Game Notes: Delaware enters tonight's contest in first place in the Colonial Athletic Association for the first time since joining last season. Old Dominion, meanwhile, finds itself in uncharted territory, having been bumped from the conference top spot for the first time since the 1991-1992 season. The Blue Hens have won three of their last four games, including a 53-50 triumph over Virginia Commonwealth on Sunday, while the Lady Monarchs are trying to snap a two-game conference losing skid. Old Dominion fell to both Virginia Commonwealth (67-56) and James Madison (98-95) on the road last week. Old Dominion defeated the Blue Hens on February 2 in Norfolk, 73-62.

Meet The Coach

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

NEWARK, DE -- Allison Trapp led all players with 23 points, including her 1,000th career point in the first half, but it was not enough as Delaware fell to league-leading Old Dominion...Delaware, which dropped to 12-6 overall, 7-2 CAA, also got 19 points and seven rebounds from Tiara Malcom and 11 points from Carrie Timmins...Malcom, coming off an 11 for 13 performance from the line vs. JMU, made all 13 of her free throws... Delaware took an early lead on two straight buckets by Trapp to go ahead 7-4 and at the 13:37 mark of the first half Trapp scored on a fast break layup to ascend the 1,000 point plateau for her career...she has scored 827 points in her two-plus seasons as a Blue Hen and 190 in 22 games at East Carolina...the Hens held the lead throughout most of the first half until Old Dominion grabbed a slim 25-24 lead with 5:11 to go...Timmins answered back for Delaware with two free throws with eight seconds left to stake the Hens to a 32-31 lead at the half..the Monarchs responded with a 10-2 run to open up the second half to take a 41-34 lead with 17:58 to go in the game and would increase their lead to eight, 50-42 with 13:32 left...the Hens would answer back with a 13-5 run of their own to tie the game at 55-55 on a Trapp layup with 8:12 left but Old Dominion rattled off five straight points, the final two on a layup by Monique Coker with 6:29 to go as they pulled away to stay a perfect 8-0 in conference and 11-7 overall..Delaware was held to a season low 26 rebounds and were outrebounded 47-26 on the afternoon.

DELAWARE 53, VIRGINIA COMMONWEALTH 50:

Down to the Wire: For the second consecutive game, Delaware snatched victory from the jaws of defeat in the final minute of play. On Thursday night, February 6, sophomore Julie Sailer's layup with five seconds remaining in the second half gave the Blue Hens a 56-55 win over UNC Wilmington. On Sunday, senior guard Carrie Timmins knocked down two free throws to give Delaware a 51-50 lead against VCU with 35 seconds remaining. Christine Cole added two more from the stripe to seal Delaware's 14th win of the season.

Doubles for Sailer: With 10 points in Sunday's win, sophomore Julie Sailer now has 28 double-digit scoring games in her career, including 15 games with at least 15 points.

Streaking Hens: Senior guard Carrie Timmins has made a 3-point field goal in eight of her last nine games. Overall, Timmins ranks 10th on Delaware's all-time list in three's.

Stay out of the Paint: Senior Christine Cole blocked a season-high four shots on Sunday. She now has 95 for her career, ranking her 5th all-time at Delaware.

Malcom in the Middle: With 11 points against the Rams on Sunday, sophomore Tiara Malcom has now posted double-figures in 17 of Delaware's 20 games this season.

Hens In CAA: Entering tonight's contest, the Blue Hens are 54-11 in conference play over the past four seasons and 24-5 in the CAA since joining last season.

The Streak Continues: With a win over Drexel on January 23, Delaware has now posted double-digit wins in each of the past five seasons.

In a Blue Hen Minute...: Trailing 55-49 with just 48 seconds remaining against UNC Wilmington on February 6, Delaware reeled off a 7-0 run, capped off by a Julie Sailer layup with five ticks left on the clock to take a 56-55 lead. Senior guard Allison Trapp blocked Cherie Lea's last-second shot to seal the win.

Free Throw Discrepancy: The Blue Hens have made 343 free throws this season on 475 attempts (72.2%), which is more than their opponents have taken (301).

