Game Summary: Richmond broke away from a three-point halftime lead by outscoring Delaware 23-2 to open the second half to spoil the Blue Hens' season opener in non-league play. Richmond forward Ebony Tanner tallied 19 points and 12 rebounds while guard Kate Flavin added 15 points and 11 rebounds. Delaware was hurt by 26 turnovers and 34 percent shooting from the field. Julie Sailer led the Hens in scoring with 15 points, all of which came in the first half.

◆MORE ON TODAY'S MATCH-UP◆

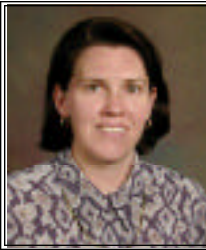
◆ Tonight's season opener for both the Spiders and the Hens marks the second straight year the teams have met to open their seasons. Last season, Richmond downed Delaware 65-47 in Richmond, VA.

◆ Including last year's loss to Richmond, the Hens are 4-3 in season opening games under head coach **Tina Martin**. However, Delaware is 3-0 when opening their season at home under Martin.

◆ Both teams appeared in the 2003 Women's National Invitation Tournament. Richmond saw post season action for the first time in over ten years and won its first-ever post season contest defeating Georgetown, 79-65, in WNIT first round before losing to Auburn, 59-53, in the quarterfinals. The Hens saw action in their second consecutive WNIT, falling to Saint Joseph's in the first round, 65-47.

◆ Delaware has won 18 straight non-league home games dating back to 1996.

◆IN DELAWARE'S CORNER◆



Tina Martin, Head Coach

Eighth season at University of Delaware...compiled a 123-80 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program becoming, the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to four straight 20 win seasons and three consecutive post season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at

Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

◆LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE◆

Delaware 60, Turkish National Team 56 ♦Exhibition Game ♦November 4, 2003

NEWARK, DE ~ Junior guard **Julie Sailer** scored a game-high 19 points and iced the game with two free throws with three seconds left as the University of Delaware women's basketball team opened its exhibition season with a 60-56 victory over the Turkish National Team at the Bob Carpenter Center....Sailer, the 2002 Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year and one of three returning starters from last year's squad that went 22-9, shared the Colonial Athletic Association regular season title with Old Dominion and fell to the Monarchs in the league championship game, hit on 6 of 11 shots from the field, connected on 6 of 9 free throws, and also dished out a team-high three assists as the Hens rallied from an early deficit to post the victory...Sailer was the only Blue Hen player in double figures but **Tiara Malcom** added eight points and 10 rebounds and **Tracey Howell** chipped in with seven points and 10 boards...Delaware held a 35-29 rebounding advantage and took advantage of 24 turnovers and 29 personal fouls by the Turkish team...The Turkish National team was led by forward **Saziye Ivegin**, who scored 18 points and nailed four three-pointers, including one with 1:23 left to play that tied the score at 53-53...After trailing by as many as 12 points in the first half, Delaware rallied and pulled to within 27-26 at halftime as they scored the final six points of the stanza....The Hens regained the lead at 32-31 on a layup by **Tiffany Young** just three minutes into the second half and held the lead until the final minutes...The Turkish team pulled close several times during the second half, cutting the lead to just one point twice at 37-36 with 13:01 left and at 40-39 with 10:47 remaining. Delaware moved the lead back up to eight points at 51-43 with 3:57 remaining, but again Turkey climbed back as Ivegin hit a three-pointer with 2:19 left to cut the lead to 53-50 and another one 1:06 later to tie the game. But Delaware took over from there as **Kristy Gaines** hit a jumper and freshman **Liz Hayes** hit a big three-pointer with 18 seconds left for a 58-53 lead. Turkey's **Arzue Ozyigit** converted a conventional three-pointer, hitting a layup and following with a free throw, with six seconds left to cut the lead again to 58-56. But Sailer followed with two free throws seconds later to ice the win. (Box score attached.)

Keeping the Tradition Alive

Over the past four years the Delaware women's basketball has recorded four consecutive 20-win seasons (21-8 in 1999-00, 26-5 in 2000-01, 23-7 2001-02, & 22-9 in 2002-03). Delaware has amassed 108 wins in the last five years, ranking 32nd among all Division I women's basketball programs for wins. In addition to the numerical success, the Blue Hens have advanced to three consecutive post season tournaments, appearing in the NCAA Regionals in 2001 and in the WNIT in 2002 and 2003. Head coach Tina Martin looks to continue this trend in 2003-04.

Getting it Done on Defense

Delaware basketball is notorious for tough, hard-nosed play--especially on defense. Last year, Delaware held opponents to 53.5 points a game to lead the CAA in scoring defense. The Hens kept teams under 50 points on 13 occasions and owned an 11-1 record when keeping teams under the half-century mark in 2002-03.

Out for the Year

Sophomore Jackie Gordon is out for the season after suffering a knee injury in the pre-season. Gordon, who joined the team as a sophomore, has already had two knee surgeries and underwent her third knee procedure on Thursday, November 20.

Hitting the Freebies

Delaware led the league in free throw percentage, shooting 73.4% from the charity stripe. Juniors Julie Sailer and Tiara Malcom ranked third and fourth, respectively, in free throw percentage. Sailer shot 82.% from the line, while Malcom connected on 81.1% of her foul shot attempts. Delaware also led the CAA in free throw percentage in 2001-02.

