Injury Report

Robin Wentt is out with a shoulder injury. Wentt had been suffering from multiple subluxations of his left shoulder, similar to the injury he suffered in his right shoulder last season. He underwent surgery on the left shoulder (the same procedure that he had last summer on the right shoulder) December 19 and is not expected to return to the line-up this season. **Rulon Washington** will not play tonight due to a separated right shoulder. He suffered the injury in the first half of the win over William & Mary on February 1. He may be ready for the Old Dominion game (Feb. 22).

2 - So much for "1" being the loneliest number. At Delaware this season, "2" is the loneliest number. Chris Prothro is the first Blue Hen to wear the No. 2. Of course, part of the reason for that is the No. 2 was illegal in college basketball from 1957-58 to 1999-2000 (as was wearing "1").

4 - The number of times Delaware has lost consecutive home games since the BCC opened in December 1992.

5 - The number of times Delaware has lost when leading with 2:00 left in regulation over the last six years. (incl. this year) Delaware is 98-5 during that span when leading at the two-minute mark.

10 - The number of Blue Hens that have had at least one double-figure scoring game this season.

32 - That's how many sellouts Delaware has had in the last four seasons at the 5,000-seat Bob Carpenter Center.

113 - The number of games that Delaware has won leading at the half over the last seven seasons (incl. this year). UD is 113-22 when leading at the half during that span.

NEWARK, DE -- Seldom-used center Ioannis Xenakis came off the bench to score a career-high 12 points, including the game-winning basket on a jumper with 12 seconds remaining, to lift Delaware to its third straight win...Xenakis, a 7-foot native of Greece, had played just 17 minutes in four games all season due to injuries...UD also got 11 points from Mike Ames, including two big three-pointers in the final five minutes...VCU which got 15 points from forward Willie Taylor, let a nine-point with seven minutes left to play slip away...UD completed the furious comeback when Ames pulled down a long rebound near midcourt following a VCU miss and found Xenakis open on the left wing for the game-winner from 12 feet out...the Rams had a chance to send the game into overtime but Troy Godwin missed a jumper in traffic in the lane just before the final horn...after a 30-30 halftime tie, VCU went ahead in the second half by as much as 10 points at 40-30 as UD missed on 12 of its first 14 shots and did not even get on the board until Ames hit his first of three second half three-pointers with 13:09 remaining...UD cut the lead to three points at 40-37 with 11:28 left but the Rams upped the margin back to nine points as Willie Taylor scored seven points in a 9-3 VCU run, completing the streak with two free throws for a 49-40 lead with 7:09 remaining...UD rallied back with Xenakis starting the run with a jumper and Ames hitting two three-pointers in a span of one minute, the second cutting the lead to 51-50 with 3:30 remaining...VCU went back up by three on a jumper by Domic Jones, but Delaware's Ryan Iversen (13 rebounds) followed with three free throws to forge the game's first tie since halftime at 53-53 at the 2:25 mark...neither team scored again until Xenakis hit the game-winner.

No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens certainly love to play at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nicknamed "The Bob" by the UD student body, Delaware has won 64 of its last 76 games on its home floor and is 116-31 at home in "The Bob's" 10-plus seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson. Delaware is 27-10 at home during Henderson's tenure.

UD has lost consecutive home games just four times since the BCC opened in December 1992 and have never lost three straight at home at the BCC.

While a member of America East, UD was 72-18 against America East members at home. In its first CAA season, UD was 6-3 against conference foes.

However, The Fightin' Blue Hens are successful out of the league, too. UD is 34-7 against non-conference foes at "The Bob", including 20 of the last 23 going back to December 1995 (the losses coming in the aforementioned game with Virginia, nationally-ranked Saint Joseph's last year and Rider this season).

Not Just Any 6th Man

Tonight's probable starting line-up has Ryan Iversen coming off of the bench. However, that doesn't mean Iversen won't play a lot of minutes.

Iversen had appeared in all 65 games of his UD career before missing the UNC Greensboro game with back spasms. In his career, Iversen has only started seven games... much of that because of his diversity as a guard, and comfort level coming off of the bench.

However, Iversen has never played less than 14 minutes in 73 career games off of the bench and has played 20 or more minutes in 57 of those 73 games.

Iversen's coming off the bench made his performance against LIU this season that much more impressive. The 6-3 former linebacker (at U. of Minnesota) recorded a triple-double - the second in UD history - in the win over LIU. He finished with 12 points and career-highs with 17 rebounds and 11 assists in 28 minutes. He actually got the triple-double with 5:14 left... meaning he got the trifecta in 23 minutes.

Iversen ranks third in steals (1.9) in the CAA and is also 10th in rebounding.

Ready, Ames... Fire!

Mike Ames led the CAA in three-point field goal shooting last season. Ames hit 73 of 160 from behind the arc (45.6%).

