POUGHKEEPSIE, NY -- Delaware's backcourt of Megan Dellegrotti and Allison Trapp combined for 48 points, 10 rebounds, 13 assists, and 11 steals as the Hens rolled over Marist...the Hens (6-2) won their third straight with an offensive explosion that saw them score 51 first half points to jump out to a nine-point halftime lead...Marist (4-4) got 20 points, including six three-pointers, and six assists from Marie Fusci, who also scored her 1,000th point, but the other four starters managed just 20 points...Dellegrotti connected for 26 points, pulled a team-high six rebounds, dished out five assists, and posted three steals while Trapp hit for 22 points, four rebounds, a career-high eight assists, and a school record eight steals....the eight steals tied the UD record set three times, the last by Denise Wojciech vs. Penn Dec. 10, 1994...the Hens, who committed just 11 fouls and 12 turnovers, shot 21 of 36 from the field (.583) to jump out to the 51-42 lead and never look back...Marist hit on 17 of its 31 first half shots (.548) but still trailed by nine at intermission...freshman Tiara Malcom, making her second straight start in place of injured starter Christina Rible (broken finger), had 13 points and four rebounds while Christine Cole netted 13 points and five rebounds...UD freshman Julie Sailer missed her first free throw of the season after hitting her first 27, just four shy of the UD record.

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

DELAWARE 71, BUCKNELL 45:

Winning at Home: Delaware has now won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997.

Season-High's All Around: The Blue Hens 71 points marked their season high, and their 42.2% shooting marked their highest total since shooting 50.0% against Virginia Commonwealth back on February 3, 2002.

Two in a Row: Sophomore forward Tiara Malcom recorded her second consecutive 'double-double' against the Bison, tying her career-high in both points (18) and rebounds (13). Malcom notched her first career 'double-double' four days earlier against St. John's, posting 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Sailer's a Thief! Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer established a new career-high in steals against the Bison with three.

Everyone Plays: For the first time since the opener at Richmond, everyone on the Blue Hens received playing time.

2002-2003 SEASON NOTES:

Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week:

Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue torn her ACL and MCL last Monday during practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Perfect After the Half: The Blue Hens loss against LaSalle snapped a streak of 19 consecutive wins 19-0 when leading entering halftime last season.

Timmins Finds Her Groove: Senior guard Carrie Timmins had a breakout game against St. John's on December 4. The senior co-captain established career-highs in assists (five) and minutes played (35) while pulling down six rebounds, which tied her career-high.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 593 career points, which ranks her 30th on Delaware's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Bridget McCarthy with 626 points.

Hens Off the Mark: Delaware shot 27.6% against the Explorers, their lowest field goal percentage since shooting 27.0% against Drexel back on February 14, 2002.

Tobin Out: Freshman Karleena Tobin is out indefinitely after having her right knee scoped. Tobin has been experiencing problems rehabilitating a torn meniscus.

Opening Night: With a season-opening night loss to Richmond, Delaware is now 13-19 all-time in season opening games, including 4-3 under Martin. They had won two openers in a row entering the contest.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 2-1 when they win the assist battle.

Home Court Advantage: Last season, the Blue Hens posted an 11-1 mark at the Bob Carpenter Center, suffering their only loss at the hands of eventual Elite Eight participant, Old Dominion, ending a 22-game home winning streak. Delaware is 48-4 the past four seasons at the BCC, 56-19 under Martin and boast a 17-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents. Their last loss was back on February 17, 1998, when the Blue Hens dropped a 59-57 decision to Morgan State.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer: Sophomore Julie Sailer has been voted to the second team All-CAA by both the CAA coaches and media polls. Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors.

Scoring Loss: Head coach Tina Martin enters the 2002-03 season without her top two scorers from a season ago. Graduates Megan Dellegrotti (13.5 ppg) and Christina Rible (12.8 ppg) accounted for 36% of Delaware's total offense in 2001-02 (726 of 2018 points).

Trapp Named to Second Team: Senior guard and co-captain Allison Trapp has been named to the CAA All-Conference second team in this season's pre-season coaches poll. Trapp started 25 of the 27 games she played in last season, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe, and placed four players among the top seven: Sailer (1st, .869), Rible (3rd, .843), Dellegrotti (4th, .840) and Trapp (7th, .828) in 2001-02. This season, Delaware is Third in the CAA, shooting .696.

Hens on TV: Delaware's second and final matchup of the 2002-2003 season against the Hofstra Pride can be seen live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic. Game time is set for 4:00 p.m. at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Three-Peat?: The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Delaware is also seeking its fourth-straight 20-win season.

Cole on the Boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 444 career rebounds, which ranks her 21st on Delaware's all-time rebounds list. She needs 2 to pass Lisa Cano and move into 20th all-time.

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

Magic Number 70: Before last season's loss to George Washington in the NIT, the Blue Hens had won 30 consecutive games when scoring 70+ points. The team was 12-1 last season and is 61-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.
