## Delaware on the Air

This season will be the first year that all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on flagship station WRDX 94.7 FM. Also on the Blue Hen radio network are WDOV-AM 1410 (Dover) and WTGM-AM (Salisbury, MD). Mike Corey and Bill Komissaroff, who enter their sixth year on the network, return to call the action.

In addition, most UD basketball games are also broadcast on the university student station, WVUD-FM 91.3, and WVUD2, the station's internet radio network.

Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through UD's athletics website.

Delaware is scheduled to play four games on television this season. The Blue Hens' game at Hofstra on January 22 will be televised by Fox Sports Net-New York, while both the February 19 home game with the Pride and the February 22 game at Drexel will be broadcast by the Colonial Athletic Association Network. Each of those games are scheduled to be shown on both Comcast SportsNet-Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic. Delaware's season-opener at Ohio State was broadcast by ESPN Plus.

Additionally, a majority of Delaware home games are shown on STN, the student television network that is shown on campus.

## Delaware vs. American

American leads the all-time series with Delaware, 15-9, but the Blue Hens have won each of the last five meetings between the two schools. Last season Delaware posted a 72-63 win in Washington, DC on November 25, as Mike Ames led four Blue Hens in double figures with 16 points.

## Blue Hens Lose Three In San Juan

Playing with just eight scholarship players, Delaware lost all three of its games at the San Juan Shootout last week, falling to Auburn, 74-46, Toledo, 81-58, and Middle Tennessee State, 73-69 in overtime. The first two losses marked the first time the Blue Hens had dropped consecutive games by at least 20 points since a 101-77 loss to Lafayette on January 18, 1985 and a 108-63 defeat to Navy two days later. The 46 points scored against Auburn were the fewest since a 50-44 loss at Pennsylvania on January 17, 2002.

However, after losing the first two games by wide margins, the Blue Hens responded against Middle Tennessee State, which was picked to win the East Division in the Sun Belt Conference.

Delaware led 31-24 at the half, just its second halftime lead of the season, and extended its advantage to 39-27 with 18:25 remaining before the Blue Raiders responded to take the lead. The Blue Hens forced overtime when **Andrew Washington** hit a three-pointer at the buzzer and led the extra session by one in the final minute, but MTSU's Mike Dean drained a three-pointer with 37 seconds left to put the Blue Raiders up for good.

## Delaware Off To Slow Start

The Blue Hens are just 4-7 in their first 11 games this season, the worst start through 11 games since the 1990-91 team also began its year 4-7. Delaware is currently mired in a four-game losing streak, the longest streak since the Blue Hens dropped four straight from February 6 to February 16, 2002.

However, UD has lost to some tough opponents thus far. Ohio State is currently 10-2, while St. Mary's (CA) is 10-4 and ranked 10th in the latest College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll, with two of its losses coming to Mississippi State and Memphis in the Coaches vs. Cancer tournament. San Francisco is currently 8-3 and has won seven straight, while Auburn is 8-4. Toledo is just 3-5 but was picked to win the West Division of the Mid-American Conference, while Middle Tennessee State is 7-4 and was picked to win the East Division of the Sun Belt Conference. The seven teams Delaware has lost to are a combined 51-27 (.654) this season.

## Blue Hens Struggling To Light Up Scoreboard

Delaware enters today's game averaging 62.2 points per game, last in the Colonial Athletic Association. The Blue Hens have gone six straight games without scoring 70 points, the longest stretch since January 3 through January 17, 2002. Delaware has not gone at least seven games without scoring 70 points since a nine-game stretch from December 9, 1989 through January 13, 1990.

## Turnovers Hurting Hens

With senior point guard **Mike Slattery** out of the lineup with a broken thumb, Delaware struggled with turnovers at the San Juan Shootout. The Blue Hens turned the ball over 26 times in the opening game against Auburn, and the following day committed 28 turnovers against Toledo, the most since Delaware also turned the ball over 28 times versus Delaware State on November 26, 1994. The Blue Hens then committed 19 turnovers against Middle Tennessee State, including two in the final 10 seconds of overtime. Delaware committed 18 turnovers in Wednesday's loss to UMBC.

