Delaware vs. Northeastern

All-Time Series Record: The Blue Hens hold a 17-10 lead in the all-time series with Northeastern and have won 10 straight over the Huskies dating back to the 1998-99 season. UD downed Northeastern 65-43 in Newark last year before rolling to a 65-35 road win later in the season. The Hens are 10-2 versus the Huskies in Newark, 9-2 at the Bob Carpenter Center. UD has gone a perfect 5-0 against Northeastern since NU entered the CAA in 2005-06.

Last time out for the Fightin' Blue Hens: Delaware dropped a 58-50 decision to visiting UNC Wilmington on Thursday evening, the Hens' seventh consecutive loss at the Bob Carpenter Center. Sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** led the Blue Hens with a career-high 14 points and added nine rebounds, while senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** notched 14 points and six steals. The Hens were outscored 32-21 in the second half, when they shot 23.1 percent.

Last time out for the Huskies: Northeastern remained winless in CAA play with a 71-66 loss at Drexel on Thursday night. Forward Stefanie Hodell scored a team-high 13 points for NU, while guard Kendra Walton added 12 points and seven rebounds.

the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in seven of the last eight years and six post-season appearances, including NCAA bids in 2001 and 2007...Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, serving as a graduate assistant, and the next season moved on to Seton Hall...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...a native of Williamsport, PA, she was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference all-star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Blue Hens Lose Battle Of The Birds

The Hens dropped a hard-fought match-up with UNC Wilmington 58-50 on Thursday evening at the Bob Carpenter Center, falling to 2-14 overall and 1-3 in the league despite a career-high 14 points and nine rebounds from sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** and a 14-point, six-steal effort from senior guard **Kyle DeHaven**. UD, which hadn't lost to the Seahawks at home since 2002-03, shot 29.1 percent from the floor - 23.1 percent in the second half - and committed 19 turnovers in the setback. Delaware led by four points midway through the second half, but UNCW ended the game with a decisive 20-8 run.

Harrison Heats Up

Sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison**, who scored a career-high 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the Hens' loss to UNC Wilmington on Thursday night, has amped up her production lately. Over her last three games, the 6-foot-1 Patterson, NJ native is averaging 10.3 ppg and 8.3 rpg, up significantly from her last three outings (3.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg). She has collected at least eight points and seven rebounds in each of the Blue Hens' last three games.

A Tale Of Two Irvings

Courtney Irving, who scored two points and hauled in eight rebounds in Thursday's setback, has elevated her play in the Hens' last nine games, nearly doubling her points and rebounds per game. Harris Hurt

One game after establishing a new career high with 14 points in the Hens' loss at William & Mary, freshman guard **Tesia Harris** was sidelined with a left ankle sprain just five minutes into the UNC Wilmington loss. The Dix Hills, NY product, an exceptional athlete with a dependable mid-range stroke, is doubtful for today's game. Harris has started UD's last five games and put up 8.7 ppg and 2.0 rpg over her last six. She had come on strong in the Hens' first three CAA games, averaging 11 points and shooting 15-for-33 (.455) from the floor in 29 minutes per night.

DeHaven Banged Up, But Probable

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** went down with a leg injury late in the Hens' loss to UNC Wilmington, but she is listed as probable for today's match-up with Northeastern.

Instant Offense From Kabongo

Freshman guard **Vanessa Kabongo** poured in seven points and added three rebounds off the bench in Delaware's loss to UNC Wilmington on Thursday, hitting three of her seven field goal tries in 20 minutes of action. The athletic off-guard has scored seven points in two consecutive games, coming off the bench to give UD a boost offensively. Sunday at William & Mary, she went 3-for-5 from the floor for seven points, all in a 4:56 span in the first half. Kabongo has made 10 starts for UD and is averaging 5.6 points and 2.0 rebounds per game on the season.

Winter Chill

With their loss to UNC Wilmington on Thursday, the Blue Hens are 1-3 this month, their worst January start since 1998 (0-4). Despite its struggles this season, UD is 23-6 (.793) in the month of January since the start of the 2004-05 season. Delaware staggered through December at 0-5, the Hens' first winless month since November of 2002. UD had melted the December snow since joining the CAA in 2001, going 35-3 (.921) in the month through last season.

For Starters

Freshman guard **Gracie Palucis** logged her first career start in Delaware's loss to Arkansas on Dec. 29 in the Blue Sky Classic, meaning that all 12 players on the Blue Hens' roster have started at least one game this season.

Stealing The Show

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** collected six steals in UD's 58-50 loss to UNCW to bring her career total to 357, fourth-best in CAA history. The Herndon, VA native needs 26 more thefts to overtake Old Dominion legend Mery Andrade for third on the league's all-time list. She has made 59 steals this year for an average of 4.2 per game, best in the conference and second in all of Division I. The three-time

CAA All-Defensive Team selection collected a league-high 99 steals last season and averaged 3.1 per game, good for 11th in the nation.

