Game Notes: Delaware enters tonight's contest off the heels of a 57-47 loss at Penn on Tuesday evening, snapping its four game winning streak. Sophomore forward Julie Sailer dropped in 15 points and grabbed seven rebounds and junior forward Tracey Howell posted nine points and seven rebounds for the Blue Hens, who lost for just the second time in their last 13 games. James Madison, meanwhile, has won three straight, including Sunday's 65-62 win over UNC-Wilmington. Shanna Price led the way with 21 points and 10 rebounds, while Jess Cichowicz and Jody LeRose each added 11. Delaware won both meetings between the two schools last season. Senior guard Allison Trapp needs 19 points for 1,000 career points. Delaware is ranked 6th nationally in scoring defense (53.5 ppg).

Meet The Coach

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

HARRISONBURG, VA -- Allison Trapp scored 12 of her game-high 18 points in the second half as Delaware overcame a nine-point second half deficit to post its fourth straight win and 13th in the last 14 outings...Megan Dellegrotti and Christina Rible each added 14 points for the Hens to help head coach Tina Martin win her 99th career game and reach 21 wins for the third straight year...James Madison (15-11, 9-8) suffered its fourth straight loss despite a big effort from guard Allyson Keener, who scored a team-high 17 points and nailed five of 11 three-pointers...Nadine Morgan and Shanna Price each added 14 points and six rebounds for the Dukes...the Hens shot just 28 percent from the field (7 of 25) in the first half and fell behind 29-25 as the host Dukes connected on 12 of 24 shots and led for all but the first two minutes of stanza...Trapp and Christine Cole (seven points, nine rebounds) each hit two field goals in the first three minutes of the second half to tie it up but JMU recovered and went back up by as much as nine points at 44-35 with 10:03 left...again, the Hens came back as Trapp fueled a 14-5 run with eight points as UD tied it up at 49-49 with 3:05 left and went ahead for good on a Lindsay Davis bank shot from the top of the key, her only field goal of the day, with 1:46 left...Dellegrotti hit a tough, fall-away shot in the lane with 55 seconds left and added two free throws 34 seconds later for a 57-53 lead....JMU guard Jess Cichowicz hit a jumper with nine seconds left to cut the lead to two, but Rible followed with two free throws to seal the win.

PENNSYLVANIA 57, DELAWARE 47:

Delaware against the Ivy League: Tuesday's loss against the Quakers was the Blue Hens first loss to an Ivy League school since a 65-64 loss to Penn on December 28, 1996.

Off the Mark: Delaware shot a season-low 26.3% from the field against the Quakers, its lowest percentage since shooting 22.6% against Coppin State on December 7, 2001.

Scoring Drought: The Quaker defense held the Blue Hens scoreless for 11:08 on Tuesday night. The Blue Hens did not score during the final 6:46 of the first half or during the first 4:22 of the second.

The Streak Continues: With a win over Drexel on January 23, Delaware has now posted double-digit wins in each of the past five seasons.

Trapp Nearing 1,000: Senior guard Allison Trapp has 981 career points, 19 short of 1,000 for her career. Trapp, who has 791 points in two-plus seasons at Delaware, scored 190 in 22 games at East Carolina.

Free Throw Discrepancy: The Blue Hens have made 260 free throws this season on 367 attempts (70.8%), which is more than their opponents have taken (238).

Hens on the Glass: The Blue Hens outrebounded the Drexel Dragons by a 39-19 margin on January 23, the lowest rebounding total Delaware has held an opponent to since the 1984-85 season. The stat was not available prior to 1984.

Sharp-Shooting Hens: Delaware shot a season-high 52.2% from the field against George Mason on January 19, its highest shooting percentage since shooting 55.4% against Towson on February 19, 2000. The Hens shot 68.0% in the first half, the second highest pct. for a half in school history.

Sail-ing Along: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer tied her career-high with 21 points against George Mason on January 19, including a career-high three 3-point field goals.

Winning at Home: Delaware has won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997, and are 51-5 over the last five seasons overall.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 791 points at Delaware, which ranks her 24th on the school's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Keisha McFadgion with 847 points.

Cole Posts Double-Double: Senior forward Christine Cole notched her third career double-double against George Mason on January 19, scoring 10 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

Unselfish Hens: Delaware's 20 assists against Towson on January 19 marked its highest total since dishing out 20 against Princeton back on December 1, 2001.

Stifling D: Delaware held William & Mary to just 17 first half points on January 26, the lowest they have held an opponent to since UNC-Wilmington scored just 17 points in the first half of a 56-54 OT win last season on January 4, 2002.

Howell Leads the Way: Sophomore forward Tracey Howell posted a career-high 12 points and grabbed eight rebounds in 27 minutes against William & Mary on January 26.

Rejected by Cole!: With a block in the second half against UNC-Wilmington on January 12, senior forward Christine Cole moved into sole possession of fifth place on Delaware's career blocks list. She has 86 for her career.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe. This season, Delaware is shooting 70.8%, placing them second in the CAA.

Timmins Continues to Improve: Senior guard Carrie Timmins has topped her career-high three times in the past seven games. After posting 10 points at VCU on Jan. 9 and 11 points at Towson on Jan. 16, Timmins dropped in a career-high 13 points against Drexel on January 23, connecting on a career-high three 3-point field goals, all in the second half.

Malcom Posts Career-High: Sophomore forward Tiara Malcom posted a career-high 21 points on 8-13 shooting against Virginia Commonwealth on January 9.

De-FENSE!: The Blue Hens held Virginia Commonwealth to a season-low 27.7% from the field on January 9. Delaware also held VCU to just one free throw, the lowest it has held a team to since holding Vermont to one back on January 28, 1994.

Career Day for Trapp: Senior guard Allison Trapp scored a career-high 34 points on 14-16 shooting against Hofstra on January 5, tying the Hofstra Arena record for points. Trapp scored 19 straight at one point, and her 34 points is the second highest single game scoring output in school history. For her efforts, she was named CAA Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

Blue Hens Win Dartmouth Tournament: With its 61-48 win over the Big Green of Dartmouth on December 30, Delaware captured its first regular season tournament title since defeating Montclair State and Northeastern to claim the Montclair (NJ) State Tournament in 1983-84.

Magic Number 70: Delaware is 5-0 this season and 66-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.

Trapp Named MVP: Senior guard Allison Trapp captured MVP honors at the Dartmouth Tournament, scoring 26 points to go with four rebounds and six steals against Alabama-Birmingham and 13 points, six boards and four steals in the championship game against Dartmouth.

Cole, Malcom Earn Honors: Senior Christine Cole and sophomore Tiara Malcom were each named to the All-Tournament team at Dartmouth. Cole pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds in the championship game against the Big Green, while Malcom notched 15 points and seven rebounds against UAB and 12 points against Dartmouth.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 7-1 when it wins the assist battle.

Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue tore the ACL and MCL in her left knee during a December practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week: Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer, Trapp: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer and senior guard Allison Trapp have each been voted to the second team All-CAA in pre-season polls (Sailer in both the CAA coaches and media poll, Trapp in the coaches poll). Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors. Trapp, meanwhile, started 25 of the 27 games she played in, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

Cole on the Boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 533 career rebounds, placing her 15th on Delaware's career list. Next up for Cole is former teammate Cindy Johnson with 541.
