Delaware vs. Louisville

All-Time Series Record: This is the first ever meeting between Delaware and Louisville.

Last time out for the Fightin' Blue Hens: The Hens dropped a 53-51 heartbreaker to Boston College on Tuesday evening when BC forward Stefanie Murphy scored on a put-back with one-tenth of a second left. Murphy finished with 26 points and 16 rebounds for the Eagles, while seniors Kyle DeHaven and Courtney Irving led Delaware with 11 and 10 points, respectively. UD forced 20 Eagle turnovers and made ten steals, but shot just 26.7 percent from the floor in their third consecutive loss.

Last time out for the Cardinals: Louisville blew a 12-point second-half lead in a 74-69 loss to Minnesota on Sunday in the Subway Classic third-place game. The Cardinals fell despite a monster game from junior All-American candidate Angel McCoughtry, who scored 39 points and pulled down 12 rebounds. Louisville, then ranked No. 22 in the nation by the Associated Press, committed 26 turnovers.

Head Coach Tina Martin

12th season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 216-113 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming

the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in seven of the last eight years and six post-season appearances, including NCAA bids in 2001 and 2007...Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, serving as a graduate assistant, and the next season moved on to Seton Hall...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...a native of Williamsport, PA, she was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference all-star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

DeHaven Returns

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven**, who broke a bone in her right hand late in Delaware's season-opening win over Delaware State and missed two games, returned to the line-up in Tuesday's loss to Boston College. DeHaven scored a team-high 11 points and added five assists and three steals, showing the grit and determination that earned her co-captain status in the preseason.

Benison Breaks Out

Sophomore guard **Corinthia Benison** posted career highs of nine points and four rebounds in the Blue Hens' 53-51 loss to Boston College on Tuesday evening. She is now averaging five points and two boards per contest.

Irving Heats Up

Senior forward **Courtney Irving** poured in a season-high 10 points and added five rebounds, two assists, and two steals in the Hens' loss to BC. She's averaging 7.7 points and 4.0 rebounds in UD's last three games after struggling in the season-opener.

Banner Year

Last season was one to remember for the Blue Hens, who tied a school record with 26 wins, toppled two top-25 teams in the regular season, and earned an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament, where they fell to Michigan State, 69-58, in a hard-fought game. Senior guard **Tyresa Smith**, who led the league with 19.8 points per game and finished a brilliant career as the Hens' No. 2 all-time scorer, was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-CAA.

Stealing The Show

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven**, who nabbed three steals in UD's 53-51 last-second loss to Boston College on Tuesday, has established herself as one of the CAA's craftiest thieves on the hardwood. She collected a league-high 99 steals last season and averaged 3.1 steals per game, good for 11th in all of Division I. On December 10, 2006, she broke the single-game school record with nine steals against Boston University. DeHaven, a three-time CAA All-Defensive Team pick, ranks sixth all-time in the conference with 326 career steals and needs just two more to move up to fifth on the list.

No Problem Being Neutral

The Blue Hens are 20-14 under Tina Martin at neutral sites. In their last such game, the Hens rolled past then-No. 20 Kentucky, 86-70, in the semifinals of the Odwalla Classic on Nov. 24, 2006.

Big East, Big Challenge

Delaware is 7-15 all-time against current Big East members. The Blue Hens last faced a Big East team on Nov. 12, 2006, when they defeated Villanova, 68-63, in their 2006-07 season opener. The Hens have faced 10 of the 16 Big East teams at least once in their history, playing four games each against Georgetown (3-1), Pittsburgh (0-4), and Villanova (1-3).

Playing The Percentages

Delaware graduated three senior leaders from last year in guards **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** and forward **Chrissy Fisher**. Numbers can't do justice to the impact those three stars had on the program, but they're a good place to start. Last year, they accounted for 58.7 percent of the Hens' points, 49.6 percent of their rebounds, and 53.8 percent of their assists.

Long Range Woes

Delaware went just 4-for-20 (.200) from three-point range in its loss to BC on Tuesday evening, and the Hens have connected on just eight of 49 tries from beyond the arc this year. Their .163 three-point field goal percentage ranks last in the CAA.

The Low Down

Delaware has scored just 130 points over its last three games, their worst three-game stretch since Feb. 6-16, 1974, when they tallied just 118 points. The Hens are averaging a league-worst 46.0 points per game.

