♦ Series Info: Delaware vs. George Mason ♦

All-Time Series: George Mason leads the all-time series, 9-4, with the first meeting between the two mid-atlantic teams occurring in the 1987-88 season. George Mason has also won the last two games. (For year-by-year results, see the opponent section in the media guide).

Last meeting between Delaware & George Mason: Tiara Malcom scored a career-high 31 points and grabbed 11 rebounds but Laura Kooij's six three-point field goals proved too much to overcome, as the Blue Hens fell to George Mason, 71-64, on January 24, 2004.

Last time out for the BlueHens: Tiara Malcom and Alena Koshansky each scored 19 points and Tyresa Smith chipped in with 14 more as the University of Delaware continued its spirited late-season play by pulling away in the second half for a 69-56 win over Towson Sunday afternoon at the Towson Center. Last time out for the Patriots: Old Dominion's Monique Coker matched her career-high of 17 rebounds and netted a team-best 22 points to lead the Monarchs to an 81-64 victory over George Mason on Sunday.

◆ Quick Shots ◆

◆ Tonight's game marks the 14th meeting all-time between George Mason University and the University of Delaware. The Patriots lead the series, 9-4, and have won the last two meetings between the teams by an average of 10.0 ppg.

◆ With a win tonight, the Blue Hens secure the No. 4 seed in next week's CAA Tournament, while a loss lands them anywhere from No. 4 to No. 6, depending on the outcome of the VCU/Drexel and Hofstra/UNC Wilmington games. George Mason, meanwhile, will be the No. 2 or No. 3 seed, depending on tonight's result and what happens to Hofstra on Friday night at UNC Wilmington

◆ Delaware enters tonight's contest in the midst of a three-game win streak and has won four out of its past five contests and has swept four conference opponents (Towson, UNC Wilmington, Drexel, Hofstra).

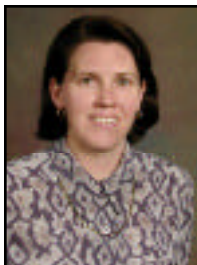
◆ The Blue Hens, who are three wins shy of 20, must knock off George Mason tonight and then win their first two games of the CAA Tournament if they hope to keep their streak of four consecutive 20-win seasons in tact. If they reach 20 wins, the Hens will have advanced to the CAA championship game for the second consecutive season

◆ Tonight the Blue Hens will honor lone senior **Tracey Howell** along with senior athletic trainer Kristy Vodvarka in a pre-game ceremony. Howell is tied for eighth in games played at Delaware (111), ninth in blocked shots (60) and 20th in rebounding (486).

◆ George Mason saw its five game losing streak snapped on Sunday with an 81-64 loss to CAA-leading Old Dominion in Fairfax in the Patriot's final home contest. The Patriots have six seniors on their squad -- Vernessa Neamo, Jen Derevjanik, Lesley Harvey, Susan Otim, Lynnette Clark, and Osato Edozor-Osula.

Tina Martin, Head Coach...Eighth season at University of Delaware...compiled a 139-89 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program becoming, the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to four-straight 20 win seasons and three consecutive post season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Matchless Malcom

Junior forward **Tiara Malcom** leads the Blue Hens in scoring (15.8 ppg) and rebounding (7.1 rpg). She also ranks fourth in the CAA in scoring and seventh in rebounding. Only one other player ranks in the top seven in both categories (Vernessa Neamo, George Mason). **Malcom has put together a standout junior season, scoring 20+ points on seven occasions and five double-doubles, including a career-high 31 points and a game-high 11 rebounds at George Mason on January 22.** She became just the 10th Blue Hen player to break the 30 point marker in a single game. She was also recognized on Tuesday, January 27 as the CAA Player of the Week after posting consecutive double-doubles against George Mason and Drexel. Since her debut in the first game of the 2001-02 season, **Malcom has played in 87 consecutive games, and the Blue Hens own a 62-25 record with Malcom in those contests.**

