Game Notes: The Blue Hens enter this afternoon's contest having won six of their last seven contests after downing Drexel on Thursday night at the Bob Carpenter Center, 51-47. Senior Allison Trapp led Delaware with 15 points and a season-high seven steals, while senior Christine Cole grabbed 11 rebounds en route to notching her second-straight double-digit rebounding game. James Madison has been just as hot, having won seven of its last eight games after knocking off Virginia Commonwealth Thursday night, 84-68. Jess Cichowicz led four Dukes in double-figures in scoring with 19 points, while Krystal Brooks dropped in 17 points and Nadine Morgan posted 13 points and nine rebounds. Overall, James Madison is led in scoring by Shanna Price, who is averaging 17.3 ppg and 7.1 rpg. Delaware won the team's first meeting back on January 30, 60-49.

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

NEWARK, DE -- Tiara Malcom posted her fourth career double-double, scoring 15 points while grabbing a career-high 16 rebounds, to give Delaware its 12th win in its last 14 games...The Blue Hens, who improved to 12-5 overall and 7-1 in conference play, also got 15 points and five rebounds from Julie Sailer, 13 points and three rebounds from Allison Trapp and seven points and a career-high five rebounds from Tiffany Young...with the win, Delaware improved to 21-4 against CAAopponents all-time, 52-10 in conference play over the past four seasons, and 52-5 at home over the last five seasons...James Madison (9-8, 4-4 CAA), which got 13 points from both Nadine Morgan and Shanna Price, fell to 1-4 all-time against the Blue Hens...Delaware took a 24-19 lead into halftime and opened the second half on a 11-3 run, sparked by a Sailer three-pointer, to take a 35-22 lead...James Madison closed the lead to 41-39 on buckets by Morgan, Price and Jody LeRose, but senior guard Carrie Timmins drilled a three with the shot clock running down to put the Blue Hens up 44-39 with five minutes to go...Sailer has now posted double-digits in points in five of her last six games, while Timmins moved into 10th place on Delaware's all-time three-point field goal list with 14...Trapp, meanwhile, remains...six points short of 1,000 for her career...the Hens took advantage of 22 James Madison turnovers and held a big advantage at the foul line where they hit on 24 of 32 shots compared to the Dukies converting just 5 of 8 from the line.

Delaware 51, Drexel 47:

With the win: Delaware has now won its last nine games against the Dragons and improved to 28-16 all-time against their former America East rival.

A game of runs: After falling behind 15-7 with 12:46 left in the first half, the Blue Hens closed the half on a 24-4 run to take a 31-19 lead. After Delaware scored the first four points of the second half, Drexel ripped off a 23-5 run to take a 42-40 lead with just 5:08 left in regulation before the Hens rallied to win.

Trapp surpasses 900-point plateau: Senior guard Allison Trapp became the 19th player in Delaware history to reach 900 career points as a Blue Hen. Trapp has 1,097 career points, however, having scored 190 in 22 games at East Carolina during her freshman season.

Cole stepping up: Senior forward Christine Cole grabbed 11 rebounds against the Dragons on Thursday night en route to notching the 13th double-digit rebounding game of her career. She is averaging 9.8 rpg in her last four contests and has moved into 12th place on UD's all-time rebound list (588).

Defense is the calling card: Delaware held the Dragons to just 47 points, the 11th time they have held an opponent under 50 points. The Blue Hens boast a 10-1 mark in those contests.

Consistency is the name of the game: Sophomore forward Tiara Malcom reached double-figures in scoring for the 21th time in 25 games this season on Thursday night. Meanwhile, senior guard Allison Trapp recorded her 20th double-digit scoring game of the season and the 46th of her career.

Hens in CAA: Entering today's contest, the Blue Hens are 58-12 in conference play over the past four seasons and 28-6 in the CAA since joining last season.

Four is a winner: The Blue Hens featured four players in double-figures in scoring against Hofstra on February 23, led by sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer's 18 points. Delaware is 5-0 when four players reach double-digits in scoring.

The streak continues: With a win over Drexel on January 23, Delaware has now posted double-digit wins in each of the past five seasons.

In a Blue Hen minute...: Trailing 55-49 with just 48 seconds remaining against UNC Wilmington on February 6, Delaware reeled off a 7-0 run, capped off by a Julie Sailer layup with five ticks left on the clock to take a 56-55 lead. Senior guard Allison Trapp blocked Cherie Lea's last-second shot to seal the win.

Magic number 70: Delaware is 5-0 this season and 66-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 907 points at Delaware, which places her 19th on the school's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Cynthia Phipps with 976 points.

