## ♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. NAVY

**All-Time Series Record:** Ninth meeting between two teams with series tied at four games apiece. The Hens are 3-0 when facing Navy at home. (See opponent section in media guide for more details.)

**Last meeting between Delaware and Navy:** The Blue Hens and Mids haven't met since December 7, 1998 when Delaware, trailing at the half 35-30, opened the second half with a 7-0 run to take a two point lead, 37-35. Despite four lead changes in the second half, Delaware held Navy to 30 percent shooting from the field in the second half and pulled away for a 74-67 victory at the Bob Carpenter Center.

**Last time out for the BlueHens:** Four players scored in double figures as Delaware won its fourth straight game, 69-47, over La Salle on Wednesday evening at the Bob Carpenter Center.

**Last time out for the Mids:** Navy pulled away from a two point half-time lead to snap a three-game losing streak by defeating UMBC, 60-41, on Wednesday evening at Alumni Hall.

## ♦ MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME: ♦



NEWARK, DE (Dec. 3) ~ The University of Delaware placed four scorers in doubles figures and rolled to its fourth straight victory with a wire-to-wire 69-47 non-league women's basketball win over La Salle Wednesday night at the Bob Carpenter Center...The Hens (4-1), who got a game-high 15 points from guard Julie Sailer, 12 points and seven rebounds from forward Tiffany Young, and 10 each from freshmen guards Liz Hayes and Tyresa Smith, defeated LaSalle for just the fourth time in 19 all-time meetings. Tracey Howell pulled a game-high 11 rebounds for the Hens, who have won 19 of their last 20 non-league home games...Smith, the 2003 Delaware high school Player of the Year at Polytech High School, came off the bench to score her career-high in just 21 minutes of action while also adding nine rebounds, three assists, and four steals...La Salle (3-2) had a two-game win streak snapped as the Explorers shot just 25.8 percent from the field for the game (16 of 62), including just 4 of 19 from the three-point line. Jill Marano led La Salle with 14 points while Crista Ricketts added 10 points and nine rebounds. (See box score and game summary for more.)

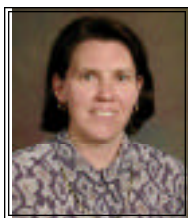

## **◆ MORE ON TONIGHT'S MATCH-UP ◆**

- ◆ Delaware owns a 3-0 record when hosting Navy at the Bob Carpenter Center including the last meeting between the teams in 1998, when the Hens pulled off a 74-67 victory at home.
- ◆ Both teams are coming off wins entering tonight's contest. The Blue Hens are riding a four game winning streak with their most recent win coming over La Salle, 69-47, on Wednesday while the Mids snapped a three-game losing streak by defeating UMBC, 60-41, on Wednesday.
- ◆ Delaware's 4-1 record through five games marks its best five game stretch to open a season since 1992-93 when the Hens opened their season 5-0.
- ◆ Navy is led by senior guard Courtney Davidson's 15.6 points per game. Davidson, a native of New Oxford, PA, played high school basketball with Delaware's newest assistant coach, Carrie Timmins (Delaware '04).

### **Tina Martin, Head Coach**

Eighth season at University of Delaware...compiled a 126-81 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program becoming, the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to four straight 20 win seasons and three consecutive post season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State

Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

**Hard Work Pays Off**

All the off-season preparation junior Tiffany Young put in is now finally paying off. After playing a reserve role in 2002-03, Young has stepped up to the challenge in 2003-04. The Fairfax, VA native has started all five games and averages 13.0 ppg, 7.0 rbg and 1.4 steals per game. Delaware's second-leading scorer, she set consecutive career-highs in points, tallying 11 against Richmond and then 13 against Stony Brook. She then surpassed that mark with her 20 points against Fairfield in the championship game of the Coca-Cola Classic. Her performance earned her a spot on the all-tournament team at the Coca-Classic. She also set a career-high in rebounds against Richmond with eight.

**Getting it Done on Defense**

Delaware basketball is notorious for tough, hard-nosed play -- especially on defense. Delaware has held two teams under 50 points this season. Last year, Delaware held opponents to 53.5 points a game to lead the CAA in scoring defense. The Hens kept teams under 50 points on 13 occasions and owned an 11-1 record when keeping teams under the half-century mark in 2002-03. The Blue Hens are allowing an average of 56.6 points per game--a number that is slightly inflated by the 80 points that Richmond racked up against the Blue Hens. In their past four wins, Delaware has allowed a mere 50.8 points per contest.

**Home Grown**

Freshman guard Tyresa Smith, the 2003 Delaware high school Player of the Year, had a break out game against LaSalle coming off the bench to net new career highs in five categories -- points (10), rebounds (9), steals (4), assists (3) and blocks (2). A product of Dover, DE's Polytech, Smith is averaging 4.2 points per game and 2.4 rebounds per game.

