**Mike Slattery** returned to the lineup at Towson after missing five straight games with a broken right thumb. **Lebo Maepa** returned Saturday at Hofstra after missing 10 games due to surgery on his left knee to repair a small tear in his miniscus. **Henry Olawoye** has missed the first 18 games of the season with compartmental syndrome, and is expected to be out of the lineup today. **Herb Courtney**, who tore his ACL late last season, and **Chris Prothro**, who needed surgery during the preseason to heal an ankle fracture, will both redshirt this year. **Delaware has missed 69 combined games this season by these five scholarship players.**

## Delaware on the Air

This season will be the first year that all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on flagship station The River 94.7 FM. Also on the Blue Hen radio network are WDOV-AM 1410 (Dover) and WTGM-AM (Salisbury, MD). Mike Corey and Bill Komissaroff, who enter their sixth year on the network, return to call the action.

In addition, most UD basketball games are also broadcast on the university student station, WVUD-FM 91.3, and WVUD2, the station's internet radio network.

Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through UD's athletics website.

Delaware is scheduled to play five games on television this season. Both the February 19 home game against Hofstra and the February 22 game at Drexel will be broadcast by the Colonial Athletic Association Network; each of those games are scheduled to be shown on both Comcast SportsNet-Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic. Additionally, the home game against Towson on February 9 will be shown by CN8. Delaware's season-opener at Ohio State was broadcast by ESPN Plus, while Saturday's game at Hofstra was broadcast by Fox Sports Net - New York.

Additionally, a majority of Delaware home games are shown on STN, the student television network that is shown on campus.

## Delaware vs. Old Dominion

The all-time series with the Blue Hens and Monarchs is tied at 4-4, but Delaware has won four of the six meetings since joining the league. The Blue Hens won the first meeting last year, 64-62, in Newark when Mike Ames buried a three-pointer from the left corner with 1.8 seconds left and Alex Loughton's 25-footer at the buzzer rimmed out. Delaware trailed 50-38 with 12:28 remaining but went on a 16-4 run to get back in the game.

Old Dominion took the rematch in Norfolk, 85-74, as Isaiah Hunter and Alex Loughton combined for 46 points.

## Rulon Washington Named CAA Player of the Week

Delaware junior guard **Rulon Washington** was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week last Monday after leading the Blue Hens to a pair over George Mason and James Madison.

Washington scored 14 points in the Blue Hens' 81-78 overtime win over George Mason on January 12, and hit a game-winning three-pointer from the right corner with two seconds left. He then tied his career-high by scoring a game-best 20 points in the 75-40 victory over James Madison on January 15, hitting 7-of-9 shots from the field including 6-of-8 from behind the arc.

Washington, who was 10-of-18 from three-point range on the week, also dished out four assists and had one steal in Delaware's two victories.

The award was the third of the season for a Delaware player, as **Harding Nana** was named the CAA Co-Player of the Week on December 13 and January 10.

## Blue Hens Face Tough Non-Conference Schedule

Delaware went just 3-8 against a tough non-conference schedule this season. Ohio State is currently 12-7 and on January 8 posted an 81-69 win over 14th-ranked Iowa. St. Mary's (CA) is 17-5, and on January 8 knocked off No. 11 Gonzaga, 89-81. The Gaels are currently ranked fifth in the latest College Insider Mid-Major Top 25 poll. San Francisco is 12-6 and on Thursday upset the 11th-ranked Zags 73-70, while Auburn is currently 9-8. Toledo is just 7-8 but was picked to win the West Division of the Mid-American Conference, while Middle Tennessee State is 12-7 and was picked to win the East Division of the Sun Belt Conference.

## Delaware Struggling To Light Up Scoreboard

The Blue Hens have scored over 70 points just four times this season and earlier this year went nine games without reaching the 70-point plateau, the longest stretch since a nine-game streak in the 1989-90 season. Delaware is currently eighth in the CAA with 64.2 points per game, which would be the lowest total since the Blue Hens averaged 58.4 points per game during the 1982-83 season. The Blue Hens are allowing 68.4 points per game and are on pace to allow more points than they score for the first time since the 1986-87 season.

## Slattery Helping UD Take Care Of The Rock

With senior point guard **Mike Slattery** out of the lineup with a broken thumb, Delaware struggled with turnovers at the San Juan Shootout. The Blue Hens turned the ball over 26 times in the opening game against Auburn, and the following day committed 28 turnovers against Toledo, the most since Delaware also turned the ball over 28 times versus Delaware State on November 26, 1994. The Blue Hens then committed 19 turnovers against Middle Tennessee State, including two in the final 10 seconds of overtime. Delaware committed 18 turnovers in the loss to UMBC on December 29.

