Delaware on the Air

This season will be the first year that all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on flagship station WRDX 94.7 FM. Also on the Blue Hen radio network are WDOV-AM 1410 (Dover) and WTGM-AM (Salisbury, MD). Mike Corey and Bill Komissaroff, who enter their sixth year on the network, return to call the action. This weekend Sean Greene and Glenn Frazier will broadcast the two games.

In addition, most UD basketball games are also broadcast on the university student station, WVUD-FM 91.3, and WVUD2, the station's internet radio network.

Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through UD's athletics website.

Delaware is scheduled to play four games on television this season. The Blue Hens' game at Hofstra on January 22 will be televised by Fox Sports Net-New York, while both the February 19 home game with the Pride and the February 22 game at Drexel will be broadcast by the Colonial Athletic Association Network. Both of those games are scheduled to be shown on both Comcast SportsNet-Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic. Delaware's season-opener at Ohio State was broadcast by ESPN Plus.

Additionally, all Delaware home games are shown on STN, the student television network that is shown on campus.

UD Backcourt Leads Hens Over Loyola (MD)

Delaware's backcourt combination of **Andrew Washington** and **Mike Slattery** combined for 46 of the Blue Hens' 63 points and keyed a second half comeback for a 63-60 non-league men's basketball victory over host Loyola Monday night at Reitz Arena.

Delaware overcame a 35-27 halftime deficit and some cold outside shooting to post the victory. Washington scored a career-high 26 points and Slattery added 20 to pace the Blue Hens, who shot just 39 percent from the field and managed to hit just 1 of 13 shots from the beyond the three-point line.

Loyola, which suffered its second three-point loss to fall to 0-4, had a chance to send the game into overtime but Charlie Bell, who led the Greyhounds with 16 points, misfired on a three-pointer from the top of the key to end the game.

Delaware had iced the victory when **Harding Nana**, who had eight points and a career-high 14 rebounds, connected on two free throws with 21 seconds left and Washington hit on one of two shots from the foul line with seven seconds left to play.

The Blue Hens trailed for most of the first half but tied the game late in the half at 27-27. But Loyola took off on 8-0 run to end the session and took a 35-27 lead into intermission.

But just like that the Hens rebounded in the second half, scoring the first eight points of the stanza to knot the score at 35-25. Loyola regained the lead at 38-36 with 13:23 left to play, but the Hens took off on a decisive 11-4 run to take the lead for good at 47-42 with 8:33 left to play. Slattery, a pre-season All-Colonial Athletic Association senior guard who also dished out four assists, scored all 11 points in the run to lead the Blue Hens. The Hens did the job defensively, holding the Greyhounds to just four field goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half.

After Nana's two free throws with 21 seconds left upped the lead to 62-58, Loyola came back to cut the margin to two points on a layup by Shane James with 8.4 seconds remaining. Washington then iced the win with his free throw before Bell's last second shot missed the mark.

Blue Hens Defeat Mount St. Mary's in Home Opener

Harding Nana scored 19 of his game-high 23 points in the first half as hot-shooting University of Delaware jumped out to a 15-point halftime lead and moved on to a 71-49 non-league victory over Mount St. Mary's in the Blue Hens' home opener Friday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Nana hit on 9 of 12 shots from the field for his 23 points and also added five rebounds, four assists, four steals, and three blocks in an all-around effort. The game was originally scheduled for Saturday evening but was moved ahead because Delaware hosted an NCAA I-AA football first round playoff game Saturday at 3 p.m. at Delaware Stadium.

The Hens, who are now 11-2 in home openers at the Bob Carpenter Center and 18-3 in their last 21 overall, shot a sizzling 64 percent from the field in the first half (16 of 25) to jump out to a 40-25 lead at intermission and finished the night hitting 58.5 percent of their shots (31 of 53) and dishing out 19 assists. The Mountaineers connected on just 34.5 percent of their shots from the field (19 of 55) and were 5 of 20 from the three-point line.

Delaware senior **Robin Wentt** came off the bench to score 13 points on 6

of 7 shooting from the field while **Mike Slattery** scored 12 points and dished out a game-high six assists and **Raphael Madera** added eight points and a game-high eight rebounds.

The first eight minutes of the game featured six ties, and Delaware led just 24-20 with 6:58 left in the opening 20 minutes after a pair of Carbone free throws. But the Hens took off on a 16-2 run to take a 40-22 lead with 1:07 left in the half. Nana started the run with a three-point play and added seven points and Slattery connected on two three-pointers during the streak to spark the Blue Hens.

