Delaware vs. UNC Wilmington

All-Time Series Record: The Blue Hens hold an 11-4 lead in the all-time series with UNC Wilmington and have won five of seven meetings at the Bob Carpenter Center. The teams last met on Jan. 17, when the Seahawks scored a 58-50 victory at the BCC behind 15 points from guard Greta Luksyte. Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** and sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** led UD with 14 points apiece, but the Hens shot just 29.1 percent from the floor.

Last time out for the Fightin' Blue Hens: Delaware dropped its fifth straight game in its regular-season finale on March 6, falling 58-55 at Towson despite a career-high 17 points from freshman guard **Vanessa Kabongo**. Freshman forward **Ariene Jenkins** added 13 points on 6-for-7 shooting and pulled down seven rebounds for UD, which hit 42.9 percent of its shots. The Hens closed a 13-point deficit to three in the final minute, but couldn't complete the comeback. The Hens collected a season-high 16 assists in a losing effort.

Last time out for the Seahawks: The Seahawks suffered a 68-60 setback to James Madison on Thursday evening, their fourth consecutive loss. Freshman forward Brittany Blackwell led UNCW with 17 points and six rebounds. The Seahawks led 29-28 at halftime.

Head Coach Tina Martin

12th season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 222-133 (.625) record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program,

becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in seven of the last eight years and six post-season appearances, including NCAA bids in 2001 and 2007...Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, serving as a graduate assistant, and the next season moved on to Seton Hall...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...a native of Williamsport, PA, she was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference all-star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Hens Seeded Ninth In CAA Tourney

Delaware earned the No. 9 seed in this weekend's Colonial Athletic Association Tournament at the Bob Carpenter Center after going 6-12 in league play and 7-23 overall. The Hens' seed is its lowest ever in the CAA tourney since joining the league in 2001-02. Delaware is 8-6 all-time in the CAA Tournament and has reached the semifinals or better all six years the Hens have participated. In last season's conference tourney, the Hens beat VCU 79-58 in the quarterfinals before suffering a 67-56 semifinal setback to James Madison at the Bob Carpenter Center. UD is 1-1 versus UNC Wilmington in CAA tourney play, scoring a 65-59 quarterfinal victory in 2004 after a 65-60 defeat in the 2003 semifinals.

Tigers Take A Bite Out Of Blue Hens

Delaware suffered its fifth straight loss on Thursday evening, falling to Towson 58-55 in its regular-season finale. Freshman guard **Vanessa Kabongo** scored a career-high 17 points on 8-for-15 shooting for the Blue Hens, who shot a solid 42.9 percent from the floor but were out-rebounded 44-35 and committed 20 turnovers in the setback. UD also got 13 points and seven rebounds from freshman forward **Ariene Jenkins**, while sophomore guard **Corinthia Benison** chipped in with seven points and four assists. Down 51-38 with 7:38 remaining, the Hens staged a 15-4 surge to close the gap to two on a put-back by Jenkins with 56 ticks on the clock, but they couldn't get any closer. Delaware had a chance to tie the game at the buzzer, but **Kyle DeHaven's** straightaway three-pointer rolled off the rim and UD fell to Towson for the second time in a row.

Blue Hens Celebrate Senior Night

Minutes before its 58-46 setback to Georgia State on Feb. 28 at the Bob Carpenter Center, Delaware honored its two seniors, guard **Kyle DeHaven** and forward **Courtney Irving**. DeHaven, a Herndon, VA native who came to UD from William & Mary after the 2004-05 season, has led the Hens as a senior co-captain this season after making major contributions to the Blue Hens' NCAA tournament run last year. DeHaven leads the nation in steals per game (4.6) this season. She's also set a new single-season school record for steals with 128. Her 426 career steals rank second

all-time in the CAA, while she sits fifth in UD history with 227 thefts as a Hen. Irving, meanwhile, offered instant offense and hard-nosed rebounding off the bench her sophomore and junior seasons before excelling in a starter's role this year. She's the Hens' all-time leader in field-goal percentage (.509) and their No. 3 career free-throw shooter (.831).

Mundy May Sit Out

Junior guard **Jamie Mundy**, a Blue Hen co-captain averaging 4.5 points and 2.4 rebounds per game, has missed Delaware's last 12 games with a knee injury suffered in practice on Jan. 29 and a later illness. She is questionable for Thursday's CAA Tournament first-round game versus UNC Wilmington.

