The season is just beginning, but Delaware has already suffered its share of injuries this season. **Chris Prothro** needed surgery to heal an ankle fracture and will probably miss the entire season. **Herb Courtney**, who tore his ACL late last season, is out until at least December, while **Henry Olawoye** is also out until mid to late December with compartmental syndrome. **Harding Nana** battled a strained groin injury most of the preseason and missed the Blue Hens' exhibition game, but is expected to play tonight. **Rulon Washington** (bruised ankle bone) and **Sam McMahon** (strained hamstring) also missed the exhibition game but are both expected to be in the lineup.

## Delaware on the Air

This season will be the first year that all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on flagship station WRDX 94.7 FM. Also on the Blue Hen radio network are WDOV-AM 1410 (Dover) and WTGM-AM (Salisbury, MD). Mike Corey and Bill Komissaroff, who enter their sixth year on the network, return to call the action.

In addition, most UD basketball games are also broadcast on the university student station, WVUD-FM 91.3, and WVUD2, the station's internet radio network.

Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through UD's athletics website.

Delaware is scheduled to play four games on television this season, including tonight's game which will be broadcast by ESPN Plus (Tom Hamilton and Bill Hosket will call the action). The Blue Hens' game at Hofstra on January 22 will be televised by Fox Sports Net-New York, while both the February 19 game with the Pride and the February 22 game at Drexel will be broadcast by the Colonial Athletic Association Network. Both of those games are scheduled to be shown on both Comcast SportsNet-Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic.

Additionally, all Delaware home games are shown on STN, the student television network that is shown on campus.

## For Openers

Delaware is 49-50 all-time in season-openers, including 2-2 under David Henderson. Last season the Blue Hens opened with a 75-72 overtime victory at Mount St. Mary's.

Delaware is 8-2 in its last 10 season-openers, and haven't lost consecutive season-openers since the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons.

## Another Road Opener

Delaware opens its 100th season of men's basketball, and once again it is on the road.

The Blue Hens have not played a season-opener at home since the 1996-97 season (a 91-63 win over Delaware State on November 22, 1996). Tonight mark the eighth straight year that Delaware will open on the road.

## Blue Hens Defeat Widener, 100-62, In Exhibition

Junior college transfer **Andrew Washington** erupted for a game-high 31 points and added seven rebounds, seven assists, and six steals as the University of Delaware men's basketball team opened its 2004-05 exhibition season with a 100-62 victory over NCAA Division III Widener at the Bob Carpenter Center on November 5.

Washington, a transfer from Allen (KS) Community College and native of Washington, DC, hit on 13 of 17 shots from the field, including two three-pointers, to lead the Blue Hens in the easy victory. The Blue Hens shot 56.5 percent from the field (39 of 69) and held a 50-34 rebounding advantage to post the victory.

Five Blue Hens scored in double figures as Washington was joined by **Raphael Madera** with 15 points and seven rebounds, **Mike Slattery** with 12 points and seven assists, **Calvin Smith** with 13 points and four blocks, and **Lebo Maepa**, who came off the bench to score 11 points and pull nine rebounds. **Robin Wentt** led all rebounders with 12 and added seven points.

Widener, which went 18-8 a year ago in NCAA Division III, got a team-high 22 points and seven rebounds off the bench from Ron Michael while Matt Sheaffer added 12 points, including two three-pointers. The Pioneers, who committed 20 turnovers and shot just 37.5 percent from the field, hit just 9 of 32 first half shots and went into halftime down 54-27 to the Blue Hens.

Delaware, which dressed only seven scholarship players due to injuries, didn't pull away until midway through the first half when the Blue Hens outscored Widener 20-6 during an eight-minute stretch to go up 39-15 with 6:09 left before halftime. Washington scored 16 of his 31 points in the opening 20 minutes as UD converted 21 of 34 shots from the field. Delaware led by as much as 46 points twice in the second half.

## Delaware vs. Ohio State

Ohio State won the only previous meeting between the schools, 109-38, on January 11, 1960 in Columbus, still the largest margin of defeat in Blue Hen history. The fourth-ranked Buckeyes raced out to a 57-16 halftime lead despite missing guard Jerry Lucas, who was averaging 28 points per game but sat out the contest with an ankle injury. Bobby Knight scored a team-high 15 points while John Havlicek added 13 for Ohio State, which set a school record for most points scored in a game.

