About Drexel: Drexel enters tonight's contest following a 74-52 loss to UNC-Wilmington on Sunday. Catherine Scanlon led the Dragons with 11 points and 14 rebounds against the Seahawks. Overall, Drexel is led in scoring by Steph Frysinger with 12.6 ppg, while Katrie Martin averages 11.8 ppg and 7.9 rpg, third in the CAA. Drexel has dropped seven straight to the Hens after winning the previous eight contests. Delaware eliminated Drexel in the first round of the CAA tournament in overtime last season, 72-63.

Meet The Coach

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

NORFOLK, VA -- Julie Sailer nailed two free throws with eight seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime and Delaware took control early in the extra session to survive a CAA Tournament first round scare...Christina Rible erupted for a career-high 28 points and pulled 13 rebounds as the No. 2 seed Blue Hens won their sixth straight game...Drexel, the No. 7 seed, finished its season with a record of 14-15...Megan Dellegrotti and Allison Trapp each added 13 points to lead the Blue Hens, who overcame 18 turnovers and 37.1 percent shooting from the field to notch their 15th win in the last 16 outings since mid-January...Rible posted her 11th double of the season and surpassed her previous scoring high of 26 points...Drexel got 20 points from freshman Jessica Copskey and 14 points and 13 rebounds from first team All-CAA forward Michelle Maslowski...Delaware overcame an eight-point deficit at 53-45 with 4:09 left in regulation, outscoring Drexel 10-2 to send the game into overtime....Sailer, the league Rookie of the Year and its top free throw shooter, rebounded a miss by Dellegrotti with 10 seconds left and was fouled on the way back up...the freshman sank the first free throw, and following a Drexel timeout, hit the second to send the game into overtime...Delaware, which won its sixth straight overtime game since 1997, took control early in the extra period...Rible and Trapp each hit two free throws to break a 57-57 tie, Sailer hit a jumper, Dellegrotti nailed a three-pointer, and Trapp followed with two more layups as part of a 13-3 run that put the Hens up 70-60 with 1:16 left to play...Delaware jumped out to a 15-2 lead but went cold from there as Drexel cut the halftime lead to 23-22...the Dragons built a 53-45 advantage with 4:09 left in regulation but hit just one field goal the rest of the way.

DELAWARE 73, GEORGE MASON 61:

Sharp-Shooting Hens: Delaware shot a season-high 52.2% from the field, its highest shooting percentage since shooting 55.4% against Towson on February 19, 2000. The Hens shot 68.0% in the first half, the second highest pct. for a half in school history.

Sail-ing Along: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer tied her career-high with 21 points against the Patriots on Sunday, including a career-high three 3-point field goals.

Cole Posts 'Double-Double': Senior forward Christine Cole notched her third career 'double-double' against GMU, scoring 10 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

Running with the Blue Hens: Delaware reeled off a 17-2 run to close the first-half against the Patriots and did not allow a field goal during the stretch.

Hens In CAA: Entering tonight's contest, the Blue Hens are now 49-10 in conference play over the past four seasons and 19-4 in the CAA since joining last season.

Career Night for Warren: Freshman Juliette Warren posted career-highs of 10 points, three assists and five steals against Towson on Jan. 19.

Unselfish Hens: Delaware's 20 assists against Towson on January 19 marked its highest total since dishing out 20 against Princeton back on December 1, 2001.

Rejected by Cole!: With a block in the second half against UNCW on January 12, senior forward Christine Cole moved into sole possession of fifth place on Delaware's career blocks list.

Malcom Posts Career-High: Sophomore forward Tiara Malcom posted a career-high 21 points on 8-13 shooting against VCU on January 9.

Winning at Home: Delaware has won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997, and are 50-5 over the last five seasons overall.

De-FENSE!: The Blue Hens held Virginia Commonwealth to a season-low 27.7% from the field. Delaware also held VCU to just one free throw, the lowest it has held a team to since holding Vermont to one back on January 28, 1994.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 759 points at Delaware, which ranks her 26th on the school's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Linda Cyborski with 764 points.

Career Day for Trapp: Senior guard Allison Trapp scored a career-high 34 points on 14-16 shooting on Sunday afternoon, tying the Hofstra Arena record for points. Trapp scored 19 straight at one point, and her 34 points is the second highest single game scoring output in school history. For her efforts, she was named CAA Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

Blue Hens Win Dartmouth Tournament: With its 61-48 win over the Big Green of Dartmouth on December 30, Delaware captured its first regular season tournament title since defeating Montclair State and Northeastern to claim the Montclair (NJ) State Tournament in 1983-84.

Trapp Named MVP: Senior guard Allison Trapp captured MVP honors at the Dartmouth Tournament, scoring 26 points to go with four rebounds and six steals against UAB, and posted 13 points, six boards and four steals in the championship game against Dartmouth.

Cole, Malcom Earn Honors: Senior Christine Cole and sophomore Tiara Malcom were each named to the All-Tournament team at Dartmouth. Cole pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds in the championship game against the Big Green, while Malcom notched 15 points and seven rebounds against UAB and 12 points against Dartmouth.

Trapp Nearing 1,000: Senior guard Allison Trapp has 949 career points, 51 short of 1,000 for her career. Trapp, who has 759 points in two-plus seasons at Delaware, scored 190 in 22 games at East Carolina.

Magic Number 70: Delaware is 4-0 this season and 65-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe. This season, Delaware is first, shooting 71.2%.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 6-1 when it wins the assist battle.

Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue tore the ACL and MCL in her left knee during a December practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week: Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Walking on: Sophomore walk-on **Jaclyn Gordon (Ambler, PA/Mt. St. Joseph's)** has been cleared to play and dressed for her first game against Marist on December 23. Gordon was a four-year letterwinner at Mt. St. Joseph's High School in Amber, PA, leading her team to two state championships. She made her first appearance against Towson on January 16.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer, Trapp: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer and senior guard Allison Trapp have each been voted to the second team All-CAA in pre-season polls (Sailer in both the CAA coaches and media poll, Trapp in the coaches poll). Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors. Trapp, meanwhile, started 25 of the 27 games she played in, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Cole on the Boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 515 career rebounds, placing her 16th on Delaware's career list. Next up for Cole is Sarah Gause with 530.

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

Hens on TV: Delaware's second and final matchup of the 2002-2003 season against the Hofstra Pride can be seen live on Comcast Sportsnet Mid-Atlantic. Game time is set for 4 p.m. at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Three-peat?: The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Delaware is also seeking its fourth-straight 20-win season.

Scoring Loss: Head coach Tina Martin entered the 2002-2003 season without her top two scorers from a season ago. Graduates Megan Dellegrotti (13.5 ppg) and Christina Rible (12.8 ppg) accounted for 36% of Delaware's total offense in 2001-02 (726 of 2018 points).