Ballhawks

The Blue Hens collected 10 steals and forced 20 turnovers in their 53-51 loss to the Eagles on Tuesday and made 18 steals in their season opener against Delaware State. The Hens are forcing 19.8 turnovers and 10.5 steals per game this season. Delaware's '06-'07 success began with its defense, as the Hens forced more turnovers (22.3 per game) than any other CAA team and made a league-high 424 steals. Three Blue Hens - **Kyle DeHaven**, **Tyresa Smith**, and **Alena Koshansky** - placed among the league's top six in steals, as all three tallied at least 80.

Back to Balance

Seniors Kyle DeHaven and Courtney Irving reached double figures with 11 and 10 points, respectively, in UD's loss to

Boston College on Tuesday. The Hens hadn't had a pair of double-figure scorers since their season-opening win at Delaware State, when DeHaven and Mundy did the trick.

New Faces

The Blue Hens welcome five true freshmen - **Tesia Harris**, **Vanessa Kabongo**, **Gracie Palucis**, **Eva Riddick**, and walk-on **Rocelia Cooper** - to the fold. Redshirt freshmen **Brittany Bell** and **Ariene Jenkins** also join the Hens, who boast the CAA's youngest roster with seven freshmen and three sophomores. Kabongo scored six points on 3-for-4 shooting in the loss to BC on Tuesday, while Riddick added a basket of her own. Kabongo, who has started three of four games, leads the newcomers with 5.5 points and 2.0 rebounds per outing.

Haven't I Seen You Somewhere?

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins. Martin has an identical twin sister, Teresa, while Radice has a fraternal twin sister, Julie.

Three And Out

UD has lost three consecutive games for the first time since a four-game slide in February of 2004.

Off The Mark

The Blue Hens are shooting just .274 from the floor this year. They connected on just 14 of 54 shots (.259) in the loss to Boston College to follow up a .250 showing in their setback at TCU on Friday. Delaware ranks last in the CAA in field goal percentage.

Hens Will Miss Smith

Delaware said goodbye to the most decorated player in school history in guard **Tyresa Smith**, who graduated last year and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the WNBA Draft. Smith, a two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first team All-CAA pick, finished her Blue Hen career at No. 2 on UD's all-time scoring list (1,635 points) and as the school's all-time leader in steals (342). She ranks among the top 11 in UD history in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, field goals made, and free throws made.

Irving's No Long Shot

Senior forward **Courtney Irving**, who scored a season-high 10 points in the heartbreaking loss to BC, ranks No. 1 on UD's all-time list with a .512 career field goal percentage. She connected on 98 of

170 shots last year (.576) to break a 15-year-old single-season school record. Irving also ranks third in Delaware history with a .827 career free-throw percentage. She connected on all four of her shots from the charity stripe on Tuesday.

Twenty-Something

Delaware has won 20 or more games in seven of its last eight seasons, amassing a 184-59 record in that span. The Hens had recorded just four 20-win years in the previous 28.

Bored With Boards

UD was outrebounded 49-33 in the BC loss, and the Hens have been beaten on the boards in all four of their games this season. They've been outrebounded by an average of 14.5 boards per night on the year, worst in the CAA. Delaware outmuscled its opponents by 1.9 rebounds per game last season.

A-OK Outside the CAA

The Hens have fared well outside the CAA in recent years. Delaware is 33-12 in non-league games since the start of the 2003-04 season, but the Hens have lost five of their last six match-ups outside the conference.

National Power to Power Outage

Last season, UD ranked fourth in the country in steals per game (13.3), tenth in turnovers per game (13.6), 18th in scoring defense (55.9 ppg), 19th in scoring margin (12.9 ppg), 19th in winning percentage (81.3%), and 50th in free throw percentage (73.7%). This year, the young Hens have struggled against top-quality competition early, and their numbers aren't quite as impressive. UD ranks last in the CAA in scoring offense, field goal percentage (27.4%), three-point field goal percentage (16.3%), rebounding margin (-14.5 rpg), assists (6.8 apg), and assist-to-turnover ratio (0.35).

Colonial Dominance

The Blue Hens have posted an 85-23 record in CAA play since they joined the league in 2001-02. Only perennial power Old Dominion (99-9) has won more conference games in that span.

