Stepping Out of Conference

The University of Delaware women's basketball team has reached the half way mark of its inaugural season in the Colonial Athletic Association, compiling a surprising 7-2 mark in conference play. After nine games with conference rivals, the Blue Hens step out of CAA play to take on the University of Pennsylvania this evening at the Bob Carpenter Center. Penn is the final non-conference opponent on UD's schedule this season.

Although the game does not effect conference standings, the Blue Hens have a lot riding on tonight's matchup with the Quakers. Delaware's seniors have never lost to a non-conference opponent at home, posting a 14-game winning steak against non-conference teams in the BCC.

Penn is the last non-conference opponent to leave Newark with a victory. The Quakers handed the Blue Hens a 64-65 loss at the Carpenter Center on December 28, 1996. That loss was in coach **Tina Martin's** first season at the helm. It is also the last time that the two programs played each other.

Last Time Out

The College of William & Mary forced UD into double-overtime before the Blue Hens eventually prevailed, 80-77, at the BCCon Sunday. It was the first women's game to go into double-overtime in the building since it opened in 1992-93. The win moved UD into a tie for second place with a James Madison team that the Blue Hens have already beaten once this season.

Allison Trapp led the way for the Blue Hens, recording five of her team-high 19 points in the second overtime. Delaware outrebounded the Tribe 62-47 as **Christina Rible** notched her seventh double-double of the season (15 pts, 11 rbs) and **Tiara Malcom** pulled down 12 boards.

Up Next

The University of Delaware starts the second half of CAA conference play as it hosts UNC Wilmington at the Carpenter Center at 7 p.m. on Friday night.

The Seahawks and Blue Hens met for the first time ever on January 4 in Wilmington, North Carolina. Delaware's **Megan Dellegrotti** hit a lay-up in heavy traffic with five seconds left in overtime to give the Blue Hens a one-point lead. **Tiara Malcom** then hit one of two from the line to clinch a 56-54 UD victory.

Playing without an injured **Christina Rible**, Dellegrotti finished with a team-high 13 points. **Lindsay Davis** (11 pts, 11 rbs) and **Julie Sailer** (12 pts, 12 rbs) notched the first double-doubles of their careers.

1,000 for Rible!!

Senior forward **Christina Rible** recorded her 1,001 career point mid-way through the first half of Sunday's game. She became just the 16th Blue Hen to reach 1,000 career points. Rible finished the game with 15 points and is now only five points away from becoming No. 15 on UD all-time scoring list.

A Good Month

Delaware's eight-game winning streak in the month of January came to an end on January 6, when it fell to VCU, 62-57, in Richmond. Before the loss, UD had not lost in January since it fell to New Hampshire, 68-75, on January 29, 2000. The Blue Hens were 7-0 in January 2001 and is now 25-10 over the last three seasons during the first month of the year.

The Next Challenge...

The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and are considered among the nation's top programs.

Delaware opened up CAA action on Saturday, December 29, defeating Hofstra, 71-66, at the Bob Carpenter Center.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAAPreseason Coaches' Poll.

This season the University of Delaware has faced eight teams that it has never faced before. It is the most new teams on the schedule since the 1980-81 season when UD faced 12 new opponents. The Blue Hens were of 4-4 in these inaugural matchups this season.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .779 from the charity stripe this season (No. 2 in the nation as of Jan. 21). Its 364 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 21.4 ppg from the line.

Leading the way are three players in the conference's top 5 in FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw in the eighth game of the season after netting her first 27 attempts. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Currently, Sailer is No. 1 in the CAA with a .904 FT Pct. (66-73).

Megan Dellegrotti's .858 FT Pct. (115-134), No. 4 in the CAA, has brought her career FTPct. up six points to .845. Her career FT Pct. is the second-best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

Allison Trapp recently reached the minimum number of attempts needed to rank among the conference leaders. Her .833 FT Pct. (35-42) is sixth in the CAA.

300 for Free

After netting her fourth of nine free throws against VCU on January 6, **Megan Dellegrotti** became only the fourth Blue Hen to score 300 points in a career from the foul line. The guard is the fastest Blue Hen to reach the mark, netting 300 FTs of her first 355 attempts. Prior to Dellegrotti, Danielle Leyfert had reached the mark in the fewest attempts when she scored 300 in 409 attempts.

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made a point to emphasize defense this season. In return, the "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success, holding opponents to just 61.9 ppg, third lowest in the CAA.

Delaware ranks among the CAA leaders in many areas of defensive play. UD is No. 2 in blocked shots, averaging 3.12 blocks per game. The opposition is shooting only .381 from the field, No. 3 in the CAA. In addition, Delaware is fourth in rebounding defense (37.7) and sixth in steals (8.18 steals per game).

Welcome Back Rible

Blue Hen forward **Christina Rible** returned to action January 11, after missing five games with a fractured finger. She sustained the injury in practice on December 13, and missed the next three weeks of action.

The tri-captain struggled against CAA powerhouse Old Dominion in her first game back, shooting just 1-9 for four points and a rebound. But Rible regained form two days later, posting her fourth double-double of the season in Delaware's victory at Towson, finishing with 12 points and 10 rebounds. That return to form came complete with a 20-point, 13-rebound performance at George Mason on Thursday, giving her five double-doubles in nine games this season.

Prior to this season, Rible had missed only three collegiate games, missing the first three contests of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games that season with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won 29 of the last 31 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. Before the Hens fell at VCU last on January 6, Delaware had a 25-game winning streak when the guard hit for double-figures dating back to the 1999-2000 season. Since Dellegrotti's sophomore season, Delaware is 29-4 when she scores at least 10. With the exception of George Mason, the senior has reached double figures every Blue Hen win this season.

