Injury Report

The University of Delaware will be without two-time All-America East forward **Christina Rible** for at least three weeks. The senior sustained a spiral fracture in the fifth finger of her left hand in practice on December 13. Rible is currently No. 1 in the CAA in rebounding and the only player in the conference averaging a double-double. A re-evaluation will be done to see if the finger requires season-ending surgery.

Introductions Required

For the fifth time this season the University of Delaware will face an opponent that it has never faced before, taking on Marist College this afternoon. This season, the Blue Hens meet with eight teams that the program has never played, the most since 1980. Delaware is 2-2 in inaugural matchups this season and 6-9 in **Tina Martin's** tenure.

Historically, Delaware has success against teams from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The Blue Hens have posted a 29-14 record against the MAAC.

The teams have shared a common opponent this season with both bringing home victories at Bucknell. Delaware beat the Bison, 86-66, on November 28. Marist followed the Blue Hens three

Last Time Out

Playing its first game since the loss of **Christina Rible**, the University of Delaware defeated La Salle University, 83-66, Tuesday night in Newark. The win extended the Blue Hens team-record home winning streak to 21 games.

After a closely fought first half, Delaware took control in the second half, out scoring the Explorers 41-28 in the final 20 minutes.

La Salle hit a Bob Carpenter Center record 11 three-pointers in 27 attempts. The teams combined for 16 threes, to tie a UD record.

Julie Sailer led six Blue Hen scorers in double figures with a career-high 21 points. Freshman **Tiara Malcom** recorded her first career double-double in her first career start with 10 points and 12 rebounds. **Megan Dellegrotti** (11 points), **Tracey Howell** (13 points), **Allison Trapp** (13 points) and **Christine Cole** (14 points) were the other double-digit scorers for Delaware.

Up Next

The University of Delaware will play its first Colonial Athletic Association conference game when it takes on Hofstra University on December 29 at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Although playing under a new flag, Delaware is facing Hofstra in conference play for the 22nd consecutive year. Hofstra and Delaware (along with Drexel and Towson) left America East to join the CAA starting in the 2001-02 season. The Blue Hens hold a 30 -5 all-time series advantage.

Delaware brought home its final conference win as a member of America East the last time these two met. **Megan Dellegrotti** was one of three players with a double-digit point total, finishing with 13, as the Blue Hens handled the Pride, 79-62, in Newark on March 21.

On the Road Again

The University of Delaware finds itself away from home once again. The Blue Hens have already played five road games, posting a 3-2 record. The Blue Hens will play another seven games (four on the road) before playing back-to-back games at the Bob Carpenter Center for the first time this season.

The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball team currently holds the fifth longest home winning streak in Division I (21 games). The team finds itself among very prestigious company as the teams in front of them have won six out of the last seven NCAA championships. Three of the four teams currently rank in the top five in the nation according to in the AP Top 25 Poll.

The Blue Hens have not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when they fell to Maine, 73-58. In addition, Delaware has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996. That loss came in **Tina Martin's** first season as head coach.

Double-Digit Margins

The last 29 games that Delaware has played in the Bob Carpenter Center have been decided by 10 points or more, with the Hens owning a 27-2 record in that span (both losses came to Maine). The last single-digit margin at home was a 69-67 win over Towson on Feb. 9, 1999, with the Blue Hens winning in the final second. The average margin of victory for the winners in the 29-game span is 18.4 points.

The Next Challenge... The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and is considered among the nation's top programs.

Not including the former America East programs, Delaware has a 4-8 all-time record against its new CAA rivals.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAA pre-season coaches poll.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .790 from the charity stripe this season, No. 5 in the nation. The team's 147 points from the line are the most in the conference. The team is averaging 21.0 points per game off free throws.

The Blue Hens have three players in the conference top 10 for FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** is yet to miss a free throw this season (27-27), placing her No. 1 in the nation (1.000 FT Pct.). She is currently four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by the school's last player to lead the nation in FT Pct., Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991.

Megan Dellegrotti's .875 FT Pct.(49-56), No. 4 in the CAA, has brought her career FT Pct. up six points to .845, the second best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

And **Lindsay Davis** is currently eighth in the CAA from the line shooting .833 (15-18).

