♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. TEAMS IN THE CHRISTMAS CITY CLASSIC:

All-Time Series Record: Alabama and Delaware will meet for the first time ever in the opening round of the Christmas City Classic at Lehigh University. If the Blue Hens meet Yale in the second day of the tournament, it would be the first time the two teams have ever met. Delaware and Lehigh have met with the Blue Hens hold a 16-10 advantage. If Delaware and Lehigh meet in the second round, it would be the 27 meeting, the Blue Hens won 80-67 in 1994 with Lehigh picking up a victory in 1990 by a score of 63-76.

Last time out for the BlueHens: Delaware's win streak moved to three with a thrilling 68-67 win over La Salle ten days ago. Senior Tiara Malcom provided the Blue Hens with a double-double of 24 points and 10 rebounds. Malcom scored the game winning basket with 4 seconds left, after Delaware trailed the entire second half of the game with the exception of two ties in the half. Tiffany Young had 13 points and eight boards while Tyresa Smith recorded 10 points and seven rebounds.

Last time out for the Crimson Tide: Alabama improved to 7-2 on the season with a 71-62 win over Alabama A&M. In that game, the Crimson Tide placed two players in double figures, Marverly Nettles recorded 23 points on 8 of 15 shooting from the floor and was 6 for 11 from the line. Kate Mastin scored 10 points all from the line as she was 10 for 10 from the charity stripe. On the season Nettles leads the way with 14.9 ppg and 5.8 rpg. Natasha Gamble is averaging 11.2 ppg and the leading rebounder is Dee Merriweather with 6.2 rpg.

PHILADELPHIA, PA(Dec. 19) – Tiara Malcom scored a season-high 24 points and hit the winning basket with just four seconds left to play as Delaware rallied late to win...the Hens(5-2) rallied from five points down in the final minutes as Amanda Blackstone and Alena Koshansky each converted clutch three-pointers and Malcom scored the game-winner...La Salle(4-4) couldn't convert on a desperation shot from halfcourt to end the game...Malcom scored a season-high 24 points and also pulled a team-high 10 rebounds and has now scored in double figures in all seven games this season in 24 of the last 25 since last season...she recorded her first double-double of the season and the 14th of her career and eclipsed 20 points for the 10th time in her career...Tiffany Young added 13 points and eight rebounds off the bench while Tyresa Smith added 10 points, seven boards, and four assists...La Salle got 19 points and nine rebounds from forward Crista Ricketts and 17 points each from forward Monica Garrido-Sanz (10 rebounds) and guard Jill Marano...the Explorer bench accounted for just eight points...Delaware owned sole possession of the lead for just over a minute the entire game, but made it count at the end...La Salle took a 30-26 lead intermission and held the lead the entire second half except for two ties at 37-37 six minutes into the second half and 66-66 with 18 seconds to play...La Salle led by as much as six points several times in the second half and still led by five when Ricketts was fouled while hitting a jumper with 2:31 left to play and added the free throw for a 62-56 advantage...the Blue Hens rallied to win the game, holding the Explorers scoreless the rest of the way...Blackstone knocked down a three-pointer with 1:45 left to cut the lead to 62-59 and Koshansky added another trey just 34 seconds later to cut the margin to 64-62 with 1:11 remaining...the Hens then made it eight straight points when Malcom's jumper in the lane knotted the score at 66-66 with 18 seconds left...the Hens got the ball back with 16 seconds left and got the ball in the hands of Malcom, who scored in the lane for the win.

◆ **Last time out for the Mountain Hawks:** Lehigh defeated Fairleigh Dickinson, 73-69 for its second win in a row. In that game, the Mountainhawks received 26 points from Sara Ellis, 23 points from Jessica DePalo, and the double-double from Jenny Callan with 12 points and 10 boards. On the season, DePalo is averaging 19.9 ppg and Ellis is pouring in 15.4 ppg. Mary Hynoski is the leading rebounder with 5.9 rpg.

◆ **Last time out for the Bulldogs:** Yale picked up its first win of the season over Morgan State, last Monday night by a 79-70 score. In that game, Tory Mauseth led all scorers with 22 points while Chinenye Okafor recorded the double-double with 16 points and 11 boards. For the season, Erica Davis leads the way, averaging 14.3 ppg and 7.3 rpg. Mauseth is averaging 11.0 ppg.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks 12th with 1,153 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 28 points to move into the top 10 and 294 points to break into the top five. Malcom has recorded 14 double-doubles in her career (UD is 10-4 in those games). Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 144 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** needs three wins to reach 150 career wins all-time at Delaware.