After the Blue Hens scored the first four points of the second half to up the lead to 19 points, the Mountaineers came back and reeled off 12 straight points of their own, including two Carbone three-pointers, to cut the lead to seven at 44-37 with 16:10 left.

But that would be the closest Mt. St. Mary's would get the rest of the night. Delaware guard **Andrew Washington** followed with a jumper and a dunk to push the lead back to double digits and the Hens later went on a 14-2 run over a span of four minutes, led by six points from Wentt, to go back up 62-41 with 11:16 remaining.

Delaware Falls To Ohio State In Opener

The University of Delaware men's basketball team had a rough outing in its 2004-05 season opener on November 19 as Ohio State guard Tony Stockman netted a game-high 26 points to lead the Buckeyes to a 74-49 victory at the Value City Arena.

The Blue Hens trailed 9-0 in the first two minutes and 19 seconds and committed 19 of their 24 turnovers in the opening stanza to fall behind early.

Harding Nana led the Blue Hens with 11 points and five rebounds while guard **Andrew Washington** netted 10 points in his Delaware debut and **Robin Wentt** pulled a team-high six rebounds. The Blue Hens shot just 36.4 percent from the field for the game (20 of 55) and managed to connect on just 4 of 21 shots from beyond the three-point line.

Stockman knocked down six of his nine three-point attempts to lead Ohio State while forward J.J. Sullinger added 12 points and four rebounds for the Buckeyes, who committed just 12 turnovers and shot 50.9 percent from the field (28 of 55). The Hens were playing Ohio State for the first time since a 109-38 setback on January 11, 1960.

Stockman connected on his first two three-point attempts to help Ohio State jump out to a 9-0 lead before the Hens finally got on the board on a jumper by Nana with 17:16 left in the opening half. However, Ohio State followed with a 19-8 run over a 10-minute span to go up 33-12 and took a 41-19 lead into intermission. OSU scored 25 points off turnovers for the stanza.

Blue Hens Dominate Inside vs. Mountaineers

Delaware outscored Mount St. Mary's, 34-14, in points in the paint during Friday's 71-49 victory, and shot extremely well from the field. The Blue Hens, who shot close to 70 percent through the first 30 minutes of the game, finished 28-of-39 from inside the arc (71.8 percent). In fact, Delaware, which shot 58.5 percent for the game despite hitting just 3-of-14 three-point attempts, missed the same number of two-point shots as three-point attempts.

Nana Starts With A Bang

Junior **Harding Nana**, who posted double-doubles in the final four regular season games last season, has started strong this year. Nana led the Blue Hens in scoring in their first two games, including a 23-point performance in Friday's win over Mount St. Mary's.

Nana, who finished 9-of-12 from the field against the Mount, hit his first six shots from the field. He also hit his final two shots at Ohio State, and his eight consecutive field goals made are the sixth-most in Delaware history.

On Monday against Loyola, Nana pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds, and hit two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to put Delaware up four. He currently leads the team with 14.0 points and 8.0 rebounds per game.

Delaware vs. St. Mary's (CA)

Tonight's game is the first ever meeting between Delaware and St. Mary's.

Delaware in the Golden State

The Blue Hens are 1-3 all-time in the state of California. Delaware dropped its first ever game in the state by falling at Southern California, 74-68, on November 25, 1988. The following day the Blue Hens dropped a 74-61 decision at San Diego State.

Delaware traveled west again in 1994 by competing in the UCSB Goucho Classic. The Blue Hens defeated Weber State, 82-70, in the first round on December 1, but two days later fell to the host Gouchos, 94-72.

Blue Hens Picked Fifth in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware received 137 points and was ranked fifth in the Colonial Athletic Association Preseason Poll announced on October 27 at the league's Media Day at the Richmond Coliseum.

Slattery, Nana Earn Preseason Recognition

Mike Slattery was a first team Preseason All-CAA selection by *Street & Smith's*, *Lindy's*, and *CBS Sportsline* magazines, and was a second team pick by *The Sporting News*. Additionally, Slattery was named the league's Top Playmaker by *Street & Smith's*, while junior **Harding Nana** was named first team Preseason All-CAA by *The Sporting News*.

