Injury Report

Senior forward **Christina Rible** will not play in either of this weekend's games. Rible sustained a spiral fracture in the fifth finger of her left hand in practice on December 13. At the time of the injury she was the only player in the CAA averaging a double-double. It is hoped that she will be able to practice with the team next week as the finger will not require surgery. Rible has missed the last three games.

New Places, New Faces

The University of Delaware takes on Virginia Commonwealth University for the first time the programs' history. As Delaware is playing only its third conference game as a member of the CAA, as these two will see a lot of each other in the coming years. So far this season the Blue Hens have faced six programs for the first time ever, compiling a 4-2 record in this matchups. Tina Martin teams are 8-10 all-time in inaugural meetings.

The Blue Hens come into today's contest riding a five-game winning streak, with their last defeat coming December 7 against Coppin State at the Cornell Tournament. VCU on the other hand, has lost six of its last seven games, drooping the Rams record on the season to 3-9 overall.

Last Time Out

It took some last minute heroics by senior Megan Dellegrotti to push the University of Delaware past UNC Wilmington 56-54 in overtime Friday night. Lindsay Davis and Julie Sailer each recorded their first career double-doubles to lead the Blue Hens.

The Seahawks erased a seven-point halftime lead with 7:31 left in regulation, and both teams battled to a tie to send the contest into overtime. In OT, **Megan Dellegrotti** scored five of her team high 13 points, including a falling underhanded layup that put the Hens up for good with five seconds remaining. The Blue Hens recorded a season-high 56 team rebounds en route to their fifth straight victory.

Up Next

Delaware returns home to play just its third home game of the young season when conference powerhouse Old Dominion visits the Bob Carpenter Center Friday January 11.

Coming off a 108-46 defeat of VCU Friday night, the Monarchs take a break from their conference schedule as they head to Knoxville to take on #2 ranked Tennessee Tuesday the 8th. ODU then takes its eight-game conference winning streak up north for its first-ever matchup versus Delaware. The Monarchs are powered by a triple threat of senior All-American candidate Lucienne Berthieu (11.0 ppg, 7.8 rpg), senior Hamchetou Maiga (10.8 ppg, 7.5 rpg), and junior Okeisha Howard (16.6 ppg).

On the Road Again

Once again Delaware finds itself away from the friendly confines of the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware plays 10 of its first 15 games away from home this season. Seven of their ten games so far have been played on the road, posting a record of 5-2 on the opposition's floors. In addition, three of UD's next four games will be on the road. Delaware will start a five-game homestand at the BCC starting on January 27 against William & Mary.

The Streak

The University of Delaware women's basketball team currently holds the fourth longest home winning streak in Division I (22 games). The team finds itself among very prestigious company as the teams ahead of them have won six out of the last seven NCAA championships. Two of the teams (UConn, Tennessee) currently rank in the top five in the nation according to in the AP Top 25 Poll and the other (Notre Dame) was last season's national champion.

The Blue Hens have not lost a game at the Bob Carpenter Center since January 4, 2000, when they fell to Maine, 73-58. In addition, Delaware has not lost to a non-conference opponent at home since losing to Pennsylvania, 65-64, in 1996.

Delaware's streak will face its biggest challenge its next game at the BCC. UD gets its initial meeting with 10-time defending CAA champion Old Dominion on January 11 in Newark. The Lady Monarchs have lost only two conference games in the last ten seasons.



The Next Challenge... The New CAA

After going 30-6 in America East play over the last two seasons and bringing home its first conference championship, Delaware faces a new challenge, joining the retooled Colonial Athletic Association this season.

The New CAA features six institutions from its 2000-01 roster and adds four former America East programs; Delaware, Drexel, Towson and Hofstra.

Historically, CAA women's basketball has been dominated by Old Dominion. The Lady Monarchs have won the last ten conference championships and is considered among the nation's top programs.

Not including the former America East programs, Delaware has a 4-8 all-time record against its new CAA rivals.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAApre-season coaches poll.

Accepting Charity

Delaware is taking full advantage of the free throw line, shooting .761 from the charity stripe this season (No. 5 in the nation as of Dec.17). The team's 207 points from the line are the most in the conference. The Blue Hens are averaging 20.7 ppg from free throws.

Leading the are two Blue Hens in the conference top 5 in FT Pct. Freshman **Julie Sailer** missed her first free throw of the season against Marist after netting her first 27. She was just four free throws shy of Delaware's consecutive FT streak of 31, held by Linda Cyborski, who shot .937 (74-79) from the line in 1991 to lead the nation. Sailer is third in the CAA with a .919 FT Pct. (34-37).

Megan Dellegrotti's .870 FT Pct.(67-77), No. 4 in the CAA, has brought her career FTPct. up eight points to .846, the second best career FT Pct. by a Blue Hen.

