Robin Wentt is out with a shoulder injury. Wentt had been suffering from multiple subluxations of his left shoulder, similar to the injury he suffered in his right shoulder last season. He underwent surgery on the left shoulder (the same procedure that he had last summer on the right shoulder) December 19 and is not expected to return to the line-up this season... **Rulon Washington** will not play today due to a separated right shoulder. He suffered the injury in the first half of the win over William & Mary on February 1. Washington has had limited workouts this week and will likely be available for tonight's contest.

2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

4 - The number of times Delaware has lost consecutive home games since the BCC opened in December 1992.

5 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 99-5 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

10 - The number of Blue Hens that have had at least one double-figure scoring game this season.

33 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

71 - UD allowed 71 points in four straight games earlier this year. UD hadn't allowed identical points in four straight games since the end of 1918-19 & start of 1919-20.

113 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons. UD is 113-23 when leading at the half during that span.

117 - The number of games Delaware has won in the 10-plus seasons at the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 117-32 (.785 pct) at "The Bob" since its opening back on Dec. 1, 1992. More recently, UD is 68-15 at "The Bob" over the last five seasons.

378 - UD has made at least one three-pointer in 378 consecutive games. The Blue Hens haven't been shutout from behind the arc since Nov. 23, 1990 at Bucknell.

2000 - Delaware could play its 2000th game this season. UD has to play two games in the CAA Tourn. to get the milestone.

NEWARK, DE -- Mike Ames connected on five of six three-pointers and finished with a game-high 21 points as Delaware took control in the final eight minutes...UD, which snapped a two-game losing streak and avoided its first ever three-game losing streak at the 10-year old Bob Carpenter Center, hit on 8 of 14 three-pointers as a team and matched a season-low with just seven turnovers on its way to the victory...David Lunn contributed 12 points, a team-high eight rebounds, and six steals and Ryan Iversen came off the bench to add 11 points for the Blue Hens...Towson trailed just 53-50 with 10 minutes left to play but couldn't keep up with the Hens and lost for the 10th time in their last 11 games...the Tigers had three scorers in double figures as Brian Allen led the way with 15 points and six assists, Jamaal Gilchrist hit for 13 points, and Tony Dixon contributed 10 points and blocked four shots...Lawrence Hamm, the team's second leading scorer at 9.6 points per game, was held to just one point...Ames connected on three three-pointers in the first three and half minutes of play as UD sprinted out to an early 11-4 lead...Towson recovered and eventually took the lead at 27-26 when Stephen Warner nailed a jumper with 2:49 left in the opening half...the Hens took a 28-27 halftime lead on Calvin Smith's jumper with 2:28 left, the last points of the half...the first 10 minutes of the second half was tightly-contested and featured six ties before the Hens took a seven-point lead at 53-46 on an Ames jumper with 12:29 left to play...Towson stayed close and moved back to within three as Gilchrist and Warner scored baskets to pull the Tigers to within 53-50 with 10:23 left...Towson never got closer, however, as Iversen followed with two free throws and a layup, Ames nailed another three-pointer, and Ioannis Xenakis converted two free throws to put the lead back up to 10.

Ready, Ames... Fire!

Mike Ames led the CAA in three-point field goal shooting last season. Ames hit 73 of 160 from behind the arc (45.6%).

Although he missed several weeks during the pre-season due to a torn meniscus, which contributed to his slow start this season (9-35 from three-point range in the first five games), Ames had a streak of 18 straight games with at least one three-point field goal earlier this season before being shutout by Rider on Dec. 14.

He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games.

Ames currently has a three-pointer in each of the last 21 games, the second longest string in UD history. In those 21 games (since the 9-35 start), he has averaged 15.7 ppg, shooting 38.6% from three-point range (59-153).

Ames had a streak of 31 made consecutive free throws earlier this season, tied for the fourth longest streak in UD history and in CAA history.

Along with leading the league in free throw percentage (93.3%), Ames is No. 10 in the CAA in scoring at 14.8 ppg. He is also second in three-pointers per game (2.68) and 10th in three-point pct. (36.4%).

Ames is 160-395 from 3-pt. range in 81 career games at Delaware (40.5%), which would rank No. 5 in 3-pt. field goal pct. in school history. His 160 career three-pointers rank him No. 4 in UD history.

40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 102-16 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 33-8 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 73-8 when leading at the half since the arena opened. UD has won 62 of the last 67 at home when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 21-3 when leading at the half at home.

Furthermore, if Delaware has lead of six points or more at half, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 60-2 over the last six seasons.

Gotta' Score 60

With the CAA known as one of the top defensive leagues around, points are at a premium.

With that said, Delaware is 3-20 over the last four seasons (including 1-4 this season) when held to less than 60 points.

Take Care of 'da Rock

One considerable change while Mike Slattery has been the starting point guard has been a decrease in turnovers.

Delaware has lost 12 of its last 13 (dating back to the 2000 NIT loss at Villanova) when it doesn't stay overnight for a road game.

Not Just Any 6th Man

Tonight's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. However, that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen had appeared in all 65 games of his UD career before missing the UNCGreensboro game with back spasms. In his career, Iversen has only started eight games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in 77 career games off of the bench and has played 20-plus minutes in 61 of the 77 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made his performance against LIU this season that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker (at U. of Minnesota) recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

Iversen is tied for third in steals (2.0) in the CAA and is also seventh in rebounding (6.7).