Delaware committed more or equal turnovers than its opponents in the first 11 games of the season before committing just 13 while American committed 18 on January 2. As of January 3, Delaware ranked 311 out of 326 teams in Division I with 19.0 turnovers committed per game. However, during the week Slattery returned to the UD lineup, the Blue Hens committed just 27 turnovers in the two games, including a season-low 11 on January 8 at William & Mary. Delaware again turned the ball over just 11 times in the overtime win over George Mason on January 12, and had just 12 Saturday at Hofstra. ## Nana Continues Impressive Season

Junior **Harding Nana** has been a force for Delaware this season, leading the Blue Hens in scoring in 14 of the 18 games this season and posting double-doubles in 12 of the last 14 games.

Nana was 9-of-12 from the field against Mount St. Mary's, hitting his first six shots from the field. He also connected on his final two shots at Ohio State, and his eight consecutive field goals made are the sixth-most in Delaware history.

Nana pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds at Loyola and hit two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to put Delaware up four.

In the game at St. Mary's (CA) Nana hit 9-of-13 shots from the field, and he posted his first double-double of the season with a 20-point, 10-rebound performance at San Francisco. He followed up that performance with game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds against Drexel. Nana tied for the team lead with 19 points, grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds, and scored the game-winning basket against Rider. His performances against Drexel and Rider earned him the CAA Co-Player of the Week award on December 13.

Nana scored a career-high 30 points on 10-of-13 shooting against Toledo while pulling down 11 rebounds, and posted 19 points and while tying his career-high with 14 rebounds versus Middle Tennessee State. He led the Blue Hens in rebounding in all three games in San Juan.

Against UMBC Nana scored 25 points on 10-of-16 shooting and pulled down 11 rebounds, both team-highs. He again posted game-highs of 24 points and a career-best 16 rebounds in the loss to American, and had team-highs of 24 points and 10 boards at Towson.

Nana recorded game-highs of 25 points and 10 rebounds in the Blue Hens' 69-59 win at William & Mary, and again posted game-highs of 20 points and 12 rebounds against George Mason, his fifth straight 20-plus point game. That streak was snapped against James Madison, but Nana again recorded a double-double with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

Nana then scored a game-high 29 points and nailed a career-high six three-pointers against Virginia Commonwealth last Wednesday, and added a team-high 19 points to go with a game-best 12 rebounds at Hofstra Saturday.

**Nana currently leads the CAA with 10.2 rebounds per game and 20.2 points per game. As of January 17, Nana was one of 13 players in Division I to be averaging a double-double. Through Monday's games, Nana and Andrew Bogut of Utah were the only players in Division I to be averaging at least 20 points and 10 rebounds per game.**

## Andrew Washington Contributes Immediately

Junior **Andrew Washington**, who played his first two seasons at Allen Community College in Kansas, has made an immediate impact in his first year with the Blue Hens. Washington, who has started all 18 games this season, currently ranks second on the team and 18th in the CAA with 11.6 points per game. Washington scored 10 points in his Delaware debut at Ohio State, and led the Blue Hens with 26 points in the 63-60 win at Loyola (MD) on November 29. He scored 14 points on 7-of-14 shooting and added a career-high six rebounds at San Francisco. Washington scored 15 points against Drexel, and added 17 points and a game-high four steals in the win over Rider.

Washington exploded for 25 points on 9-of-16 shooting against Middle Tennessee State, and hit a three-pointer at the regulation buzzer to send the game into overtime. He added 13 points, hitting all eight of his free throw attempts, in the loss to UMBC.

Washington scored 24 points at William & Mary, including 11 straight UD points from the 9:18 to the 4:30 mark of the second half. With the Blue Hens up six, his steal and breakaway dunk with 15 seconds remaining put the game away for Delaware. Washington scored 16 points while playing 40 minutes against George Mason last Wednesday and dished out four assists, including one on **Robin Wentt's** dunk that gave Delaware a two-point lead in the final minute of regulation. On January 19 Washington pulled down a career-high nine rebounds against Virginia Commonwealth.

## Rulon Makes His Point

With **Mike Slattery** injured, junior guard **Rulon Washington** made his first five career starts prior to the Towson game, averaging 35.4 minutes per game in the five contests. Washington played all 40 minutes against Auburn, and was on the court for 42 of the 45 minutes in the overtime loss to Middle Tennessee State. Washington scored a team-high 12 points against the Tigers and added 14 versus the Blue Raiders, including a 3-of-5 performance from three-point range. He played 39 minutes against American on January 2, scoring 14 points, posting four assists and four steals, and tying the school record with 13 three-point attempts. On January 5 at Towson he came off the bench to score 14 points, second on the team, in 33 minutes of action.

