♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. LOYOLA:

All-Time Series Record: Delaware holds the series advantage, 11-1, over Loyola. The teams first met in 1981, when the Blue Hens downed the Greyhounds, 78-64. Loyola's only victory over Delaware occurred on January 15, 1982 as the Greyhounds pulled out a 64-63 victory over the Blue Hens. Delaware has won the last 10 meetings, with the most recent win coming just last year.

Last meeting between Delaware and Loyola: Delaware and Loyola just met last year on December 14. The Blue Hens came away with the 54-27 victory at Reitz Arena. Senior forward **Tiffany Young** led the Blue Hens with 12 points while **Tyresa Smith** dropped in 10.

Last time out for the Blue Hens: Delaware won its exhibition game over the Netherlands National Team by a score of 74-66. The Blue Hens were led by senior forward **Tiara Malcom's** 27 points while fellow seniors **Julie Sailer** and **Young** each contributed 11.

Last time out for the Greyhounds: This is the first game action for the Greyhounds as they are kicking off their 2004-05 season.

♦ MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME: ♦



NEWARK, DE (Nov. 6) ~ Blue Hen senior forward **Tiara Malcom** scored 27 points while fellow seniors **Tiffany Young** and **Julie Sailer** each added 11 to lead the University of Delaware women's basketball team to a 74-66 exhibition win over the Netherlands National Team Saturday night at the Bob Carpenter Center. **Malcom**, the Colonial Athletic Association Preseason Player of the Year, hit 8-of-21 shots from the floor and 11-of-12 from the free throw line while adding six rebounds for the Blue Hens, who never trailed in the game. **Young** finished with team-highs of nine rebounds and three assists, while sophomore **Tyresa Smith** chipped in seven points and four boards for Delaware. **Naomi Halman** finished with a team-highs of 23 points and 12 rebounds for the Netherlands, which had lost to Old Dominion, 88-60, and defeated Villanova, 90-79 in triple overtime, in its previous two exhibition games. The Blue Hens used an early six-point run to take a 12-5 lead with 15:12 remaining in the first half, and after the Netherlands pulled to within 21-15, Delaware scored nine straight points, capped on a lay-up by **Liz Hayes**, to take its largest lead of the half at 30-15 with 4:04 on the clock. The Netherlands got within nine at 33-24 in the final minute before the half.

◆ MORE ON THE MATCH-UP ◆

◆ This is the second straight home opener for the Blue Hens, the Hens have a mark of 4-4 in season openers under Head Coach Tina Martin.

◆ The Greyhounds who finished last season with a record of 14-15, 9-9 in the MAAC will be led by juniors Katie Scherle and Lauren Troupe. Loyola advanced to the second round of the MAAC tournament before falling to runner-up Canisius. Scherle was a second team all-MAAC selection after leading the Greyhounds in scoring (11.5 ppg) and rebounding (6.2 rpg). Troupe was second on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.4 rpg). Troupe also led the team in three point field goal percentage (.318) and free throw percentage (.786).

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks 17th with 1,036 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 145 points to move into the top 10 and 411 points to break into the top five. Malcom has recorded 13 double-doubles in her career (UDis 9-4 in those games). Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 193 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** needs eight wins to reach 150 career wins all-time at Delaware.

Defense Delivers

Delaware basketball is known for its defense. The Blue Hens held seven teams under 50 points in 2003-04 and came away with a 7-0 mark in those games. Delaware has led the CAAthe last two seasons in scoring defense. In 18 of the Blue Hens' 19 wins last year, opponents were held under 60 points.

Helping Hand

From 2001-04, the Blue Hens recorded a 35-2 mark when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent. The Hens finished the 2003-04 season with an 8-1 record when they won the assist battle.

If it's Free, I'll make it

The Blue Hens finished the 2003-04 season shooting 70.1 percent from the foul line, ranking second in the CAA. **Julie Sailer, Alena Koshansky, Tiffany Young, and Tiara Malcom** all shot over 75% from the charity stripe. Malcom and Young ranked in the top 10 in the CAAin free throw percentage last year by shooting 75% from the line. The Blue Hens shot 70% from the line as they averaged almost 27 trips to the charity stripe per game.

Young Gun

Senior forward **Tiffany Young** took her game to the next level last year for the Blue Hens. Prior to last season, Young had never scored in double digits, averaging 1.4 ppg for her career. Last season, Young had two 20-point performances and recorded two double-doubles. As Delaware's second-leading scorer, she tallied her first 20-point performance in the championship game of the Coca Cola Classic at Fairfield on her way to being named to the all-tournament team. She also scored 21 points against Manhattan, this time with an impressive 11-14 spot from the foul line.

Delaware Basketball Tradition

Delaware women's basketball has recorded six consecutive winning seasons, a seventh would be a program record. The program has recorded 20-win seasons in three of its last four campaigns and has made postseason tournament appearances three times in the last four years.

There's No Place Like Home

Having four home losses in a season is somewhat of an anomaly for the Blue Hens. The last time the Hens lost four games at home in the same season dates back to 1998-99 when they were still in the America East conference. Despite its four losses last season at home, Delaware's home record is nothing to scoff at. Since the 1999-00 season, the Blue Hens are 55-7 at the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware has won over 88% of its home contests over the last four years (42-6) and over 72% in the last seven years (70-15).

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Black is Back

Amanda Blackstone returned to her style of game last year after battling with mono throughout the 2002-2003 season. Blackstone made her first ever start against Hofstra on February 15 and set a career high in points with 14. She would later surpass that career best by scoring a team high 17 points off of 7-10 shooting in the CAA Quarterfinal matchup with Old Dominion last year.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist. **Courtney Irving** was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Matchless Malcom

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** finished the 2003-04 season leading the Blue Hens in scoring 15.5 ppg and tied the for the team lead in rebounds with 6.8 rpg. Malcom put together an impressive junior season that saw her score 20+ on seven occasions and wrap up five double-doubles on the year. She scored a career high 31 points and a game-high 11 rebounds against George Mason on January 22. Malcom became just the 10th Blue Hen to break the 30-point mark in a single game. She has played in 90 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 64-26 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 16.7 points per game in six NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also,

her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 14 points per game and 7.5 rebounds per game in two games this season for Fairfield.

Freshman First

Alena Koshansky was named the CAA Co-Rookie of the Week on March 1, 2004 after scoring double figures in back-to-back conference wins for the Blue Hens. The honor marked the first time that a Delaware player had earned Rookie of the Week honors since the Blue Hens joined the CAA in 2001. Against Towson last year, Koshansky poured in a career best 19 points, including an impressive 5-of-9 from behind the arc, just one shy of the Delaware record for three pointers made in a game. Koshansky scored in double figures seven times last season and the Blue Hens were a perfect 7-0 in those matches.

Is It December Yet?

While the season may be just getting under way today, the Blue Hens will be wishing for the calendar to say December. In the past two seasons, the Blue Hens had compiled back to back perfect Decembers. The team has produced records of 5-0 in that month. This year's squad will have to work hard to keep the perfection going as the Hens are slated for six games this year in December.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

Big Shots

Liz Hayes may have been just a freshman last year, but she hit the shots that counted for the Blue Hens. In two different games (vs. Richmond and Drexel), Hayes hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to send the game into overtime.