"D" is for Defense

Head coach **Tina Martin** has made it a point to emphasize defense this season. The "D" has played a major part in the Blue Hens success so far, holding opponents to only 61.0 ppg, third lowest in the conference.

Delaware ranks high in the CAA in many areas of defensive play. UD is No. 1 in blocked shots, averaging 3.1 blocks per game. When an opponent gets a shot past the UD defense, the chances are its not going in. The opposition is shooting .368 (No. 2 in CAA) from the field.

The Key is 70

Delaware has only allowed one team to score 70 points in a game this season (Marist put 72 up against the Hens). This statistic has been a key the team's success over the past four seasons in which the Blue Hens are 63-6 under 70 points. Overall, during coach Martin's tenure (now in her sixth season), 74 of Delaware's 85 wins have come when holding the opponent under 70 points.

A Big Loss

On December 13, team tri-captain **Christina Rible** fractured the fifth finger in her left hand during practice. After missing the last three games, the finger was re-evaluated on January 2 and seems to be healing. Rible will not play this weekend but it is hoped she will return to practice next week.

At the time of the injury, Rible was leading the CAA in rebounding (11.2 rpg). She averaged a double-double in 2000-01 and was at it again this season (12.2 ppg). She has already achieved the feat against Liberty (18 points, 12 rebounds), Bucknell (20 points, 13 rebounds) and Coppin State (14 points, 11 rebounds).

Rible had missed only three prior collegiate games in her career missing the first three of the 1999-2000 season with a torn knee ligament. She went on to play the 26 remaining games with the injury, choosing to delay surgery till after the season.

When #11 Scores Ten...

...you can forget about it. The University of Delaware has won its last 25 games that **Megan Dellegrotti** has scored 10 points or more. The last time she hit for double-digits and lost was at Hofstra on February 3, 2000, with UD falling 67-57. Since Dellegrotti's sophomore season, Delaware is 27-2 when she scores 10 plus. The senior has reached double figures in every Blue Hen win this season.

The Backcourt

Since **Allison Trapp** returned to the starting lineup four games ago, the Blue Hen backcourt (consisting of Trapp and **Megan Dellegrotti**) has put up monstrous numbers. The two have combined for 125 points (31.3 ppg), 27 assists and 19 steals in the last three games.

Trapp posted 22 points in back-to-back games last week, the first time this season a Delaware player has scored 20 points consecutive games.

Stepping Up Underneath

The injury to **Christina Ribble** has placed new roles on Blue Hens **Tracey Howell**, **Tiara Malcom** and **Christine Cole**. The three have responded well with the opportunity to expand their games.

Tracey Howell has seen an average of six extra minutes off the bench over the last three games. The sophomore has been an asset to the Blue Hen defense and has pulled at least six boards in each game of the last three games.

Last years *Wilmington News Journal* Co-Player of the year Tiara Malcom was posting bench highs in points and rebounds, before the loss of Ribble. Malcom, now starting, posted her first career double-double in her first start against La Salle on December 18. The freshman is almost averaging a double-double in the games she has started (8.3 ppg, 9.0 rpg).

Always considered a big factor in the success of Delaware's defense, Christine Cole has expanded her game offensively. Cole has posted 40 points last four contests, the highest four-game point total of her collegiate career. In doing so, Cole has almost doubled her ppg (from 3.3 to 6.0). The center posted a career high 14 points against La Salle, Delaware's first game without Ribble.

What a Year

As Delaware plays its first game of 2002, here a list of some of the accomplishments that the Blue Hens reached in 2001.

Scoring Quartet

Four Delaware players are currently averaging more than 10 ppg (**Megan Dellegrotti**, **Allison Trapp**, **Christina Ribble** and **Julie Sailer**).

The last time that four Delaware players averaged double figures was in the 1997-1998 season. A fifth player, **Lindsay Davis**, is currently averaging 9.8 ppg.

A Good Month

The Blue Hens have not lost a game in the month of January since they fell to New Hampshire, 68-75, on January 29, 2000. Delaware was 7-0 in January 2001.

Finishing Up

The University of Delaware seniors know how to keep a lead. In the last four seasons the Blue Hens are 57-7 when leading at the half. This season the Hens are a perfect 6-0 when leading after the first 20 minutes. The last time that UD lead at the break and lost was a 58-68 loss at Vermont on February 24, 2001, when it blew a 34-32 halftime lead.

Upcoming Milestones

- **Megan Dellegrotti** needs 12 free throws to become the fourth Delaware player to net 300 points from the charity stripe in a career.
- **Julie Sailer** needs 6 points to reach 100 career points. She will most likely be the fastest freshman to reach 100 points since Daniel Leyfert hit the mark six games into her collegiate career in 1997-98.