Delaware has committed more turnovers than its opponents in 10 of 11 games this season, while the Blue Hens and St. Mary's (CA) each committed 16 in their game on December 2. As of December 20, Delaware ranked 311 out of 326 teams in Division I with 18.8 turnovers committed per game.

## Controlling The Boards

Delaware out-rebounded its opponents in all three games at the San Juan Shootout, and has posted more rebounds than its opponents in eight of 11 games this season. The Blue Hens recorded a 41-27 rebounding edge against Auburn, had a 32-29 advantage over Toledo, and posted a 37-29 margin versus Middle Tennessee State, which entered the game with a +10 rebounding margin. Delaware currently leads the CAA with 32.5 rebounds allowed per game, is second with a +3.8 rebounding margin, and is third with 35.7 rebounds per game.

## Madera Comes Up Big In San Juan

After starting the first seven games this season, **Raphael Madera** came off the bench at the San Juan Shootout, but the change did not seem to bother the big man. Madera scored 10 points and pulled down five rebounds against Auburn, and tied his career-high with 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field versus Toledo.

## Nana Continues Impressive Season

Junior **Harding Nana**, who posted double-doubles in the final four regular season games last season, has started strong this year. Nana has led the Blue Hens in scoring in eight of the first 11 games this season, including double-doubles in six of the last seven games.

Nana was 9-of-12 from the field against Mount St. Mary's, hitting his first six shots from the field. He also hit his final two shots at Ohio State, and his eight consecutive field goals made are the sixth-most in Delaware history.

Nana pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds at Loyola and hit two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to put Delaware up four.

In the game at St. Mary's (CA) Nana hit 9-of-13 shots from the field, and he posted his first double-double of the season with a 20-point, 10-rebound performance at San Francisco. He followed up that performance with game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds against Drexel. Nana tied for the team lead with 19 points, grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds, and scored the game-winning basket against Rider. His performances against Drexel and Rider earned him the CAA Co-Player of the Week award on December 13.

Nana scored a career-high 30 points on 10-of-13 shooting against Toledo while pulling down 11 rebounds, and posted 19 points and while tying his career-high with 14 rebounds versus Middle Tennessee State. He led the Blue Hens in rebounding in all three games in San Juan.

Wednesday against UMBC Nana scored 25 points on 10-of-16 shooting and pulled down 11 rebounds, both team-highs.

Nana currently leads the CAA with 9.7 rebounds per game and is second with 18.7 points per game.

## Nana Named CAA Co-Player of the Week

**Harding Nana** was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on December 13 after posting a pair of double-doubles in the last two Blue Hen wins.

Nana recorded game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds in Delaware's 67-65 win over Drexel on December 8 in the conference opener for both teams, and added an assist and a steal. He also hit two free throws with 33 seconds remaining to give the Blue Hens a 65-62 lead, and Delaware hung on for the win when the Dragons' Bashir Mason missed a driving lay-up at the buzzer.

Nana, who was named the conference co-player of the week once last season, posted his third consecutive double-double with 19 points and a game-best 12 rebounds in the 68-66 victory over Rider on December 11. He also recorded two blocks, an assist and a steal in the all-around effort, and scored what proved to be the game-winning basket by converting a lay-up with 1:13 remaining and the score tied at 66-66.

## Andrew Washington Contributes Immediately

Junior **Andrew Washington**, who played his first two seasons at Allen Community College in Kansas, has made an immediate impact in his first year with the Blue Hens. Washington, who has started all 11 games this season, currently ranks second on the team and 12th in the CAA with 13.1 points per game. Washington scored 10 points in his Delaware debut at Ohio State, and led the Blue Hens with 26 points in the 63-60 win at Loyola (MD) on November 29. He scored 14 points on 7-of-14 shooting and added a

career-high six rebounds at San Francisco. Washington scored 15 points, second only to Nana's 21 points, against Drexel, and added 17 points and a game-high four steals in the win over Rider.

