Injury Report

The University of Delaware will be without two-time All-America East forward **Christina Rible** for at least two weeks. The senior sustained a spiral fracture in the fifth finger of her left hand in practice on December 13. Rible is currently No. 1 in the CAA in rebounding and the only player in the conference averaging a double-double. The injury has caused her to miss two already. A re-evaluation will be done on January 2nd.

Raising a New Flag

Delaware gets its first taste of Colonial Athletic Association play today against a very familiar opponent. Hofstra has played UD in conference in 19 of the last 22 seasons, spanning three different conferences (East Coast Conference, North Atlantic Conference and America East). Today's game will be the inaugural CAA conference game for both Delaware and Hofstra.

Hofstra last played on December 9, losing to Wagner, 61-60. The Pride have three starters averaging double-figures. Jen Brickey (15.4 ppg) and Kimberly Coke (13.2) were selected All America East last season, second and third team respectively. Sophomore Rume Pela is netting 10.2 ppg.

Last Time Out

Delaware's backcourt of **Megan Dellegrotti** and **Allison Trapp** combined for 48 points, 10 rebounds, 13 assists, and 11 steals as the Blue Hens defeated Marist College, 87-72, in Poughkeepsie, New York on December 22. The Hens won their third straight with an offensive explosion that saw them score 51 points to jump out to a nine-point halftime lead. UD committed just 11 fouls and 12 turnovers, both season-lows.

Dellegrotti hit for 26 points for the second time in three games and also pulled down six rebounds, matching **Tracey Howell** for a team-high (the first time at Delaware she was the team's leading rebounder).

Trapp, making only her second start since returning from injury, scored 22 points and tied a Delaware record with eight steals.

Tiara Malcom and **Christine Cole** both hit for 13 points and combined for 9 rebounds.

Up Next

The Blue Hens get out the name tags once again, as they head down south to face the University of North Carolina Wilmington and Virginia Commonwealth University in CAA play. UD has never faced either program.

So far this season the Blue Hens have faced five programs for the first time ever, compiling a 3-2 record in this matchups. Tina Martin teams are 7-10 all-time in inaugural meetings.

Delaware plays at UNCW at 7 p.m. next Friday (1/4) and takes on VCU next Sunday (1/6) at 2 p.m.

Stressing the Basics

Today's game features two teams that focus on the basics of the game: defense and foul shooting. Hofstra is first in the CAA in defensive ppg (57.9), UD is No. 2 (61.2). Delaware is first in FTPct. (.779), Hofstra is second (.693).

The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball team currently holds the fifth longest home winning streak in Division I (21 games). The team finds itself among very prestigious company as the teams in front of them have won six out of the last seven NCAA championships. Three of the four teams currently rank in the top five in the nation according to the AP Top 25 Poll.

The Blue Hens have not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when they fell to Maine, 73-58. In addition, Delaware has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996.

Double-Digit Margins

The last 29 games that Delaware has played in the Bob Carpenter Center have been decided by 10 points or more, with the Hens owning a 27-2 record in that span (both losses came to Maine). The last single-digit margin at home was a 69-67 win over Towson on Feb. 9, 1999, with the Blue Hens winning in the final second. The average margin of victory for the winners in the 29-game span is 18.4 points.

The Next Challenge...

The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and is considered among the nation's top programs.

Not including the former America East programs, Delaware has a 4-8 all-time record against its new CAA rivals.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAA pre-season coaches poll.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .779 from the charity stripe this season (No. 5 in the nation as of Dec. 17). The team's 169 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 21.1 ppg from free throws.

The Blue Hens have two players in the conference top 5 in FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw of the season last game against Marist after netting her first 27. She was just four free

throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Sailer is second in the CAA with a .967 FT Pct.

Megan Dellegrotti's .885 FT Pct.(54-61), No. 4 in the CAA, has brought her career FT Pct. up eight points to .847, the second best in a career for a Blue Hen.

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. The "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far this season, holding opponents to only 61.2 ppg, second lowest in the conference.

Delaware ranks high in the CAA in all areas of defensive play. UD is No. 1 in blocked shots, averaging 3.25 per game. When an opponent gets a shot past the UD defense, the chances are its not going in. The opposition is shooting .366 (tied with Hofstra for No. 1 in CAA) from the field. The team's 26.25 defensive rpg is third in the conference.

The Key is 70

Delaware has only allowed one team to score 70 points in a game this season (Marist put 72 up against the Hens). This statistic has been a key to the team's success over the past four seasons. The Blue Hens are 62-6 over the last four seasons when holding teams under 70 points. Overall, during Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 73 of Delaware's 83 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

A Big Loss

On December 7, team tri-captain **Christina Rible** fractured the fifth finger in her left hand during practice. She is expected to miss at least three weeks. A re-evaluation will be done on January 2 to see if the finger requires surgery that may end her season.

At the time of the injury, Rible was leading the CAA in rebounding (11.2 rpg). She averaged a double-double in 2000-01 and the senior was at it again (12.2 ppg). She notched double-doubles against Liberty (18 points, 12 rebounds), Bucknell (20 points, 13 rebounds) and Coppin State (14 points, 11 rebounds).

Rible had missed only three prior collegiate games in her career missing the first three of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

A Big Return

Delaware junior **Allison Trapp** returned to action at the Cornell Tournament on December 7. She had missed three games after sustaining a high-ankle sprain in the first minute of UD's season opener with Liberty University. Trapp was the team's leading scorer in its two pre-season games.

Trapp's performance has improved steadily the more games she has played. Since returning against Coppin State (December 7), Trapp has improved each game in every statistic. In UD's last game, the junior scored a 22 points with four rebounds while posting season team-highs in assists (8) and steals (8, which also tied the school record).

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won the last 23 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. The last time she hit for double-digits and lost was at Hofstra on February 3,

2000, with UD falling 67-57. Since the start of Dellegrotti's sophomore season Delaware is 25-2 when she scores 10 plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season.

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after Allison Trapp went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer posted a career-high 21 points off the bench against La Salle last Tuesday. She is currently averaging 10.9 ppg with 5.0 rpg in 28.3 minutes.

New Roles

The injury to **Christina Rible** has placed new roles on Blue Hens **Tracey Howell**, **Tiara Malcom** and **Christine Cole**. With the opportunity for these three to expand their game, so far the results have been positive.

Tracey Howell is averaging five more minutes each game, pulling down 12 rebounds and blocking two shots in her time.

Last year's *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year Tiara Malcom was posting bench highs in points and rebounds, before the loss of Rible. Malcom, now starting, posted her first career double-double in her first start against La Salle last Tuesday. The freshman has 23 points and 16 rebounds in the two games she has started.

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, Christine Cole has expanded her game offensively in Rible's absence. Cole is averaging 13.5 ppg in the last two contests, compared to the 3.3 ppg she was averaging prior. The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle last Tuesday.

- **Megan Dellegrotti** needs 17 free throws to become the fourth Delaware player to net 300 points from the charity stripe in a career.
- **Julie Sailer** needs 13 points to reach 100 career points.