Blue Hens Enter 100th Year

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th year for the Delaware men's basketball program. Including this season, the Blue Hens have posted an overall record of 991-1046-2 in their first century of basketball, have made four trips to the NCAA Tournament and one to the Postseason NIT, and have won 20 games six times, the last coming during **David Henderson's** first season in 2000-01 when UD went 20-10.

Cardiac Kids

Delaware played eight games that were decided by two points or less last season, not including two overtime games that were decided by seven and 11 points. Additionally, the Blue Hens played 11 games when the outcome was decided in the final five seconds of regulation and/or overtime, posting a 6-5 mark in those games.

Nov. 21 at Mount St. Mary's: The Mountaineers' Charles Cook forced the extra session by hitting a three-pointer with three seconds remaining in regulation, but the Blue Hens prevailed in overtime, 75-72.

Nov. 30 vs. San Francisco: The Dons' Andre Hazel hit a fallaway jumper just before the final buzzer to give San Francisco a 74-72 win in the Blue Hens' home opener.

Jan. 10 at Towson: The Tigers' Jamaal Gilchrist converted a driving lay-up with 4.4 seconds to go and **Chris Prothro** missed a three-pointer at the buzzer as Towson defeated Delaware, 70-68. UD had trailed, 56-45, with 7:59 to play before rallying to take the lead with 53 seconds left.

Jan. 17 vs. Old Dominion: Mike Ames buried a three-pointer with just 1.8 seconds left as the Blue Hens came back to defeat the Monarchs, 70-68. Delaware trailed, 50-38, with 12:28 remaining.

Jan. 21 vs. William & Mary: **Rulon Washington's** three-pointer with 0.9 seconds left capped a furious rally to force overtime, and Delaware went on to defeat the Tribe, 93-82. The Blue Hens trailed 71-63 with 1:15 left in regulation but forced the extra session by hitting three three-pointers in the final 21 seconds.

Jan. 24 at UNC Wilmington: Delaware almost made it three incredible wins in a row but fell short to the Seahawks, 50-49. The Blue Hens trailed by four in the final seconds, but **Robin Wentt** converted a three-point play with 6.7 seconds remaining and John Goldsberry missed a free throw to give UD a chance. However, Washington mishandled a pass and missed a 25-footer at the buzzer.

Jan. 31 at James Madison: Herb Courtney followed a miss by **Mike Slattery** to beat the buzzer and give the Blue Hens a 63-61 win over the Dukes.

Feb. 4 at Hofstra: Mike Ames missed a three-pointer with 10 seconds left that would have tied the game, as Hofstra held on for a 63-61 victory.

Feb. 7 vs. Towson: Mike Ames drained a three-pointer with three seconds remaining to force overtime in UD's 80-76 extra session win over the Tigers. The Blue Hens trailed 63-57 with 2:17 left.

Feb. 16 vs. UNC Wilmington: David Lunn intercepted a pass in the lane by UNCW's John Goldsberry with 1.7 seconds left and ran out the clock as Delaware held off the Seahawks, 62-61.

Feb. 21 vs. Virginia Commonwealth: Delaware rallied from an eight-point second-half deficit to take a three-point lead with 32 seconds left, only to have VCU tie it on a fallaway jumper by Dominic Jones with six seconds left. **Rulon Washington** hit a three-pointer in the final minute of the first overtime and again tied the game with a three with nine seconds left in the second extra session, but Nick George scored on a follow of a Derrick Reid miss at the buzzer to give the Rams a 71-69 double overtime win.

Mar. 6 vs. George Mason: The Blue Hens ended the season the way they started, with another overtime game in the CAA Quarterfinals against George Mason. Delaware trailed by as many as 13 points, but **Mike Slattery** forced overtime by hitting a driving lay-up with 3.5 seconds left before the Patriots pulled away in the extra session to win, 65-58.

Last season Delaware finished 3-5 in games decided by two points or less, while 13 of its 28 games were decided by five points or fewer (7-6). The Blue Hens also won three of their five overtime games.

Mister Assister

Mike Slattery took over the starting point guard spot during the second half of his freshman year, and finished the season with 94 assists.

He led the CAA and ranked 18th in in Division I with 6.2 assists per game as a sophomore, while playing 35.7 minutes per game.

Last season Slattery again led the league while ranking 21st in the nation with 5.9 assists per game, and also led the conference with a 2.34 assist/turnover ratio.

Since taking over the starting spot, in 72 starts Slattery has 410 assists and just 178 turnovers for a 2.30 assist/turnover ratio. In those 72 starts, he has had more turnovers than assists just five times, and has six games with 10 or more assists in his career.

