♦ **SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. GEORGE MASON:**

All-Time Series Record: George Mason holds a 9-6 advantage in the all-time series between these two squads. Delaware has won the last two contests including a 72-56 win on January 16 of this year.

Last time the Blue Hens and Patriots met: Delaware used a strong second half to claim the 72-56 win over George Mason on January 16. In that game, Tyresa Smith scored 19 points and pulled down seven boards while Tiara Malcom chipped in with 17 points and five rebounds. Malcom was 11 for 11 from the foul line in that game. The Patriots were led by Jen Daniels who scored a career-high 26 points in that game.

Last time out for the BlueHens: Delaware used a big effort from senior Tiara Malcom as she recorded a season-high 25 points and Delaware won its 14th straight game defeating James Madison 66-55. Malcom was 11 of 12 from the foul line and pulled down seven rebounds while Alena Koshansky added 11 points and Tiffany Young chipped in 10 off the bench.

Last time out for the Patriots: George Mason dropped its second straight game as the Patriots fell at Drexel by a score of 59-55. In that game George Mason received 14 points from Jen Daniels and a game-high 13 rebounds from Julie Flanders. The Patriots outrebounded Drexel by a 40-34 advantage.

♦ **MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME:** ♦



NEWARK, DE (Jan. 30) – Tiara Malcom scored a season-high 25 points and pulled down a team-high seven rebounds and Delaware held off two second half runs by James Madison for its 14th straight win...the Hens (16-2, 9-0 CAA) share the nation's longest current win streak and also won their 11th straight home game...Alena Koshansky added 11 points, including three three-pointers, and Tiffany Young contributed 10 points...Malcom converted 11 of 12 free throws, upping her career free throw total to 464 to move into third place on the CAA career list...James Madison (11-7, 4-5 CAA) got 14 points from Lesley Dickinson while freshman Tamera Young added 12 points and pulled a career-high 15 rebounds...the Dukes shot just 29.7 from the field (19 of 64) for the game...James Madison posted a 48-37 advantage on the boards and pulled 22 offensive rebounds but couldn't overcome 21 turnovers...Delaware also had its troubles from the field but hit on 29 of 38 free throws and committed just 16 turnovers...led by Malcom's 16 first half points, the Hens took the lead for good in the first five minutes of the game and took a 32-24 advantage into intermission...James Madison gradually got back into the game in the second half, cutting the deficit to three points at 36-33 as Young scored all the points in a 5-0 run and converted a layup with 15:20 left to play...the Dukes trailed by just four points at 39-35 with 13:48 left but went cold from there...Delaware followed with an 11-0 run capped by a jumper by Sailer for a 50-35 lead with 6:50 remaining...James Madison turned the ball over eight times and missed all five of its shots during the run...but the Dukes turned things around quickly, mounting another rally with a 15-3 run to cut the lead to 53-50 with 2:44 remaining capped by a jumper by Dickinson who scored six points during the run...but that was as close as the Dukes would get as the Hens converted 9 of 10 free throws down the stretch to ice the win.

◆ MORE ON THE MATCH-UP ◆

◆ Last time these two squads met, George Mason's Jen Daniels made five three-pointers in the game on 12 attempts. That is the most three-pointers that any player has made against the Blue Hens this year.

◆ Delaware is shooting 74.5% from the foul line this season having made 356 shots out of a possible 478. Those 356 made attempts are 58 more shots than their opponents have even attempted. Delaware opponents are 200 of 298 from the foul line this year.

◆ Delaware leads the CAA in turnover margin followed by George Mason. The Blue Hens have a turnover margin of +4.1 while the Patriots are at +3.2.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks seventh with 1,324 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 123 points to break into the top five. Malcom needs to make nine more free throws to rank second on the CAA all-time list in that category. Malcom has recorded 16 double-doubles in her career (UDis 12-4 in those games). Malcom is also closing in on the record for most games played in a career, which is 117. If the current streak holds out Malcom would tie the record during the last game of the regular season at James Madison and would break the record for most games played in a career in the first game of the CAA Tournament. Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 64 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** reached 150 career wins with the victory over VCU on January 2.

Streaking....

The Blue Hens are in the midst of a 14 game win streak that has seen them land at the top of the CAA standings. The Hens currently are in a tie for the longest win streak with #25 Temple and Gonzaga in Division I women's basketball. Gonzaga takes on St. Mary's (CA) tonight while Temple is off until Sunday.

60 Below

The Blue Hens are riding a 14 game win streak and one of the keys to that success is their stifling defense. The Hens have kept 12 out of their 14 opponents during this stretch under 60 points for the game. In fact, the 70 points allowed to Old Dominion marked the first time this year, the Hens had surrendered 70 points in a game. Even more impressive, they are forcing their opponents to turn the ball over an average of 20.5 times per game during the streak.