Kabongo Connects

Freshman guard **Vanessa Kabongo** finished the regular season on a high note, as she poured in a career-high 17 points on 8-for-15 shooting and dished out three assists in the loss at Towson on Thursday evening. The scoring outburst was the 10th double-figure scoring day for the freshman from Toronto, who leads the five UD newcomers with 6.6 ppg this season. She's averaging 9.3 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 1.0 assists over her last three games.

DeHaven Stuffs The Scorebook

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** notched five points, five assists, one rebound, and one steal in 29 minutes of action against Towson, another well-rounded line for the spark plug from Herndon, VA. DeHaven has shined in CAA play, averaging team highs of 10.4 ppg, 5.1 spg, and 3.3 apg in conference games. On the year, DeHaven leads the Blue Hens in scoring (10.5 ppg), assists (3.6 apg), steals (4.6 spg), three-pointers made (25), and minutes played (35.9 mpg), while she ranks second in free-throw percentage (.832) and rebounds (5.0). She has notched two double-doubles this season - the first two of her career - and has logged 13 3-3-3-3 games (three or more points, rebounds, assists, and steals) on the year. For comparison's sake, eventual WNBA draft pick Tyresa Smith managed eight 3-3-3-3 nights all of last season. DeHaven has recorded 19 3-3-3-3 games since she transferred to Delaware, including nine in her last 17 outings:

All Right, Ariene!

Freshman forward **Ariene Jenkins**, who scored 13 points and grabbed seven rebounds in UD's loss on Thursday night, has hit her stride in CAA play. She averaged 6.9 points and 6.2 rebounds in league play this season, up dramatically from 2.0 ppg and 2.8 rpg outside the conference. Jenkins has posted five double-figure scoring games in her last 11 and is averaging 7.5 ppg and 6.7 rpg during that span. She has really come to life on the glass, where she's pulled down at least five rebounds in 11 of her last 12 outings.

Harrison Heats Up

Sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison**, who notched four points, five rebounds, two assists, two blocks, and two steals in Thursday's defeat at the hands of Towson, has amped up her production as of late. Over her last 17 games, the 6-foot-1 Patterson, NJ native is averaging 7.4 ppg and 6.2 rpg, up significantly from her previous 12 outings (2.7 ppg, 3.2 rpg). In the Hens' loss to Old Dominion on Jan. 27, she recorded her first career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Harrison has scored in double figures six times on the year, all in CAA play. She has hauled in five or more rebounds in 13 of her last 17 games and has led the team in rebounding eight times this season.

Sinking The Seahawks

The Blue Hens hold an 11-4 lead in the all-time series with UNC Wilmington and have won five of seven meetings at the Bob Carpenter Center. The teams last met on Jan. 17, when the Seahawks scored a 58-50 victory at the BCC behind 15 points from guard Greta Luksyte. Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** and sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** led UD with 14 points apiece, but the Hens shot just 29.1 percent from the floor in the defeat.

Last Meeting

Delaware suffered a 58-50 defeat at the hands of visiting UNC Wilmington on Jan. 17 at the BCC despite 14 points, six steals, four assists, and four rebounds from senior guard **Kyle DeHaven**. Sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** added 14 points and nine rebounds off the bench for the Hens, who forced 23 Wilmington turnovers but allowed the Seahawks to shoot .556 (20-for-36) from the floor. UD made just 16 of its 55 field-goal attempts (.291) and missed nine free throws in the loss. Guard Greta Luksyte led UNCW with 15 points, while forward Sahsha Taylor had 14 points and six rebounds and forward Brittany Blackwell chipped in with 13 points and nine boards. The Seahawks snapped a three-game losing streak to UD that dated back to the 2005-06 season.

Winter Chill

The Hens fell to 0-2 in March with a 58-55 setback at Towson on Thursday evening. They won just three of eight games in February, their fewest wins in that month since a 1-6 mark in 1997-98. UD went 3-5 in January and staggered through December at 0-5, their first winless month since November of 2002. Before their struggles this season, UD had gone a combined 106-27 (.797) in December, January, and February since joining the CAA for the 2001-02 season.

For Starters

Freshman guard **Gracie Palucis** logged her first career start in Delaware's loss to Arkansas on Dec. 29 in the Blue Sky Classic, meaning that all 12 players on the Blue Hens' roster have started at least one game this season. When coach **Tina Martin** started **Tesia Harris**, **Vanessa Kabongo**, **Kyle DeHaven**, **Farrah Ferguson**, and **Sha'Ron Harrison** on March 2 against VCU, she used her 14th different starting line-up of the year.

