Selected players will also be available outside the locker room as well. **The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.** Pre-game interview requests for players or coaches should be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews: ALL requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Sports Information Office at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

Tina Martin's revival of the University of Delaware women's basketball program is one of the best success stories in the sport in the last five years.

In a span of five years, the 37-year old former Lock Haven (PA) standout has turned the Blue Hens from cellar-dwellers to conference champions. Hired on May 14, 1996 to replacing 18-year veteran Joyce Perry, Martin received a five-year contract extension prior to the 2000-2001 season.

Last season, Delaware's first in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), the Blue Hens won 20 games for the third-consecutive season, posting a 23-7 record, and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Martin won her 100th game as coach of the Blue Hens, becoming the fastest coach in Delaware history to achieve that milestone.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and 21-8 and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. All but one starter returned in 2000-2001, as the Blue Hens posted a 26-5 record and captured the America East regular season title. Along with receiving votes in a National Top 25 poll for the first-time in school history, the team also earned their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Martin's experience with rebuilding programs extends back to her days as an assistant coach at Seton Hall. She played a big part in rebuilding a Lady Pirate program that went from three-straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, PA, Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven and was a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and Two-Time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87, where she served as a graduate assistant. She moved onto Seton Hall the following season, assisting Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse.

Martin is single and resides in Newark.

DELAWARE 77, MARIST 49

Winning at Home: Delaware has now won 18 straight non-league home games, dating back to 1997.

Career Night for Trapp: Senior guard Allison Trapp scored a career-high 27 points against the Red Foxes, the most by a Blue Hen since Christina Rible dropped 27 on Maine back on January 27, 2000. Trapp's four steals also tied her career-high.

At the Half: The Blue Hens took a 45-22 lead into halftime, a 23-point difference. The last time Delaware led by as many as 23 points at halftime was back on November 22, 1996, when it led Delaware State, 40-17, at the break.

Quick as a Fox: The Blue Hens forced the Red Foxes into 31 turnovers, the most Delaware has forced an opponent to commit since Boston University committed 32 on January 6, 2000.

Assist Queens: Senior guard Carrie Timmins and sophomore forward Tracey Howell each dished out six assists against Marist, a career high for both. As a team, Delaware handed out 16 assists, a season-high.

Walking on: Sophomore walk-on **Jaclyn Gordon (Ambler, PA/Mt. St. Joseph's)** dressed for her first game against Marist. She is the younger sister of Villanova Wildcats quarterback, Brett.

2002-2003 SEASON NOTES:

Sailer Named CAA Player of the Week:

Sophomore and reigning CAA Rookie of the Year Julie Sailer was named CAA Player of the Week for the second time in her career after helping lead Delaware to its first two wins of the season. Sailer posted 16 points and 11 rebounds against St. John's on December 4 and 16 points and seven rebounds against Bucknell four days later.

Hogue To Miss Remainder of Season: Freshman forward LaShannen Hogue torn the ACL and MCL in her left knee last Monday during practice and will miss the remainder of the 2002-03 season. Hogue, who was averaging 8.0 points and 4.0 rebounds, will apply for a medical redshirt.

Perfect After the Half: The Blue Hens loss against LaSalle snapped a streak of 19 consecutive wins 19-0 when leading entering halftime last season.

Tobin Out: Freshman Karleena Tobin is out indefinitely after having her right knee scoped. Tobin has been experiencing problems rehabilitating a torn meniscus.

Moving on Up: Senior Guard Allison Trapp has 620 career points, which ranks her 30th on Delaware's all-time scoring list. Next up for Trapp is Bridget McCarthy with 626 points.

Dish The Rock: The Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 last season when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. This season, Delaware is 2-1 when they win the assist battle.

Home Court Advantage: Last season, the Blue Hens posted an 11-1 mark at the Bob Carpenter Center, suffering their only loss at the hands of eventual Elite Eight participant, Old Dominion, ending a 22-game home winning streak. Delaware is 49-4 the past four seasons at the BCC, 57-19 under Martin and boast a 18-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents. Their last loss was back on February 17, 1998, when the Blue Hens dropped a 59-57 decision to Morgan State.

Pre-Season Accolades for Sailer: Sophomore Julie Sailer has been voted to the second team All-CAA by both the CAA coaches and media polls. Last season, Sailer averaged 9.4 ppg en route to earning CAA Rookie of the Year honors, the first University of Delaware basketball player (men's or women's) to earn such honors.

Scoring Loss: Head coach Tina Martin enters the 2002-03 season without her top two scorers from a season ago. Graduates Megan Dellegrotti (13.5 ppg) and Christina Rible (12.8 ppg) accounted for 36% of Delaware's total offense in 2001-02 (726 of 2018 points).

Trapp Named to Second Team: Senior guard and co-captain Allison Trapp has been named to the CAA All-Conference second team in this season's pre-season coaches poll. Trapp started 25 of the 27 games she played in last season, averaging 12.5 ppg. For her efforts, she was named to the CAA All-Defensive team.

Don't Hack the Hens: Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage last season, shooting 77.4% from the stripe, and placed four players among the top seven: Sailer (1st, .869), Rible (3rd, .843), Dellegrotti (4th, .840) and Trapp (7th, .828) in 2001-02. This season, Delaware is second in the CAA, shooting .696 (as of 12/23).

Hens on TV: Delaware's second and final matchup of the 2002-2003 season against the Hofstra Pride can be seen live on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic. Game time is set for 4:00 p.m. at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Three-Peat?: The Blue Hens have advanced to the post-season in each of the last two seasons. In 2000-2001, Delaware captured the America East Championship and earned an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Last season, the Blue Hens qualified for the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). In addition, Delaware is also seeking its fourth-straight 20-win season.

Cole on the Boards: Senior forward Christine Cole has 449 career rebounds, which ranks her 20st on Delaware's all-time rebounds list. She needs 25 to pass Robin Stoffel and move into 19th all-time.

Trading Places: After suffering through an injury-plagued freshman campaign at the University of Maryland, forward Arek Deng decided a change was needed and transferred to the University of Delaware. She will sit out the 2002-2003 season, as per NCAA transfer requirements, but will practice with the team throughout the season.

Magic Number 70: Before last season's loss to George Washington in the NIT, the Blue Hens had won 30 consecutive games when scoring 70+ points. The team was 12-1 last season and is 61-6 over the last three seasons when hitting the 70-point plateau.

Rejected by Cole!: Along with being a force on the glass, senior Christine Cole stands as one of Martin's best defenders. She is currently ranked sixth on Delaware's all-time blocks list.
