Injury Report

Blue Hen forward Christina Rible is sustained a spiral fracture in the fifth finger of her left hand in practice on December 13. The injury forced the two-time All-America East player to miss five games. Rible returned action last week against Old Dominion with the finger heavily taped up.

Battle of the Minds

Last season's Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year takes on last season's America East Coach of the Year this evening when George Mason University hosts the University of Delaware. Last season, Debbie Taneyhill lead the Patriots to a third place finish in the CAA while Tina Martin led the Blue Hens to the program's first America East title in its final season in the conference. Delaware is currently playing its first season as a member of the CAA.

Martin and Taneyhill dueled last season in in Fairfax, with the Patriots handing the Hens their worse loss of the season, 61-89. In that contest, UD shot a season-low .283 from the field and committing 30 turnovers in the loss.

Excluding the former America East programs, George Mason is the CAA opponent that Delaware has played the most. In their eight meetings, the Blue Hens have come up on the losing end seven times. UD's lone win came in a 1994 showdown in Fairfax, winning, 84-83, in overtime. Tonight is the first conference meeting between George Mason and Delaware.

GMU is coming off a 51-71 loss to Old Dominion on Sunday at the Patriot Center.

Last Time Out

The University of Delaware snapped its first two-game losing streak in two seasons with a 68-51 victory at Towson (1-13, 0-5 CAA) on Sunday. The Blue Hens, who never trailed, recovered from poor shooting in the first half (7-22) to hit half of their shots (15-30) in the second half. UDnow has a four-game winning streak over the Tigers.

Megan Dellegrotti led all scorers with 25 points and six assists and **Christina Rible**, playing in only her second game since returning from injury, posted her fifth double-double of the season (12 pts, 10 rbs) in the Delaware victory.

Up Next

After losing its first game at the Bob Carpenter Center in 22 contests, the University of Delaware looks to start a new home-court winning streak when it hosts James Madison on Sunday. The Dukers are among the conferences top programs, finishing No. 2 in the conference last season and selected second in the preseason coaches' poll. The all-time series between Delaware and James Madison is tied at one win a piece.

JMU (11-3 and 5-0 CAA), is coming off a 66-51 victory at William & Mary on Sunday. The Dukers are led by All-CAAselection Nadine Morgan (12.5 ppg, 6.8 rpg) and forward Shanna Price (15.8 ppg, 6.4 rpg). In addition the JMU lineup consists of a trio of conference leaders. Allyson Keener leads the CAA in 3-pointers made (2.71 pg), Jess Cichowicz is No. 1 in the conference in assists (6.36 apg) and center Hollee Franklin leads the league in blocks (1.57 blocks per game).

A Good Month

Delaware's eight-game winning streak in the month of January came to an end on January 6 when the Hens fell to VCU, 62-57, in Richmond. Before the loss, UD had not lost in January since it fell to New Hampshire, 68-75, on January 29, 2000. Delaware was 7-0 in January 2001 and is 21-10 over the last three seasons during the first month of the year.

The Next Challenge...

The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAAwomen's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and are considered among the nation's top programs.

Delaware opened up CAA action on Saturday, December 29, defeating Hofstra, 71-66, at the Bob Carpenter Center.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAAPreseason Coaches' Poll.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .766 from the charity stripe this season (No. 6 in the nation). The team's 269 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 20.7 ppg from FTs alone.

Leading the way are three players in the conference's top 5 in FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw in the eighth game of the season after netting her first 27. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Currently, Sailer leads the CAA with a .902 FT Pct. (46-51).

Allison Trapp recently reached the minimum number of attempts needed to rank among the conference leaders. Her .880 FT Pct. (22-25) is the third best in the CAA.

Megan Dellegrotti's .856 FT Pct.(89-104), No. 5 in the CAA, has brought her career FT Pct. up five points to .844. Her career FT Pct. is the second best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

300 for Free

After netting her fourth of nine free throws against VCU on January 6, **Megan Dellegrotti** became only the fourth Blue Hen to score 300 points in a career from the foul line. The guard is the fastest Blue Hen to reach the mark, netting 300 FTs of her first 355 attempts. Prior to Dellegrotti, Danielle Leyfert had reached the mark in the fewest attempts when she scored 300 in 409 attempts.

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made a point to emphasize defense this season. In return, the "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success, holding opponents to just 61.9 ppg, third lowest in the CAA.

Delaware ranks among the CAA leaders in many areas of defensive play. UD is No. 4 in blocked shots, averaging 2.85 blocks per game. The opposition is shooting only .390 from the field, No. 4 in the CAA. Delaware is also fourth in rebounding defense (36.7 rpg) and fifth in

steals (9.73 steals per game).

Welcome Back Rible

Blue Hen forward **Christina Rible** returned to action last Friday night after missing five games with a fractured finger. She was out of action since sustaining the injury in practice on December 13.