Stealing The Show

Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** made one steal in UD's 58-55 setback at Towson to bring her career total to 426, second-best in CAA history. When she intercepted a pass in the first half against the VCU on March 2, she passed VCU alum Rochelle Luckett for the No. 2 spot. DeHaven is just the third CAA player ever to tally 400 or more thefts. With 128 steals and counting in '07-'08, the Herndon, VA native has established a new single-season school record for steals. She has made 128 steals this year for an average of 4.6 per game, best in all of Division I. In Delaware's victory over Northeastern on Jan. 20, DeHaven tied her own school record with

nine steals. Remarkably, DeHaven has made at least one steal in 34 consecutive games dating back to last season, and she's made six or more steals 12 times this year. The four-time CAA All-Defensive Team selection, who was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year this week (she also took the honor in 2004-05 while at William & Mary), collected a league-high 99 steals last season and averaged 3.1 per game, good for 11th in the nation.

Study Hall Superstars

Junior guard **Jamie Mundy** and sophomore center **Farrah Ferguson** were named to the CAA All-Academic second team this week. A month ago, both were nominated for ESPN The Magazine/College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-American honors. Both Mundy and Ferguson have maintained GPAs of 3.2 or higher, and they've set a lofty academic standard for their fellow Blue Hens.

Home Sweet Home

The Blue Hens are 115-40 (.742) in the Bob Carpenter Center under head coach **Tina Martin**, 48-14 (.774) in CAA play. UD went 77-11 (.875) at home from the start of the 2000-01 season through the end of last year.

...But Lately, Homesick

The Hens are just 4-11 (.267) at the Bob Carpenter Center this year. Before its victory over Northeastern on Jan. 20, Delaware dropped seven straight at home for the first time since a seven-game skid from Dec. 12, 1996 to Jan. 21, 1997.

Road Warriors

Delaware may be just 3-9 (.250) away from home this season, but the Hens have fared very well away from the comfy confines of the Bob Carpenter Center in recent years. UD has compiled a 33-20 record (.623) on the road since the beginning of the 2004-05 season, including a 17-11 mark (.607) in CAA road games.

Banner Year

Last season was one to remember for the Blue Hens, who tied a school record with 26 wins, toppled two top-25 teams in the regular season, and earned an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament, where they fell to Michigan State, 69-58, in a hard-fought game. Senior guard **Tyresa Smith**, who led the league with 19.8 points per game and finished a brilliant career as the Hens' No. 2 all-time scorer, was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-CAA.

Playing The Percentages

Delaware graduated three senior leaders from last year in guards **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** and forward

Chrissy Fisher. Numbers can't do justice to the impact those three stars had on the program, but they're a good place to start. Last year, they accounted for 58.7 percent of the Hens' points, 49.6 percent of their rebounds, and 53.8 percent of their assists. Their five newcomers - **Tesia Harris**, **Ariene Jenkins**, **Vanessa Kabongo**, **Gracie Palucis**, and **Eva Riddick** - have done their best to compensate for the Hens' huge graduation losses. This year, they're responsible for 34.1 percent of all UD's points, 30.1 percent of its rebounds, and 18.6 percent of its assists.

Off The Mark From Behind The Arc

The Hens went just 1-for-9 (.111) from three-point range against Towson on Thursday night to follow up a dismal 1-for-8 (.125) effort on March 2 versus VCU. Delaware has made just six of its 34 three-point tries (.176) over the last three games after going 11-for-24 (.458) from deep over its previous three outings. Despite the fact that they're shooting .269 from beyond the arc in CAA play, up from .173 outside the league, the Hens just haven't been able to find the range this year. Delaware's .222 three-point field goal percentage is worst in the CAA, and UD ranks last in all of Division I in three-pointers made at 1.9 per game. The Blue Hens haven't made five or more trifectas in a game since March 1 of last season. Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven**, who went 1-for-5 from the outside against Towson on Thursday, is the team's leader in threes made with 25. One Hen who has caught fire recently is freshman guard **Tesia Harris**, who has canned 13 of her 37 attempts (.351) in conference play.

Ballhawks...or Ball-Hens?

