Injury Report

Senior forward **Christina Rible** returned to action Friday night after missing five games with a fractured finger she sustained in practice on December 13th. Rible shot just 1-9 from the field, finishing with four points and one rebound...freshman **Tiara Malcom** played against ODU despite suffering some effects from a concussion she received in the UNC Wilmington game. She is expected to will play today.

Familiar Foes

After playing the last three games against new conference rivals that the it has never played before, the University of Delaware gets to face a familiar opponent today as it takes on Towson University (1-12, 0-4 CAA). The teams meet for the 42nd time, making the Tigers Delaware's longest standing rival. The programs have met every season but one since 1973. Today is their first meeting as members of the Colonial Athletic Association

Last season, the Blue Hens won 74-59 at Towson on January 20, 2001. **Megan Dellegrotti** lead four UD scorers in double figures with 19 points while **Christina Rible** posted her seventh double-double of the season. The win ended UD's three-game losing streak at the Towson Center. Delaware outscored the Tigers by an average of 20 points in two meetings last season.

Towson comes into today's game with a nine-game losing streak. The Tigers lost as James Madison, 64-49, in CAAaction on Thursday night.

Last Time Out

The University of Delaware had its 22-game home court winning streak come to an end with a 55-82 loss to No. 25 Old Dominion on Friday night at the Bob Carpenter Center. The loss was UD's worst since a 89-61 setback to George Mason last season. The Hens have now lost consecutive games for the first time since the 1999-00 season.

ODU jumped out to a 21-4 lead seven minutes in and never looked back. Hamchetou Maiga scored a game high 21 points as ODU won the game inside, outscoring UD 46-10 in the paint and 22-2 on fast breaks. **Julie Sailer** came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points for the Blue Hens

Up Next

Delaware looks to avenge a 89-61 loss at George Mason last season when they meet on Thursday night in Fairfax. It will be the first time that the programs have met as members of the same conference. The Patriots own the all-time series, 7-1, with UD's lone win coming in 1994-95.

George Mason was selected to finish in third place in the CAA Preseason Poll, just ahead of Delaware who was selected fourth. The Patriots are currently 9-6 (4-1 CAA) after defeating William & Mary 69-55 on Friday. They host Old Dominion this afternoon at 2 p.m..

The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball held the third longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games) for six days. Tennessee's loss to Connecticut on January 5, made Delaware's two-year old streak the third best in the nation and placed the Hens in very prestigious company. Connecticut was No. 1 in both the AP and the USA Today/ESPN and Notre Dame is the defending NCAA National Champion.

The streak came to an end on Friday night as the Blue Hens lost to Old Dominion, 82-55. Prior to that, Delaware had not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when it fell to Maine, 73-58. Delaware still has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996.

The Next Challenge...

The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and are considered among the nation's top programs.

Delaware opened up CAA action on Saturday, December 29, defeating Hofstra, 71-66, at the Bob Carpenter Center.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAAPreseason Coaches' Poll.

Double-Digit Margins

29 Out of the last thirty games that Delaware has played in the Bob Carpenter Center have been decided by 10 points or more. A streak of 28 straight contests decided by 10 or more ended on December 29th when the Hens defeated Hofstra, 71-66. Before that point, the last single-digit margin at home was a 69-67 win over Towson on Feb. 9, 1999, with the Blue Hens winning in the final second.

A Good Month

Delaware's eight game winning streak in the month of January came to an end on Sunday. The Hens fell to VCU, 62-57, in Richmond. Before Sunday UD had not lost in January since it fell to New Hampshire, 68-75, on January 29, 2000. Delaware was 7-0 in January 2001 and is 20-10 over the last three seasons during the first month of the year.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .766 from the charity stripe this season (No. 7 in the nation). The team's 232 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 21.1 ppg from FTs alone.

Leading the team are two players in the conference's top 3 in FTPct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw in the eighth game of the season after netting her first 27. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Sailer is second in the CAA with a .905 FT Pct. (38-42).

Megan Dellegrotti's .864 FT Pct.(76-88), No. 3 in the CAA, has brought her career FT Pct. up six points to .845, the second best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

300 for Free

After netting her fourth of nine free throws against VCU on Sunday, **Megan Dellegrotti** became only the fourth Blue Hen to score 300 points from the foul line. The guard is the fastest Blue Hen to reach the mark, making 300 FTs out of 355 attempts. Before Dellegrotti, Danielle Leyfert had reached the mark in the fewest attempts when she did it in 409 attempts.

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. In return the "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far by holding opponents to only to just 62.8 ppg.

Delaware ranks among the CAA leaders in many areas of defensive play. UD is No. 3 in blocked shots, averaging 2.82 blocks per game. The opposition is shooting only .375 (No. 3 in CAA) from the field. In addition, Delaware is fourth in rebounding defense (37.3 rpg) and fifth in steals (9.73 steals per game).

Welcome Back Rible

Christina Rible returned to action on Friday night after missing five games with a fractured finger in her left hand she sustained during practice on December 13. The tri-captain struggled to regain her form in the

game against CAA powerhouse Old Dominion, shooting just 1-9 for four points and one rebound.

