NEWARK, DE -- Freshman Julie Sailer led six scorers in double figures with a career-high 21 points as Delaware cruised past La Salle...Sailer came off the bench to hit on 7 of 10 shots from the field, including three three-pointers, to go with five rebounds and three assists as the Blue Hens (5-2) extended their school record with their 21st straight home win...Sailer hit on all four free throws to remain perfect in her career with 27 straight...the Hens, who hit on 20 of 23 free throws and committed just 12 turnovers, also won their 14th straight non-league game at home and defeated La Salle for the first time since 1980 after 12 straight losses...La Salle (2-6), which had four scorers in double figures led by guard Suzanne Keilty with 18 points, lost despite hitting a BCC record 11 three-pointers in 27 tries...La Salle shot just 34.6 percent from the field (18 of 52), including just 7 of 25 inside the three-point arc...Delaware freshman Tiara Malcom, making her first career start in place of injured starter Christina Rible (broken finger), recorded her first double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds and Tracey Howell also came off the bench to add 11 points and six rebounds...a closely fought first half ended with Delaware holding a 42-38 advantage and the Blue Hens stayed in control the entire second half, leading by at least six points the entire way...the Hens held La Salle scoreless for over three minutes at one points to put the game away...Delaware outscored the Explorers 8-2 to go up 65-53 with 7:51 left.

Meet The Coach

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

RICHMOND 65, DELAWARE 47:

Opening Night: With Friday night's loss to Richmond, Delaware is now 13-19 all-time in season opening games, including 4-3 under Martin. They had won two in a row entering Friday's contest.

Inaugural Meeting: Friday night's contest marked the first meeting ever between the Spiders and the Blue Hens.

Starting Slow: The 45 points scored by the Blue Hens was their second-lowest ever in a season opener. The 1973-74 team opened its season with a 53-41 loss to Maryland.

Malcom Sets Career-High: Tiara Malcom recorded a career-high in blocks with five against the Spiders. Her previous high was three, which she accomplished twice, most recently against Hofstra on December 29, 2001.

Baptism By Fire: Freshman Juliette Warren played 17 minutes in her first collegiate game, scoring six points on 3-of-7 shooting.

Young Misses Opener: Sophomore forward Tiffany Young sat out Delaware's season-opener with a strained muscle in her right leg. She is expected to miss 7-10 days.

2002-2002 SEASON NOTES:

Home Court Advantage: Last season, the Blue Hens posted an 11-1 mark at the Bob Carpenter Center, suffering their only loss at the hands of eventual Elite Eight participant, Old Dominion, ending a 22-game home winning streak. Delaware is 46-4 the past four seasons at the BCC and 54-19 under Martin.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer: Sophomore Julie Sailer has been voted to the second team All-CAA by both the CAA coaches and media polls. Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors.

Trapp Named to Second Team: Senior guard and co-captain Allison Trapp has been named to the CAA All-Conference second team in this season's pre-season coaches poll. Trapp started 25 of the 27 games she played in last season, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Promoted: Megan Dellegrotti, a four-year letter-winner at Delaware who stands 12th on the Blue Hens all-time scoring list with 1,112 points, has been appointed assistant coach for the 2002-2003

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 538 career points, which ranks her 32nd on Delaware's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Jackie Porac, who scored 552 points.

season. A standout both on and off the court, Dellegrotti earned second team All-CAA honors as a senior and also earned CoSIDA District II All-Academic honors during her stint as the floor general of the Hens offense. She will complete her work for her bachelor's degree in health and exercise science this academic year.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe, and placed four players among the top seven: Sailer (1st, .869), Rible (3rd, .843), Dellegrotti (4th, .840) and Trapp (7th, .828).

Three-Peat?: The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Delaware is also seeking its fourth-straight 20-win season.

Scoring Loss: Head coach Tina Martin enters the 2002-03 season without her top two scorers from a season ago. Graduates Megan Dellegrotti (13.5 ppg) and Christina Rible (12.8 ppg) accounted for 36% of Delaware's total offense in 2001-02 (726 of 2018 points).

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle.

Cole on the Boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 426 career rebounds, which ranks her 22nd on Delaware's all-time rebounds list. She needs 18 to pass Jackie Porac and move into 21st place.

Perfect After the Half: The Blue Hens will look to continue their solid second-half play in 2002-03. Delaware posted a perfect 19-0 record when leading entering halftime last season. Their last loss when leading at the half came against former America East rival Vermont.

Rejected by Cole!: Along with being a force on the glass, senior Christina Cole stands as one of Martin's best defenders. She is currently ranked sixth on Delaware's all-time blocks list.