Study Hall Superstars

Junior guard **Jamie Mundy** and sophomore center **Farrak Ferguson** were nominated last week for ESPN The Magazine/College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-American honors. Both Mundy and Ferguson have maintained GPAs of 3.2 or higher, and they've set a high academic standard for their fellow Blue Hens.

Home Sweet Home

The Blue Hens are 112-36 (.757) in the Bob Carpenter Center under head coach **Tina Martin**, 45-10 (.818) in CAA play. UD went 77-11 (.875) at home from the start of the 2000-01 season through the end of last year.

...But Lately, Homesick

The Hens have lost seven of eight games at the BCC this year. Delaware has dropped seven straight at home for the first time since a seven-game skid from Dec. 12, 1996 to Jan. 21, 1997, matching UD's longest losing streak in 15-plus years at the Bob Carpenter Center. The Hens have lost eight straight at home once in program history - from Jan. 25, 1979 to Jan. 15, 1980.

Banner Year

Last season was one to remember for the Blue Hens, who tied a school record with 26 wins, toppled two top-25 teams in the regular season, and earned an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament, where they fell to Michigan State, 69-58, in a hard-fought game. Senior guard **Tyresa Smith**, who led the league with 19.8 points per game and finished a brilliant career as the Hens' No. 2 all-time scorer, was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-CAA.

Playing The Percentages

Delaware graduated three senior leaders from last year in guards **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** and forward **Chrissy Fisher**. Numbers can't do justice to the impact those three stars had on the program, but they're a good place to start. Last year, they accounted for 58.7 percent of the Hens' points, 49.6 percent of their rebounds, and 53.8 percent of their assists.

Off the Mark Behind The Arc

The Hens went 2-for-6 from three-point range in Thursday's loss to UNC Wilmington, but UD has connected on just 27 of its 146 tries from beyond the arc this year. The Blue Hens' .185 three-point field goal percentage ranks last in the CAA, and UD hasn't made five or more

trifectas in a game since March 1 of last season. Delaware ranks last in all of Division I in three-pointers made at 1.7 per game. Senior guard Kyle DeHaven, who sank both Delaware threes on Thursday, is the team's leader in three-pointers made with 11. With three three-pointers in a loss at William & Mary on Dec. 13, the Blue Hens ended a three-game drought in which UD went a combined 0-for-17 from deep.

Ballhawks...or Ball-Hens?

Delaware collected 11 steals and forced 23 turnovers in its loss to UNC Wilmington on Thursday. The Hens have forced 20.1 turnovers and made 10.5 steals per game this season, picking up where they left off last year. Delaware's '06-'07 success began with its defense, as the Hens forced more turnovers (22.3 per game) than any other CAA team and made a league-high 424 steals. Three Blue Hens - **Kyle DeHaven**, **Tyresa Smith**, and **Alena Koshansky** - placed among the league's top six in steals, as all three tallied at least 80. This year, DeHaven leads the CAA with 4.2 spg, good for second nationally.

Around And Out

The Blue Hens, who managed just 50 points in Thursday's loss to UNCW (21 in the second half), have struggled to find the basket this season, averaging a CAA-low 50.4 points per game. The school record for lowest-scoring season was set in the experimental year of 1970-71, when Delaware averaged 44.7 ppg. in its first year as a varsity program. UD's season high of 64 points is lower than the average scoring output of six other CAA teams.

Up, Up And Away In CAA Play

Statistically, Delaware has improved significantly in virtually all facets of the game since beginning its CAA season on Jan. 6. A quick look at the Blue Hens' upswing:

New Faces

The Blue Hens welcome four true freshmen - guards **Tesia Harris**, **Vanessa Kabongo**, and **Gracie Palucis** and center **Eva Riddick** - to the fold this season. Redshirt freshman **Ariene Jenkins** also joins the Hens, who boast the CAA's youngest roster with five freshmen and three sophomores. Kabongo has averaged 5.6 points this season to lead the new-

comers, reaching double figures four times, while Harris (4.5 ppg) has logged four double-figure games of her own and poured in a career-high 14 points in the Hens' loss at William & Mary on Dec. 13. Jenkins (3.1 ppg, 3.6 rpg) has made seven starts and torched George Mason for a career-high 15 points on Jan. 6, while Palucis (1.0 ppg) netted six points on two three-pointers in Delaware's loss to Quinnipiac on Dec. 18. Riddick, meanwhile, has made two starts and is pulling down 2.6 rebounds per contest. Together, the five newcomers are contributing 13.4 ppg, 8.3 rpg, and 1.0 apg.

Haven't I Seen You Somewhere?

