## ♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. GEORGE MASON:

**All-Time Series Record:** George Mason holds a 9-5 advantage in the all-time series between these two squads. The Patriots had won two in a row before Delaware claimed the regular season finale between these two squads in Newark last year.

**Last time the Blue Hens and Patriots met:** These two teams last met in the regular season finale for both squads last year. Delaware claimed victory by a score of 67-58 and was led by Tyresa Smith's 16 points. Also in that game for the Hens, Tiffany Young contributed 12 points and eight boards while Tiara Malcom had 12 and Liz Hayes scored 11 points. For the Patriots, Vernessa Neamo led the way with 14 points and eight boards and Jen Derevjanik scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds.

**Last time out for the BlueHens:** Delaware used a strong second half to win its ninth game in a row, defeating UNC Wilmington 56-40. Tiara Malcom recorded her second double-double of the season and 15th of her career with 23 points and 11 boards. Malcom also recorded a season-high four blocks. Tiffany Young came off the bench to provide the Hens with 14 points and nine boards.

**Last time out for the Patriots:** George Mason needed overtime to hold off James Madison as the Patriots won by a score of 50-48. Julie Flanders recorded her fourth career double-double with 11 points and 12 boards while Jen Daniels pulled down 10 rebounds.

## ♦ MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME: ♦



**NEWARK, DE (Jan. 14)** - Tiara Malcom posted her 15th career double-double with 23 points and a season-high 11 rebounds as Delaware broke away from a one-point half-time lead...Delaware (11-2, 4-0 CAA) won its ninth straight game but needed a big second half effort...the Hens outscored UNC Wilmington 34-19 in the second stanza and held the Seahawks (4-9, 1-3 CAA) to 20.7 percent (6 of 29) shooting for the half...Malcom also blocked four shots in leading Delaware to its eighth straight win at home...Tiffany Young came off the bench to add 14 points and nine rebounds while freshman guard Melissa Czorniewy scored a career-high nine points...UNC Wilmington which lost its third straight game, was led by forward Meagan Samis with team-highs of 13 points and seven rebounds...the Seahawks shot just 29.6 percent (16 of 54) from the field for the game and missed on all 14 three point attempts...the Seahawks led by as much as seven points in the first half but Delaware rallied and took a 22-21 lead at the break...the Hens scored the first five points of the second half to go up 27-21 and held the Seahawks to just five points in the first 10 minutes of the stanza...Hens led 37-26 with 10:21 left but UNCW cut the lead back to seven at 37-30 with 9:01 remaining...but the Hens came back with a decisive 13-3 run to put the game away as Young scored six of her points in that span and Delaware upped the lead to 50-33 with 3:49 remaining.

## ◆ MORE ON THE MATCH-UP ◆

◆ Delaware and George Mason are leading the CAA in the three point field goal percentage category. George Mason is hitting .318 percent of its shots while Delaware is hitting .311 percent.

◆ George Mason is first in the CAA in turnover margin forcing its opponents to turn the ball over 4.08 more times per game. Delaware is a close second in that category forcing its opponents to turn the ball over 4.00 more times per game.

◆ The Blue Hens' Tiara Malcom is third in the CAA in scoring, averaging 16.3 points per game. George Mason's Julie Flanders is second in the CAA in rebounding, grabbing 9.5 rebounds per game.

### **Tina Martin, Head Coach**

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

**Records Watch**

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks seventh with 1,248 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 199 points to break into the top five. Malcom needs 15 more rebounds to move into the top 10 for career rebounding. Malcom has recorded 15 double-doubles in her career ( UD is 11-4 in those games). Malcom is also closing in on the record for most games played in a career, which is 117. If the current streak holds out Malcom would tie the record during the last game of the regular season at James Madison and would break the record for most games played in a career in the first game of the CAA Tournament. Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 99 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** reached 150 career wins with the victory over VCU on Sunday.

**60 Below**

The Blue Hens are riding a nine game win streak and one of the keys to that success is their stifling defense. The Hens have kept seven out of their nine opponents during this stretch under 60 points for the game. In fact, the 70 points allowed to Old Dominion marked the first time this year, the Hens had surrendered 70 points in a game. Even more impressive, they are forcing their opponents to turn the ball over an average of 19.9 times per game during the streak.

**Three Times and Counting**

Senior **Tiara Malcom** was named the CAA Women's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on January 10. Malcom received that honor for the third straight week. Malcom earned Player of the Week honors just once last year after the Hens overtime win at Drexel.

