♦ SERIES INFO: DELAWARE VS. WILLIAM & MARY:

All-Time Series Record: This game will mark the ninth time that these two squads have met. Delaware holds a 6-2 advantage in the series which dates back to the 1980-81 season. William & Mary did claim wins in both contests last year.

Last time the Blue Hens and Tribe met: These two teams met last year on February 8 with William & Mary claiming a 55-48 win over the Blue Hens. In that game, Tiffan Young scored 16 points and pulled down nine rebounds while Tiara Malcom scored 13 points with 8 boards. Tracey Howell pulled down a game-high 12 boards. For the Tribe, Kyle DeHaven scored 25 points and grabbed six rebounds while Kyra Kaylor had 13 points and five boards.

Last time out for the BlueHens: For the second straight game, it was senior Tiffany Young leading the Blue Hens to victory. This time Young scored 17 points and grabbed nine rebounds as she was 7 of 7 from the foul line in the 70-54 victory over Hofstra. Tiara Malcom and Tyresa Smith added 10 points a piece as Malcom grabbed eight rebounds and the Blue Hens won their 12th straight game.

Last time out for the Tribe: William & Mary lost its second straight game on Sunday, falling to Drexel by a score of 73-63. The Tribe placed three players in double-digits led by Kyle DeHaven's 17 points and six rebounds. Lindsey Brizendine had 13 and Lizzie Schiel scored 10 points.

♦ MORE ON THE HENS' LAST GAME: ♦



HEMPSTEAD, NY (Jan. 23) ~ Backup forward Tiffany Young scored a game-high 17 points and pulled nine rebounds and Delaware converted 27 of 28 shots from the foul line for its 12th straight win...Delaware (14-2, 7-0 CAA) also got 10 points and eight rebounds from Tiara Malcom and 10 points and five rebounds from Tyresa Smith...Hens downed Hofstra for the 10th straight time...Hofstra (8-8, 3-4 CAA) got 16 points and 15 rebounds from Lizanne Murphy, 16 points from Vanessa Gidden, and 12 points from CAA-leading scorer Cigi McCollin...Murphy posted her league-leading ninth double-double of the season...Young scored six points in an 8-2 run to end the first half to give Delaware a 26-22 advantage at the break...Hens opened second half on an 8-2 run and after Hofstra cut the lead to 34-28 with 16:28, took off on a decisive 18-2 run to put the game away...Amanda Blackstone opened the 18-2 run with a three-pointer and later added another triple with 10:40 remaining to up the Delaware lead to 50-30...Hofstra went an agonizing stretch over nine minutes in which it missed 13 straight field goal attempts and turned the ball over four times...by the time Murphy ended the field goal drought with 7:16 left, Delaware was up 54-35...both teams struggled throughout the day holding on to the ball and hitting shots from the field...Delaware shot just 30.3 percent from the field (20 of 66) for the game and committed 21 turnovers but Hofstra committed 22 turnovers and shot just 23.4 percent from the field, hitting 15 of 64 shots...Delaware, however, held a commanding 57-42 advantage on the boards.

◆ William & Mary and Delaware rank second and third in the CAA in steals per game. William & Mary is second with 10.81 per game while the Blue Hens are third with 10.38 per game.

◆ Tyresa Smith of Delaware and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary are two of the best in the CAA when it comes to assists per game and steals per game. Smith is fifth in assists with 3.06 per game and second in steals with 3.31 per game. DeHaven ranks second in assists with 4.25 per game and first in steals with 3.44 per game.

◆ Tiara Malcom and Tiffany Young rank 11th and 12th in the CAA in rebounds per game with, 6.8 and 6.5 respectively. The Tribe's Devin James and Kyle DeHaven are 15th and 20th with 5.6 and 4.8 respectively.

Tina Martin, Head Coach

Ninth season at University of Delaware...has compiled a 142-90 record at the helm of the Hens' basketball program, becoming the fastest UD basketball coach (men's or women's) to reach 100 career wins...has led the Blue Hens to 20-win seasons in three of the last four years and three post-season appearances...spent nine seasons at Seton Hall as an assistant coach in a program that made back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995, advancing to the Sweet 16 in 1994...was a two-time Division II All-American at Lock Haven University, a four-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star, and two-time league Player of the Year who finished her career as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 career points.