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirements needed to coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins. Martin has an identical twin sister, Teresa, while Radice has a fraternal twin sister, Julie.

False Start

When they dropped a hard-fought match-up with UNC Wilmington on Thursday, the Blue Hens fell to 2-14 overall, the worst 16-game start in program history. UD's 1-3 CAA start is its worst since joining the league in the 2001-02 season.

Rimmed Out

The Blue Hens are shooting just .321 from the floor this year, worst in the CAA. UD has shot below 35 percent in 12 of 16 games this season, and 10 of UD's 12 players are shooting below 40 percent on the year. The Hens struggled with their stroke on Thursday, hitting just 16 of 55 shots (.291) against UNC Wilmington. Delaware couldn't buy a bucket after intermission, going 6-for-26 (.231) in the second half. Senior forward **Courtney Irving** leads the team with a .494 field-goal percentage.

We'll Miss Ya, 'Resal'

Delaware said goodbye to the most decorated player in school history in guard **Tyresa Smith**, who graduated last year and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the WNBA Draft. Smith, a two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first team All-CAA pick, finished her Blue Hen career at No. 2 on UD's all-time scoring list (1,635 points) and as the school's all-time leader in steals (342). She ranks among the top 11 in UD history in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, field goals made, and free throws made.

Irving's No Long Shot

Senior forward **Courtney Irving**, who scored two points on 1-for-3 shooting against the Seahawks on Thursday, ranks

No. 1 on UD's all-time list with a .512 career field goal percentage. She connected on 98 of 170 shots last year (.576) to break a 15-year-old single-season school record. Irving also ranks third in Delaware history with a .827 career free-throw percentage. This season, she's made 39 of her 79 field goal attempts (.494) and 36 of 43 free throws (.837).

Twenty-Something

Delaware has won 20 or more games in seven of its last eight seasons, amassing a 184-59 record in that span. The Hens had recorded just four 20-win years in the previous 28.

Bored With Boards

Delaware was outrebounded 35-32 in its loss to UNCW on Thursday, the 11th time this season that the Hens have lost the battle of the boards. But the Hens have crashed the glass in league play. In their first four CAA games, they've outrebounded opponents by an average of 5.2 boards. In conference games, the Hens rank first in the league in rebounding defense (32.5 rpg) and third in rebounding margin (+5.2 rpg).

Out of Their Element

Until this season, the Hens had fared very well in non-conference games in recent years. Delaware is 33-20 (.623) outside the CAA since the start of the 2003-04 season, but the Hens have lost 13 of their last 14 games against teams from other leagues, including 11 of 12 this season.

National Power to Power Outage

Last season, UD ranked fourth in the country in steals per game (13.3), tenth in turnovers per game (13.6), 18th in scoring defense (55.9 ppg), 19th in scoring margin (12.9 ppg), 19th in winning percentage (81.3%), and 50th in free throw percentage (73.7%). This year, the young Hens have struggled against top-quality competition and their numbers aren't quite as impressive. UD ranks last in the CAA in scoring offense (50.4 ppg), field goal percentage (32.1%), three-point field goal percentage (18.5%), assists (6.8 apg), assist-to-turnover ratio (0.35), and three-point field goals made (1.7 per game). Delaware ranks in the bottom half of the CAA in 16 of the 19 team categories kept by the league, but the Hens are third in free-throw percentage at 71.9%, fourth in steals at 10.5 spg, and fifth in scoring defense at 61.6 ppg. Nationally, the numbers don't look any better. As of Jan. 17, Delaware ranked 321st of 326 Division I teams in scoring, 322nd in field goal percentage, 326th in three-pointers made, 326th in assists per game, and 324th in assist-to-turnover ratio. On a more promising note, the Hens were 65th nationwide in free throw percentage and 61st in steals.

Colonial Dominance

The Blue Hens have posted an 86-26 record (.768) in CAA play since they joined the league in 2001-02. Only perennial power Old Dominion (99-9) has won more conference games in that span.

Tough Slate

In 2007-08, Delaware will face at least seven teams – Delaware State, Maryland, Louisville, Texas Christian, Bowling Green, James Madison, and Old Dominion – that made the NCAA Tournament last year. Four of the Hens' first five opponents went to the Big Dance a year ago.

Talking Turkey

In June, head coach **Tina Martin**, associate head coach **Jeanine Radice**, former player **Alena Koshansky**, and current players **Courtney Irving** and **Kyle DeHaven** ventured to Turkey along with members of the UD sports management department. For eight days, the Blue Hen representatives conducted clinics for coaches and players as part of FIBA Europe's Year of Women's Basketball campaign.

It Runs In The Family

Freshman guard **Tesia Harris**, a Street & Smith All-American as a high school senior last year, has basketball in her blood. She is a cousin of Channing Frye, a forward with the Portland Trailblazers.
