Injury Report

Mike Slattery suffered a broken thumb against Rider and is out at least two more weeks, when he will be reevaluated. **Lebo Maepa** underwent surgery on his left knee on Thursday to repair a small tear in his miniscus, and will miss the next two to four weeks. **Henry Olawoye** has missed the first seven games this season with compartmental syndrome, but could be back as early as next week. **Herb Courtney**, who tore his ACL late last season, is out indefinitely and could redshirt this season. **Chris Prothro** needed surgery during the preseason to heal an ankle fracture, and will also redshirt this year.

With five players out of the lineup, Delaware has just eight scholarship players available for the San Juan Shootout.

Delaware on the Air

This season will be the first year that all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on flagship station WRDX 94.7 FM. Also on the Blue Hen radio network are WDOV-AM 1410 (Dover) and WTGM-AM (Salisbury, MD). Mike Corey and Bill Komissaroff, who enter their sixth year on the network, return to call the action.

In addition, most UD basketball games are also broadcast on the university student station, WVUD-FM 91.3, and WVUD2, the station's internet radio network.

Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through UD's athletics website.

Delaware is scheduled to play four games on television this season. The Blue Hens' game at Hofstra on January 22 will be televised by Fox Sports Net-New York, while both the February 19 home game with the Pride and the February 22 game at Drexel will be broadcast by the Colonial Athletic Association Network. Each of those games are scheduled to be shown on both Comcast SportsNet-Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic. Delaware's season-opener at Ohio State was broadcast by ESPN Plus.

Additionally, all Delaware home games are shown on STN, the student television network that is shown on campus.

Delaware vs. Auburn

The Tigers defeated the Blue Hens, 95-63, on December 22, 1984 in the consolation game of the Krystal Classic in Chattanooga, TN, in the only previous meeting between the teams. Auburn's Chuck Person, who went on to win NBA Rookie of the Year honors in the 1986-87 season while with the Indiana Pacers, posted game-highs of 33 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Tigers to the easy victory.

Blue Hens vs. The Southeastern Conference

Delaware is 3-7 all-time against teams in the Southeastern Conference, although when the Blue Hens defeated South Carolina, 84-72, in 1978, the Gamecocks were not yet a member of the SEC. Delaware has also won two of its last three meetings with teams from the SEC, with the only loss in that stretch coming to fourth-seeded Tennessee in the first round of the 1999 NCAA Tournament. The Blue Hens' played Florida as a member of the America East conference, and posted the league's first-ever victory over an SEC school by defeating the Gators. One other note: the 117 points Georgia scored against Delaware are still the most ever allowed by the Blue Hens.

Delaware vs. Toledo

The Rockets hold a 5-0 lead in the all-time series against Delaware, although the teams have met just once since the 1965-66 season. That meeting came on December 29, 1993, as the Rockets posted a 69-65 victory in the first round of the Toledo MVP Holiday Classic. Brian Pearl led four Blue Hen scorers in that game with 19 points.

Blue Hens vs. The MAC

Delaware is 2-9 all-time against teams in the Mid-American Conference, including 0-5 against Toledo. Neither Marshall nor Buffalo were members of the MAC when they faced the Blue Hens. (Marshall was still a member of the Southern Conference, while Buffalo did not compete at the Division I level).

Delaware vs. Middle Tennessee State

Wednesday's game will be the first ever meeting between the Blue Hens and Blue Raiders.

Blue Hens vs. the Sun Belt Conference

Delaware has played just two games against Sun Belt teams - both against the University of New Orleans. The Blue Hens fell to the Privateers, 82-52, on December 28, 1979, and 58-56 on December 22, 1993, with both games taking place in New Orleans.

