### Trading Places

The Blue Hens and the Dukes have gone down different roads since UD rallied from a 13-point deficit to defeat JMU, 58-50, on January 20. Going into that contest the Dukes were tied for first place in the CAA with a 6-0 record and were ranked No. 46 according to *CollegeRPI.com*. But since Julie Sailer came off the bench to score a game-high 14 points to snap its winning streak, James Madison has gone 3-6 and seen its RPI drop to No. 124.

The fourth-place Dukes lost at UNC Wilmington, 55-52, on Thursday night to extend its losing streak to three games.

On the other hand, Delaware has clinched second in the conference, its RPI is at a season-high No. 58, and comes in with a three-game winning streak.

Delaware defeated George Mason, 69-56, in the final game at the Bob Carpenter Center on Thursday night. Delaware shot 22-24 (.916) from the free throw line to sweep the season series with the Patriots.

It was the final game at the BCC for the Blue Hens seniors who led the way. Senior **Christina Rible** led the way with 14 points and nine rebounds as her classmates **Megan Dellegrotti** (12 points, five rebounds) and **Lindsay Davis** (12 points, career-high six assists) also scored in double figures.

## Up Next

The University of Delaware will close out the regular season on Friday night as it takes on Hofstra University in New York.

The Blue Hens beat the Pride, 71-66, at the Bob Carpenter Center on December 29, 2001. **Christine Cole**'s three-point play with 1:35 left to play put Delaware up for good. **Allison Trapp** matched season-high to finish with game-high 22 points. It was the first CAA game for both programs. The Blue Hens have won three-straight over the Pride.

## What a Ride

The 2001-02 Blue Hen seniors played their last game at the Bob Carpenter Center on Thursday night. The play of these young ladies have brought about a level of success that has never seen before in Newark. Their record of 83-29 is the best four-year record in the programs history. They have turned the BCC into one of the best home courts in the nation posting a record of 46-4 at home including a school-record 22-game home winning streak. They led the Blue Hens to its only America East Championship and the programs first trip into the NCAA Tournament in last season.

Seniors **Lindsay Davis**, **Megan Dellegrotti** and **Christina Rible** each scored in double figures to led the Blue Hens to a, 69-56, win over George Mason. Their classmates, **Valerie Katsorhis** added an assist and **Kim Tingley** finished with four points, a career-high.

## The Next Challenge...

### The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and are considered among the nation's top programs.

Delaware opened up CAA action on Saturday, December 29, 2001, when it defeated Hofstra, 71-66, at the Bob Carpenter Center.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAAPreseason Coaches' Poll.

## Fabulous in February

Over the course of the last three seasons Delaware is 19-2 during the month of February. The Blue Hens ended a 13-game winning streak in the second month of the year, when they lost to Vermont on February 24, 2001, 68-58. The Vermont loss was UD's last loss in America East conference-play.

## Nine Straight

The University of Delaware ended a nine-game winning-streak when it lost at Old Dominion, 72-45, on February 10. This year's version of the season-high winning streak marks the third straight season that the Blue Hens have run a winning-streak to at least nine games. UD won nine straight in 1999-2000 before a season-ending loss to Maine in the America East semifinals. Last season the Blue Hens posted a record 17-game winning-streak before losing at Vermont.

## The "D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made a point to emphasize defense this season. In return, the "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success, holding opponents to just 59.1 ppg, the second lowest in the CAA. They have not allowed less than 60.0 ppg in a season since 1983-84, when the Blue Hens finished the season allowing opponents 57.6 ppg.

Delaware ranks among the CAA leaders in many areas of defensive play. UD is second in blocked shots, averaging 3.36 blocks per game. The opposition is shooting only .377 from the field, No. 2 in the CAA. Delaware is third in rebounding defense (36.0 rpg).

## Scoring Quartet

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti**, **Allison Trapp**, **Christina Rible** and **Julie Sailer**).

The last time that four Delaware players finished the season averaging in double figures was in the 1997-1998 season.

Delaware is one of two teams in conference to have four players ranked among the top 25 conference scoring leaders. The four makeup 71.3% of the UD offense (48.3 ppg of 67.6 ppg)

### ***New Places, New Faces***

This season the University of Delaware faced eight teams that it has never played before. It is the most new teams on the schedule since the 1980-81 season when UD faced 12 new opponents. The Blue Hens were of 4-4 in these inaugural matchups this season.

### ***Accepting Charity***

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .776 from the charity stripe this season, No. 5 in the nation in Tuesday's NCAArankings. The Blue Hens'516 points from the line are the most in the country, as they averages 20.6 ppg from the line.

Leading the way are three players in the conference's top FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw in the eighth game of the season after netting her first 27 attempts. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. While shooting a conference best .895 (94-105) from the line she was is No. 5 in the nation on Tuesday.

**Megan Dellegrotti's** .851 FT Pct. (143-168), No. 3 in the CAA. Her career .844 FTPct. is the second-best career FTPct. by a Blue Hen and her 143 points from the line this season is second most ever by a Delaware player.