**There's No Place Like Home**

For the Blue Hen women's basketball team there truly is no place like home. The Hens are 5-0 at home this season and currently have a eight game win streak at the Bob Carpenter Center dating back to last season. The last time the Blue Hens lost a game at home was February 12, 2004 as the Hens fell to James Madison. Over the last three years, Delaware is 25-5 on its home floor.

**Sophomore Studs**

Sophomores **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** have been a large part of the Blue Hens success early on this season. Smith is

the second leading scorer on the team with 11.2 ppg and 4.6 rpg. Smith has also dished out a team leading 41 assists, 6 blocks, and 48 steals. Smith established a new career high in points and rebounds with her double-double vs. Stony Brook (18 pts and 10 boards). She scored in double figures in six straight games and was named to the All-Tournament Team at Lehigh. Smith's 46 steals rank her seventh in the nation at 3.8 steals per game. Koshansky has been deadly both from three point range (18 of 44) and from the foul line (35 of 40). Koshansky's four three pointers vs. Georgetown were just one shy of her career best. Koshansky also had a career-high seven assists vs. Old Dominion. The pair also ranks first and seventh in the CAA in assist to turnover ratio. Koshansky is at 1.67 while Smith's ratio is 1.11.

**Seniors Stand Tall**

It was the backcourt tandem of **Tiara Malcom** and **Tiffany Young** which led the Blue Hens to the 69-59 win over UNC Greensboro at the Arizona Tournament. Both seniors scored 17 points in the game with Malcom doing her damage from the foul line going 9-for-10 while Young led the way on the boards with eight. Malcom and Young teamed up again to lead the Hens to the victory over Lehigh. Malcom followed up her 21 points vs. Alabama with 14 points and a career high six assists vs. Lehigh. Young came off the bench to record the double-double with 12 points and 10 boards. Once again, it was the senior duo of Young and Malcom that helped the Blue Hens gain the victory over Drexel. Young recorded her second double-double of the year with 18 points and 11 boards while Malcom chipped in 15 points.

**If it's Free, I'll make it**

Last year the Blue Hens shot 70% from the charity stripe. In the season opener, the Hens picked up where they left off, shooting 86% from the free throw line. The Blue Hens have four players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage as they are currently shooting 70.9% from the line. **Alena Koshansky** is shooting .875 from the line while **Tiara Malcom** is shooting .763, **Julie Sailer** is shooting .712 and **Tiffany Young** rounds out that group by shooting .768 from the line.

**Reaching for the Top**

Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

**Topping the MAAC**

The Blue Hens improved to 5-0 in the last two seasons vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with their win over Fairfield. Last year the Blue Hens registered a perfect 3-0 mark against the MAAC. This year Delaware has registered a 63-49 win over Loyola (MD) and the 76-54 victory over Fairfield.

**The Maryland Connection**

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

**Impressive Resume**

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist. **Courtney Irving** was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

**Picking Up Where She Left Off**

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 16.3 ppg and 6.9 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in all of the games this season but the one against VCU. Malcom recorded the double-double vs. La Salle with 24 points and 10 rebounds and another one vs. UNCW with 23 points and 11 boards. She has played in 103 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 75-28 mark with Malcom in those contests.

**It Runs in the Family**

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 12.9 points per game in 33 NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 13.4 points per game and 8.6 rebounds per game in 14 games this season for Fairfield.

**December to Remember**

The Blue Hens put a wrap on the month of December by winning the Christmas City Classic at Lehigh. While in the past two seasons Delaware has gone 5-0 in the month of December, this December did not start out so hot, with the Hens falling to Weber State. Delaware showed why it likes the month so much by bouncing back the next day for the win over UNCG. With the win over Lehigh, the Blue Hens completed the month of December with a mark of 5-1 in that month.

**Keep it Below 70**

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8. This year's team has kept twelve of its thirteen opponents under 70 points for a mark of 11-2.

**Night is Alright**

After playing the first two games of the year during the day, the Blue Hens opened the night time part of their schedule with a huge 83-58 win over Stony Brook. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years.

### ***Defense, Defense, and More Defense***

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

### ***Twin Factor***

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

### ***It's My Party***

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday. Koshansky's birthday will fall the day after the CAA Championships March 13. **Melissa Czorniewy** (12/2), **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), **Aminata Dieye** (1/21), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) also have birthdays during the season.
