The University of Richmond overcame a ten-point half-time deficit as the Spiders downed host Delaware in its season-opener, 80-78...Richmond was led by sophomore guard Saona Chapman, who scored 11 of her game-high 29 points in overtime, including two big three-pointers...The Blue Hens put four scorers in double figures, led by Tiara Malcom's 24 points and seven rebounds, but had an eight-game home win streak and an 18-game non-league home win streak snapped...The loss was just the fourth in the last 50 home games for the Blue Hens...Richmond forward Kate Flavin scored 18 points and pulled a game-high 14 rebounds for Richmond while Jamell Beasley came off the bench to add 12 points. Julie Sailer scored 16 points in the Delaware effort while freshman Liz Hayes added 12 points in her collegiate debut and senior Tiffany Young added career-highs with 11 points and eight rebounds in her second career start. ◆MORE ON TODAY'S MATCH-UP◆

◆ Delaware goes on the road for the first time this season for its first meeting with the Seawolves. Both Delaware and Stony Brook opened their seasons with home-opening losses. Delaware lost to Richmond, 80-78, in overtime while the Seawolves fell to St. Bonaventure, 74-62.

◆ Delaware, who started its season 0-3 in 2002-03 and still finished atop the CAA with a 22-9 mark, looks to improve on its 0-1 start. Including 2002-03, Delaware has begun 0-2 only seven times (1997-98, 1995-95, 1990-91, 1987-88, 1985-86, 1981-82, 1979-80) in its 32 year program history.

◆ Both of the teams in today's match up feature pre-season all-conference picks in Delaware's Tiara Malcom and Stony Brook's Sherry Jordan. Malcom opened her 2003-04 season with 24 points and seven rebounds while Jordan did not play in the Seawolves's opener.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Eighth season at University of Delaware...compiled a 123-81 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program becoming, the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to four straight 20 win seasons and three consecutive post season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Keeping the Tradition Alive

Over the past four years, the Delaware women's basketball team has recorded **four consecutive 20-win seasons** (21-8 in 1999-00, 26-5 in 2000-01, 23-7 2001-02, & 22-9 in 2002-03). Delaware has amassed 108 wins in the last five years, ranking 32nd among all Division I women's basketball programs for wins. In addition to the numerical success, the Blue Hens have advanced to three consecutive postseason tournaments, appearing in the NCAA Regionals in 2001 and in the WNIT in 2002 and 2003. Head coach **Tina Martin** looks to continue this trend in 2003-04.

There's No Place Like Home

Despite ending a eight-game home winning streak to Richmond, the Blue Hens' home record is nothing to sniff at. Over the past four years the Blue Hens are 46-4 at the Bob Carpenter Center. To put that into perspective, Delaware has won 92% of its home contest over the last four years and over 75% of the home games in the past seven years.

Seeing Double

Junior forward and tri-captain **Tiara Malcom** recorded **seven double-doubles** in 2002-03 including a 15 point, 16 rebound (career-high) outing against James Madison on January 30, 2003. A first-team pick in the pre-season CAA media poll, the Wilmington native led the Blue Hens in rebounds per game (7.6), ranking sixth in the conference last season. Malcom also tallied 13.8 points per game as the team's second leading scorer.

First Time for Everything

Liz Hayes' debut as the Blue Hens' point guard against Richmond marked the first time a freshman has started in that position since Megan Dellegrotti ('02) made her collegiate debut in 1998. Hayes scored 12 points, including the game-tying three to send the contest to overtime.

Is It December Yet?

November is not always a kind month to the Blue Hens. With the loss to Richmond, Delaware opened its season 0-1 for the fourth straight season. However, December is often another story. After opening their season last year with three straight loses in November, the Hens went 5-0 through December. Over the past five years, the Hens are 24-5 in the month of December.

Getting it Done on Defense

Delaware basketball is notorious for tough, hard-nosed play--especially on defense. **Last year, Delaware held opponents to 53.5 points a game to lead the CAA in scoring defense.** The Hens kept teams under 50 points on 13 occasions and owned an 11-1 record when keeping teams under the half-century mark in 2002-03. The 80 points that Richmond racked up against the Blue Hens were the most Delaware has allowed since January 11, 2002 when then-ranked #25 Old Dominion defeated the Hens, 82-55.