Finally, **Allison Trapp** is shooting .800 (64-80) from the charity stripe which is good for sixth in the CAA.

The Blue Hens may add a fourth player to the conference top 10 shortly. Tiara Malcom is shooting .700 (70-100) from the line this season, No. 12 in the CAA

### ***The Key is 70***

Delaware has only allowed an opponent to score 70 points in a game this season four times. Despite winning two of the four contests, keeping teams below 70 is a key to UD's success. Over the past five seasons the Blue Hens are 73-10 when holding opponents under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 85 of Delaware's 98 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

On the other side of the coin over the past five seasons UD is 8-37 when giving up 70 plus.

The Blue Hens may be even more tough when scoring 70 points. This season Delaware is 11-0 when hitting the mark. Over the last three seasons it is 60-5 and has a 29-game winning streak when scoring at least 70. Its last loss when scoring 70 plus was a 70-71 loss at the University of Maryland on November 26, 2000.

### ***What a Streak It was***

The University of Delaware women's basketball team held the third longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games) for six days. Tennessee's loss to Connecticut on January 5, made Delaware's two-year old streak the third-longest in the nation and placed the Hens among very prestigious company. At the time, Connecticut was No. 1 in both the APand the USA Today/ESPN and Notre Dame is the defending NCAANational Champion.

The streak came to an end when the Blue Hens lost to No. 25 Old Dominion, 82-55. Prior to that game, Delaware had not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when it fell to Maine, 73-58. Delaware has still has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 64-65, in 1996, a span of 15 games.

### ***UD Versus Ranked Opponents***

To say the that the University of Delaware is due for a win against a ranked opponent is an understatement. The Blue Hens are 0-21 all-time against teams ranked in the top 25.

### ***Finishing Up***

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 68-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 17-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lost after leading at the break was a 68-58 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001. Delaware held a two-point half-time lead in that contest.

### ***The Backcourt***

The Delaware backcourt ranks as one of the best in the CAA as either **Megan Dellegrotti** or **Allison Trapp** rank among the conference leaders in many categories. The two combine to average 26.2 ppg, the best guard tandem in the CAA. In addition the duo is averaging nearly five assists, three steals while shooting .835 from the foul line.

Dellegrotti is currently No. 6 in the CAA scoring (13.6)while she holds four of the top five Blue Hen scoring performances this season.

She is also eighth in the conference in assists (3.64) and sixth from behind the three-point arc (.365).

Trapp is No. 12 in the CAA with 12.6 ppg. The junior is the only Blue Hen to score 20 points in back-to-back games this season and leads the team shooting .427 (103-241) from the field. In addition, she is fifth in the CAA in steals (2.18).

### ***Rible's Return***

Blue Hen forward **Christina Rible** returned to action January 11 after missing five games with a fractured finger. She sustained the injury in practice on December 13 and missed the next four weeks of action.

Rible has been a force since her return, recording double-doubles in five of her first seven games back. Currently, she is leading the CAA in rebounding with 9.9 rpg while being tied for fourth in offensive rebounding (3.20) and second in defensive rebounding (6.65).

Prior to this season, Rible had missed only three collegiate games. She missed the first three contests of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament then went on to play the 26 remaining games that season with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

### ***Immediate Impact***

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after **Allison Trapp** went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer scored the 100th point of her career at UNC Wilmington on January 4. Reaching the total in 10 games, she became the fastest Blue Hen to reach the century mark since Danielle Leyfert hit the mark in her first six games in 1997-98.

### ***Its Her Time***

After playing a role off the bench the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court for the Blue Hens. Her 7.3 ppg is good for fifth on the team and she is fourth with 5.0 rpg, both career-highs. Defensively, Davis second on the team with 36 steals and is tied for second with 96 defensive rebounds.

Davis recorded her 600th career point earlier this season against Drexel and recorded her first collegiate double-double (11 pts, 11 rbs) versus UNC Wilmington on January 4.

### ***Stepping Up Underneath Part 1***

The injury to **Christina Rible** forced a couple of players to increase their roles. Last year's *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the Year **Tiara Malcom** was posting bench highs in points and rebounds before the loss of Rible. Thrust into a starting role, Malcom posted her first career double-double in her first start on December 18, 2001, vs. La Salle. The freshman went on to average 7.6 ppg and 8.6 rpg in the five games she started.

### ***Stepping Up Underneath Part 2***

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, **Christine Cole** had to expand her game offensively when Rible went down. Cole answered the challenge by doubling her scoring output (from 3.3 ppg to 8.0) and her rebounding (2.7 rpg to 6.4) in the five game span. The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle, Delaware's first game without Rible.

### ***When #11 Scores Ten...***

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won 34 of the last 36 games that senior guard **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. Before the Hens fell at VCU, on January 6, Delaware had a 25-game winning streak dating back to the 1999-2000 season when the guard hit for double-figures. Since Dellegrotti's sophomore season, Delaware is 34-4 when she scores at least 10. UD is 17-2 this year when No. 11 scores 10 or more.