Blue Hens Return To San Juan

Delaware participated in the 1996 San Juan Shootout, as the Blue Hens finished in fifth place by winning two of their three games. Delaware fell to 10th-ranked Clemson, 78-71, on November 29, despite 31 points and a school-record tying seven three-pointers by Peca Arsic. The Blue Hens rebounded the following day by defeating Tennessee-Chattanooga, 83-74, as Keith Davis scored a game-high 25 points. Delaware then won the fifth-place game by topping Florida, 88-78, as the Blue Hens ended the game on a 31-14 run to erase a seven-point deficit with 10:37 remaining. Arsic scored a game-high 17 points against the Gators and was named to the all-tournament team.

Delaware Outside The United States

The San Juan Shootout marks the fourth trip outside of the United States for the Blue Hens. Delaware fell to Xavier, 74-66, on December 18, 1992, but rebounded to defeat Rice, 71-65, the following day at the NCAA Ball Tournament in Toyko, Japan. The Blue Hens then competed in the 1996 San Juan Shootout at the Caguas Sports Complex, and defeated American, 67-56, on November 29, 1997 at the Bermuda College Gym, the first college basketball game on the island of Bermuda.

Nana Named CAA Co-Player of the Week

Harding Nana was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week last Monday after posting a pair of double-doubles in two Blue Hen wins.

Nana recorded game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds in Delaware's 67-65 win over Drexel on December 8 in the conference opener for both teams, and added an assist and a steal. He also hit two free throws with 33 seconds remaining to give the Blue Hens a 65-62 lead, and Delaware hung on for the win when the Dragons' Bashir Mason missed a driving lay-up at the buzzer.

Nana, who was named the conference co-player of the week once last season, posted his third consecutive double-double with 19 points and a game-best 12 rebounds in the 68-66 victory over Rider on December 11. He also recorded two blocks, an assist and a steal in the all-around effort, and scored what proved to be the game-winning basket by converting a lay-up with 1:13 remaining and the score tied at 66-66.

Delaware Finishes Strong On West Coast

The Blue Hens trailed by double-digit margins during the second half of both games in California, but did not quit. Delaware trailed St. Mary's (CA), 63-40, with 10:40 remaining, but closed the game on an 18-4 run to cut the final margin to nine. The Blue Hens were down 65-49 to San Francisco with just 8:32 to play, but used a 25-12 run to get within 77-74 with 50 seconds remaining. Delaware again pulled within three at 82-79 with three seconds left before the Dons' John Cox put the game away with a pair of free throws.

Nana Starts With A Bang

Junior **Harding Nana**, who posted double-doubles in the final four regular season games last season, has started strong this year. Nana has led the Blue Hens in scoring in six of the first seven games this season, including double-doubles in the last three games against San Francisco (20 pts/10 rebs), Drexel (21 pts/12 rebs), and Rider (19 pts/12 rebs).

Nana was 9-of-12 from the field against Mount St. Mary's, hitting his first six shots from the field. He also hit his final two shots at Ohio State, and his eight consecutive field goals made are the sixth-most in Delaware history.

Nana pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds at Loyola and hit two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to put Delaware up four.

In the game at St. Mary's (CA) Nana hit 9-of-13 shots from the field, and posted his first double-double of the season with a 20-point, 10-rebound performance at San Francisco. He followed up that performance with game-

high of 21 points and 12 rebounds against the Dragons. Nana tied for the team lead with 19 points, grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds, and scored the game-winning basket against Rider.

He currently leads the team with 17.6 points per game, and leads the CAA with 9.0 rebounds per game.

Andrew Washington Contributes Immediately

Junior **Andrew Washington**, who played his first two seasons at Allen Community College in Kansas, has made an immediate impact in his first year with the Blue Hens. Washington, who has started all seven games this season, currently ranks second on the team and 14th in the CAA with 13.1 points per game. Washington scored 10 points in his Delaware debut at Ohio State, and led the Blue Hens with 26 points in the 63-60 win at Loyola (MD) on November 29. He scored 14 points on 7-of-14 shooting and added a career-high six rebounds at San Francisco. Washington scored 15 points, second only to Nana's 21 points, against Drexel, and added 17 points and a game-high four steals in the win over Rider.