Hitting the Freebies

Delaware led the league in free throw percentage, shooting 73.4% from the charity stripe in 2002-03. Juniors **Julie Sailer** and **Tiara Malcom** ranked third and fourth, respectively, in free throw percentage. Sailer shot 82.% from the line while Malcom connected on 81.1% of her foul shot attempts. Delaware also led the CAA in free throw percentage in 2001-02. After missing her first foul shot attempt, Sailer connected on five straight to shoot 83% on the evening against Richmond.

The Leftovers from 2002-03

Even though the numbers below do not seem very promising, the Blue Hens are used to picking up scoring slack when teammates have left the nest. In the last three seasons, Delaware has lost five 1,000 point scorers. Also, going into the 2002-03 season, the squad had lost over thirty percent of their scoring from 2001-02 and still managed to finish 22-9.

Up and Coming

After several seasons of solid play, senior Tracey Howell and juniors Tiara Malcom and Julie Sailer are beginning to see their names climbing up the career statistical leader-boards at Delaware.

- ◆Malcom ranks in the top 15 in career blocks with 40, needing just two more to break into the top 10. Howell also ranks in the top 15 with 39 blocked shots (39).
- ◆Sailer ranks 31st in career scoring with 621 points while Malcom stands just behind Sailer in 32nd place with 610 points.
- ◆Malcom continues to climb the all-time rebounding leader board. With seven rebounds against Richmond, Malcom moved into 24th place with 406 career rebounds.
- ◆Sailer is second in career free throw percentage (84.3), hitting 226 of her 268 attempts, and is seventh in made three-point field goals with 35 in her career. Malcom is also among the top 10 free throw shooters in Delaware basketball history, shooting over 75% from the charity stripe.

Transfer Tales--Part I, II & III

This years' squad carries three players with unique playing backgrounds in redshirt sophomore **Arek Deng**, junior **Kristy Gaines** and redshirt junior **Geneva Livingston**.

- ◆Deng, native of Sudan, is eligible this year after transferring from Maryland. At Maryland, Deng appeared in four games in 2001-02 before a broken ankle ended her season.
- ◆Gaines also has a Maryland background in her collegiate career. Gaines' story is a journey-man-type A native of Newman, GA, Gaines began her career at Southern Mississippi in 2000-01 before transferring to Maryland and taking a redshirt year. Gaines, who never saw action at Maryland, then transferred to Hagerstown (MD) Junior College and averaged 16.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season.
- ◆Livingston comes to Delaware from the University of New Hampshire where she averaged 10.4 ppg as the team's No. 2 scorer. She will sit out the 2003-04 season per NCAA transfer regulations.

Homecoming

Who says you can't go home again? Well, Thomas Wolfe did, but clearly **Carrie Timmins** wasn't listening. The former standout point guard returns to Delaware this year in a new capacity--assistant coach. Timmins, who will earn her bachelor's degree in health and exercise sciences from Delaware in December, averaged 6.4 points last season and ranked among the CAA leaders in assists (91) and steals (28). Timmins played in 111 games as a Blue Hen (8th all-time) and will use that experience to aid in the development of freshmen point guards **Liz Hayes** and **Alena Koshansky**. Timmins also joins another fellow Delaware grad and standout player turned assistant coach, **Tyrone Perry**. Perry, in his fifth year coaching at UD, was an assistant with the men's team for two years and is now entering his third season with the women's basketball team.

A Family Affair

When the Blue Hens travel to Fairfield, CT for the Coca-Cola Classic on November 29-30th, bragging rights could potentially be up for grabs. Delaware plays Brown in the first-round of the Classic and then plays either Massachusetts or Fairfield. If the Fairfield-Delaware match-up takes place, 6'4" center **Arek Deng** will have an extra incentive as her brother, Gai, plays for the Stags' men's basketball team. Gai, a 6'9" center, is a standout at Fairfield, who averaged 12.9 points per game and finished fourth in the nation for blocked shots with 3.8 per game last year.

Arek is one of nine children. Her younger brother, Luol, a freshman at Duke, is considered one of the nation's best rookies--if not the best in the class of 2003-04.

Don't Be A Ball Hog

Passing the rock is a necessity in basketball and to the Blue Hens, each assist has an extra significance.
