Injury Report

The University of Delaware will be without the services of two-time All-America East forward **Christina Rible** for at least three weeks. Rible sustained a spiral fracture in the fifth finger of her left hand in practice on December 13. Rible is currently No. 1 in the CAA in rebounding and one of only two players in the conference averaging a double-double. A re-evaluation will be done to see if the finger requires surgery.

Game On

After not playing in 10 days because of exams, the University of Delaware women's basketball team returns to action tonight against a La Salle team that is also coming off a 10-day layoff. La Salle dominates the all-time series, 14-2. La Salle and Delaware met annually in the early and mid-eighties. The Explorers won the last meeting in 1997, 86-79, in Philadelphia. The last time the Blue Hens defeated La Salle, nine Delaware players were not even born. In 1980, Delaware topped La Salle, 86-79, in the Delaware Field House. Tonight's game is UD's last home game before opening up Colonial Athletic Association play against Hofstra at the BCC on December 29.

Last Time Out

After a disappointing loss to Coppin State the night before, the Blue Hen offense returned to form defeating Centenary College, 78-54, in the consolation game of the Cornell Tournament on December 8. **Megan Dellegrotti** lead all scorers with 26 points and five assists. **Allison Trapp** returned to action, shooting five of seven from the field for 12 points. Sophomore **Tracey Howell** scored nine points and pulled down seven boards. The Hen defense made things tough for the Centenary shooters, blocking six shots. **Christine Cole** swatted four Lady shots for UD.

Megan Dellegrotti was the lone Blue Hen to be named to the Cornell Tournament All-Tournament Team.

Up Next

Delaware heads to the Empire State for its first ever meeting with Marist College of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference on Saturday. Marist is the fifth team this season to face UD for the first time. So far, Delaware is 2-2 in these inaugural matchups.

Excluding Marist, the Blue Hens have faced every team in the MAAC, compiling a 29-14 record all-time against the conference. Marist will come into the contest off a 13-day break, after falling to St. Peters, 67-40, on December 9. The Red Foxes are currently 4-3 and were picked to finish sixth in the MAAC.

The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball team currently holds the fifth longest home winning streak in Division I (20 games). The team finds itself among very prestigious company as the teams in front of them have won six out of the last seven NCAA championships. Three of the those four teams currently rank in the top five in the nation in the AP Top 25 Poll.

The Blue Hens have not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when they fell to Maine, 73-58. In addition, Delaware has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996. That was in **Tina Martin's** first season as head coach.

Double-Digit Margins

The last 28 games that Delaware has played in the Bob Carpenter Center have been decided by 10 points or more, with the Hens owning a 26-2 record in that span (both losses came to Maine). The last single-digit margin at home was a 69-67 win over Towson on Feb. 9, 1999, with the Blue Hens winning in the final second. The average margin of victory for the winners in the 28-game span is 18.5 points.

The Next Challenge...

The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from it's 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAAwomen's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion, who has won the last ten conference championships and is considered among the nation's top programs.

Not including the former America East programs, Delaware has a 4-8 all-time record against it's new CAA rivals.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAApre-season coaches poll.

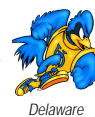
CAA action begins Dec. 29 for Delaware when it hosts Hofstra.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .779 from the charity stripe this season, No. 8 in the nation. The team has scored a conference-best 127 points despite playing only six games. In fact, 30% of Delaware's points have come from the line, an average of 21.7 points per game.

The Blue Hens have three players in the conference top 10 for FT pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** is yet to miss a free throw this season (23-23), placing her No. 1 in the nation. She is currently eight FTs shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31 held by the school's last player to lead the nation in FT pct., Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991.

Megan Dellegrotti's .875 FT pct.(42-48), No. 4 in the CAA, has

brought her career FT pct. up five points to .844, the second best career FT pct. by a Blue Hen.

Lindsay Davis is currently seventh in the CAA from the line shooting .824 (14-17).

“D” for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. The “D” has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far this season, holding opponents to only 58.7 points per game. Delaware ranks high in the CAA in all aspects of defensive play. UD is No. 1 in blocked shots, averaging four per game. When an opponent gets a shot past the UD defense, the chances are its not going in. The opposition is shooting .350 (No. 1 in CAA) from the field and .276 (No. 2) from behind the arc. The Blue Hens’ 28.33 defensive rpg is third.