There's No Place Like Home

For the Blue Hen women's basketball team there truly is no place like home. The Hens are 8-0 at home this season and currently have a 11 game win streak at the Bob Carpenter Center dating back to last season. The last time the Blue Hens lost a game at home was February 12, 2004 as the Hens fell to James Madison. Over the last three years, Delaware is 27-5 on its home floor.

Top of the Class

Senior **Julie Sailer** and sophomore **Alena Koshansky** have both been nominated for the CoSIDA Academic All-American Team. The CoSIDA Academic All-American Team recognizes athletes for their accomplishments both on and off the court. Sailer was selected to the District 2, second team last year and was a member of the CAA All-Academic team.

Gaining Some Attention

The USA Today/ ESPN/ WBCA Women's Basketball Top 25 Poll was released on Tuesday and the Blue Hens received 19 votes in this week's poll. This marks the third time this season, the Blue Hens have received votes and the second time that the Hens have received multiple votes.

Sophomore Studs

Sophomores **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** have been a large part of the Blue Hens success this season. Smith is the second leading scorer on the team with 11.4 ppg and 4.6 rpg. Smith has also dished out a team leading 55 assists, 7 blocks, and 60 steals. Smith established the first double-double of her career vs. StonyBrook. She scored in double figures in six straight games and was named to the All-Tournament Team at Lehigh. Koshansky has been deadly both from three point range (24 of 57) and from the foul line (45 of 53). Koshansky's four three pointers vs. Georgetown were just one shy of her career best. Koshansky also had a career-high seven assists vs. Old Dominion.

If it's Free, I'll make it

The Blue Hens proved why they are deadly from the foul line in their game against Hofstra. The Hens went 27 of 28 from the foul line in that game and the starters were 16 of 16 in that game. The Hens followed that up by shooting 91% from the line vs. William & Mary. The Blue Hens have four players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage as they are currently shooting 74.5% from the line. **Alena Koshansky** is shooting .849 from the line while **Tiara Malcom** is shooting .829, **Tiffany Young** is shooting .818 from the line, and **Julie Sailer** is shooting .746.

Senior **Tiara Malcom** was named the CAA Women's Basketball Player of the Week on January 17. Malcom received that honor for the fourth straight week. Malcom earned Player of the Week honors just once last year after the Hens overtime win at Drexel.

Reaching for the Top

The Blue Hens were selected second in the CAAPre-season Media Poll while senior forward **Tiara Malcom** was selected the league's Pre-season Player of the Year. Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

Topping the MAAC

The Blue Hens improved to 5-0 in the last two seasons vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with their win over Fairfield. Last year the Blue Hens registered a perfect 3-0 mark against the MAAC. This year Delaware has registered a 63-49 win over Loyola (MD) and the 76-54 victory over Fairfield.

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist.

Courtney Irving was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 16.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in all of the games this season but the one against VCU. Malcom recorded the double-double vs. La Salle with 24 points and 10 rebounds and another one vs. UNCW with 23 points and 11 boards and another one vs. William & Mary with 12 points and 11 boards. She has played in 108 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 80-28 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 12.9 points per game in 36 NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 14.4 points per game and 8.2 rebounds per game in 17 games this season for Fairfield. Gai, also blocked 13 shots in a game vs. Siena, one short of the NCAA Division I record.

Seniors Stand Tall

It was the backcourt tandem of **Tiara Malcom** and **Tiffany Young** which led the Blue Hens to the 69-59 win over UNC Greensboro at the Arizona Tournament. Malcom and Young teamed up again to lead the Hens to the victory over Lehigh. Malcom followed up her 21 points vs. Alabama with 14 points and a career high six assists vs. Lehigh. Young came off the bench to record the double-double with 12 points and 10 boards. Once again, it was the senior duo of Young and Malcom that helped the Blue Hens gain the victory over Drexel. Young recorded her second double-double of the year with 18 points and 11 boards while Malcom chipped in 15 points.

December to Remember

The Blue Hens put a wrap on the month of December by winning the Christmas City Classic at Lehigh. While in the past two seasons Delaware has gone 5-0 in the month of December, this December did not start out so hot, with the Hens falling to Weber State. Delaware showed why it likes the month so much by bouncing back the next day for the win over UNCG. With the win over Lehigh, the Blue Hens completed the month of December with a mark of 5-1 in that month.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8. This year's team has kept 17 of its 18 opponents under 70 points for a mark of 15-2 in those games.

Night is Alright

After playing the first two games of the year during the day, the Blue Hens opened the night time part of their schedule with a huge 83-58 win over Stony Brook. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years. This year's squad is 8-0 at night and 8-2 during the day.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina**

Martin and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday. Koshansky's birthday will fall the day after the CAA Championships March 13. **Melissa Czorniewy** (12/2), **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), **Aminata Dieye** (1/21), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) also have birthdays during the season.