Winning at Home: Delaware has won 17 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997, and is 53-5 over the last five seasons overall.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe. This season, Delaware once again atop the CAA rankings at 72.2%.

Unselfish Hens: Delaware's 20 assists against Towson on January 19 marked its highest total since dishing out 20 against Princeton back on December 1, 2001.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 841 points at Delaware, which ranks her 24th on the school's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Keisha McFadgion with 847 points.

Magic Number 70: Delaware is 5-0 this season and 66-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.

Hens on the Glass: The Blue Hens outrebounded the Drexel Dragons by a 39-19 margin on January 23, the lowest rebounding total Delaware has held an opponent to since the 1984-85 season. The stat was not available prior to 1984.

De-FENSE!: The Blue Hens held Virginia Commonwealth to a season-low 27.7% from the field on January 9. Delaware also held the Rams to just one free throw, the lowest it has held a team to since holding Vermont to one back on January 28, 1994.

Sharp-Shooting Hens: Delaware shot a season-high 52.2% from the field against George Mason on January 19, its highest shooting percentage since shooting 55.4% against Towson on February 19, 2000. The Blue Hens shot 68.0% in the first half, the second highest percentage for a half in school history.

Stifling D: Delaware held William & Mary to just 17 first-half points on January 26, the lowest it has held an opponent to since UNC Wilmington scored just 17 points in the first half of a 56-54 OT win last season on January 4, 2002.

Blue Hens Win Dartmouth Tournament: With its 61-48 win over the Big Green of Dartmouth on December 30, Delaware captured its first regular season tournament title since defeating Montclair State and Northeastern to claim the Montclair (NJ) State Tournament in 1983-84.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 7-1 when it wins the assist battle.

Promoted: Megan Dellegrotti, a four-year letterwinner at Delaware who stands 12th on the Blue Hens all-time scoring list with 1,112 points, has been appointed assistant coach for the 2002-03 season. Dellegrotti, who earned second team All-CAA honors as a senior, will complete her work for her bachelor's degree in health and exercise science this academic year.

Three-peat?: The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT).

2002-2003 PLAYER NOTES:

Trapp Breaks 1,000 Point Barrier: With a layup at 13:37 of the first half against Old Dominion on February 2, senior guard Allison Trapp reached the 1,000 point plateau for her career. Trapp, who scored 190 points in 22 games as a freshman at East Carolina, has 841 while at Delaware, ranking her 24th all-time.

Sail-ing Along: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer tied her career-high with 21 points against George Mason on January 19, including a career-high three 3-point field goals.

Cole Posts Double-Double: Senior forward Christine Cole notched her third career double-double against George Mason on January 19, scoring 10 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

Rejected by Cole!: With a block in the second half against UNC Wilmington on January 12, senior forward Christine Cole moved into sole possession of 5th place on Delaware's career blocks list. She has 95 for her career.

Malcom Dominates the Dukes: Sophomore forward Tiara Malcom grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds to go along with 15 points against James Madison on January 30 en route to notching her fourth-career double-double.

Career Day for Trapp: Senior guard Allison Trapp scored a career-high 34 points on 14-16 shooting against Hofstra on January 5, tying the Hofstra Arena record for points. Trapp scored 19 straight at one point, and her 34 points is the second highest single game scoring output in school history. For her efforts, she was named CAA Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

Trapp Named MVP: Senior guard Allison Trapp captured MVP honors at the Dartmouth Tournament, scoring 26 points to go with four rebounds and six steals against Alabama-Birmingham and 13 points, six boards and four steals in the championship game against Dartmouth.

Cole, Malcom Earn Honors: Senior Christine Cole and sophomore Tiara Malcom were each named to the All-Tournament team at Dartmouth. Cole pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds in the championship game against the Big Green, while Malcom notched 15 points and seven rebounds against Alabama-Birmingham and 12 points against Dartmouth.

Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue tore the ACL and MCL in her left knee during a December practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week: Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer, Trapp: Sophomore forward Julie Sailer and senior guard Allison Trapp have each been voted to the second team All-CAA in pre-season polls (Sailer in both the CAA coaches and media poll, Trapp in the coaches poll). Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors. Trapp, meanwhile, started 25 of the 27 games she played in, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.