Free throw discrepancy: The Blue Hens have made 419 free throws this season on 575 attempts (72.9%), which is more than their opponents have taken (387).

Lack of scoring: The 36 points scored by the Blue Hens against George Mason on February 20 marked not only their fewest point total of the season, but also the lowest total under head coach Tina Martin and the second-lowest in team history. The last time a Delaware team scored just 36 points was in a 92-36 loss at Cheyney back on January 17, 1980. In addition, Delaware recorded just two assists against the Patriots, a school-record for fewest assists in one game.

Winning at home: Delaware has won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997, and is 56-5 over the last five seasons overall.

Don't hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe. This season, Delaware is once again atop the CAA rankings at 72.9%.

Unselfish Hens: Delaware's 20 assists against Towson on January 19 marked its highest total since dishing out 20 against Princeton back on December 1, 2001.

Boxed out: The Blue Hens were held to a record-low 19 rebounds in a 58-50 win over Old Dominion on February 14. Their previous low came 12 years ago, when they grabbed 22 against Penn on January 19, 1991.

It's all fundamental: Delaware knocked down 21 of its 22 free throws against Old Dominion on February 14, including its final 18, establishing a school record for free throw percentage in a game at 95.5%. The previous high was 94.7%, set almost 30 years ago, back on February 22, 1974 against Morgan State.

Hens on the glass: The Blue Hens outrebounded the Drexel Dragons by a 39-19 margin on January 23, the lowest rebounding total Delaware has ever held an opponent to.

D-FENSE!: The Blue Hens held Virginia Commonwealth to a season-low 27.7% from the field on January 9. Delaware also held the Rams to just one free throw, the lowest it has held a team to since holding former America East Vermont to one back on January 28, 1994.

Sharp-shooting Hens: Delaware shot 68.0% in the first half against George Mason on January 19, the second highest percentage for a half in school history.

Blue Hens win Dartmouth Tournament: With its 61-48 win over the Big Green of Dartmouth on December 30, Delaware captured its first regular season tournament title since defeating Montclair State and Northeastern to claim the Montclair (NJ) State Tournament in 1983-84.

Dish the rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 8-1 when it wins the assist battle.

2002-2003 PLAYER NOTES:

Cole reaches milestone: With two blocks against the Pride on February 23, senior forward Christine Cole became just the fifth Blue Hen to record 100 career blocks.

Sailer from the arc: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer has made a 3-point field goal in 14 of the team's 25 games this season. Delaware is 13-1 in those contests.

Rejected by Cole!: With a block in the second half against UNC Wilmington on January 12, senior forward Christine Cole moved into sole possession of 5th place on Delaware's career blocks list. She has 102 for her career.

Trapp breaks 1,000 point barrier: With a layup at 13:37 of the first half against Old Dominion on February 2, senior guard Allison Trapp reached the 1,000 point plateau for her career. Trapp, who scored 190 points in 22 games as a freshman at East Carolina, has 907 points while at Delaware, placing her 19th on the school's all-time scoring list.

Sail-ing along: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer tied her career-high with 21 points against George Mason on January 19, including a career-high three 3-point field goals.

Career day for Trapp: Senior guard Allison Trapp scored a career-high 34 points on 14-16 shooting against Hofstra on January 5, tying the Hofstra Arena record for points. Trapp scored 19 straight at one point, and her 34 points is the second highest single game scoring output in school history. For her efforts, she was named CAA Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

Cole on the boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 588 career rebounds, placing her 12th on Delaware's career list. Next up for Cole is former teammate Danielle Leyfert with 645.

Trapp named MVP of Dartmouth Tournament: Senior guard Allison Trapp captured MVP honors at the Dartmouth Tournament, scoring 26 points to go with four rebounds and six steals against Alabama-Birmingham and 13 points, six boards and four steals in the championship game against Dartmouth. In addition, senior Christine Cole and sophomore Tiara Malcom were each named to the All-Tournament team at Dartmouth.

Hogue to miss remainder of season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue tore the ACL and MCL in her left knee during a December practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds through three games, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Sailer named CAA Player of the Week: Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Walking on: Sophomore walk-on **Jaclyn Gordon (Ambler, PA/Mt. St. Joseph's)** has been cleared to play and made her first career appearance at Towson on January 16. Gordon was a four-year letterwinner at Mt. St. Joseph's High School, leading her team to two state championships.

Pre-season accolades for Sailer, Trapp: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer and senior guard Allison Trapp have each been voted to the second team All-CAA in pre-season polls (Sailer in both the CAA coaches and media poll, Trapp in the coaches poll). Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors. Trapp, meanwhile, started 25 of the 27 games she appeared in, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.
