♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. TOWSON:

All-Time Series Record: Delaware leads the all-time series between the two squads, 32-13. The Blue Hens have won nine straight games against Towson with the last Tigers win coming January 22, 2000 as Towson posted the 59-53 victory.

Last time the Blue Hens and Tigers met: These two squads met on February 29 of last year with the Blue Hens posting a 69-56 win. In that game, Tiara Malcom and Alena Koshansky both scored 19 points in the game. Koshansky hit a career-best five three-pointers in that contest and contributed five steals. Tyresa Smith scored 14 points to go along with five steals and four assists. Kelly Robinson led the Tigers with 18 points and 10 boards as she posted the double-double while Brandi Harris had 16 points.

Last time out for the BlueHens: Tyresa Smith and Tiara Malcom combined to score 36 points as Delaware defeated GeorgeMason by a score of 72-56. Smith had 19 points and seven rebounds while Malcom scored 17 points and pulled down five boards to lead Delaware to its tenth straight win. Malcom was an impressive 11 of 11 from the foul line in this game.

Last time out for the Tigers: Towson used a strong second half from freshman Alis Freeman to defeat UNC Wilmington by a score of 65-61. Freeman scored a career-high 26 points including 22 in the second half while Tierra Jackson added 10 points and nine rebounds.

♦ MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME: ♦



NEWARK, DE (Jan. 16) ~ Tyresa Smith and Tiara Malcom combined for 36 points and Delaware converted 23 of 28 free throws to break open a close game...the Blue Hens (12-2, 5-0 CAA) won their 10th straight game and their ninth straight home game since last season...George Mason (6-8, 2-3 CAA), which had won two straight conference games, trailed by just five points at the half but shot 34.5 percent from the field in the second half...George Mason guard Jen Daniels scored a career-high 26 points and pulled six rebounds in a losing effort while also converting 5 of 12 three-pointers...the Patriots hit nine three-pointers in a BCC-record tying 27 attempts...Smith finished with a team-high 19 points while also pulling seven rebounds while Malcom recorded 17 points and converted all 11 of her free throw attempts...Liz Hayes added nine points, including two three-pointers, while Amanda Blackstone pulled eight rebounds as the Hens held a 38-28 advantage on the boards...Delaware converted 23 of 28 free throws for the game (.821), including hitting 16 of 19 in the second half...George Mason led for the opening 10 minutes of the first half before the Hens tied the score at 13-13 with 9:25 left in the stanza...after two more ties and six lead changes, the Hens took the lead for good on a free throw by Blackstone and two by Smith to go up 30-27 with 2:10 left in the stanza...Alena Koshansky converted a three-point play with two seconds left to send the Hens up 36-31 at halftime...the Hens never trailed in the second half as Malcom scored 13 of her 17 points...the Hens outscored the Patriots 17-8 over the first seven minutes of the half to take a 53-39 lead with 12:58 remaining...Malcom scored seven points and Smith added four during the pivotal run...the Hens led by as much as 19 points at 60-41 with 9:02 left to play.

◆ MORE ON THE MATCH-UP ◆

◆ Delaware and Towson are the second and third ranked teams in the CAA when it comes to scoring defense. Delaware is allowing 56.4 points per game on average while Towson has been surrendering 58.8 points per game.

◆ Both Delaware's Tyresa Smith and Towson's Alis Freeman rank in the top five in assists and steals in the CAA. Smith is fifth in assists averaging 3.07 per game and second in steals averaging 3.43 per game. Freeman is fourth in assists with 4.00 per game and third in steals with 3.19

◆ Delaware and Towson can boast the players of the week for the CAA this week. The Blue Hen's Tiara Malcom was named the Player of the Week for the fourth straight week. Towson's Alis Freeman claimed her second straight Rookie of the Week award.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks seventh with 1,265 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 182 points to break into the top five. Malcom needs 10 more rebounds to move into the top 10 for career rebounding. Malcom has recorded 15 double-doubles in her career (UD is 11-4 in those games). Malcom is also closing in on the record for most games played in a career, which is 117. If the current streak holds out Malcom would tie the record during the last game of the regular season at James Madison and would break the record for most games played in a career in the first game of the CAA Tournament. Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 95 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** reached 150 career wins with the victory over VCU on Sunday.

60 Below

The Blue Hens are riding a ten game win streak and one of the keys to that success is their stifling defense. The Hens have kept eight out of their ten opponents during this stretch under 60 points for the game. In fact, the 70 points allowed to Old Dominion marked the first time this year, the Hens had surrendered 70 points in a game. Even more impressive, they are forcing their opponents to turn the ball over an average of 19.2 times per game during the streak.

Four Times and Counting

Senior **Tiara Malcom** was named the CAA Women's Basketball Player of the Week on January 17. Malcom received that honor for the fourth straight week. Malcom earned Player of the Week honors just once last year after the Hens overtime win at Drexel.