Although he missed several weeks during the pre-season due to a torn meniscus, which contributed to his slow start this season (9-35 from three-point range in the first five games), Ames had a streak of 18 straight games with at least one three-point field goal before being shutout by Rider on Dec. 14. The 18-game string tied for the third-longest in UD history.

He also began last season by hitting at least one three-point field goal in 14 straight games.

Ames looks like he has started to find his stroke again. He has a three-pointer in each of the last 17 games. In those 17 games (since the 9-35 start), he has averaged 16.7 ppg, shooting 40.8% from three-point range (51-125).

Ames had a streak of 31 made consecutive free throws earlier this season, tied for the fourth longest streak in UD history and in CAA history.

Along with leading the league in free throw percentage (93.8%), Ames is No. 10 in the CAA in scoring at 15.1 ppg. He is also second in three-pointers per game (2.76) and seventh in three-point pct. (37.4%).

Ames is 152-367 from 3-pt. range in 79 career games at Delaware (41.4%), which would rank No. 2 in 3-pt. field goal pct. in school history. His 152 career three-pointers rank him No. 4 in UD history.

Kanga-ROO

No wonder Rulon Washington's nickname is "Roo". It might be short for Kanga-ROO.

Washington, a native of Jacksonville, FL, comes to Delaware with a 40-inch vertical leap. He proved that with an ally-oop dunk in UD's exhibition win over a team from Ukraine.

Washington graduated from Edward White HS in the spring of 2001. However, he wasn't recruited by Division I schools (partially because he had four HS coaches in four years), so he chose to stay in Jacksonville and play in Grayson Marshall's midnight league. Marshall, a former Clemson player (1985-88), called Henderson and put him onto "Roo."

Not the First from the Island

Anwar Rohan earned a walk-on spot with the squad in pre-season practice.

Rohan, a 6-2 freshman guard, is from St. Thomas, Virgin Islands. However, he is NOT the first UD basketball player from the American Territory. Elsworth Bowers, who lettered three seasons at UD (1986-89), hailed from St. Croix, VI.

40-minute Men

In recent seasons, Delaware has been a tough team to beat when it has a halftime lead.

Delaware is 102-15 over the last six seasons (including this one) when leading at the half, including a 33-7 mark during head coach David Henderson's tenure.

That mark gets better when UD is at home. At the BCC, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 73-8 when leading at the half since the arena opened. UD has won 62 of the last 67 at home when leading at intermission.

Under David Henderson, Delaware is 21-3 when leading at the half at home.

Furthermore, if Delaware has lead of six points or more at half, the Fightin' Blue Hens are 60-2 over the last six seasons.

Gotta' Score 60

With the CAA known as one of the top defensive leagues around, points are at a premium.

With that said, Delaware is 3-19 over the last four seasons (including 1-3 this season) when held to less than 60 points.

Daddy's Little Girl

UD assistant coach Billy Martin's daughter, Chantel, is a key member of the Campbell University women's basketball team this season.

Chantel, a sophomore guard, has been the Camels' first player off the bench for most of the season, averaging 7.3 ppg (third on the team) and 2.3 rpg in 17.8 minutes per game through the first 19 games of the season.

She had 14 points in her first collegiate start last Saturday, a 67-61 home loss to Mercer. On Thursday, however, she played just four minutes before suffering a sprained ankle in a win over Florida Atlantic.

CU (8-13, 4-6) travels to Central Florida for a game today (Saturday).

No Splinters on this Squad

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's tenure, **the UD bench has scored in double-figures in 77 of 82 games. Currently, Delaware's bench has scored in double-figures in 52 consecutive games.** Delaware's bench was last held to less than 10 points on March 10, 2001 by Hofstra (8) in the America East title game.

In seven of UD's wins, the Blue Hens scored 32 or more bench points (32, 35, 39, 39, 40, 42, 48).

Last season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 ppg and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games.

This season, 10 players have scored in double-figures for Delaware at least once. The only players that have not scored in double-figures this year are Robin Wentt, who played in just one game before undergoing season-ending shoulder surgery, and walk-on Anwar Rohan.

Houdini-like Hens

This season, the Blue Hens have made some great escapes.

In five of Delaware's wins this season, the Blue Hens have trailed by five points or more in the second half, only to come from behind for the win.

This season, Delaware is 6-1 in games decided by four points or less. Last year, UD was just 2-4 in those games, including three losses in conference play.

Earlier this season, Delaware won three consecutive games by two points or less (at William & Mary, home vs. VCU, and at Old Dominion) - a first in UD's 98 seasons of basketball.

Delaware almost rallied for two more wins. Delaware rallied from an 11-point deficit to within 50-49, before UNC Wilmington pulled away, 68-62, back on January 18. At Hofstra, Delaware came back from a seven-point deficit to retake the lead, only to fall in the final seconds, 64-62.