Tough Slate

In 2007-08, UD will face at least seven teams – Texas Christian, Maryland, Delaware State, Bowling Green, Louisville, James Madison, and Old Dominion - that made the NCAA Tournament last year. They've opened the season with three games in a row against teams that went to the Big Dance a year ago.

Talking Turkey

In June, head coach **Tina Martin**, associate head coach **Jeanine Radice**, former player **Alena Koshansky**, and current

players **Courtney Irving** and **Kyle DeHaven** ventured to Turkey along with members of the UD sports management department. For eight days, the Blue Hen representatives conducted clinics for coaches and players as part of FIBA Europe's Year of Women's Basketball campaign.

It Runs In The Family

Freshman guard **Tesia Harris**, a Street & Smith All-American as a high school senior last year, has basketball in her blood. She is a cousin of Channing Frye, a forward with the Portland Trailblazers.

COLLEGE PARK, MD -- The strength and balance of Maryland was too much for short-handed Delaware as the Blue Hens suffered their worst loss in a decade...the No. 3 ranked Terrapins (3-0), the 2006 NCAA national champions, placed four scorers in double figures and never trailed as the Hens (1-1) suffered their biggest losing margin since a 102-54 setback to Maine Feb. 13, 1997 during head coach Tina Martin's rookie campaign...freshman Vanessa Kabongo led the Blue Hens with 11 points...Delaware played without senior point guard Kyle DeHaven, who sat out with a broken hand suffered in a season-opening win over Delaware State in which she scored 24 points...despite the absence of DeHaven, the Hens committed just 14 turnovers, four less than the Terrapins...Kristi Toliver led the Terps with 19 points and 10 assists, Jade Perry had 11 points and 15 rebounds, Ashleigh Newman registered 18 points, and Marissa Coleman added 16 points...Maryland held a commanding 57-27 rebounding advantage and also converted 25 of 27 free throws...Maryland's 91 points were the most allowed by the Hens since a 91-85 overtime loss to Hofstra Feb. 12, 2006...Courtney Irving had nine points and a team-high six rebounds and Mundy contributed nine points to pace Delaware, which shot just 24.2 percent (16 of 66) from the field...Delaware stayed close early, tying the game at 8-8 six minutes into the contest...after Maryland's Toliver hit a three-pointer, the Hens pulled to within 14-12 on a jumper by Kabongo...that would be as close as the Hens would get the rest of the night as Maryland reeled off seven straight points to take control at 21-12 and used a 34-11 run that resulted in a 46-21 halftime advantage...Delaware never got closer than 23 the entire second half with Maryland pushing the lead to as much as 49 points at 91-42 in the closing minutes.

FORTH WORTH, TX -- Offensive woes continued to plague Delaware as the young and outmanned Blue Hens shot just 25 percent from the field and committed 30 turnovers...Jamie Mundy led the Blue Hens (1-2) with nine points and seven rebounds while ShaRon Harrison added seven points, and freshman Eva Riddick pulled down seven rebounds...the Hens shot just 11 of 44 from the field (5 of 21 in the opening half) and were 0 for 7 from beyond the three-point line...TCU (2-1), an NCAA Tournament qualifier each of the past seven seasons, jumped out to a 32-15 halftime lead and never looked back as Jenna Lohse scored a game-high 13 points, Helena Sverrisdottier added 11 points and six assists, and Lori Butler-Rayford had seven points and eight rebounds...the Hens were held to their lowest scoring output since a 47-36 setback to George Mason Feb. 20, 2003...UD played its second straight game without senior pre-season All-CAA standout Kyle DeHaven (broken hand)...Delaware failed to put a scorer in double figures for the first time since a 68-47 loss at Towson on Dec. 9, 1997...TCU went 21-11 last season and advanced to the NCAA Tournament before falling to Mississippi in the opening round...Delaware tied the score at 2-2 on a Harrison jumper just over a minute into the game, but the Lady Frogs reeled off 14 of the next 16 points and held the Hens scoreless for nearly six minutes to take control at 15-4...the Hens battled back and out the lead to 17-11 on a Mundy free throw with 7:41 left in the opening half, but TCU roared back again and scored nine straight points on the way to a 26-11 lead and eventually took a 17-point advantage into the break.