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. The "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far this season, holding opponents to only 59.7 ppg, second lowest in the conference. Delaware ranks high in the CAA in all aspects of defensive play. UD is No. 1 in blocked shots, averaging 3.57 per game. When an opponent gets a shot past the UD defense, the chances are its not going in. The opposition is shooting .350 (No. 1 in CAA) from the field. The Blue Hens' 27.71 defensive rpg is third.

The Key is 70

Delaware is yet to allow an opponent to reach 70 points in a game this season. This statistic has been a key to the team's success over the past four seasons. The Blue Hens are 62-6 over the last four seasons when holding teams under 70 points. Overall, during Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 73 of Delaware's 83 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

A Big Loss

On December 7, team tri-captain **Christina Rible** fractured the fifth finger in her left hand during practice. She is expected to miss at least three weeks. A re-evaluation is needed to see if the finger requires surgery that may end her season.

At the time of the injury, Rible was leading the CAA in rebounding (11.2 rpg). She averaged a double-double in 2000-01 and the senior was at it again (12.2 ppg). She notched double-doubles against Liberty (18 points, 12 rebounds), Bucknell (20 points, 13 rebounds) and Coppin State (14 points, 11 rebounds).

Rible had missed only three prior collegiate games in her career missing the first three of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

A Big Return

Delaware junior **Allison Trapp** returned to action at the Cornell Tournament on December 7. She had missed three games after sustaining a high-ankle sprain in the first minute of UD's season opener with Liberty University. Trapp was the team's leading scorer in its two pre-season games.

In the three games since returning to action, Trapp is shooting .417 from the field (10-24), with two treys and 25 points. She returned to the

starting lineup Tuesday night against La Salle after the team had a 10-day layoff for exams, finishing with a season-high 13 points in 29 minutes.

Returning to Poughkeepsie

The University of Delaware team may be new to Marist but associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** is not. Radice began her collegiate coaching career at Marist as an assistant coach for two seasons in the early 90's. The Red Foxes posted a 33-23 record while Radice was in Poughkeepsie. She left Marist to become an assistant coach at Seton Hall in the 1992-93 season, where she joined Pirate assistant coach **Tina Martin**. Radice followed Martin to Delaware in 1996, to become the No. 1 assistant in Newark.

Its Her Time

After playing off the bench for Delaware the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court. She ranks among the team leaders with 10.3 ppg and 5.4 rpg. Defensively, Davis has two blocked shots, 30 defensive rebounds and leads the team with 14 steals.

The tri-captain had arguably the best game of her collegiate career against Bucknell on November 28, in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium. Davis scored a career-high 26 points, 24 of which came in the second half. On top of that, she added eight rebounds and went eight for nine from the foul line, leading the Blue Hens as they overcame a six-point halftime deficit to defeat Bucknell, 86-66.

She recorded the 500th point of her career on December 1 against Princeton.

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won the last 22 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. The last time she hit for double-digits and lost was at Hofstra on February 3, 2000, with UD falling 67-57. Since the start of Dellegrotti's sophomore season Delaware is 24-2 when she scores 10 plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season.

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament

after Allison Trapp went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer posted a career-high 21 points off the bench against La Salle on Tuesday. She is currently averaging 11.9 ppg with 5.1 rpg in 29.0 minutes.

The frosh is even more deadly from the line. Sailer's 1.000 FT Pct. is No. 1 in the nation. She is yet to miss a collegiate free throw (27-27).

A New Role

Last years *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year **Tiara Malcom**'s role has changed only six games into her first collegiate season. After posting reserve highs in points and rebounds, Malcom is now taking the starting position left behind by injured **Christina Rible**.

In her first collegiate start Tuesday against La Salle, she posted first career double-double (10 points, 12 rebounds).

Upcoming Milestones

- **Julie Sailer** is four free throws shy of Delaware's record for consecutive free throws made (31).
- **Megan Dellegrotti** needs 22 free throws to become the fourth Delaware player to net 300 points from the charity stripe in a career.

Other Notes

- Freshmen **Julie Sailer** and **Tiara Malcom** both reached double-digit point totals against La Salle. The last time two Delaware freshman to achieved this feat was on February 20, 1999, when Megan Dellegrotti scored 13 points and Christina Rible scored 10 against New Hampshire.
- The 16 three-pointers between Delaware and La Salle tied a school record.
- Delaware has outrebounded its last four opponents.
