### Injury Report

Senior forward **Christina Ribble** will return to action tonight after missing the last five games. She broke her fifth finger in her left hand in practice on December 13th. At the time of the injury Ribble was the only player in the conference averaging a double-double...freshman **Tiara Malcom** is questionable for tonight's game as she is still suffering some effects from a concussion she received in last Friday's game with UNC Wilmington.

### The CAA Elite

The University of Delaware introduces itself to its third straight new opponent, this time hosting defending CAA Champion Old Dominion University. The Lady Monarchs will be the first women's program to play in the Bob Carpenter Center that has won a NCAA National Championship, winning the title in the 1984-85 season. ODU has dominated the Colonial since it joined the conference in 1991-92, losing only two conference games and winning every title.

Currently No. 25 in the AP Poll, Old Dominion is coming off a 62-74 loss at No. 2 Tennessee on Tuesday night. The Lady Monarchs feature an explosive offense that has already scored 100 points twice this season and is averaging 91.5 ppg against CAA competition. Their lineup includes three players that were selected to the All-CAAPreseason Team; forwards Hamchetou Maiga (11.0 ppg, 7.4 rpg), Lucienne Berthieu (10.7 ppg, 7.2 rpg) and (the 2000-01 CAA Player of the Year) guard Okeisha Howard (15.4 ppg).

## Last Time Out

The University of Delaware had its five-game winning streak come to an end as it suffered its first-ever CAA loss, falling to Virginia Commonwealth, 62-57, in Richmond on Sunday. Despite having fewer turnovers and more rebounds than the Rams, Delaware could not overcome shooting just .294 from the field. **Megan Dellegrotti** led all scorers with 18 points. The win snapped a four-game losing streak for VCU (4-9, 1-3 CAA).

UD led by as much as nine points in the first half before a run gave VCU a two-point halftime lead. A closely battled second half saw seven lead changes and six ties. The Hens, trailing by three with 2.5 seconds, had a chance to tie the game but **Dellegrotti's** open three-pointer from the top of the key bounced off the back of the rim.

## Up Next

After facing three-straight programs for the first time, the Blue Hens travel to face a familiar opponent in Towson University (1-12, 0-4 CAA) on Sunday. The teams meet for the 42nd time, making the Tigers Delaware's longest standing rival. The programs have met every season but one since 1973.

Winning at Towson last season, the Blue Hens won 74-59 on January 20, 2001. **Megan Dellegrotti** lead four UD scorers in double figures with 19 points while **Christina Rible** posted her seventh double-double of the season. The win ended UD's three-game losing streak at the Towson Center. Delaware outscored the Tigers by a combined total of 40 points in two meetings last season.

## The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball team currently holds the third longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games). The team finds itself in very prestigious company. Connecticut is currently No. 1 in

both the AP and the USA Today/ESPN and Notre Dame is the defending NCAA National Champion.

The Blue Hens have not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when they fell to Maine, 73-58. In addition, Delaware has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996.

Today the streak faces its largest challenge as it is UD's initial meeting with ten-time defending CAA Champion Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have lost only two conference games in the last ten seasons.

## The Next Challenge...

### The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and are considered among the nation's top programs.

Not including the former America East programs, Delaware has a 5-9 all-time record against its new CAA rivals.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAA Preseason Coaches' Poll.

## Double-Digit Margins

A streak of 29 straight games that Delaware has played in the Bob Carpenter Center decided by 10 points or more ended on December 29th when the Hens defeated Hofstra, 71-66. Before that point, the last single-digit margin at home was a 69-67 win over Towson on Feb. 9, 1999, with the Blue Hens winning in the final second.

## A Good Month

Delaware's eight game winning streak in the month of January came to an end on Sunday. The Hens fell to VCU, 62-57, in Richmond. Before Sunday UD had not lost in January since it fell to New Hampshire, 68-75, on January 29, 2000. Delaware was 7-0 in January 2001 and is 20-9 over the last three seasons during the first month of the year.

## Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .766 from the charity stripe this season (No. 7 in the nation). The team's 232 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 21.1 ppg from FTs alone.

Leading the team are two players in the conference's top 3 in FTPct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw in the eighth game of the season after netting her first 27. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Sailer is second in the CAA with a .905 FT Pct. (38-42).

**Megan Dellegrotti's** .864 FT Pct. (76-88), No. 3 in the CAA, has brought her career FT Pct. up six points to .845, the second best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

## 300 for Free

After netting her fourth of nine free throws against VCU on Sunday, **Megan Dellegrotti** became only the fourth Blue Hen to score 300 points from the foul line. The guard is the fastest Blue Hen to reach the mark, making 300 FTs out of 355 attempts. Before Dellegrotti, Danielle Leyfert had reached the mark in the fewest attempts when she did it in 409 attempts.

## "D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. In return the "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far by holding opponents to only 61.1 ppg, third lowest in the

conference.