Scoring Quartet

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti**, **Allison Trapp**, **Christina Rible** and **Julie Sailer**). The last time that four Delaware players averaged double figures was in the 1997-1998 season. The four makeup 75% of the UD offense (52.1 ppg of 69.5 ppg)

Player of the Week

Freshman **Julie Sailer** became the first UD women's basketball player to be named Colonial Athletic Association's Player of the Week, when she received the honor for the week of January 20th.

Last Sunday, Sailer came off the bench to score a game-high 15 points, 10 of which came during a 19-2 run that rallied the Blue Hens from a 13-point deficit. Delaware upset James Madison, 58-50, at the Bob Carpenter Center. Sailer also hit for a team-high 18 points in a 72-62 victory over host George Mason on Thursday, January 17.

Sailer averaged 16.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 1.5 steals while shooting 13 for 24 (.542) from the field and 3 of 6 behind the arc.

University of Delaware Women's Basketball Media Notes

What a Streak it was

The University of Delaware women's basketball held the third longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games) for six days. Tennessee's loss to Connecticut on January 5, made Delaware's two-year old streak the third-longest in the nation and placed the Hens among very prestigious company. Connecticut was No. 1 in both the AP and the USA Today/ESPN and Notre Dame is the defending NCAA National Champion.

The streak came to an end when the Blue Hens lost to No. 25 Old Dominion, 82-55. Prior to that game, Delaware had not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when it fell to Maine, 73-58. Delaware has still has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 64-65, in 1996.

The Backcourt

Since **Allison Trapp** returned to the starting lineup against La Salle, the Blue Hen backcourt (consisting of Trapp and **Megan Dellegrotti**) has put together impressive numbers while leading the team to a 9-2 record. Combined, the duo is averaging 29 points and six assists. They are the top two scorers on the team in the 11 game span (Trapp 14.9 ppg and Dellegrotti 14.1 ppg).

Dellegrotti is currently No. 6 in the CAA in ppg while holding four of the top five Blue Hen scoring performances this season. Her counterpart, Trapp, is the only Blue Hen to score 20 points in back-to-back games this season. She hit for 22 against La Salle (12/18) and Marist (12/22).

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after **Allison Trapp** went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer scored the 100th point of her career at UNC Wilmington on January 4. Reaching the total in 10 games, she became the fastest Blue Hen to reach the century mark since Danielle Leyfert hit the mark in her six games in 1987-88.

Naming the Gym After Her

Senior forward **Lindsay Davis** had arguably the best game of her career on November 28, against Bucknell. Playing in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium, Davis scored a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds. She scored 24 points in the second half alone, as Delaware overcame a six-point halftime deficit to win the game, 86-66.

A Roller Coaster of a Week

Megan Dellegrotti had a very interesting first week of December. On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game by hitting six as she put up a career-high 29 points in the Blue Hens' 85-57

victory over Princeton. Six days later, Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances taking on Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. She shot just 1-11 from the field, as the team shot a season-low .226 and committed 30 turnovers in the loss. But tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a very big way the next day against Centenary. The tri-captain posted her second best career scoring performance (26 points) with three treys and five assists in the Delaware victory. She finished the roller coaster of a week by being named to the Cornell All-Tournament Team and the Wilmington Trust Best of Blue Hen Player of the Week.

Do Not Foul Them

Delaware made 32 of 34 (.941) free throw attempts in its January 27 win at George Mason. After netting its two lone first half attempts from the line, the Blue Hens hit 30 of 32 attempts in the second. It took 26 shoots before Delaware finally missed a FT. UD connected on 30 straight FTs after making the last five FTs against Towson on January 13 and the first 25 at George Mason.

Seven Blue Hens hit free throws in the contest; **Megan Dellegrotti** and **Allison Trapp** each finished 7-8 from the line, **Christina Rible** went 6-6, **Christine Cole** and **Julie Sailer** each went 4-4, and **Lindsay Davis** and **Tiara Malcom** made both of their FT attempts.

Playing by the Rules

When Delaware point guard **Megan Dellegrotti** fouled out of UD's game with William & Mary on Sunday, it was the first time in her 93-game career she had been disqualified from a contest.

The Key is 70

Delaware has only allowed three teams to score 70 points in a game this season. This statistic has been a key in the team's success over the past four seasons, in which the Blue Hens are 67-7 when holding opponents under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 79 of Delaware's 91 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

The Blue Hens may be even more tough when scoring 70 points. This season Delaware is 9-0 when hitting the mark. Over the last three seasons it is 58-5 and has a 29-game winning streak when scoring at least 70. Its last loss when scoring 70 plus was a 70-71 loss at the University of Maryland on November 26, 2000.

Finishing Up

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 62-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 11-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lost after leading at the break was a 68-58 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001. Delaware held a two-point half-time lead in that contest.

Making the Grade

Delaware seniors **Christina Rible**, **Lindsay Davis** and **Megan Dellegrotti** were selected as nominees for CoSIDA Academic All-American on January 29. Players nominated must excel both on the court and in the classroom, posting at least a 3.2 GPA. The nomination is the third for Rible, the second for Davis and Dellegrotti's first.

The Council Rock Connection

Blue Hen **Julie Sailer** faces high school teammate Karen Habrukowich tonight. The guards meet as collegiate opponents after they lead Council Rock High School to a 15-0 league record and an Eastern Pennsylvania Championship as seniors last season.

Habrukowich has started 10 games for the Quakers, averaging 9.5 ppg and 2.7 rpg while playing 31 minutes per game.