## Blue Hens vs. Big Ten

Delaware will be looking for its first ever win over a Big Ten opponent tonight, as UD enters the game 0-16 all-time against Big Ten opponents. The Blue Hens are 0-2 against Michigan and 0-1 against Ohio State, Iowa, Indiana, and Purdue, losing those games by an average of 35 points. Delaware is also 0-10 all-time against Penn State, although the teams have not met since the Nittany Lions joined the league. The last time the Blue Hens faced a Big Ten opponent was in the 1998 NCAA Tournament First Round, when second-seeded Purdue posted a 95-56 win over 15th-seeded Delaware at the United Center in Chicago, IL.

## Slattery, Nana Earn Preseason Recognition

**Mike Slattery** was a first team Preseason All-CAA selection by *Street & Smith's*, *Lindy's*, and *CBS Sportsline* magazines, and was a second team pick by *The Sporting News*. Additionally, Slattery was named the league's Top Playmaker by *Street & Smith's*, while junior **Harding Nana** was named first team Preseason All-CAA by *The Sporting News*.

## Blue Hens Enter 100th Year

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th year for the Delaware men's basketball program. The Blue Hens have posted an overall record of 989-1045-2 in their first 99 years, have made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one to the Postseason NIT, and have won 20 games six times, the last coming during David Henderson's first season in 2000-01 when UD went 20-10.

## Cardiac Kids

Delaware played eight games that were decided by two points or less last season, not including two overtime games that were decided by seven and 11 points. Additionally, the Blue Hens played 11 games when the outcome was decided in the final five seconds of regulation and/or overtime, posting a 6-5 mark in those games.

**Nov. 21 at Mount St. Mary's:** The Mountaineers' Charles Cook forced the extra session by hitting a three-pointer with three seconds remaining in regulation, but the Blue Hens prevailed in overtime, 75-72.

**Nov. 30 vs. San Francisco:** The Dons' Andre Hazel hit a fall-away jumper

just before the final buzzer to give San Francisco a 74-72 win in the Blue Hens' home opener.

**Jan. 10 at Towson:** The Tigers' Jamaal Gilchrist converted a driving lay-up with 4.4 seconds to go and **Chris Prothro** missed a three-pointer at the buzzer as Towson defeated Delaware, 70-68. UD had trailed, 56-45, with 7:59 to play before rallying to take the lead with 53 seconds left.

**Jan. 17 vs. Old Dominion:** **Mike Ames** buried a three-pointer with just 1.8 seconds left as the Blue Hens came back to defeat the Monarchs, 70-68. Delaware trailed, 50-38, with 12:28 remaining.

**Jan. 21 vs. William & Mary:** **Rulon Washington's** three-pointer with 0.9 seconds left capped a furious rally to force overtime, and Delaware went on to defeat the Tribe, 93-82. The Blue Hens trailed 71-63 with 1:15 left in regulation but forced the extra session by hitting three three-pointers in the final 21 seconds.

**Jan. 24 at UNC Wilmington:** Delaware almost made it three incredible wins in a row but fell short to the Seahawks, 50-49. The Blue Hens trailed by four in the final seconds, but **Robin Wentt** converted a three-point play with 6.7 seconds remaining and John Goldsberry missed a free throw to give UD a chance. However, Washington mishandled a pass and missed a 25-footer at the buzzer.

**Jan. 31 at James Madison:** **Herb Courtney** followed a miss by **Mike Slattery** to beat the buzzer and give the Blue Hens a 63-61 win over the Dukes.

**Feb. 4 at Hofstra:** **Mike Ames** missed a three-pointer with 10 seconds left that would have tied the game, as Hofstra held on for a 63-61 victory.

**Feb. 7 vs. Towson:** **Mike Ames** drained a three-pointer with three seconds remaining to force overtime in UD's 80-76 extra session win over the Tigers. The Blue Hens trailed 63-57 with 2:17 left.

**Feb. 16 vs. UNC Wilmington:** **David Lunn** intercepted a pass in the lane by UNCW's John Goldsberry with 1.7 seconds left and ran out the clock as Delaware held off the Seahawks, 62-61.

**Feb. 21 vs. Virginia Commonwealth:** Delaware rallied from an eight-point second-half deficit to take a three-point lead with 32 seconds left, only to have VCU tie it on a fallaway jumper by Dominic Jones with six seconds left. **Rulon Washington** hit a three-pointer in the final minute of the first overtime and again tied the game with a three with nine seconds left in the second extra session, but Nick George scored on a follow of a Derrick Reid miss at the buzzer to give the Rams a 71-69 double overtime win.