Slattery is the fourth player in UD history to record 400 career assists, and only the second to do it before his senior season. He currently ranks third at Delaware with 452 career assists.

Against UNC Greensboro during his sophomore year Slattery posted a career-high 15 assists, the most by a Blue Hen in 20 years, tied for the second-highest single-game total in UD history, and a Carpenter Center record. In that game, Slattery played all 40 minutes and had 15 assists versus just one turnover. The 15 assists were also one shy of the CAA record. He duplicated that performance in UD's home win over William & Mary, making Slattery one of two players in the nation to record multiple 15-assist games.

Delaware Bench-Marks

David Henderson has used his bench a lot during his tenure at Delaware.

During Henderson's five seasons at UD, the Blue Hen bench has scored in double figures in 113 of 120 games. Delaware's bench had scored in double figures in 71 straight games until being held to just eight points in the Blue Hens' 80-66 win over James Madison on January 12, 2004.

In the 2001-02 season, UD's bench averaged 28.3 points per game and scored 20 or more points in 27 of 30 games, while in 2002-03 Delaware's bench averaged 25.1 points per game, 8.4 more than the opposition.

Last season Delaware got 20 or more points from its bench in 18 games.

The Blue Hen bench scored in double figures in the first two games this season, but managed just two points in the win over Loyola.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 412 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games (522 of 527) since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87. Delaware's streak almost came to an end Monday, as the Blue Hens hit just 1 of 13 three-point attempts. The lone three came by **Mike Slattery** with just 10:29 remaining in the game.

Reaching No. 10

Delaware has won at least 10 games in 22 straight seasons, dating back to 1981-82. Drexel, which has won 10 or more games in 30 consecutive years, is the only CAA school with a longer streak.

Slattery Moving Up UD Career Charts

Mike Slattery has appeared in all 90 games at Delaware and has started 72 consecutive contests, just 10 shy of the Delaware record of 82 set by Taurence Chisholm from 1984 through 1988 and Mike Ames from 2000 through 2004. Slattery ranks third on the UD list with 452 career assists and is just five helpers shy of 10th place on the CAA all-time chart. He also ranks

12th in Delaware history with 286 career three-pointers attempted and 14th with 99 made, is 15th with 2,682 career minutes played, and 37th with 807 career points. Slattery currently ranks ninth at UD with 132 career steals.

Home Sweet Home

Delaware has enjoyed tremendous success at the Bob Carpenter Center since the building opened prior to the 1992-93 season.

The Blue Hens have won 76 of their last 92 games on their home floor and are 128-35 (.785) at home in the BCC's 12 seasons.

UD has lost consecutive home games just four times since the BCC opened in December 1992 and has never lost three straight at home at the BCC.

BALTIMORE, MD -- Delaware's backcourt combination of Andrew Washington and Mike Slattery combined for 46 of the Blue Hens' 63 points and keyed a second half comeback...Delaware (2-1) overcame a 35-27 halftime deficit and some cold outside shooting to post the victory...Washington scored a career-high 26 points and Slattery added 20 to pace the Blue Hens, who shot just 39 percent from the field and managed to hit just 11 of 13 shots from the beyond the three-point line...Loyola, which suffered its second straight three-point loss to fall to 0-4, had a chance to send the game into overtime but Charlie Bell, who led the Greyhounds with 16 points, misfired on a three-pointer from the top of the key to end the game...Delaware had iced the victory when Harding Nana, who had eight points and a career-high 14 rebounds, connected on two free throws with 21 seconds left and Washington hit on one of two shots from the foul line with seven seconds left...the Blue Hens trailed for most of the first half but tied the game late in the half at 27-27...but Loyola took off on 8-0 run to end the session and took a 35-27 lead into intermission...the Hens rebounded in the second half, scoring the first eight points of the stanza to knot the score at 35-25...Loyola regained the lead at 38-36 with 13:23 left to play, but the Hens took off on a decisive 11-4 run to take the lead for good at 47-42 with 8:33 left to play...Slattery, who also dished out four assists, scored all 11 points in the run to lead the Hens...the Hens did the job defensively, holding the Greyhounds to just four field goals in the first 15 minutes of the second half...after Nana's two free throws with 21 seconds left upped the lead to 62-58, Loyola came back to cut the margin to two points on a layup by Shane James with 8.4 seconds remaining...Washington iced the win with his free throw before Bell's last second shot missed the mark.