Rulon Washington Heating Up

Through the first four games this season, junior guard **Rulon Washington** hit just 3-of-19 shots from the field, including 2-of-15 from three-point range. However, in the last three games Washington has gone 10-for-18 from the field and 9-for-15 from behind the arc. With the Blue Hens down 77-67 to San Francisco with 2:18 remaining, Washington nailed consecutive three-pointers to pull Delaware within four with 1:28 to play. He then scored 10 points against Drexel, and hit two free throws with 19 seconds left to give UD a 67-62 lead. Washington scored 19 points against Rider, one shy of his career-high, and hit five three-pointers in a career-high 31 minutes of action.

Thanks to his recent hot shooting, Washington currently ranks 12th in the CAA with a .367 three-point percentage and 15th with 1.57 three-pointers made per game.

Comeback Kids

Delaware has trailed at the half in six of its seven games this season (the exception being a 40-25 halftime lead against Mount St. Mary's), but has rallied to overcome a deficit at the break three times. The Blue Hens trailed Loyola (MD) 35-27 at the half, but quickly scored the first eight points of the second half to tie the game. The Greyhounds regained the lead at 38-36, but Delaware responded with an 11-4 run and would not trail again.

The Blue Hens trailed Drexel 38-36 at the break, but after the teams were tied at 57-57 with 6:23 remaining, Delaware scored six straight points and held the lead the rest of the way.

UD was down to Rider 40-30 at the half in its last game, but scored 13 of the first 16 points of the second period to quickly draw even. The Blue Hens did not trail in the final three minutes to post their third comeback win of the season.

Don't Leave Early

Last season Delaware finished 3-5 in games decided by two points or less, while 13 of its 28 games were decided by five points or fewer (UD went 7-6 in those games). Additionally the Blue Hens, who won three of their five overtime contests, played 11 games when the outcome was decided in the final five seconds of regulation and/or overtime, posting a 6-5 mark in those games.

That trend has continued this season, as three games have been decided at the buzzer. The Blue Hens held off Loyola (MD), 63-60, when the Greyhounds' Charlie Bell missed a three-pointer from the top of the key at the buzzer.

Delaware didn't clinch its 67-65 win over Drexel until the final horn, as the Dragons' Bashir Mason had his driving lay-up roll off the rim. With the Blue Hens up 68-66 over Rider in the final seconds, **Calvin Smith** blocked a three-point attempt by the Broncs' Jerry Johnson out of bounds with 1.9 seconds remaining, and Terrance Mounon's fallaway three-pointer at the buzzer fell short.

On The Road Again

Delaware is certainly racking up the frequent flier miles early this season. The Blue Hens traveled 770 round trip miles to Columbus, OH for their season-opener at Ohio State, and in early December flew 2503 miles to and from San Francisco, CA. Saturday Delaware flew 1575 miles to Puerto Rico, and will make the return trip home on Thursday. Add in a 104-mile round trip bus ride to Loyola (MD), and by the time the holidays arrive the Blue Hens will have traveled 9030 miles and made three plane trips.

Hot From Inside, Cold From Outside

The Blue Hens shot 36.7 percent from three-point range last season, but currently are last in the league with a 27.2 three-point field goal percentage and 4.43 three-pointers made per game. Delaware entered the San Francisco game just 10-of-59 (16.9 percent) from long distance, but has gone 8-of-19 against the Dons, 6-of-15 versus Drexel, and 7-of-21 against Rider (21-of-55,

38.2 percent).

However, the Blue Hens are shooting 54.1 percent from inside the arc this season, and overall are shooting 45.8 percent from the field, second in the conference. In the home opener against Mount St. Mary's, the Blue Hens shot close to 70 percent through the first 30 minutes of the game and finished 28-of-39 from inside the arc (71.8 percent). In fact, Delaware, which shot 58.5 percent for the game despite hitting just 3-of-14 three-point attempts, missed the same number of two-point shots as three-point attempts.

The Blue Hens were 20-of-40 against Drexel and 17-of-33 versus Rider from two-point range, and have shot 65-of-112 (58.0 percent) from inside the arc in their three home games this year.