Reaching for the Top

The Blue Hens were selected second in the CAAPre-season Media Poll while senior forward **Tiara Malcom** was selected the league's Pre-season Player of the Year. Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

Going Deep

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is making the shots from behind the arc so far this season. Koshansky is 12-23 from three point range so far this season for a percentage of .522. She is first in the CAAin three point field goal percentage and sixth in three point field goals made. Koshansky went 4-for-7 from three point range against Georgetown which was just one shy of her career best from that area.

Sophomore Studs

Sophomores **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** have been a large part of the Blue Hens success early on this season. Smith is the second leading scorer on the team with 10.3 ppg and 4.6 rpg. Smith has also dished

out a team leading 25 assists, 6 blocks, and 22 steals. Smith established a new career high in points and rebounds with her double-double vs. Stony Brook (18 pts and 10 boards). Koshansky has been deadly both from three point range (12 of 23) and from the foul line (21 of 25). Koshansky's four three pointers vs. Georgetown were just one shy of her career best.

Seniors Stand Tall

It was the backcourt tandem of **Tiara Malcom** and **Tiffany Young** which led the Blue Hens to the 69-59 win over UNC Greensboro at the Arizona Tournament. Both seniors scored 17 points in the game with Malcom doing her damage from the foul line going 9-for-10 while Young led the way on the boards with eight.

If it's Free, I'll make it

Last year the Blue Hens shot 70% from the charity stripe. In the season opener, the Hens picked up where they left off, shooting 86% from the free throw line. The Blue Hens have two players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage. **Alena Koshansky** is shooting .840 from the line while **Tiffany Young** is shooting .813 from the line.

Topping the MAAC

The Blue Hens improved to 5-0 in the last two seasons vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with their win over Fairfield. Last year the Blue Hens registered a perfect 3-0 mark against the MAAC. This year Delaware has registered a 63-49 win over Loyola (MD) and the 76-54 victory over Fairfield.

Delaware Basketball Tradition

Delaware women's basketball has recorded six consecutive winning seasons, a seventh would be a program record. The program has recorded 20-win seasons in three of its last four campaigns and has made postseason tournament appearances three times in the last four years.

There's No Place Like Home

Having four home losses in a season is somewhat of an anomaly for the Blue Hens. The last time the Hens lost four games at home in the same season dates back to 1998-99 when they were still in the America East conference. Despite its four losses last season at home, Delaware's home record is nothing to scoff at. Since the 1999-00 season, the Blue Hens are 55-7 at the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware has won over 88% of its home contests over the last four years (42-6) and over 72% in the last seven years (70-15).

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Black is Golden for the Hens

Amanda Blackstone has made her impact felt this season for the Blue Hens. In the first game against Loyola (MD), Blackstone scored six points and grabbed two rebounds. Against Georgetown, Blackstone provided a spark off the bench, pouring in 14 points and pulling down nine boards. She tied for the team lead in both of those categories on Saturday and her 14 points were just three shy of her career-best. Blackstone grabbed a career high 10 rebounds vs. Weber State.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist. **Courtney Irving** was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 16.7 ppg and 7.1 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in all of the games this season. Malcom recorded her first double-double of the season vs. La Salle with 24 points and 10 rebounds. Malcom was named the CAACo-

Player of the Week for Women's Basketball for her efforts vs. La Salle. Malcom's double-double was the 14th of her career and the Blue Hens have a record of 10-4 in games where she records a double-double. She has played in 97 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 69-28 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 13.4 points per game in 23 NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 13.1 points per game and 8.9 rebounds per game in nine games this season for Fairfield.

Will it be a December to Remember?

Finally, the calendar has reached December for the Blue Hens. While in the past two seasons Delaware has gone 5-0 in the month of December, this December did not start out so hot, with the Hens falling to Weber State. Delaware showed why it likes the month so much by bouncing back the next day for the win over UNCG. With the win over La Salle, the Blue Hens are 3-1 in the month of December, having won three games in a row.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. This year, the Blue Hens have kept all seven of their opponents under 70 points and post a mark of 5-2. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8.

Night is Alright

After playing the first two games of the year during the day, the Blue Hens opened the night time part of their schedule with a huge 83-58 win over Stony Brook. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

It's My Party

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday. Koshansky's birthday will fall the day after the CAA Championships March 13. **Melissa Czorniewy** (12/2), **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), **Aminata Dieye** (1/21), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) also have birthdays during the season.