**Mar. 6 vs. George Mason:** The Blue Hens ended the season the way they started, with another overtime game in the CAA Quarterfinals against George Mason. Delaware trailed by as many as 13 points, but **Mike Slattery** forced overtime by hitting a driving lay-up with 3.5 seconds left before the Patriots pulled away in overtime to win, 65-58.

Last season Delaware finished 3-5 in games decided by two points or less, while 13 of its 28 games were decided by five points or fewer (7-6). The Blue Hens also won three of their five overtime games.

## Mister Assister

**Mike Slattery** took over the starting point guard spot during the second half of his freshman year, and finished the season with 94 assists.

He led the CAA and ranked 18th in in Division I with 6.2 assists per game as a sophomore, while playing 35.7 minutes per game.

Last season Slattery again led the league while ranking 21st in the nation with 5.9 assists per game, and also led the conference with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio.

Since taking over the starting spot, in 69 starts Slattery has 397 assists and just 171 turnovers for a 2.32 assist/turnover ratio. In those 69 starts, he has had more turnovers than assists just five times, and has six games with 10 or more assists in his career.

Slattery is the fourth player in UD history to record 400 career assists, and only the second to do it before his senior season. He enters the season ranked third at Delaware with 439 career assists.

Against UNC Greensboro during his sophomore year Slattery posted a career-high 15 assists, the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years, tied for the second-highest single-game total in UD history, and a Carpenter Center record. In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of the CAA record. He duplicated that performance in UD's home win over William & Mary, making Slattery one of two players in the nation to record multiple 15-assist games.

## Delaware Bench-Marks

**David Henderson** has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's four seasons at UD, the Blue Hen bench has scored in double figures in 111 of 117 games. Delaware's bench had scored in double figures in 71 straight games until being held to just eight points in the Blue Hens' 80-66 win over James Madison on January 12.

In the 2001-02 season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 points per game and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games, while in 2002-03 Delaware's bench averaged 25.1 points per game, 8.4 more than the opposition.

Last season Delaware got 20 or more points from its bench in 18 games.

## Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 409 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (519 of 524) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87.

## Reaching No. 10

Delaware has won at least 10 games in 22 straight seasons, dating back to 1981-82. Drexel, which has won 10 or more games in 30 consecutive years, is the only CAA school with a longer streak.

## Slattery Moving Up UD Career Charts

**Mike Slattery** has appeared in all 87 games during his first three seasons at Delaware and has started 69 consecutive contests, just 13 shy of the Delaware record of 82 set by Taurence Chisholm from 1984 through 198 and Mike Ames from 2000 through 2004. Slattery begins the season third on the UD list with 439 career assists and is just 18 helpers shy of 10th place on the CAA all-time chart. He also ranks 12th in Delaware history with 273 career three-pointers attempted and 14th with 95 made, is 18th with 2,572 career minutes played, and 43rd with 768 career points.

## Nana Starts, Ends Strong

Junior **Harding Nana** transfer from Virginia Tech, made the most of his Blue Hen debut on December 23 last year by scoring 21 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the field, including 3-of-5 from three-point range.

It was the first time a player scored 20 points in his Delaware debut since Keith Davis scored 24 against Delaware State on November 22, 1996 - Davis' first game after transferring to Delaware from Virginia Commonwealth.

Nana then closed the regular season by posting four straight double-doubles, including a 28-point (season-high), 10-rebound effort in the regular season finale win over Drexel that helped him earn CAA Co-Player of the Week honors.

## Not Just Basketball Smart

In addition to earning recognition for his outstanding play on the court, **Mike Slattery** has also been recognized for his academic accomplishments. Last season Slattery was named to the Verizon/CoSIDA District II All-Academic First Team, and has earned Colonial Athletic Association All-Academic Team honors in each of the last two years. Slattery, a sports management major, will be a candidate for both teams again this season.

## Home Sweet Home

Delaware has enjoyed tremendous success at the Bob Carpenter Center since the building opened prior to the 1992-93 season.

The Blue Hens have won 75 of their last 91 games on their home floor and are 127-35 (.784) at home in the BCC's 12 seasons.

That success has continued under David Henderson, as Delaware is 37-15 at home during Henderson's tenure.

UD has lost consecutive home games just four times since the BCC opened in December 1992 and has never lost three straight at home at the BCC.