Rible had missed only three prior collegiate games, missing the first three contests of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games that season with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

Double Trouble

After posting averaging a double-double last season, Blue Hen senior **Christina Rible** is near the mark again. She has already achieved the feat against Liberty (18 points, 12 rebounds), Bucknell (20 points, 13 rebounds) and Coppin State (14 points, 11 rebounds). At the time of her injury, the forward was the player in the CAA averaging a double-double.

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won 25 of the last 27 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. Before the Hens fell at VCU last Sunday, Delaware had a 25-game winning streak when the guard hit for double-figures dating back to the 1999-2000 season. Since Dellegrotti was a sophomore, Delaware is 27-4 when she scores ten plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season. In addition, she has hit for double figures in UD's last two losses.

Scoring Quartet

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti**, **Allison Trapp**, **Christina Rible** and **Julie Sailer**). The last time that four Delaware players averaged double figures was in the 1997-1998 season. A fifth player, **Lindsay Davis**, is currently averaging 9.2 ppg.

UD Versus Ranked Opponents

To say the that the University of Delaware is due for a win against a ranked opponent is an understatement. The Blue Hens are 0-20 all-time against teams ranked in the top 25.

The Backcourt

Since **Allison Trapp** returned to the starting lineup against La Salle five games ago, the Blue Hen backcourt (consisting of Trapp and **Megan Dellegrotti**) has put up impressive numbers. Combined, the duo is averaging almost 30 points, six rebounds, six assists and nearly five steals per contest.

Trapp became the first Blue Hen to score 20 points in back-to-back this season when she hit for 22 against La Salle (12/18) and Marist (12/22).

Its Her Time

After playing a role off the bench the last two seasons, senior **Lindsay Davis** is making the most of her new role as a starter. The forward has been a consistent force on both sides of the court for the Blue Hens. Her 9.6 ppg is good for fifth on the team and she is third with 5.3 rpg. Defensively, Davis leads the team with 24 steals and has the second most defensive rebounds (49) on the team.

Davis recorded her 500th career point earlier this season against Princeton on December 1 and recorded her first collegiate double-double (11 pts, 11rbs) versus UNC Wilmington on January 4.

Immediate Impact

Freshman **Julie Sailer** did not spend much time "paying her dues" on the bench as many first yearers do. The former high school All-American saw her first collegiate action less than one minute into the season, entering the Hens' opener at the UNC Greensboro Tournament after **Allison Trapp** went down with an ankle injury. Sailer went on to play 33 minutes in the contest, scoring 14 points with five rebounds and four assists. She followed that performance by netting a game-high 16 points against UNCG and being selected to the all-tournament team.

After finishing with 16 points against Bucknell, Sailer became the first Blue Hen since 1991 to net double-digit point totals in the first three games of her career.

Sailer scored the 100th point of her career at UNC Wilmington last Friday. Reaching the total in ten games, she became the fastest Blue Hen to reach the century mark since Danielle Leyfert hit the mark in her six games in 1987-88.

Stepping Up Underneath Part 1

The injury to **Christina Rible** force a couple of players to increase their roles. Last year's *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year **Tiara Malcom** was posting bench highs in points and rebounds before the loss of Rible. Thrust into a starting role the last five games, Malcom posted her first career double-double in her first start against La Salle on December 18. The freshman averaged 7.6 ppg and 8.6 rpg as a starter.

Stepping Up Underneath Part 2

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, **Christine Cole** has expanded her game offensively when Ribble went down. Cole more than doubled her ppg (from 3.3 to 8.0) and pulled down an additional 3.7 rpg (2.7 to 6.4) in the five game span. The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle, Delaware's first game without Ribble.

Naming the Gym After Her

Senior forward **Lindsay Davis** had arguably the best game of her career on November 28, against Bucknell. Playing in a building ironically named Davis Gymnasium, Davis scored a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds. She scored 24 points in the second half alone, as Delaware overcame a six-point halftime deficit to win the game, 86-66.

A Roller Coaster of a Week

Megan Dellegrotti had a very interesting first week of December. On December 1, the senior tied her school record for treys in a game by hitting six as she put up a career-high 29 points in the Blue Hens' 85-57 victory over Princeton. Six days later, Dellegrotti had one of her most forgettable performances taking on Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. She shot just 1-11 from the field, as the team shot a season-low .226 and committed 30 turnovers in the loss. But tri-captain bounced back from that performance in a very big way the next day against Centenary. The tri-captain had her second best career scoring performance (26 points) with three treys and five assists in the Delaware victory. She finished the roller coaster of a week by being named to the Cornell All-Tournament Team and the Wilmington Trust Best of Blue Hen Player of the Week.

The Key is 70

Delaware has only allowed two teams to score 70 points in a game this season (Marist and ODU). This statistic has been a key in the team's success over the past four seasons in which the Blue Hens are 64-7 when holding opponents under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 75 of Delaware's 86 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

Finishing Up

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 58-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 7-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lead at the break and lost was a 58-68 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001. Delaware had after a 34-32 halftime lead.

He had spent the last two seasons as a member the men's coaching staff. Perry is the career games played leader for the men's basketball team as well as its first three-time captain. The former guard led the Hens to back-to-back America East titles his junior and senior seasons.