Delaware is yet to allow an opponent to reach 70 points in a game this season. This statistic has been a key the the team's success over the past four seasons. The Blue Hens are 61-6 over the last four seasons when holding teams under 70 points. Overall, during Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 72 of Delaware's 82 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

A Big Loss

On December 7, team tri-captain **Christina Rible** fractured the fifth finger in her left hand during practice. She is expected to miss at least three weeks. A re-evaluation is needed to see if the finger requires surgery that may end her season.

Rible is leading the CAA in rebounding (11.2 rpg). She averaged a double-double in 2000-01 and the senior is currently at it again (12.2 ppg). She has notched double-doubles against Liberty (18 pts, 12 rbs), Bucknell (20 pts, 13 rbs) and Coppin State (14 pts, 11 rbs).

Rible had missed only three prior collegiate games in her career. She missed the first three of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

A Big Return

Delaware junior **Allison Trapp** returned to action at the Cornell Tournament on December 7. She had missed three games after sustaining a high-ankle sprain in the first minute of UD's season opener with Liberty University. Trapp was the team's leading scorer in its two pre-season games.

Playing with the ankle not yet at full strength, Trapp played 11 minutes in Delaware's game with Coppin State, shooting zero for four from the field. But she returned to form the next night against Centenary. She played 10 minutes, shooting five of seven from the field for 12 points and four assists.

The ten-days of rest can do nothing but help the injury. Trapp will return to the Blue Hen starting lineup tonight against La Salle.

A Roller Coaster of a Week

Megan Dellegrotti has had an interesting last three games. On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game with six, while putting up a career-high 29 points and leading the Blue Hens over Princeton, 85-57. Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances six days later at the Cornell Tournament. She went 1-11 from the field, as the team shot .226 and committed 30 turnovers in a frustrating loss to Coppin State. The tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a big way the very next day against Centenary. She put up the

second best scoring performance of her career (26 points) with three treys and five assists. She finished the roller coaster of a week by being named to the Cornell Tournament All-Tournament team.

Its Her Time

After playing off the bench for Delaware the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court. She ranks among the team leaders with 11.5 ppg and 6.2 rpg. Defensively, Davis has two blocked shots, 29 defensive rebounds and leads the team with 13 steals.

Davis had arguably the best game of her collegiate career against Bucknell on November 28, in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium. She scored a career-high 26 points, 24 of which came in the second half. On top of that, she added eight rebounds and went eight for nine from the foul line as the Blue Hens overcame a six-point halftime deficit to defeat Bucknell, 86-66.

She recorded the 500th point of her career on December 1 against Princeton.

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. Former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after Allison Trapp went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest with Liberty, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career. Sailer is currently averaging 10.3 ppg with 5.2 rpg in 29.5 minutes.

The frosh is deadly from the line. Sailer's 1.000 FT pct. is No. 1 in the nation. She is yet to miss a collegiate free throw (23-23).

A New Spark Underneath

Freshman **Tiara Malcom** has played a big role inside for the Blue Hens. While seeing almost 21 minutes per game of action off the bench, she is showing improvement each time out. Last years *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year is averaging 6.8 ppg and 5.5 rpg, both team highs for a reserve. In addition, Malcom is second on the team with five blocked shots.

Malcom's role will increase significantly with the injury to **Christina Rible**. She will make her first collegiate start this evening against La Salle.

The Council Rock Connection

Delaware's freshman standout **Julie Sailer** should know the game of La Salle junior Bonnie Randa pretty well. The two starred together for two seasons as members of the Council Rock High School girl's basketball team. In 1998 and 1999, they lead the Indians to a 29-1 league mark. In 1999 the team posted a 30-2 overall record. Both scored over 1,500 points during their careers at Council Rock.

Randa is currently averaging 9.1 ppg and 3.4 rpg as her first year as

a starter for the Explorers.

Upcoming Milestones

- **Christine Cole's** next FG will be the 100th of her collegiate career.
- If **Julie Sailer** knocks down her next eight FTs she will tie Delaware's record for consecutive FTs made (31).

To the Bench

Blue Hen fans will recognize another face on the women's coaching staff this season. UD's all-time leading scorer **Cindy Johnson** joins the coaching staff this season, her first as a coach. Johnson is UD's all-time leading scorer and helped lead the team to it's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament last season.

The Tina Martin Show