Charitable Turnaround

After the UNC Greensboro game, Delaware coach David Henderson was furious with his squad for their horrific foul shooting. That has since changed, however.

Following the UNCG game, in which Delaware shot just 13-26 from the line, UD was shooting just 59.6% from the foul line (62-104).

Since then, over the last 14 games, UD is shooting 74.8% from the line (231-309) to raise the season mark up to 70.9%

As a team, Delaware is third in the CAA in FT shooting.

UD Inks Four to NLI's Early

UD head coach **David Henderson** announced the signing of four student-athletes during the early NLI signing period.

The Blue Hens have signed NLI commitments from 6-8 F **Henry Olawoye (pronounced Oh-luh-way)** (St. Mark's Prep [MA]/Woonsocket, RI), 6-7 F **Octavius Flowers** (Community Christian Academy/Wilson, NC), 6-7 F **Herb Courtney** (Hatboro-Horsham HS/Horsham, PA), and 6-8 F **Lebo (pronounced Lay-bo) Maepa** (Durban HS/Johannesburg, South Africa).

Maepa, having graduated from Durban last December, enrolled at UD in January.

Olawoye is a Woonsocket, RI native who enrolled two years ago at St. Mark's Prep School in Southborough, MA, a suburb of Boston. Last season, he earned All-Independent School League honors at St. Mark's, averaging 14.8 and 9.3 rpg. He also earned all-tournament honors at the Boys Club of New York Holiday Classic. He is also a member of St. Mark's baseball squad.

Flowers transferred to Community Christian Academy in Wilson, NC this season after spending the last three seasons at Wayne Country Day School. At Wayne Country Day, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.4 rebounds, 5.9 blocks and 3.1 assists per game as a junior. Last season, playing on the top-ranked high school team in North Carolina with a 22-3 mark, he earned all-conference honors and honorable mention all-state accolades.

Flowers, a native of Goldsboro, NC, also earned all-conference honors as a sophomore, averaging 14.6 ppg, 9.8 rpg and 3.8 bpg as his team was ranked No. 4 in the state. He is ranked as one of the Top 35 players in the Carolinas by *HoopScoop Online*.

Courtney is a native of Hatboro, PA and product of Hatboro-Horsham HS. He averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per contest and All-Suburban One League honors last season at Hatboro-Horsham. He is ranked as one of the Top 20 players in the Delaware Valley by *HoopScoop Online*.

Maepa Joins Team

Lebo (Lay-BO) Maepa (MAY-PUH), a native Johannesburg, So. Africa, has joined the squad for the second semester and will spend his redshirt season.

Maepa, a member of the South African national team, signed an NLI during the early period. However, because South African schools run on a different calendar, Maepa has already earned his high school degree from Durban HS in Dec. 2001 and is enrolled in UD's winter session. He will practice and travel with the team.

Slattery Hits 200

Mike Slattery recorded his 200th collegiate assist on January 29 at Hofstra. Slattery achieved the milestone in his 48th game, third fastest at UD, and is the 20th Blue Hen to reach the 200-assist mark.

In comparison, Brian Pearl (46 games) and Taurence Chisholm (25 games) started each of their first two seasons, while Slattery did not gain the starting nod until the middle of last season.

Nana Transfers to UD

David Henderson confirmed Wednesday that forward **Harding Nana** has enrolled in classes at Delaware.

Nana, a 6-8 native of Douala, Cameroon, will not practice with the Blue Hens this season, although he is permitted to do so under NCAA rules. Instead, Nana will enroll in a regular class schedule and is expected to join the team for the 2003-04 season. Under NCAA transfer regulations, Nana will not be eligible for competition until Dec. 20 - when UD's fall semester is complete.

Nana asked for his release from Virginia Tech on Dec. 14. He played in three games in 2001-02 for the Hokies before receiving a medical redshirt. He did not appear in any games this season.

Nana attended Newport School in Kensington, MD. He averaged 11 ppg and 11 rpg on a team that finished 30-8 and had four other current Division I players. He then attended Notre Dame Prep in Middleburg, MA for one year. At Notre Dame Prep, Nana averaged 12.3 ppg and 8.0 rpg.

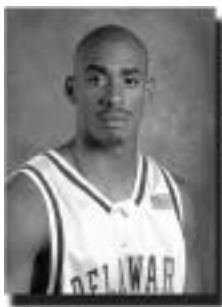

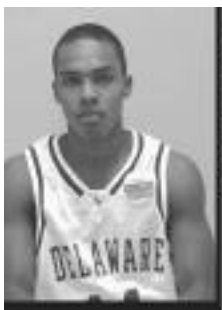

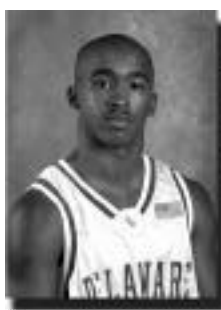