The tri-captain struggled against CAA powerhouse Old Dominion in her first game back, shooting just 1-9 for four points and a rebound. But Rible regained form two days later, posting her fourth double-double of the season in Delaware's victory at Towson, finishing with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Prior to this season, Rible had missed only three collegiate games, missing the first three contests of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games that season with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won 26 of the last 28 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. Before the Hens fell at VCU last on January 6, Delaware had a 25-game winning streak when the guard hit for double-figures dating back to the 1999-2000 season. Since Dellegrotti's sophomore season, Delaware is 28-4 when she scores 10 plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season.

Scoring Quartet

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti, Allison Trapp, Christina Rible and Julie Sailer**). The last time that four Delaware players averaged double figures was in the 1997-1998 season.

UD Versus Ranked Opponents

To say the that the University of Delaware is due for a win against a ranked opponent is an understatement. The Blue Hens are 0-20 all-time against teams ranked in the top 25.

What a Streak it was

The University of Delaware women's basketball held the third longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games) for six days. Tennessee's loss to Connecticut on January 5, made Delaware's two-year old streak the third longest in the nation and placed the Hens among very prestigious company. Connecticut was No. 1 in both the AP and the USA Today/ESPN and Notre Dame is the defending NCAA National Champion.

The streak came to an end last Friday night when the Blue Hens lost to No. 25 Old Dominion, 82-55. Prior to that game, Delaware had not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when it fell to Maine, 73-58. Delaware has still has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996.

The Backcourt

Since **Allison Trapp** returned to the starting lineup against La Salle, the Blue Hen backcourt (consisting of Trapp and **Megan Dellegrotti**) has put together impressive numbers. Combined, the duo is averaging almost 27 points, five assists and nearly four steals per contest.

Dellegrotti is currently No. 5 in the CAA in ppg and holds four of the top five Blue Hen scoring performances this season. While her counterpart, Allison Trapp, is the only Blue Hen to score 20 points in back-to-back this season. She hit for 22 against La Salle (12/18) and Marist (12/22).

Its Her Time

After playing a role off the bench the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court for the Blue Hens. Her 8.6 ppg is good for fifth on the team and she is third with 5.2 rpg. Defensively, Davis second on the team with 24 steals and has the second most defensive rebounds (52).

Davis recorded her 500th career point earlier this season against Princeton on December 1 and recorded her first collegiate double-double (11 pts, 11rbs) versus UNC Wilmington on January 4.

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues"

on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after **Allison Trapp** went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer scored the 100th point of her career at UNC Wilmington on January 4. Reaching the total in 10 games, she became the fastest Blue Hen to reach the century mark since Danielle Leyfert hit the mark in her six games in 1987-88.

Stepping Up Underneath Part 1

The injury to **Christina Rible** force a couple of players to increase their roles. Last year's *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year **Tiara Malcom** was posting bench highs in points and rebounds before the loss of Rible. Thrust into a starting role for five games, Malcom posted her first career double-double in her first start against La Salle on December 18. The freshman averaged 7.6 ppg and 8.6 rpg as a starter.

Stepping Up Underneath Part 2

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, **Christine Cole** had to expand her game offensively when Rible went down. Cole answered the challenge and then doubled her ppg (from 3.3 to 8.0) and pulled down an additional 3.7 rpg (2.7 to 6.4) in the five game span. The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle, Delaware's first game without Rible.

Naming the Gym After Her

Senior forward **Lindsay Davis** had arguably the best game of her career on November 28, against Bucknell. Playing in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium, Davis scored a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds. She scored 24 points in the second half alone, as Delaware overcame a six-point halftime deficit to win the game, 86-66.

A Roller Coaster of a Week

Megan Dellegrotti had a very interesting first week of December, On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game by hitting six as she put up a career-high 29 points in the Blue Hens' 85-57 victory over Princeton. Six days later, Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances taking on Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. She shot just 1-11 from the field, as the team shot a season-low .226 and committed 30 turnovers in the loss. But tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a very big way the next day against Centenary. The tri-captain had her second best career scoring performance (26 points) with three treys and five assists in the Delaware victory. She finished the roller coaster of a week by being named to the Cornell All-Tournament Team and the Wilmington Trust Best of Blue Hen Player of the Week.

The Key is 70

Delaware has only allowed two teams to score 70 points in a game this season (Marist and ODU). This statistic has been a key in the team's success over the past four seasons in which the Blue Hens are 65-7 when holding opponents under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 76 of Delaware's 87 wins have come

when holding the opponent under 70 points.

Finishing Up

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 59-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 8-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lost after leading at the break was a 58-68 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001. Delaware held a two-point halftime lead.

Former University of Delaware men's basketball standout **Tyrone Perry** has joined the women's basketball coaching staff this season. He had spent the last two seasons as a member the men's coaching staff. Perry is the career games played leader for the men's basketball team as well as its first three-time captain. The former guard led the Hens to back-to-back America East titles his junior and senior seasons.