Delaware, long known as one of the CAA's toughest defensive squads, collected 11 steals and forced 20 turnovers in its loss on Thursday evening. The Hens have forced 21.3 turnovers and made 11.6 steals per game this season, ranking second in the conference in both categories. In league play, the Hens lead the conference in turnovers forced (22.0 topg), rank second in steals (12.4 spg), and rank third in turnover margin (+2.8 topg). Defensively, the Hens have picked up where they left off last year. Delaware's '06-'07 success began with its defense, as the Hens forced more turnovers (22.3 per game) than any other CAA team and made a league-high 424 steals. Three Blue Hens - **Kyle DeHaven**, **Tyresa Smith**, and **Alena Koshansky** - placed among the league's top six in steals, as all three tallied at least 80. This year, DeHaven leads the CAA with a school record 128 steals and ranks first nationwide with 4.6 spg.

Keeping Score

Delaware managed just 55 points in its loss at Towson on Thursday evening after a dreadful 33-point outing at VCU on March 2, the fewest points by the Hens in any game since they put up a program-low 32 in a loss at Temple on March 2, 1974. UD has been held under 50 points in six of its last nine games, averaging an anemic 46.4 ppg in that span. But unkind iron is nothing new to the Hens, who have struggled to find the basket all season en route to a league-low 50.4 points per game (324th among 326 Division I teams). The school record for lowest-scoring season was set in the experimental year of 1970-71, when Delaware averaged 44.7 ppg in its first year as a varsity program. UD's season high of 71 points is lower than the *average* output of two other CAA teams - #14 Old Dominion and James Madison.

Dead-Last Distribution

The Blue Hens dished out a season-high 16 assists on Thursday at Towson Center Arena, but they rank last in the CAA - and the nation - in assists at 7.5 apg. UD has tallied just 226 assists on the season, while its opponents have nearly doubled that total with 433. Delaware has dished out three assists or fewer six times this season, setting a school record with just one assist in a loss at Dartmouth on Dec. 30. Senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** leads the squad with 3.6 assists per game and collected five assists on Thursday.

Up, Up And Away In CAA Play

Statistically, Delaware has improved significantly in virtually all facets of the game since beginning its CAA season on Jan. 6. A quick look at the Blue Hens' upswing:

New Faces

The Blue Hens have gotten solid production from their five freshmen - guards **Tesia Harris**, **Vanessa Kabongo**, and **Gracie Palucis**, forward **Ariene Jenkins**, and center **Eva Riddick** - this season. The Hens boast the CAA's youngest roster with five freshmen and three sophomores, but the new arrivals have delivered. Kabongo has averaged 6.6 points this season to lead the freshmen, reaching double figures 10 times and hauling in 2.6 rebounds per night. She poured in a career-high 17 points on 8-for-15 shoot-

ing on Thursday at Towson. Harris (5.0 ppg, 2.0 rpg) has logged six double-figure games of her own and poured in a career-high 21 points in the Hens' win over Hofstra on Feb. 17, becoming the first UD freshman to eclipse 20 points in a game since 2001. Jenkins (5.3 ppg, 5.1 rpg) has averaged 7.5 points and 6.7 rebounds over her last 11 games, while Riddick (0.7 ppg, 2.1 rpg) matched her career high with seven rebounds in UD's loss at VCU on March 2. Palucis (1.1 ppg, 0.7 rpg) netted a career-high nine points on three tri-fectas in Delaware's loss to Georgia State on Feb. 28. Together, the five newcomers are contributing 17.2 ppg, 10.8 rpg, 1.4 apg, and 2.7 spg, but those numbers jump to 20.7 ppg, 12.8 rpg, 1.6 apg, and 3.2 spg in CAA games. They combined for 36 points, 13 boards, four assists, and five steals in the Hens' 58-55 loss to the Tigers on Thursday evening.

Haven't I Seen You Somewhere?

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirements needed to coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins. Martin has an identical twin sister, Teresa, while Radice has a fraternal twin sister, Julie.

Miserable Milestones

With their loss on Thursday, the Blue Hens fell to 7-23 on the season, setting a new school record for losses. The 1997-98 squad finished with a 6-21 record. The Towson setback was also UD's 12th CAA loss, the most by the Hens since they joined the league.