Records Watch

Senior **Tiara Malcom** ranks seventh with 1,287 points among the career scoring leaders at Delaware. She needs 160 points to break into the top five. Malcom needs to make four more free throws to rank third on the CAA all-time list in that category. Malcom has recorded 15 double-doubles in her career (UDis 11-4 in those games). Malcom is also closing in on the record for most games played in a career, which is 117. If the current streak holds out Malcom would tie the record during the last game of the regular season at James Madison and would break the record for most games played in a career in the first game of the CAA Tournament. Fellow senior **Julie Sailer** needs 83 points to reach the 1,000 career point plateau. She would become the 20th Delaware women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in a career. Head coach **Tina Martin** reached 150 career wins with the victory over VCU on Sunday.

Streaking....

The Blue Hens are in the midst of a 12 game win streak that has seen them land at the top of the CAA standings. The Hens currently are in a tie for second with #25 Temple when it comes to the longest current win streak in Division I women's basketball. The longest streak currently is held by Gonzaga which has won 13 straight games.

60 Below

The Blue Hens are riding a 12 game win streak and one of the keys to that success is their stifling defense. The Hens have kept 10 out of their 12 opponents during this stretch under 60 points for the game. In fact, the 70 points allowed to Old Dominion marked the first time this year, the Hens had surrendered 70 points in a game. Even more impressive, they are forcing their opponents to turn the ball over an average of 19.75 times per game during the streak.

There's No Place Like Home

For the Blue Hen women's basketball team there truly is no place like home. The Hens are 6-0 at home this season and currently have a nine game win streak at the Bob Carpenter Center dating back to last season. The last time the Blue Hens lost a game at home was February 12, 2004 as the Hens fell to James Madison. Over the last three years, Delaware is 25-5 on its home floor.

Top of the Class

Senior **Julie Sailer** and sophomore **Alena Koshansky** have both been nominated for the CoSIDA Academic All-American Team. The CoSIDA Academic All-American Team recognizes athletes for their accomplishments both on and off the court. Sailer was selected to the District 2, second team last year and was a member of the CAA All-Academic team.

Gaining Some Attention

The USA Today/ ESPN/ WBCA Women's Basketball Top 25 Poll was released on Tuesday and the Blue Hens received three votes. This marks just the third time in the history of the women's basketball program that a team has received a vote in the poll and the first time they received multiple votes. The first time was February of 2001 when the Hens were in the midst of a 16-game win streak and eventually won the America East Conference Tournament that year. This year's squad received a vote in last week's poll as well.

Sophomore Studs

Sophomores **Tyresa Smith** and **Alena Koshansky** have been a large part of the Blue Hens success this season. Smith is the second leading scorer on the team with 11.8 ppg and 4.7 rpg. Smith has also dished out a team leading 49 assists, 6 blocks, and 53 steals. Smith established the first double-double of her career vs. StonyBrook. She scored in double figures in six straight games and was named to the All-Tournament Team at Lehigh. Koshansky has been deadly both from three point range (21 of 53) and from the foul line (43 of 51). Koshansky's four three pointers vs. Georgetown were just one shy of her career best. Koshansky also had a career-high seven assists vs. Old Dominion. The pair also ranks first and seventh in the CAA in assist to turnover ratio. Koshansky is at 1.46 while Smith's ratio is 1.07.

If it's Free, I'll make it

The Blue Hens proved why they are deadly from the foul line in their game against Hofstra. The Hens went 27 of 28 from the foul line in that game and the starters were 16 of 16 in that game. The Blue Hens have three players ranked in the top 15 of the CAA in free throw percentage as they are currently shooting 73.5% from the line. **Alena Koshansky** is shooting .843 from the line while **Tiara Malcom** is shooting .811, and **Tiffany Young** rounds out that group by shooting .800 from the line.