Up and Coming

After several seasons of solid play, senior Tracey Howell and juniors Tiara Malcom and Julie Sailer are beginning to see their names climbing up the career statistical leader-boards at Delaware.

◆Malcom ranks in the top 15 in career blocks with 39, needing just three more to break into the top 10. Howell ranks 16th career blocked shots (37).

◆Sailer ranks 31st in career scoring with 605 points while Malcom stands just behind Sailer in 33rd with 586 points

◆After nabbing 14 rebounds in the Blue Hens season finale versus Saint Joseph's (PA) in the WNIT, Malcom moved into 25th place with 389 career rebounds.

◆Sailer is second in career free throw percentage (84.4), hitting 221 of her 262 attempts, and is tied for eighth with 34 made three-point field goals in her career. Malcom is also among the top 10 free throw shooters in Delaware basketball history ranking eighth with 77.0 percent shooting.

Seeing Double

Junior forward and tri-captain Tiara Malcom recorded seven double-doubles in 2002-03 including a 15 point, 16 point rebound (career-high) outing against James Madison on January 30, 2003. A first-team pick in the pre-season CAA media poll, the Wilmington native led the Blue Hens in rebounds per game (7.6) ranking sixth in the conference last season. Malcom also tallied 13.8 points per game as the team's second leading scorer.

Transfer Tales--Part I, II & III

This years' squad carries three players with unique playing backgrounds in redshirt sophomore **Arek Deng**, junior **Kristy Gaines** and redshirting junior **Geneva Livingston**.

- ◆Deng, native of Sudan who went to school in England, sat out the 2002-03 season and is eligible this year after transferring from Maryland. At Maryland, Deng appeared in four games in 01-02 before a broken ankle ended her season.
- ◆Gaines also has a Maryland background in her collegiate career. Gaines' story is a journey-man-type A native of Newman, GA, Gaines began her career at Southern Mississippi in 2000-01 before transferring to Maryland and taking a redshirt year. Gaines, who never saw action at Maryland, then transferred to Hagerstown (MD) Junior College and averaged 16.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season.
- ◆Livingston comes to Delaware from the University of New Hampshire where she averaged 10.4 ppg as the team's No. 2 scorer. She will sit out the 2003-04 season per NCAA transfer regulations.

Homecoming

Who says you can't go home again? Well, Thomas Wolfe did but clearly **Carrie Timmins** wasn't listening. The former standout point guard returns to Delaware this year in a new capacity--assistant coach. Timmins, who will earn her bachelor's degree in health and exercise sciences from Delaware in December, averaged 6.4 points last season and ranked among the CAA leaders in assists (91) and steals (28). Timmins played in 111 games as a Blue Hen (8th all-time) and will bring use that experience to aid in the development of freshmen point guards **Liz Hayes** and **Alena Koshansky**. Timmins also joins another fellow Delaware grad and standout player turned assistant coach, **Tyrone Perry**. Perry, in his fifth year coaching at UD, was an assistant with the men's team for two years and is now entering his third season with the women's basketball team.

A Family Affair

When the Blue Hens travel to Fairfield, CT for the Coca-Cola Classic on November 29-30th, bragging rights could potentially be up for grabs. Delaware plays Brown in the first-round of the Classic and then plays either Massachusetts or Fairfield. If the Fairfield-Delaware match-up takes place, 6'4" center **Arek Deng** will have an extra incentive as her brother, Gai, plays for the Stags' men's basketball team. Gai, a 6'9" center, is a standout at Fairfield, who averaging 12.9 points per game and finished fourth in the nation for blocked shots with 3.8 per game last year.

Arek is one of nine children. Her younger brother, Luol, is a freshman at Duke and considered one of the nation's best rookies--if not the best in the class of 2003-04.

First Time for Everything

When **Liz Hayes** takes the floor as starting point guard, it will be the first time a freshman has started in that position since Megan Dellegrotti ('02) made her collegiate debut on November 16, 1998, scoring 17 points to defeat Lafayette, 80-59, in the Blue Hens' home and season-opener.

Don't Be A Ball Hog

Passing the rock is a necessity in basketball and to the Blue Hens, each assist has an extra significance. In 2001-02, the Blue Hens were a perfect 16-0 when they had more or equal the assist total of their opponent, but just 7-7 when they lost the assist battle. Last season, Delaware was 11-1 when it won the assist battle and 11-8 when it did not.

There's No Place Like Home

The Blue Hens have thrived under **Tina Martin**, especially when playing at home in the Bob Carpenter Center. Currently, Delaware is riding a seven-game winning streak dating back to the Hens' 56-49 loss to UNC Wilmington on January 12, 2003. Over the past seven seasons, the Hens have amassed a 66-20 record at the BCC under Martin. In the last four years, the Hens are 46-3 at home.

Is It December Yet?

Last year, November was not kind to the Blue Hens. However, December was another story. After opening their season last year with three straight loses in November, the Hens when 5-0 through December. Over the past five years, the Hens are 24-5 in the month of December.

Table for Four, Please

At Delaware, four is a lucky number--at least it was last year. In 2002-03, the Blue Hens went undefeated (5-0) when they featured four or more players hitting double-digits in scoring.

It's My Party

Freshman **Alena Koshansky's** 19th birthday has the potential to be extra sweet. If the Hens continue their winning tradition and advance to the conference finals, Delaware could vie for the conference championship on Koshansky's 19th birthday (3/13). **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) will also celebrate birthdays during the season.