Washington exploded for 25 points on 9-of-16 shooting against Middle Tennessee State, and hit a three-pointer at the regulation buzzer to send the game into overtime. He added 13 points, hitting all eight of his free throw attempts, in Wednesday's loss to UMBC.

## Rulon Washington Makes His Point

With **Mike Slattery** injured, junior guard **Rulon Washington** has made his first four career starts in the last four games, averaging 34.5 minutes per game in the four contests. Washington played all 40 minutes against Auburn, and was on the court for 42 of the 45 minutes in the overtime loss to Middle Tennessee State. Washington scored a team-high 12 points against the Tigers and added 14 versus the Blue Raiders, including a 3-of-5 performance from three-point range.

## Comeback Kids

Delaware has trailed at the half in nine of its 11 games this season (the the Blue Hens have led only Mount St. Mary's and Middle Tennessee State at the break), but has rallied to overcome a deficit at the half three times. The Blue Hens trailed Loyola (MD) 35-27 at the half, but quickly scored the first eight points of the second half to tie the game. The Greyhounds regained the lead at 38-36, but Delaware responded with an 11-4 run and would not trail again.

The Blue Hens trailed Drexel 38-36 at the break, but after the teams were tied at 57-57 with 6:23 remaining, Delaware scored six straight points and held the lead the rest of the way.

UD was down to Rider 40-30 at the half on December 11, but scored 13 of the first 16 points of the second period to quickly draw even. The Blue Hens did not trail in the final three minutes to post their third comeback win of the season.

Delaware trailed UMBC 26-19 at the half Wednesday, and its 19 first-half points were the second fewest by a Blue Hen team in the history of the Bob Carpenter Center. UD did rally to take the lead in the second half, the final time at 46-44 with 8:25 remaining, but the Retrievers answered with a 7-0 run to take control of the game.

## Don't Leave Early

Last season Delaware finished 3-5 in games decided by two points or less, while 13 of its 28 games were decided by five points or fewer (UD went 7-6 in those games). Additionally the Blue Hens, who won three of their five overtime contests, played 11 games when the outcome was decided in the final five seconds of regulation and/or overtime, posting a 6-5 mark in those games.

That trend has continued this season, as four games have been decided at the buzzer or in overtime. The Blue Hens held off Loyola (MD), 63-60, when the Greyhounds' Charlie Bell missed a three-pointer from the top of the key at the buzzer.

Delaware didn't clinch its 67-65 win over Drexel until the final horn, as the Dragons' Bashir Mason had his driving lay-up roll off the rim. With the Blue Hens up 68-66 over Rider in the final seconds, **Calvin Smith** blocked a three-point attempt by the Broncs' Jerry Johnson out of bounds with 1.9 seconds remaining, and Terrance Mouton's fallaway three-pointer at the buzzer fell short.

The Blue Hens trailed Middle Tennessee State 61-58 with four seconds remaining, but **Andrew Washington** took the inbounds pass and buried a three-pointer at the buzzer to force overtime. Delaware led 69-68 in the extra session after a steal and breakaway lay-up by **Harding Nana**, but the Blue Raiders' Mike Dean buried a three-pointer with 37 seconds left to put MTSU up for good.

## On The Road Again

Delaware has certainly racked up the frequent flier miles early this season, playing seven of its first 10 games away from the Carpenter Center. The Blue Hens traveled 770 round trip miles to Columbus, OH for their season-opener at Ohio State, and in early December flew 2503 miles to and from San Francisco, CA. Delaware flew 1575 miles to and from San Juan, Puerto Rico just before the holidays. Add in a 104-mile round trip bus ride to Loyola (MD), and the Blue Hens have already traveled 9030 miles and made three plane trips this season.

## Hot From Inside, Cold From Outside

The Blue Hens shot 36.7 percent from three-point range last season, but currently are last in the league with a 28.5 three-point field goal percentage and 4.45 three-pointers made per game. Delaware entered the San Francisco game just 10-of-59 (16.9 percent) from long distance, but went 33-of-89 (37.1 percent) in its next seven games. The Blue Hens were just 6-of-24 from behind the arc Wednesday against UMBC.