**Is It December Yet?**

Yes, it's the final month of 2003 and the Hens have carried over the winning streak they began in November to December. The Blue Hens are made it through the month of November with a 3-1 record, improving on last year's November record of 0-3, and opened December 1-0. Traditionally, the Hens are more successful in December. After opening their season last year with three straight loses in November, the Hens went 5-0 through December. Over the past five years, the Hens are 24-5 in the month of December.

**There's No Place Like Home**

Despite ending a eight-game home winning streak to Richmond, the Blue Hens' home record is nothing to scoff at. Over the past four years the Blue Hens are 47-4 at the Bob Carpenter Center. To put that into perspective, Delaware has won 92% of its home contests over the last four years and over 75% of its home games in the past seven years.

**Don't Be A Ball Hog**

Passing the rock is a necessity in basketball and to the Blue Hens, each assist has an extra significance. In 2001-02, the Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. Last season, Delaware was 11-1 when it won the assist battle and 11-8 when it did not. The Hens out-dished an opponent for the first time this season in their win over La Salle holding a 11-7 edge.

**Hitting the Freebies**

Delaware is shooting 73.5 percent from the foul line this season and Tiffany Young and Amanda Blackstone are both shooting over 80% from the charity stripe. Delaware has connected on 108 of 147 attempts while its opponents have shot just 59.8 percent (52 of 87) from the line. Delaware averages over 21 points from the foul line per game. The solid shooting is no surprise as Delaware led the CAA in free throw percentage in 2002-03 with 73.4%. Sailer shot 82.% from the line, good for third overall in the conference while Malcom connected on 81.1% of her foul shot attempts, placing her fourth. Delaware also led the CAA in this category in 2001-02.

**More Bench Impact**

Sophomore guard Amanda Blackstone once again provided the Blue Hens with a boost of the bench as she tied her career-high six points, set against Stony Brook, and set a new career-high with four rebounds in the Hens' 69-47 win over the LaSalle. On November 25, Blackstone played 11 minutes--all in the second-half--scoring six points and grabbing three rebounds against Stony Brook.

**Keeping the Tradition Alive**

Over the past four years, the Delaware women's basketball team has recorded four consecutive 20-win seasons (21-8 in 1999-00, 26-5 in 2000-01, 23-7 2001-02, & 22-9 in 2002-03). Delaware has amassed 108 wins in the last five years, ranking 32nd among all Division I women's basketball programs for wins. In addition to the numerical success, the Blue Hens have advanced to three consecutive post season tournaments, appearing in the NCAA Regionals in 2001 and in the WNIT in 2002 and 2003.

**Seeing Double**

Junior forward and tri-captain **Tiara Malcom** tallied her first “double-double” of 2003-04 season with 14 points and 11 rebounds in the championship game of Coca-Cola Classic against host Fairfield. Malcom recorded seven “double-doubles” in 2002-03, including a 15 point, 16 rebound (career-high) outing against James Madison on January 30, 2003. A first-team pick in the pre-season CAAmedia poll, Malcom leads the Hens in scoring this year with 15.2 points per game while also averaging 6.2 rebounds.

**First Time for Everything**

**Liz Hayes'** debut as the Blue Hens' point guard againstRichmond marked the first time a freshman has started in that position since Megan Dellegrotti ('02) made her collegiate debut in 1998. Hayes is averaging 8.8 points per contest, fourth-best on the team. She also leads the team in made three-pointers, with nine (9-24 total), including the game-tying three to send the Hens into overtime againstRichmond on November 21.

**It Runs in the Family**

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children, and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, a freshman at Duke, is considered one of the nation's best rookies--if not the best in the class of 2003-04. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6'9" center, averaged 12.9 points per game and finished fourth in the nation for blocked shots with 3.8 per game last year.

**Transfer Tales--Part I, II & III**

This years' squad carries three players with unique playing backgrounds in redshirt sophomore **Arek Deng**, junior **Kristy Gaines** and red-shirt junior **Geneva Livingston**.

◆Deng, native of Sudan, is eligible this year after transferring from Maryland. At Maryland, Deng appeared in four games in 2001-02 before a broken ankle ended her season.

◆Gaines also has a Maryland background in her collegiate career. Gaines' story is a journey-man-type A native of Newman, GA, Gaines began her career at Southern Mississippi in 2000-01 before transferring to Maryland and taking a redshirt year. Gaines, who never saw action at Maryland, then transferred to Hagerstown (MD) Junior College and averaged 16.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season.

◆Livingston comes to Delaware from the University of New Hampshire where she averaged 10.4 ppg as the team's No. 2 scorer. She will sit out the 2003-04 season

per NCAAtransfer regulations.

Even though the numbers below do not seem very promising, the Blue Hens are used to picking up scoring slack when teammates have left the nest. In the last three seasons, Delaware has lost five 1,000 point scorers. Also, going into the 2002-03 season, the squad had lost over thirty percent of their scoring from 2001-02 and still managed to finish 22-9.
