♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. STONY BROOK:

All-Time Series Record: Delaware holds the series advantage, 1-0 over Stony Brook. The two teams met for the first time last season, as the Blue Hens came away with the 67-58 victory over the Seawolves.

Last meeting between Delaware and Stony Brook: Last year the Blue Hens used a balanced attack as Julie Sailer scored 15 points while Tiara Malcom and Tiffany Young knocked down 13 points apiece. Malcom and Sailer also pulled down six boards apiece.

Last time out for the BlueHens: Delaware dropped its first game of the year at Georgetown on Saturday by a score of 67-56. Tiara Malcom and Amanda Blackstone led the way with 14 points and nine boards apiece. Alena Koshansky was the other Blue Hen in double figures with 13 points on the afternoon.

Last time out for the Seawolves: The Seawolves dropped their season opener at Bradley by a score of 87-60. Inbar Orion was one of three players to score in double figures with 12 points and eight rebounds. Jessie Boylan had 11 points while Mykeema Ford contributed 10 points. Dana Ferraro pulled down 11 boards to lead the Seawolves on the glass.

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Nov. 27) ~ Four Hoyas scored in double figures as the Georgetown women's basketball team used a strong second half effort to defeat Delaware, 67-56, in women's basketball action Saturday afternoon at McDonough Arena. Kieraah Marlow and Sarah Jenkins each scored 14 points to lead a balanced attack for Georgetown, which improved to 1-2 on the season. Varda Tamoulianis added 12 points and seven rebounds, while Mary Lisicky chipped in 12 points and a game-best 10 assists. Bethany LeSueur narrowly missed becoming the fifth Hoya in double figures, as she finished with nine points and a game-high six steals. The Blue Hens, who fell to 1-1 on the year, were led by senior forward Tiara Malcom who tied for the team lead with 14 points and nine rebounds. Junior guard Amanda Blackstone also had 14 points and nine boards for Delaware while sophomore guard Alena Koshansky added 13 points, hitting 4-of-7 three-point attempts. The Hoyas trailed 29-27 at the half but scored the first 12 points of the second period to take a 39-29 lead with 16:10 remaining and would not trail again.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks 16th with 1,067 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 114 points to move into the top 10 and 380 points to break into the top five. Malcom has recorded 13 double-doubles in her career (UD is 9-4 in those games). Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 182 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** needs seven wins to reach 150 career wins all-time at Delaware.

Reaching for the Top

The Blue Hens were selected second in the CAAPre-season Media Poll while senior forward **Tiara Malcom** was selected the league's Pre-season Player of the Year. Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

Going Deep

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is making the shots from behind the arc so far this season. Koshansky is 5-9 from three point range so far this season for a percentage of .556. She is tied for first in the CAAin three point field goal percentage and in three point field goals made. Koshansky went 4-for-7 from three point range on Saturday at Georgetown which is just one shy of her career best from that area.

Defense Delivers

Delaware basketball is known for its defense. The Blue Hens held seven teams under 50 points in 2003-04 and came away with a 7-0 mark in those games. Delaware continued

this trend with its win over Loyola (MD) to start this season. Delaware has led the CAA the last two seasons in scoring defense and is tied for the lead in scoring defense early on in this season.

If it's Free, I'll make it

Last year the Blue Hens shot 70% from the charity stripe. In the season opener, the Hens picked up where they left off, shooting 86% from the free throw line. The Blue Hens have four players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage. **Amanda Blackstone** is a perfect 4-for-4 from the line, while **Alena Koshansky** is shooting 83%. **Tiara Malcom** is shooting 76.5% from the charity stripe and fellow senior **Tiffany Young** is shooting 70% from the line.

Delaware Basketball Tradition

Delaware women's basketball has recorded six consecutive winning seasons, a seventh would be a program record. The program has recorded 20-win seasons in three of its last four campaigns and has made postseason tournament appearances three times in the last four years.

There's No Place Like Home

Having four home losses in a season is somewhat of an anomaly for the Blue Hens. The last time the Hens lost four games at home in the same season dates back to 1998-99 when they were still in the America East conference. Despite its four losses last season at home, Delaware's home record is nothing to scoff at. Since the 1999-00 season, the Blue Hens are 55-7 at the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware has won over 88% of its home contests over the last four years (42-6) and over 72% in the last seven years (70-15).

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Black is Golden for the Hens

Amanda Blackstone has made her impact felt in two games this season for the Blue Hens. In the first game against Loyola (MD), Blackstone scored six points and grabbed two rebounds. Against Georgetown, Blackstone provided a spark off the bench, pouring in 14 points and pulling down nine boards. She tied for the team lead in both of those categories on Saturday and her 14 points were just three shy of her career-best.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist. **Courtney Irving** was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 15.5 ppg and 8.5 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in both games this season. Malcom just missed recording the double-double in the game against Georgetown with 14 points and nine rebounds. She has played in 92 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 65-27 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 16.7 points per game in six NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 14 points per game and 7.5 rebounds per

game in two games this season for Fairfield.

Is It December Yet?

The calendar says today is the last day of November and the Blue Hens are ready to welcome in the month of December. In the past two seasons, the Blue Hens have compiled back to back perfect Decembers. The team has produced records of 5-0 in that month. This year's squad will have to work hard to keep the perfection going as the Hens are slated for six games this year in December.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8.

Night Games Begin

Tonight marks the first night game of the season for the Blue Hens. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

It's My Party

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday.
