8-1 to finish off the game.