However, the Blue Hens are shooting 51.1 percent from inside the arc this season, and overall are shooting 44.4 percent from the field, third in the con-

ference. In the home opener against Mount St. Mary's, the Blue Hens shot close to 70 percent through the first 30 minutes of the game and finished 28-of-39 from inside the arc (71.8 percent). In fact, Delaware, which shot 58.5 percent for the game despite hitting just 3-of-14 three-point attempts, missed the same number of two-point shots as three-point attempts.

The Blue Hens were 20-of-40 against Drexel and 17-of-33 versus Rider from two-point range, and shot 65-of-112 (58.0 percent) from inside the arc in their first three home games this year. However, Delaware shot just 35.3 percent against UMBC, including 12-of-27 (44.4 percent) from inside the arc.

## Slattery, Nana Among NCAA Leaders

Through games of December 20, **Mike Slattery** ranked 20th in Division I with 6.4 assists per game, while **Harding Nana** was 50th with 8.9 rebounds per game.

## Slattery, Nana Earn Preseason Recognition

**Mike Slattery** was a first team Preseason All-CAA selection by *Street & Smith's*, *Lindy's*, and *CBS Sportsline* magazines, and was a second team pick by *The Sporting News*. Additionally, Slattery was named the league's Top Playmaker by *Street & Smith's*, while junior **Harding Nana** was named first team Preseason All-CAA by *The Sporting News*.

## Blue Hens Compete In 100th Year of Basketball

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th year for the Delaware men's basketball program. Including this season, the Blue Hens have posted an overall record of 993-1052-2 in their first century of basketball, have made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one to the Postseason NIT, and have won 20 games six times, the last coming during **David Henderson's** first season in 2000-01 when UD went 20-10.

## Mister Assister

**Mike Slattery** took over the starting point guard spot during the second half of his freshman year, and finished the season with 94 assists.

He led the CAA and ranked 18th in Division I with 6.2 assists per game as a sophomore, while playing 35.7 minutes per game.

Last season Slattery again led the league while ranking 21st in the nation with 5.9 assists per game, and also led the conference with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio.

Slattery currently ranks first in the conference and 20th in Division I with 6.43 assists per game.

Since taking over the starting spot, in 76 starts Slattery has 442 assists and just 191 turnovers for a 2.31 assist/turnover ratio. In those 76 starts, he has had more turnovers than assists just six times, and has seven games with 10 or more assists in his career.

Slattery is the fourth player in UD history to record 400 career assists, and only the second to do it before his senior season. He currently ranks third at Delaware with 484 career assists.

Against UNC Greensboro during his sophomore year Slattery posted a career-high 15 assists, the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years, tied for the second-highest single-game total in UD history, and a Carpenter Center record. In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of the CAA record. He duplicated that performance in UD's home win over William & Mary, making Slattery one of two players in the nation to record multiple 15-assist games.

## Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 419 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (529 of 534) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. Delaware's streak has been in jeopardy this season, as the Blue Hens hit just 1-of-13 three-point attempts against Loyola (MD), went just 2-of-11 from behind the arc against St. Mary's (CA), and were 1-of-14 versus Auburn.

## Reaching No. 10

Delaware has won at least 10 games in 22 straight seasons, dating back to 1981-82. Drexel, which has won 10 or more games in 30 consecutive years, is the only CAA school with a longer streak.

## Slattery Moving Up UD Career Charts

**Mike Slattery** had appeared in his first 94 games at Delaware and had started 76 consecutive contests, just six shy of the Delaware record of 82 set

by Taurence Chisholm from 1984 through 1988 and Mike Ames from 2000 through 2004, before missing the last four games with a broken right thumb. Slattery, who could return this afternoon, ranks third on the UD list with 484 career assists and is in eighth place on the CAA all-time chart. He also ranks 12th in Delaware history with 294 career three-pointers attempted and 14th with 103 made, is 13th with 2,821 career minutes played, and 37th with 832 career points. Slattery currently ranks ninth at UD with 138 career steals.