Delaware ranks among the CAA leaders in many areas of defensive play. UD is No. 3 in blocked shots, averaging 2.82 blocks per game. The opposition is shooting only .375 (No. 3 in CAA) from the field. In addition, Delaware is fourth in rebounding defense (37.3 rpg) and fifth in steals (9.73 steals per game).

### **Welcome Back Ribble**

Tonight marks the return of two-time All-America East selection **Christina Ribble**. Ribble had missed the last five games after fracturing the fifth finger in her left hand during practice on December 13. With the finger heavily taped up, the tri-captain returned to practice on Tuesday and is expected to play in tonight's game.

At the time of the injury, Ribble was leading the CAA in rebounding (11.2 rpg). She averaged a double-double in 2000-01 and was at it again this season (12.2 ppg). She has already achieved the feat against Liberty (18 points, 12 rebounds), Bucknell (20 points, 13 rebounds) and Coppin State (14 points, 11 rebounds).

Ribble had missed only three prior collegiate games, missing the first three contests of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games that season with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

### **When #11 Scores Ten...**

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won 25 of the last 26 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. Before the Hens fell at VCU on Sunday, Delaware had a 25-game winning streak when the guard hit for double-figures dating back to the 1999-2000 season. Since Dellegrotti was a sophomore, Delaware is 27-3 when she scores ten plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season.

### **Scoring Quartet**

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti**, **Allison Trapp**, **Christina Ribble** and **Julie Sailer**). The last time that four Delaware players averaged double figures was in the 1997-1998 season. A fifth player, **Lindsay Davis**, is currently averaging 9.6 ppg.

### **UD Versus Ranked Opponents**

Old Dominion is currently No. 25 in the AP Poll. To say the that the University of Delaware is due for a win against a ranked opponent is an understatement. The Blue Hens are 0-19 all-time against teams ranked in the top 25. ODU will be only the second ranked team to ever come into Bob Carpenter Center. Vermont was ranked No. 17 when they defeated the Blue Hens 77-55 in the BCC in 1993.

### **The Backcourt**

Since **Allison Trapp** returned to the starting lineup against La Salle five games ago, the Blue Hen backcourt (consisting of Trapp and **Megan Dellegrotti**) has put up impressive numbers. Combined, the duo is averaging 31 points, seven rebounds, six assists and nearly five steals per contest.

Trapp posted 22 points in each of Delaware's last two games in December, becoming the first Blue Hen to score 20 points in back-to-back this season.

### **Its Her Time**

After playing a role off the bench the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court for the Blue Hens. Her 9.6 ppg is good for fifth on the team and she is third with 5.7 rpg. Defensively, Davis leads the team with 22 steals and has the second most defensive rebounds (48) on the team.

Davis recorded her 500th career point earlier this season against Princeton on December 1 and last week she recorded her first career double-double (11 pts, 11 rbs) versus UNC Wilmington.

### **Immediate Impact**

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after **Allison Trapp** went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer scored the 100th point of her career at UNC Wilmington last Friday. Reaching the total in ten games, she became the fastest Blue Hen to reach the century mark since Danielle Leyfert hit the mark in her six games in 1987-88.

### **Stepping Up Underneath Part 1**

The injury to **Christina Ribble** force a couple of players to increase their roles. Last year's *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year **Tiara Malcom** was posting bench highs in points and rebounds before the loss of Ribble. Thrust into a starting role the last five games, Malcom posted her first career double-double in her first start against La Salle on December 18. The freshman is averaging 7.6 ppg and 8.6 rpg as a starter.

### **Stepping Up Underneath Part 2**

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, **Christine Cole** has expanded her game offensively. Cole has more than doubled her ppg (from 3.3 to 8.0) and is pulling down an additional 3.7 rpg (2.7 to 6.4) in the last five games. The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle, Delaware's first game without Ribble.

### **Naming the Gym After Her**

Senior forward **Lindsay Davis** had arguably the best game of her career on November 28, against Bucknell. Playing in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium, Davis scored a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds. She scored 24 points in the second half alone, as Delaware overcame a six-point halftime deficit to win the game, 86-66.

### **A Roller Coaster of a Week**

**Megan Dellegrotti** had a very interesting first week of December, On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game by hitting six as she put up a career-high 29 points in the Blue Hens' 85-57 victory over Princeton. Six days later, Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances taking on Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. She shot just 1-11 from the field, as the team shot a season-low .226 and committed 30 turnovers in the loss. But tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a very big way the next day against Centenary. The tri-captain had her second best career scoring performance (26 points) with three treys and five assists in the Delaware victory. She finished the roller coaster of a week by being named to the Cornell All-Tournament Team and the Wilmington Trust Best of Blue Hen Player of the Week.

### **The Key is 70**

Delaware has allowed only one team to score 70 points in a game this season (Marist put up 72 points against the Hens). This statistic has been a key in the team's success over the past four seasons in which the Blue Hens are 64-7 when holding opponents under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 75 of Delaware's 86 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

### **Finishing Up**

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 58-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 7-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lead at the break and lost was a 58-68 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001. Delaware had after a 34-32 halftime lead.

### **The CAA in the RPI**