Rulon was back in the starting lineup at William & Mary, scoring six points on a pair of huge three-pointers and tying his season-high with four assists. The Tribe led 55-53, but Washington nailed a three-pointer to put Delaware up 56-55 with 3:09 to play. William & Mary went back up 57-56, but Washington hit another triple to put UD ahead for good at 59-57 with 2:28 left, igniting a 13-2 Blue Hen run to end the game.

Washington again started against George Mason, scoring 14 points and hitting the game-winning three-pointer with two seconds remaining in overtime. He then tied his career-high with a game-best 20 points on January 15 against James Madison, hitting 6-of-8 shots from behind the arc.

## Washingtons Hit Big Threes In Clutch

On December 22 at the San Juan Shootout, the Blue Hens trailed Middle Tennessee State by three points with four seconds remaining. However, **Andrew Washington** took an inbounds pass and buried a three-pointer from the top of the key at the buzzer to send the game into overtime.

On January 12 the Blue Hens and George Mason were tied at 78-78 when **Rulon Washington** nailed a three-pointer with two seconds remaining to give Delaware a win over the Patriots. The shot was not the first dramatic three-pointer hit by Rulon in his career. Last season the Blue Hens trailed William & Mary at home before Rulon beat the buzzer with a three-pointer to force overtime in a game Delaware went on to win, 93-82. Additionally, Washington hit a three-pointer in the final minute of the first overtime and tied the game with nine seconds to go in the second overtime during last season's 71-69 double-overtime loss to Virginia Commonwealth.

## Comeback Kids

Delaware has trailed at the half in 14 of its 18 games this season (the Blue Hens have led only Mount St. Mary's, Middle Tennessee State, American and James Madison at the break), but has rallied to overcome a deficit at the half five times. The Blue Hens trailed Loyola (MD) 35-27 at the half, but quickly scored the first eight points of the second half to tie the game. The Greyhounds regained the lead at 38-36, but Delaware responded with an 11-4 run and would not trail again.

The Blue Hens trailed Drexel 38-36 at the break, but after the teams were tied at 57-57 with 6:23 remaining, Delaware scored six straight points and held the lead the rest of the way.

UD was down to Rider 40-30 at the half on December 11, but scored 13 of the first 16 points of the second period to quickly draw even. The Blue Hens did not trail in the final three minutes to post their third comeback win of the season.

The Blue Hens were down at William & Mary 30-23 at the half, and the Tribe extended their advantage to 38-25 with 16:02 remaining. However, Delaware responded with a 20-5 run to take a 45-43 lead with 8:28 to play. William & Mary led 57-56 with 2:40 on the clock, but the Blue Hens closed the game with a 13-2 run to secure the victory.

Delaware trailed George Mason, 34-33, at the half last Wednesday, but did not trail in the final 9:44 of regulation. The Patriots led 78-76 with 1:35 left in overtime, but **Harding Nana** hit two free throws with 44 seconds to go to tie the game and **Rulon Washington** hit a three-pointer with two seconds left to win it for the Blue Hens.

Delaware came up just short in its comeback attempt last Wednesday against Virginia Commonwealth. The Blue Hens trailed the Rams 52-36 with 10:30 remaining before going on a 16-2 run to get within 54-52 before VCU pulled away late.

## Don't Leave Early

Last season Delaware finished 3-5 in games decided by two points or less, while 13 of its 28 games were decided by five points or fewer (UD went 7-6 in those games). Additionally the Blue Hens, who won three of their five overtime contests, played 11 games when the outcome was decided in the final five seconds of regulation and/or overtime, posting a 6-5 mark in those games.

That trend has continued this season, as four games have been decided at the buzzer or in overtime. The Blue Hens held off Loyola (MD), 63-60, when the Greyhounds' Charlie Bell missed a three-pointer from the top of the key at the buzzer.

Delaware didn't clinch its 67-65 win over Drexel until the final horn, as the Dragons' Bashir Mason had his driving lay-up roll off the rim. With the Blue Hens up 68-66 over Rider in the final seconds, **Calvin Smith** blocked a three-point attempt by the Broncs' Jerry Johnson out of bounds with 1.9 seconds remaining, and Terrance Mouton's fallaway three-pointer at the buzzer fell short.

The Blue Hens trailed Middle Tennessee State 61-58 with four seconds remaining, but **Andrew Washington** took the inbounds pass and buried a three-pointer at the buzzer to force overtime. Delaware led 69-68 in the extra session after a steal and breakaway lay-up by **Harding Nana**, but the Blue Raiders' Mike Dean buried a three-pointer with 37 seconds left to put MTSU up for good.