There's No Place Like Home

For the Blue Hen women's basketball team there truly is no place like home. The Hens are 6-0 at home this season and currently have a nine game win streak at the Bob Carpenter Center dating back to last season. The last time the Blue Hens lost a game at home was February 12, 2004 as the Hens fell to James Madison. Over the last three years, Delaware is 25-5 on its home floor.

Top of the Class

Senior **Julie Sailer** and sophomore **Alena Koshansky** have both been nominated for the CoSIDA Academic All-American Team.

The CoSIDA Academic All-American Team recognizes athletes for their accomplishments both on and off the court. Sailer was selected to the District 2, second team last year and was a member of the CAA All-Academic team.

Gaining Some Attention

The USA Today/ ESPN/ WBCA Women's Basketball Top 25 Poll was released on Tuesday and the Blue Hens received a vote. This marks just the second time in the history of the women's basketball program that a team has received a vote in the poll. The last time was February of 2001 when the Hens were in the midst of a 16-game win streak and eventually won the America East Conference Tournament that year.

Sophomore Studs

Sophomores **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** have been a large part of the Blue Hens success early on this season. Smith is the second leading scorer on the team with 11.7 ppg and 4.8 rpg. Smith has also dished out a team leading 43 assists, 6 blocks, and 48 steals. Smith established a new career high in points and rebounds with her double-double vs. Stony Brook (18 pts and 10 boards). She scored in double figures in six straight games and was named to the All-Tournament Team at Lehigh. Smith's 48 steals rank her 15th in the nation at 3.4 steals per game. Koshansky has been deadly both from three point range (19 of 48) and from the foul line (36 of 43). Koshansky's four three pointers vs. Georgetown were just one shy of her career best. Koshansky also had a career-high seven assists vs. Old Dominion. The pair also ranks first and fifth in the CAA in assist to turnover ratio. Koshansky is at 1.59 while Smith's ratio is 1.10.

If it's Free, I'll make it

Last year the Blue Hens shot 70% from the charity stripe. In the season opener, the Hens picked up where they left off, shooting 86% from the free throw line. The Blue Hens have three players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage as they are currently shooting 71.8% from the line. **Alena Koshansky** is shooting .837 from the line while **Tiara Malcom** is shooting .793, and **Tiffany Young** rounds out that group by shooting .759 from the line.

Reaching for the Top

The Blue Hens were selected second in the CAAPre-season Media Poll while senior forward **Tiara Malcom** was selected the league's Pre-season Player of the Year. Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

Topping the MAAC

The Blue Hens improved to 5-0 in the last two seasons vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with their win over Fairfield. Last year the Blue Hens registered a perfect 3-0 mark against the MAAC. This year Delaware has registered a 63-49 win over Loyola (MD) and the 76-54 victory over Fairfield.

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist. **Courtney Irving** was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 16.4 ppg and 6.8 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in all of the games this season but the one against VCU. Malcom recorded the double-double vs. La Salle with 24 points and 10 rebounds and another one vs. UNCW with 23 points and 11 boards. She has played in 104 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 76-28 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 12.9 points per game in 36 NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 14.1 points per game and 8.4 rebounds per game in 16 games this season for Fairfield.

December to Remember

The Blue Hens put a wrap on the month of December by winning the Christmas City Classic at Lehigh. While in the past two seasons Delaware has gone 5-0 in the month of December, this December did not start out so hot, with the Hens falling to Weber State. Delaware showed why it likes the month so much by bouncing back the next day for the win over UNCG. With the win over Lehigh, the Blue Hens completed the month of December with a mark of 5-1 in that month.

Seniors Stand Tall

It was the backcourt tandem of **Tiara Malcom** and **Tiffany Young** which led the Blue Hens to the 69-59 win over UNC Greensboro at the Arizona Tournament. Malcom and Young teamed up again to lead the Hens to the victory over Lehigh. Malcom followed up her 21 points vs. Alabama with 14 points and a career high six assists vs. Lehigh. Young came off the bench to record the double-double with 12 points and 10 boards. Once again, it was the senior duo of Young and Malcom that helped the Blue Hens gain the victory over Drexel. Young recorded her second double-double of the year with 18 points and 11 boards while Malcom chipped in 15 points.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8. This year's team has kept twelve of its thirteen opponents under 70 points for a mark of 11-2.

Night is Alright

After playing the first two games of the year during the day, the Blue Hens opened the night time part of their schedule with a huge 83-58 win over Stony Brook. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina Martin** and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday. Koshansky's birthday will fall the day after the CAA Championships March 13. **Melissa Czorniewy** (12/2), **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), **Aminata Dieye** (1/21), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) also have birthdays during the season.