Slattery, Nana Among NCAA Leaders

Through games of December 13, **Mike Slattery** was tied for 15th in Division I with 6.43 assists per game, while **Harding Nana** ranked 48th with 9.0 rebounds per game.

Slattery, Nana Earn Preseason Recognition

Mike Slattery was a first team Preseason All-CAA selection by *Street & Smith's*, *Lindy's*, and *CBS Sportsline* magazines, and was a second team pick by *The Sporting News*. Additionally, Slattery was named the league's Top Playmaker by *Street & Smith's*, while junior **Harding Nana** was named first team Preseason All-CAA by *The Sporting News*.

Blue Hens Celebrate 100th Year of Basketball

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th year for the Delaware men's basketball program. Including this season, the Blue Hens have posted an overall record of 993-1048-2 in their first century of basketball, have made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one to the Postseason NIT, and have won 20 games six times, the last coming during **David Henderson's** first season in 2000-01 when UD went 20-10.

Mister Assister

Mike Slattery took over the starting point guard spot during the second half of his freshman year, and finished the season with 94 assists.

He led the CAA and ranked 18th in in Division I with 6.2 assists per game as a sophomore, while playing 35.7 minutes per game.

Last season Slattery again led the league while ranking 21st in the nation with 5.9 assists per game, and also led the conference with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio.

Slattery currently ranks first in the conference and tied for 15th in Division I with 6.43 assists per game.

Since taking over the starting spot, in 76 starts Slattery has 442 assists and just 191 turnovers for a 2.31 assist/turnover ratio. In those 76 starts, he has had more turnovers than assists just six times, and has seven games with 10 or more assists in his career.

Slattery is the fourth player in UD history to record 400 career assists, and only the second to do it before his senior season. He currently ranks third at Delaware with 484 career assists.

Against UNC Greensboro during his sophomore year Slattery posted a career-high 15 assists, the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years, tied for the second-highest single-game total in UD history, and a Carpenter Center record. In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of the CAA record. He duplicated that performance in UD's home win over William & Mary, making Slattery one of two players in the nation to record multiple 15-assist games.

Delaware Bench-Marks

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's five seasons at UD, the Blue Hen bench has scored in double figures in 116 of 124 games. Delaware's bench had scored in double figures in 71 straight games until being held to just eight points in the Blue Hens' 80-66 win over James Madison on January 12, 2004.

In the 2001-02 season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 points per game and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games, while in 2002-03 Delaware's bench averaged 25.1 points per game, 8.4 more than the opposition.

Last season Delaware got 20 or more points from its bench in 18 games.

This season the UD bench has scored in double figures in six of seven games and is averaging 16.4 points per game, while the Blue Hens' opponents are averaging 17.4 points per game.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 415 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (525 of 530) since the imple-

mentation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. Delaware's streak has been in jeopardy this season, as the Blue Hens hit just 1-of-13 three-point attempts against Loyola (MD) and went just 2-of-11 from behind the arc against St. Mary's (CA).

Reaching No. 10

Delaware has won at least 10 games in 22 straight seasons, dating back to 1981-82. Drexel, which has won 10 or more games in 30 consecutive years, is the only CAA school with a longer streak.

Slattery Moving Up UD Career Charts

Mike Slattery has appeared in all 94 games at Delaware and has started 76 consecutive contests, just six shy of the Delaware record of 82 set by Taurence Chisholm from 1984 through 1988 and Mike Ames from 2000 through 2004. However, that streak will end as Slattery will miss at least the next three weeks with a broken right thumb. Slattery ranks third on the UD list with 484 career assists and is in eighth place on the CAA all-time chart. He also ranks 12th in Delaware history with 294 career three-pointers attempted and 14th with 103 made, is 13th with 2,821 career minutes played, and 37th with 832 career points. Slattery currently ranks ninth at UD with 138 career steals.

That success has continued under David Henderson, as Delaware is 42-14 (.750) at home during Henderson's tenure.