In addition, Iversen has scored in double-figures in 13 consecutive games (12 of those coming off of the bench), which is the longest string since Mike Pegues' 25 straight in 1999-2000.

Daddy's Little Girl

UD assistant coach Billy Martin's daughter, Chantel, is a key member of the Campbell University women's basketball team this season.

Chantel, a sophomore guard, has been the Camels' first player off the bench for most of the season, averaging 6.6 ppg (third on the team) and 2.0 rpg in 16.3 minutes per game through the first 25 games of the season. She is shooting 44% from 3-pt. range.

CU (9-16, 5-9) hosts Jacksonville St on Saturday.

No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, **the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 81 of 86 games. Currently, Delaware's bench has scored in double-figures in 56 consecutive games.** Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

In seven of UD's wins, the Blue Hens scored 32 or more bench points (32, 35, 39, 39, 40, 42, 48).

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

This season, 10 players have scored in double-figures for Delaware at least once. The only players that have not scored in double-figures this year are Robin Wentt, who played in just one game before undergoing season-ending shoulder surgery, and walk-on Anwar Rohan.

Houdini-like Hens

This season, the Blue Hens have made some great escapes.

In five of Delaware's wins this season, the Blue Hens have trailed by five points or more in the second half, only to come from behind for the win.

This season, Delaware is 6-1 in games decided by four points or less. Last year, UD was just 2-4 in those games, including three losses in conference play.

Earlier this season, Delaware won three consecutive games by two points or less (at William & Mary, home vs. VCU, and at Old Dominion) - a first in UD's 98 seasons of basketball.

Delaware almost rallied for two more wins. Delaware rallied from an 11-point deficit to within 50-49, before UNC Wilmington pulled away, 68-62, back on January 18. At Hofstra, Delaware came back from a seven-point deficit to retake the lead, only to fall in the final seconds, 64-62.

Charitable Turnaround

After the UNC Greensboro game, Delaware coach David Henderson was furious with his squad for their horrific foul shooting. That has since changed, however.

Following the UNCG game, in which Delaware shot just 13-26 from the line, UD was shooting just 59.6% from the foul line (62-104).

Since then, UD is shooting 74.7% from the line (283-379) to raise the season mark up to 71.4%, which leads the CAA.

UD Inks Four to NLI's Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-8 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, enrolled at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

Maepa Joins Team

Lebo (Lay-BO) Maepa (MAY-PUH), a native Johannesburg, So. Africa, has joined the squad for the second semester and will spend his redshirt season.

Maepa, a member of the South African national team, signed an NLI during the early period. However, because South African schools run on a different calendar, Maepa has already earned his high school degree from Durban HS in Dec. 2001 and is enrolled in UD's winter session. He will practice and travel with the team.

Nana Transfers to UD

David Henderson has confirmed that forward **Harding Nana (Nah-Nah)** has enrolled in classes at Delaware.

Nana, a 6-8 native of Douala, Cameroon, will join the team for the 2003-04 season. Under NCAA transfer regulations, Nana will not be eligible for competition until Dec. 20 - when UD's fall semester is complete. He will have 2-1/2 seasons of eligibility.

Nana asked for his release from Virginia Tech on Dec. 14. He played in three games in 2001-02 for the Hokies before receiving a medical redshirt. He did not appear in any games this season.

Nana attended Newport School in Kensington, MD. He averaged 11 ppg and 11 rpg on a team that finished 30-8 and had four other current Division I players. He then attended Notre Dame Prep in Middleburg, MA for one year. At Notre Dame Prep, Nana averaged 12.3 ppg and 8.0 rpg.

Slattery Hits 200

Mike Slattery recorded his 200th collegiate assist on January 29 at Hofstra. Slattery achieved the milestone in his 48th game, third fastest at UD, and is the 20th Blue Hen to reach the 200-assist mark.

In comparison, Brian Pearl (46 games) and Taurence Chisholm (25 games) started each of their first two seasons, while Slattery did not gain the starting nod until the middle of last season.

Working Overtime

All-time, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 38-31 in overtime games, 23-10 in Newark. (A complete list can be found in the UD media guide.)

Delaware is 6-2 in overtime games all-time at the BCC.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 3-2 in overtime games.

So much of last season's 14-16 mark came down to just making baskets, which hurts when you consider seven losses last year were by six points or less.

In Delaware's 14 wins last season, UD held the opponent to 39.8% from the field, including 32.2% from three-point range. Meanwhile, Delaware shot 44.1% from the field, including 37.8% from three-point range.

On the other side of the ledger, in UD's 16 losses, the opposition shot 45.2% from the field, including 38.2% from behind the three-point line. Meanwhile, UD shot just 38.4% from the field and just 30% from three-point range in losses.

UD was 3-11 last season when it shot under 40% from the field. Under Henderson, UD is 5-24 when shooting 40% or less from the field (incl. 1-9 this season).

Last season, Delaware averaged 73.8 ppg in its 14 wins, but just 60.6 ppg in its 16 losses.

UD was 10-3 when it scored 70 or more points last season.

UD averaged just 11.9 turnovers in its 14 wins. That number, however, jumped to 14.6 per game in its 16 losses.