Rimmed Out

The Blue Hens shot a solid 42.9 percent from the floor in Thursday's loss to the Tigers, just the second time in 10 games that Delaware has made more than 40 percent of its attempts. UD's hot shooting night came just a week after the Hens made just 21.8 percent of their shots (11.5 percent before intermission) in a Senior Day loss to Georgia State. On Feb. 10, UD established an all-time program low for field-goal percentage (.196) in a loss to visiting George Mason. The Blue Hens are shooting .324 from the floor this year, worst in the CAA and 324th of 326 Division I teams. UD has shot below 35 percent in 21 of 30 games this season, and 11 of the team's 12 players are shooting below 40 percent on the year. The Hens have shot below 35 percent in eight of their last 10 outings, connecting on just 171 of 561 field-goal attempts (.305) in those contests. Senior forward **Courtney Irving** leads the team with a .500 field-goal percentage.

We'll Miss Ya, 'Resal'

Delaware said goodbye to the most decorated player in school history in guard **Tyresa Smith**, who graduated last year and was selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the WNBA Draft. Smith, a two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year and first team All-CAA pick, finished her Blue Hen career at No. 2 on UD's all-time scoring list (1,635 points) and as the school's all-time leader in steals (342). She ranks among the top 11 in UD history in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, field goals made, and free throws made.

Irving's No Long Shot

Senior forward **Courtney Irving** ranks No. 1 on UD's all-time list with a .509 career field goal percentage. She connected on 98 of 170 shots last year (.576) to break a 15-year-old single-season school record. Irving also ranks third in Delaware history with an .831 career free-throw percentage. This season, she's made 55 of her 110 field goal attempts (.500) and 48 of 57 free throws (.842), both team highs.

Twenty-Something

Before this year, Delaware had won 20 or more games in seven of its previous eight seasons, amassing a 184-59 record in that span. The Hens had recorded just four 20-win years in the previous 28.

Bored With Boards

Towson outrebounded Delaware 44-35 on Thursday, the 18th time in 30 games that UD has lost the battle of the boards. But the Hens have thrived on the glass in conference play, ranking sixth in the league in rebounding (37.5 rpg), fifth in rebounding defense (37.2 rpg), and sixth in rebounding margin (+0.3 rpg). Freshman forward **Ariene Jenkins** leads the team in rebounding with 5.1 rpg, while sophomore forward **Sha'Ron Harrison** and senior guard **Kyle DeHaven** are pulling down 5.0 rpg apiece.

Out of Their Element

Until this season, the Hens had fared very well in non-conference games in recent years. Delaware is 33-20 (.623) outside the CAA since the start of the 2003-04 season, but the Hens have lost 13 of their last 14 games against teams from other leagues, including 11 of 12 this season.

National Power to Power Outage

Last season, UD ranked fourth in the country in steals per game (13.3), tenth in turnovers per game (13.6), 18th in scoring defense (55.9 ppg), 19th in scoring margin (12.9 ppg), 19th in winning percentage (81.3%), and 50th in free throw percentage (73.7%). This year, the young Hens have struggled against top-quality competition and their numbers aren't quite as

impressive. UD ranks last in the CAA in scoring offense (50.4 ppg), field goal percentage (32.4%), three-point field goal percentage (22.2%), assists (7.5 apg), assist-to-turnover ratio (0.39), and three-point field goals made (1.9 per game). Delaware ranks in the bottom half of the CAA in 14 of the 19 team categories kept by the league, but the Hens are second in steals at 11.6 spg, fourth in turnover margin at +2.0 topg, fourth in scoring defense at 58.6 ppg, fifth in free-throw percentage at 67.9%, and sixth in offensive rebounds at 15.1 rpg. Nationally, the numbers don't look much better. As of March 9, Delaware ranked 324th of 326 Division I teams in scoring, 326th in field goal percentage, 326th in three-pointers made, 326th in assists per game, and 325th in assist-to-turnover ratio. On a more promising note, the Hens were 17th nationwide in steals and 53rd in scoring defense.

Colonial Dominance

The Blue Hens have posted a 91-35 record (.722) in CAA play since they joined the league in 2001-02. Only perennial power Old Dominion (116-10) has won more conference games in that span.

Tough Slate

In 2007-08, Delaware has faced seven teams – Delaware State, Maryland, Louisville, Texas Christian, Bowling Green, James Madison, and Old Dominion – that made the NCAA Tournament last year. Four of the Hens' first five opponents went to the Big Dance a year ago. The Hens have already faced three top-25 teams - No. 3 Maryland, No. 13 Old Dominion, and No. 23 Arkansas - this season. Delaware is now 2-29 all-time against teams in the top 25, including 0-3 this season.