**NEWARK, DE** -- Nick George tipped-in a missed three-point attempt just before the final buzzer as league-leading VCU stunned Delaware in double overtime...Delaware's Rulon Washington, who sent the game into the second extra session with a three-pointer in the final minute of the first overtime, deadlocked the game once again with a three-pointer with nine seconds left in the final period...VCU raced down the court with Derrick Reid launching a three-pointer from the left corner...the ball bounced off the front of the rim but George was there to tip the ball in just before the final buzzer sounded...the officials reviewed the replay on a court-side monitor for several minutes before declaring the basket good...the Hens rallied from a seven-point deficit with nine minutes left in regulation to take the lead, only to see the game go into overtime when VCU's Domicion Jones (21 points), sent the game into an extra session with a layup with six seconds left...the Hens had the chance to win the game in regulation but Washington missed two three-pointers in the final four seconds, knotting the score at 55-55...the Rams (19-7, 13-4 CAA) stayed in a tie for first place in the CAAstandings with Drexel...Troy Godwin added 17 points and nine rebounds for the Rams while George hit on 7 of 9 shots from the field and finished with 15 points and a team-high 12 rebounds...Mike Slattery, who gave Delaware a 55-53 lead in the closing seconds of the second half with two free throws, finished with a career-high 24 points and dished out nine assists while Harding Nana added 14 points and a team-high 12 rebounds for his fourth straight double-double, and Washington came off the bench to add 12 more points...the loss snapped a streak of six straight wins for Delaware in double overtime games and was the Hens' fourth game this season that went into overtime...VCU led most of the first overtime session and went up by six points at 63-57 on a free throw by Godwin with 2:42 remaining...Nana followed with a layup to cut the lead to four and Washington followed with a three-pointer with 1:24 remaining to pull the Hens to within 63-62...Jones followed with a jumper to put VCU up 65-62, but Washington struck again from long range just 17 seconds later with a three-pointer that tied the game at 65-65...Jones' three-pointer from top of the key just before the buzzer missed...the Rams led the entire second overtime period, going up 69-66 with 1:47 remaining...Reid missed two free throws with 31 seconds left to give the Hens a chance to tie and they took advantage...Washington missed a three-pointer but Nana rebounded and fed him again for another three-attempt which was good, knotting the score at 69-69.

**NEWARK, DE** -- Harding Nana exploded for a career-high 28 points and pulled 10 rebounds for his fourth straight double-double as Delaware closed out the regular season with the hard-fought win over long-time rival Drexel...Delaware, which improved to 16-11 (10-8) and earned the No. 6 seed for the upcoming CAA Tournament in Richmond, VA, jumped out to a 30-21 halftime lead and held off a late Drexel surge for the victory...the Hens hit 13 of 20 shots from the field (65 percent) in the second half and finished at 52 percent (26 of 50) for the game and held a commanding 43-29 advantage on the boards...guard Rulon Washington came off the bench to add 11 points for the Hens while forward Robin Wentt pulled a game-high 13 rebounds and Mike Slattery and senior Mike Ames, playing in his final game at home, each chipped in with 11...the Hens, who overcame 20 turnovers, defeated Drexel for the first time in the last four meetings...Drexel, which will now be the No. 2 seed in the CAA quarterfinals behind VCU, had a three-game win streak snapped and lost for just the second time in its last 11 games...guard Tim Whitworth kept the Dragons in the game with 22 points, including 15 in the first half when he connected on five three-pointers...guard Jeremiah King added 15 points and a game-high eight assists...Drexel shot just 33.3 percent from the field for the game (18 of 54) and connected on just 19 of 31 free throws...Drexel led 10-8 midway through the first half before the Blue Hens charged back with a 8-2 run that put them up for good at 21-12 with 7:04 left...Washington started the spurt with a three-pointer and later added a layup for the Hens...the nine-point lead held until intermission despite the hot-shooting of Whitworth...a quick start in the second half for the Hens upheld the lead to 13 points at 37-24 as Nana scored five points in the first four minutes of the half...Drexel rallied and cut the lead to five points several times, pulling to within 42-37 with 11:59 remaining on two free throws by Jermaine Miller...but back came Delaware once again to increase the lead to 15 points at 57-42 with 7:48 left thanks to a 15-5 run that started on consecutive three-pointers by Washington and Slattery and a dunk by Nana...Nana closed the run with another layup and Drexel never got closer than eight point the rest of the way.