### ***Player of the Week***

Freshman **Julie Sailer** became the first UD women's basketball player to be named Colonial Athletic Association's Player of the Week, when she received the honor for the week of January 20th.

On January 20, Sailer came off the bench to score a game-high 15 points, 10 of which came during a 19-2 run that rallied the Blue Hens from a 13-point deficit. Delaware upset James Madison, 58-50, at the Bob Carpenter Center. Sailer also hit for a team-high 18 points in a 72-62 victory over host George Mason on Thursday, January 17.

For the week, Sailer averaged 16.5 points 3.5 rebounds, and 1.5 steals while shooting 13 for 24 (.542) from the field and 3 of 6 (.500) behind the three-point arc.

### ***Naming the Gym After Her***

Senior forward **Lindsay Davis** had arguably the best game of her career on November 28, against Bucknell. Playing in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium, Davis scored a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds. She scored 24 points in the second half alone, as Delaware overcame a six-point halftime deficit to win the game, 86-66.

### ***A Roller Coaster of a Week***

**Megan Dellegrotti** had a very interesting first week of December. On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game by hitting six of them as she put up a career-high 29 points in the Blue Hens' 85-57 victory over Princeton.

Six days later, Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances while taking on Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. Despite finishing with eight points, she shot just 1-11 from the field. The trend was popular that evening as the team shot a season-low .226 from the floor and committed 30 turnovers in the, 52-44, loss.

But the tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a very big way the next day against Centenary. Dellegrotti posted her second best career scoring performance (26 points) with three treys and five assists in the Delaware victory.

Dellegrotti finished the roller coaster of a week by being selected as Wilmington Trust Best of Blue Hen Player of the Week and the only Delaware player named to the Cornell All-Tournament Team.

### ***Playing by the Rules***

When Delaware point guard **Megan Dellegrotti** fouled out of UD's game with William & Mary on January 27, it was the first time in her 93-

game career she had been disqualified from a contest.

### **Do Not Foul Them**

Delaware made 32 of 34 (.941) free throw attempts in its January 27 win at George Mason, the best team shooting performance from the line in the CAA this season. After netting its two lone first half attempts from the line, the Blue Hens hit 30 of 32 attempts in the second. It took 26 shoots before Delaware finally missed a FT. After making the last five FTs against Towson on January 13 and the first 25 at George Mason, UD connected on 30 straight FTs.

Seven Blue Hens hit free throws in the contest; **Megan Dellegrotti** and **Allison Trapp** each finished 7-8 from the line, **Christina Rible** went 6-6, **Christine Cole** and **Julie Sailer** each went 4-4, and **Lindsay Davis** and **Tiara Malcom** made both of their FT attempts.

### **Double Impact**

The Blue Hens have recorded 12 double-double performances this season, nine of which have come from senior forward **Christina Rible**. Coming off a 2000-01 campaign in which she posted 15 double-doubles, she has nine despite missing five games with a fractured finger. She has achieved the feat six times since returning from the injury. Rible now has 35 double-doubles for her career.

Prior to Dellegrotti, Danielle Leyfert had reached the mark in the fewest attempts when she scored 300 in 409 attempts.

### **1,000 Point Club**

The University of Delaware added two new members to its 1,000 point club this season. Seniors **Christina Rible** and **Megan Dellegrotti** became just the fourth duo in Delaware history to reach the 1,000-point milestone while playing at the same time. Before they reached the mark, the last two players to do so were Cindy Johnson and Danielle Leyfert two seasons ago.

Rible reached the milestone against William & Mary on January 27 midway through the first half. She became just the 16th Blue Hen to

record 1,000 career points.

Dellegrotti's milestone night came against Towson on February 7. Needing only two points, the guard hit a jumper just inside the three-point arc on the base-line to join Rible at 1,000. She finished with eight points.

### **Making the Grade**

Delaware seniors **Christina Rible**, **Lindsay Davis** and **Megan Dellegrotti** were selected as nominees for CoSIDA Academic All-American on January 29. Players nominated must excel both on the court and in the classroom, posting at least a 3.2 GPA. The nomination is the third for Rible, the second for Davis and Dellegrotti's first.

Dellegrotti and Rible were selected Verizon Academic All-American District 2 second team on February 21.

### **Upcoming Milestones**

- **Tina Martin** needs two wins to become the second UD coach to win 100 career games.
- **Christina Rible** is three points shy of 1,100. She would be the 11th Blue Hen to reach the mark.
- **Lindsay Davis** needs five assists to reach 200.
- **Megan Dellegrotti** needs six three-pointers to record her 150th career trey. She can also reach 100 career steals with four steals.

### **Changing His Game**

Former University of Delaware men's basketball standout **Tyrone Perry** has joined the women's basketball coaching staff this season. He had spent the last two seasons as a member the men's coaching staff. Perry is the career games played leader for the men's basketball team as well as its first three-time captain. The former guard led the Hens to back-to-back America East titles his junior and senior seasons.