And She's Not Alone

Tiara Malcom is not the only Hen to have posted a double-double this season. Junior forward **Tiffany Young** & senior guard **Tracey Howell** both posted their first career double-doubles this year. Howell and Young have both recorded two double-doubles this year. Young posted double-figures in points and rebounds against W&M (1/9) and VCU (1/18) while Howell tallied her first double-double vs. JMU (2/1). She followed that with a **10 point and 10 rebound effort vs. league-leading ODU on February 20.**

The Defense Gets It Done

Delaware basketball is notorious for its defense. **The Blue Hens have held six teams under 50 points this year and hold a 7-0 mark in those games.** Last year, Delaware held opponents to 53.5 points a game to lead the CAA in scoring defense. The Hens kept teams under 50 points on 13 occasions in 2002-03 to posted a 12-1 record in those contests. This season, the Blue Hens are allowing an average of 56.7 points per game. **In 16 of Delaware's 17 wins, the Hens have kept opponents under 60 points, with their opponents averaging 49.26ppg in the losses.** Delaware has also kept opponents under 50 points seven times this season.

Koshansky Earns CAACo-Rookie of the Week Freshman point guard **Alena Koshansky** was named CAACo-Rookie of the Week this week after scoring double figures in back-to-back conference wins for the Hens. This marks the first time a Delaware player has earned ROW honors since the Blue Hens joined the CAA in 2001. **Against Towson, she poured in a career-high 19 points, including 5-of-9 from the behind the three-point line, one shy of tying the UD record for made threes in a game.** Koshansky has scored in double-figures six times this season -- all conference wins. She netted 13 in the Hens' win over UNC Wilmington on February 22, and notched double -figures in both of the Hens' wins over Hofstra and in the wins against Virginia Commonwealth (1/18), and Drexel (2/26) **Delaware is 6-0 when Koshansky scores in double-figures.**

Home Grown

Freshman guard **Tyresa Smith**, the 2003 Delaware High School Player of the Year, set a new career-high with **15 points against William & Mary on January 9.** Against the Tribe, Smith also had seven steals. She followed that performance by posting eight points, six rebounds, and eight steals to tie the UD program record for steals in a game against Hofstra on January 15. Smith has scored in double-figures in seven games this season, including 12 points in the Hens' overtime win over Drexel on January 25. Against La Salle, she came off the bench to add 10 points, nine rebounds, four steals, three assists, and two blocks.

Spreading the Wealth

Delaware had four of its five starters score in double-figures against Towson on January 29 (Hayes - 15, Young - 15, Malcom -11, Sailer - 11). Delaware has had four or more scorers with double-digit point totals on six occasions this season. Against Virginia Commonwealth on January 18, Delaware had a season-high five players with 10 or more points (Hayes - 12, Young - 12, Malcom - 10, Koshansky - 10, Sailer - 10). It was the first time five Blue Hens had scored in double-figures since a win over Drexel on February 4, 2001.

More on the Delaware "D"

◆ Delaware is tops in the CAA in scoring defense in 2003-04 with an average opponent scoring total of 57.5 ppg. **The Blue Hens also rank 27th in the nation in scoring defense.**

◆ Following two back-to-back double-digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion, the Blue Hen defense made a statement versus Hofstra on January 15, holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal for the first 12 minutes of the contest.

◆ The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware on December 14 is the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. **Delaware held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest half-time scores in all of Division I women's basketball this season.** As of December 20th, only Florida State and Vanderbilt had held teams to fewer points in a half. The Seminoles and the Commodores held Savannah State to three and six points in the first half, respectively.

◆ Delaware's defense allowed Navy only four points in the first 12 minutes of the first half back on December 5. Delaware held the Mids scoreless for the first 2:30 of the game, as it began the game on a 9-2 run.

◆ Against Manhattan, Delaware held the Jaspers to just three points in the final 7:04 of the second half.

◆ The Hens held St. John's to 15 points at the half, which was the lowest opponent half-time score -- before the Loyola win on 12/14 -- since December 8, 2001 when the Blue Hens held Centenary to 14 points in the first half.