On January 12 Delaware led George Mason 69-61 with 2:22 remaining, but the Patriots quickly answered with an 8-0 run to tie the game at 69-69 with 1:13 left. **Andrew Washington** then found **Robin Wentt** for a dunk to put Delaware up two with 51 seconds left, but Jai Lewis responded with a lay-up with 37 seconds on the clock. After the Blue Hens committed a shot clock violation, Tony Skinn's driving lay-up at the buzzer rolled off the rim to force overtime.

The Patriots led 78-76 with 1:35 remaining in the extra session, but Nana tied the game with a pair of free throws and, following a miss by Lewis, **Rulon Washington** nailed a three-pointer with two seconds left to give UD the win.

## On The Road Again

Delaware certainly racked up the frequent flier miles early this season, playing seven of its first 10 games away from the Carpenter Center. The Blue Hens traveled 770 round trip miles to Columbus, OH for their season-opener at Ohio State, and in early December flew 2503 miles to and from San Francisco, CA. Delaware flew 1575 miles to and from San Juan, Puerto Rico just before the holidays. Add in a 104-mile round trip bus ride to Loyola, and UD traveled 9030 miles and made three plane trips prior to the holidays.

## Hens Third In CAA In Shooting

The Blue Hens shot 36.7 percent from three-point range last season but has struggled from behind the arc this year. UD is tied for eighth in the league with a 32.4 three-point percentage and is eighth with 5.56 three-pointers made per game.

However, the Blue Hens are shooting 49.2 percent from inside the arc this season and overall are shooting 43.9 percent from the field, third in the conference. In the home opener against Mount St. Mary's, the Blue Hens shot close to 70 percent through the first 30 minutes of the game and finished 28-of-39 from inside the arc (71.8%). In fact Delaware, which shot 58.5 percent for the game despite hitting just 3-of-14 three-point attempts, missed the same number of two-point shots as three-point attempts.

## Nana Among NCAA Leaders

Through Monday's games, **Harding Nana** was 10th in Division I with 10.2 rebounds per game and tied for 17th with 20.2 points per game.

## Blue Hens Compete In 100th Year of Basketball

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th year for the Delaware men's basketball program. Including this season, the Blue Hens have posted an overall record of 996-1056-2 in their first century of basketball, have made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one to the Postseason NIT, and have won 20 games six times, the last coming during **David Henderson's** first season in 2000-01 when UD went 20-10.

## Mister Assister

**Mike Slattery** took over the starting point guard spot during the second half of his freshman year, and finished the season with 94 assists.

He led the CAA and ranked 18th in Division I with 6.2 assists per game as a sophomore, while playing 35.7 minutes per game.

Last season Slattery again led the league while ranking 21st in the nation with 5.9 assists per game, and also led the conference with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio.

**This season Slattery is averaging 6.9 assists per game, which would be tied for 10th in Division I if he had competed in enough games to qualify for the rankings.**

Since taking over the starting spot, in 82 starts Slattery has 487 assists and just 206 turnovers for a 2.36 assist/turnover ratio. In those 82 starts, he has had more turnovers than assists just six times, and has seven games with 10 or more assists in his career.

Slattery is the third player in UD history to record 500 career assists, and was just the second Blue Hen to reach the 400-assist plateau before his senior season. He currently is second in Delaware history with 529 career assists.

Against UNC Greensboro during his sophomore year Slattery posted a career-high 15 assists, the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years, tied for the sec-

ond-highest single-game total in UD history, and a Carpenter Center record. In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of the CAA record. He duplicated that performance in UD's home win over William & Mary, making Slattery one of two players in the nation to record multiple 15-assist games.

## Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 426 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (536 of 541) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. Delaware's streak has been in jeopardy this season, as the Blue Hens hit just 1-of-13 three-point attempts against Loyola (MD), went just 2-of-11 from behind the arc against St. Mary's (CA), and were 1-of-14 versus Auburn.

## Reaching No. 10

Delaware has won at least 10 games in 22 straight seasons, dating back to 1981-82. Drexel, which has won 10 or more games in 30 consecutive years, is the only CAA school with a longer streak.

## Slattery Moving Up UD Career Charts

**Mike Slattery** had appeared in his first 94 games at Delaware and had started 76 consecutive contests, just six shy of the Delaware record of 82 set by Taurence Chisholm from 1984 through 1988 and Mike Ames from 2000 through 2004, before missing five games with a broken right thumb. Slattery currently is in second place on the UD list with 524 career assists and is in sixth place on the CAA all-time chart. He also ranks sixth at UD with 153 career steals, 10th with 3,061 career minutes played, tied for 11th with both 308 career three-pointers attempted and with 110 career three-pointers made, and 29th with 893 career points.
