# Meet The Coach



**Tina Martin**  
**Head Coach**  
**7th Season**  
**(106-74)**  
**Lock Haven '86**

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

**HEMPSTEAD, NY** -- Christina Rible led the way with a season-high 24 points and 10 rebounds for her 10th double-double of the season as Delaware won its regular season finale and gave head coach Tina Martin her 100th career victory...Hens (22-5, 15-3) won their fifth straight game and their 14th in the last 15 outings...the 22 wins is the second highest total in school history...Hofstra (9-18, 6-12) lost despite having three players score in double figures as Tara Dilworth came off the bench to post 14 points and a team-high seven rebounds and guard Jen Brickey had 15 points...Martin became the second coach in UD history to reach 100 wins but did so faster (169 games) than Joyce Perry (266 wins - 184 games to win 100)...Rible connected on 9 of 16 field goals and converted all six free throws for her season-high 24 points, her fourth 20-point effort of the season. ... Allison Trapp added 15 points for the Blue Hens...Delaware overcame 22 turnovers by out-rebounding Hofstra 37-32 and holding the Pride to just 33.3 percent shooting from the field (16 of 48), including just 3 of 17 from the three-point line...the Hens continued their torrid foul shooting by converting 20 of 24 tries, including all 17 in the second half...Hofstra led early 11-10 but the Hens countered with a 14-5 run with Rible scoring four baskets during the stretch...Delaware, which downed Hofstra for the fifth straight time, scored the first seven points of the second half, including four by Rible, to extend a 31-24 lead at intermission to the lead to 38-24.

**Blue Hens Open Conference Play:** This afternoon's game marks the conference opener for both Delaware and Hofstra. The Blue Hens posted a 15-3 mark in conference play last season, while the Pride finished 6-12.

**DARTMOUTH TOURNAMENT:**

**Blue Hens Win Tournament:** With its 61-48 win over the Big Green of Dartmouth on Monday night, Delaware captured its first regular season tournament title since defeating Montclair State and Northeastern to claim the Montclair (NJ) State Tournament in 1983-84.

**Trapp Named MVP:** Senior guard Allison Trapp captured tournament MVP honors, scoring 26 points to go with four rebounds and six steals against UAB on Sunday night, and posted 13 points, six boards and four steals in the championship game against Dartmouth. She has now reached 20 points or more in three of the Blue Hens last four games and seven times in her career.

**Cole, Malcom Earn Honors:** Senior Christine Cole and sophomore Tiara Malcom were each named to the All-Tournament team at Dartmouth. Cole pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds in the championship game against the Big Green, while Malcom notched 15 points and seven rebounds against UAB on Sunday and 12 points against Dartmouth on Monday.

**Timmins Matches Career High:** Senior guard Carrie Timmins tied her career-high of six assists against UAB last Sunday.

**Blanketing Defense:** Trailing 39-31 in the second half, the Blue Hens held Dartmouth scoreless for 8:16 without a field goal for over eleven minutes, helping turn a five-point halftime deficit into a 46-43 lead, which they never relinquished.

**2002-2003 SEASON NOTES:**

**Winning at Home:** Delaware has won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997.

**Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week:**

Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

**Moving on Up:** Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 632 career points, which ranks her 29th on Delaware's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is former teammate, Lindsay Davis, with 645 points.

**Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season:** Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue torn the ACL and MCL in her left knee last Monday during practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

**Walking on:** Sophomore walk-on **Jaclyn Gordon (Ambler, PA/Mt. St. Joseph's)** has been cleared to play and dressed for her first game against Marist on December 23. Gordon was a four-year letterwinner at Mt. St. Joseph's high school in Amber, PA, leading her team to the state championship every season, winning twice.

**Dish The Rock:** The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 2-1 when they win the assist battle.

**Home Court Advantage:** Last season, the Blue Hens posted an 11-1 mark at the Bob Carpenter Center, suffering their only loss at the hands of eventual Elite Eight participant, Old Dominion, ending a 22-game home winning streak. Delaware is 48-4 the past four seasons at the BCC, 56-19 under Martin and boast a 17-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents. Their last loss was back on February 17, 1998, when the Blue Hens dropped a 59-57 decision to Morgan State.

**Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer:** Sophomore Julie Sailer has been voted to the second team All-CAA by both the CAA coaches and media polls. Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors.

**Scoring Loss:** Head coach Tina Martin enters the 2002-03 season without her top two scorers from a season ago. Graduates Megan Dellegrotti (13.5 ppg) and Christina Rible (12.8 ppg) accounted for 36% of Delaware's total offense in 2001-02 (726 of 2018 points).

**Trapp Named to Second Team:** Senior guard and co-captain Allison Trapp has been named to the CAA All-Conference second team in this season's pre-season coaches poll. Trapp started 25 of the 27 games she played in last season, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

**Don't Hack the Hens:** Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe, and placed four players among the top seven: Sailer (1st, .869), Rible (3rd, .843), Dellagrotti (4th, .840) and Trapp (7th, .828) in 2001-02. This season, Delaware is Third in the CAA, shooting .696.

**Hens on TV:** Delaware's second and final matchup of the 2002-2003 season against the Hofstra Pride can be seen live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic. Game time is set for 4:00 p.m. at the Bob Carpenter Center.

**Three-Peat?:** The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Delaware is also seeking its fourth-straight 20-win season.

**Cole on the Boards:** Senior forward Christine Cole has 444 career rebounds, which ranks her 21st on Delaware's all-time rebounds list. She needs 2 to pass Lisa Cano and move into 20th all-time.

**Trading Places:** After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

**Magic Number 70:** Before last season's loss to George Washington in the NIT, the Blue Hens had won 30 consecutive games when scoring 70+ points. The team was 12-1 last season and is 61-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.