◆ UNC Wilmington only scored 14 points in the first half on January 4, which was then the Seahawks' season-low for points in a half.

◆ Delaware held Hofstra to just 17 points in the second half (a UD season-low) on February 15, including holding the Pride scoreless for the final four minutes of the contest.

"Black" is BACK

After battling mono throughout the 2002-03 season, sophomore guard **Amanda Blackstone** has played this season at full speed. Blackstone made her first career start against Hofstra on February 15, and set a career-high in points with 14, including two three-pointers. Prior to earning her starting status, she came off the bench against VCU on February 5 to score 10 points. Despite holding a season average of 4.1 ppg and 2.1 rpg, Blackstone has averaged 8.2 ppg and 3.2 rpg in the last six games for Delaware.

Big Shots

Freshman point guard **Liz Hayes** has been hitting the important shots this year for the Blue Hens. On two occasions (Richmond & Drexel), Hayes has hit a three-pointer at the end of regulation to send the contest to an extra session. **Hayes has also scored in double-figures on seven occasions this season, including a career-high 17 points against St. John's, shooting 6-9 from the field and 3-4 from long-range.** Hayes is averaging 7.0 ppg, fourth-best on the team. She also leads the team in made three-pointers with 29 (29-88, .330 pct.), which puts her 10th in made three-pointers in UD program history. Joining Hayes, classmate **Alena Koshansky** has also made her share of big shots this season. **She is shooting a red-hot .400 pct from behind the three-point line this season, connecting on 22 of her 55 attempts thus far.**

Young in 2003-04

Junior forward **Tiffany Young's** improvement as a player is obvious. After averaging just 1.8 ppg in 02-03, Young has stepped it up 2003-04. Before this season, Young had never scored in double-digits. Now, Young has had two twenty-point performances and two double-doubles with 12 points and a career-high 14 rebounds against William & Mary on January 9 and 12 points and 14 rebounds against Virginia Commonwealth on January 18. As Delaware's second-leading scorer (10.8 ppg), she tallied her first 20 point game against Fairfield in the championship game of the Coca-Cola Classic, earning her a spot on the all-tournament team. Against Manhattan, Young reached the 20 point mark for the second time, surpassing it with 21 points and 11-14 shooting from the foul line.

The DishFactor

In 2001-02 and 2002-03, the Blue Hens recorded a 27-1 record when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent. The Hens are now 7-1 when they win the assist battle in 2003-04.

Hitting the Freebies

The Blue Hens are shooting **70.4 percent** from the foul line this season, ranking second in the CAA. **Liz Hayes, Julie Sailer, Tiffany Young, and Tiara Malcom** are all shooting over 75% from the charity stripe. Malcom, Sailer, and Young rank in the top 10 in the league in free throw percentage. Delaware has connected on 490 of 696 attempts and averages over 18 points from the foul line per game. Delaware has not shot lower than 57.7 percent from the foul line (vs. JMU on 2/12) this season. The solid shooting is no surprise as Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage in 2002-03 with 73.4%.

There's No Place Like Home

Having four home-losses in a season is somewhat of an anomaly for the Blue Hens. The last time the Hens lost four games at home in the same season dates back to the 1998-99 when they were still in the America East Conference. Despite its four losses this season at home, Delaware's home record is nothing to scoff at. **Since the 1999-00 season, the Blue Hens are 54-7 at the Bob Carpenter Center.** To put that into perspective, Delaware has won over 88% of its home contests over the last four years and over 72% of its home games in the past seven years.

Delaware Basketball Tradition

Over the past four years, the Delaware women's basketball team has recorded **four consecutive 20-win seasons** (21-8 in 1999-00, 26-5 in 2000-01, 23-7 2001-02, & 22-9 in 2002-03). Delaware has amassed 108 wins in the last five years, ranking 32nd among all Division I women's basketball programs for wins (entering the 2003-04 season). In addition to the numerical success, the Blue Hens have advanced to three consecutive post season tournaments, appearing in the NCAA Regionals in 2001 and in the WNIT in 2002 and 2003. The Hens need to win their final regular-season game tonight, and at least two games in the CAA tournament to secure a fifth 20-win season.