Talking Turkey

In June, head coach **Tina Martin**, associate head coach **Jeanine Radice**, former player **Alena Koshansky**, and current players **Courtney Irving** and **Kyle DeHaven** ventured to Turkey along with members of the UD sports management department. For eight days, the Blue Hen representatives conducted clinics for coaches and players as part of FIBA Europe's Year of Women's Basketball campaign.

It Runs In The Family

Freshman guard **Tesia Harris**, a Street & Smith All-American as a high school senior last year, has basketball in her blood. She is a cousin of Channing Frye, a forward with the Portland Trailblazers.

RICHMOND, VA -- Guard La'Tavia Rorie posted game highs of 13 points and eight rebounds off the bench to lead Virginia Commonwealth to a 55-33 victory over cold-shooting Delaware on Sunday at Alltel Pavilion...sophomore forward Sha'Ron Harrison scored 10 points and blocked three shots for the Blue Hens, who lost their fourth straight game, fell to VCU for the first time since the 2004-05 season, and scored their fewest points since a 1974 loss to Temple...freshman guard Tesia Harris contributed six points and five rebounds for UD, while sophomore guard Corinthia Benison netted five points and dished out three assists...forward Krystal Vaughn celebrated VCU's Senior Day with 12 points and seven boards, while fellow forward Kita Waller added nine points, six boards, and four steals...Delaware (7-22, 6-11 CAA) trailed from the opening tap, as the Rams used a 17-0 run midway through the first half to take a 24-4 lead with 5:24 left before intermission...Rorie hit two three-pointers during the surge, while Waller netted five points...meanwhile, UD was held scoreless for 10:29, missing 12 consecutive shots until Harrison drained a 15-footer to stop the bleeding at the 5:02 mark...the Blue Hens cut the deficit to 15 in the final minute of the period, but VCU guard Radoslava Bachvarova's deep three with 19 seconds left gave the Rams the momentum and a 30-12 halftime advantage...the Hens shot 20.7 percent from the floor in the half and scored their fewest points in any half this season...VCU extended its lead to as many as 26 in the second half and coasted to its third straight win, forcing 22 Delaware turnovers and outrebounding the Hens 44-40...senior guard Kyle DeHaven had two points and three steals for UD, passing VCU alum Rochelle Luckett for second in CAA history with 425 career thefts...the Hens have lost 22 games, the most in program history.

TOWSON, MD -- Forward Kandace Davis scored 16 points and guard Holly Mahan added 15 to help Towson thwart a late comeback bid by Delaware in a 58-55 decision on Thursday evening at the Towson Center Arena...freshman guard Vanessa Kabongo poured in a career-high 17 points on 8-for-15 shooting for the Blue Hens, who dropped their fifth straight in spite of a furious rally over the last eight minutes...fellow freshman Ariene Jenkins added 13 points and seven rebounds...down 51-38 with 7:38 remaining, the Hens staged a 15-4 surge to close the gap to two on a put-back by Jenkins with 56 ticks on the clock...but UD couldn't get a key stop, as Mahan found space in the lane and hit an uncontested lay-in to double the Tigers' edge to four with 30 seconds left...Kabongo answered with a jumper from the left wing on UD's next trip down the floor, and the Hens fouled Davis with 6.6 seconds left...Davis couldn't ice the game for TU, making just one of two free throws to give Delaware a chance to tie...senior guard Kyle DeHaven raced downcourt and got herself open for a three-point try from the right wing, but her shot rolled off the rim as the buzzer sounded and Towson celebrated its Senior Night with its second win in a row...Kabongo poured in 10 first-half points on 5-of-8 shooting for the Hens, who shot a solid 44.4 percent in the period...Davis countered with 10 of her own for Towson, hitting five of her six field goal tries...Towson opened the second half with an 11-4 surge and added a 7-0 run midway through the half, highlighted by a deep three from Mahan, to take its biggest lead of the night at 51-38...UD got seven points and four assists from sophomore guard Corinthia Benison, while freshman guard Tesia Harris chipped in with six points and Kyle DeHaven logged five points and five assists...the Hens shot 42.9 percent (24-for-56) for the game, holding Towson to 35-percent shooting and forcing 20 Tiger turnovers...Delaware finished the regular season with a program-worst 7-23 record.