A December to Remember

Delaware completed the month of December with a perfect 5-0 record. The Blue Hens made it through the month of November with a 3-1 record, improving on last year's November record of 0-3. In the past two Decembers, Delaware has compiled a perfect 10-0 mark.

It's My Party

Freshman **Alena Koshansky's** 19th birthday has the potential to be extra sweet. If the Hens advanced to the conference finals, Delaware could vie for the conference championship on Koshansky's 19th birthday (3/13). **Geneva Livingston (1/1), Arek Deng (1/13), and Tiara Malcom (1/24)** also celebrated birthdays this season.

The Leftovers from 2002-03

Even though the numbers below do not seem very promising, the Blue Hens are used to picking up scoring slack when teammates have left the nest. In the last three seasons, Delaware has lost five 1,000 point scorers. Also, going into the 2002-03 season, the squad had lost over thirty percent of their scoring from 2001-02 and still managed to finish 22-9.

The former standout point guard returns to Delaware this year in a new capacity--assistant coach. Timmins, who earned her bachelor's degree in health and exercise sciences from Delaware in December, averaged 6.4 points last season and ranked among the CAA leaders in assists (91) and steals (28). She also played in 111 games as a Blue Hen (8th all-time). Timmins also joins another fellow Delaware grad and standout player turned assistant coach, **Tyrone Perry**. Perry, in his fifth year coaching at UD, was an assistant with the men's team for two years and is now entering his third season with the women's basketball team.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children, and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, **Ajou**, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, **Luol**, a freshman at Duke, is considered one of the nation's best rookies -- if not the best -- in the class of 2003-04. Also, her cousin, **Gai**, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team.

◆ *Up and Coming* ◆

◆ Junior **Tiara Malcom** is just 4 points away from becoming the 19th player in Delaware history to score 1,000 points. Malcom, who has scored 996 points in her career, holds a career average of 11.4 ppg.

◆ After hitting a three in the Drexel game on Thursday, February 26, freshman **Liz Hayes** broke the Delaware freshman record for made threes in a season (29). Megan Dellegrotti ('02) hit 28 three-pointers in her rookie season in 1998-99.

◆ Junior **Tiara Malcom** and senior **Tracey Howell** are both climbing the all-time blocked shot leaderboard at Delaware. Malcom ranks sixth with 80 career-blocks while Howell ranks ninth with 60 to her name.

◆ Senior **Tracey Howell** is one of two players to start all 26 games for the Hens in 2003-04 (Tiara Malcom is the other). She has played in 111 games in her career which places her tied for eighth in all-time games played in Delaware women's basketball history.



Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Three out of four members of the coaching staff have a twin connection in their family. Head coach **Tina Martin** and associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin while Radice has a fraternal twin sister. Assistant coach **Tyrone Perry** also has twin fraternal siblings.

Transfer Tales--Part I, II & III

This year's squad carries three players with unique playing backgrounds in redshirt sophomore **Arek Deng**, junior **Kristy Gaines** and red-shirt junior **Geneva Livingston**.

◆ Deng, native of Sudan, is eligible this year after transferring from Maryland. As a Terp, Deng appeared in four games in 2001-02, before a broken ankle ended her season.

◆ Gaines also has a Maryland background in her collegiate career. Gaines' story is that of a journey-man. A native of Newman, GA, Gaines began her career at Southern Mississippi in 2000-01 before transferring to Maryland and taking a redshirt year. Gaines, who never saw action at Maryland, then transferred to Hagerstown (MD) Junior College and averaged 16.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season.

◆ Livingston comes to Delaware from the University of New Hampshire where she averaged 10.4 ppg as the team's No. 2 scorer. She will sit out the 2003-04 season per NCAA transfer regulations.