Senior **Tiara Malcom** was named the CAA Women's Basketball Player of the Week on January 17. Malcom received that honor for the fourth straight week. Malcom earned Player of the Week honors just once last year after the Hens overtime win at Drexel.

Reaching for the Top

The Blue Hens were selected second in the CAAPre-season Media Poll while senior forward **Tiara Malcom** was selected the league's Pre-season Player of the Year. Malcom was joined on the first team by Shareese Grant of Old Dominion, Amaka Agugua of Hofstra, Lesley Dickinson of James Madison, and Kacy O'Brien of Towson. The second team consisted of Meredith Alexis of James Madison, Catherine Scanlon of Drexel, Kyra Kaylor and Kyle DeHaven of William & Mary, and Lauren Hogan of Virginia Commonwealth.

Topping the MAAC

The Blue Hens improved to 5-0 in the last two seasons vs. the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference with their win over Fairfield. Last year the Blue Hens registered a perfect 3-0 mark against the MAAC. This year Delaware has registered a 63-49 win over Loyola (MD) and the 76-54 victory over Fairfield.

The Maryland Connection

For the second time in three years, the Blue Hens will welcome a transfer from the University of Maryland to the Carpenter Center. Two years ago it was center **Arek Deng** joining the Blue Hen mix. This year its forward **Chrissy Fisher** joining the squad. Fisher will have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules but should provide depth in the backcourt next year.

Impressive Resume

This year's freshman class brings an impressive resume to the Delaware basketball program. **Melissa Czorniewy** scored over 1,000 points at Holy Angels in New Jersey and was a McDonald's All-American finalist.

Courtney Irving was the first player at Wilmington Charter here in Delaware to score 1,000 points in a career. **Katie Kline** was a McDonald's All-American nominee on her way to scoring 2,110 points and grabbing 1,100 rebounds at Pennsville High School in New Jersey.

Picking Up Where She Left Off

Senior forward **Tiara Malcom** has picked up right where she left off last season. Malcom leads the team with 15.7 ppg and 6.8 rpg so far this season. She has scored in double figures in all of the games this season but the one against VCU. Malcom recorded the double-double vs. La Salle with 24 points and 10 rebounds and another one vs. UNCW with 23 points and 11 boards. She has played in 106 consecutive games and the Blue Hens own a 78-28 mark with Malcom in those contests.

It Runs in the Family

Center **Arek Deng** is one of eight children and basketball must run in her family's genes. Her older brother, Ajou, played for the Fairfield basketball team while her younger brother, Luol, is a member of the Chicago Bulls who is averaging 12.9 points per game in 36 NBA contests so far this season and was an All-American at Duke. Also, her cousin, Gai, plays for the Fairfield men's basketball team. Gai, a 6-9 center, is averaging 14.4 points per game and 8.2 rebounds per game in 17 games this season for Fairfield. Gai, also blocked 13 shots in a game vs. Siena, one short of the NCAA Division I record.

Seniors Stand Tall

It was the backcourt tandem of **Tiara Malcom** and **Tiffany Young** which led the Blue Hens to the 69-59 win over UNC Greensboro at the Arizona Tournament. Malcom and Young teamed up again to lead the Hens to the victory over Lehigh. Malcom followed up her 21 points vs. Alabama with 14 points and a career high six assists vs. Lehigh. Young came off the bench to record the double-double with 12 points and 10 boards. Once again, it was the senior duo of Young and Malcom that helped the Blue Hens gain the victory over Drexel. Young recorded her second double-double of the year with 18 points and 11 boards while Malcom chipped in 15 points.

December to Remember

The Blue Hens put a wrap on the month of December by winning the Christmas City Classic at Lehigh. While in the past two seasons Delaware has gone 5-0 in the month of December, this December did not start out so hot, with the Hens falling to Weber State. Delaware showed why it likes the month so much by bouncing back the next day for the win over UNCG. With the win over Lehigh, the Blue Hens completed the month of December with a mark of 5-1 in that month.

Keep it Below 70

The Blue Hens like to keep it below 70, and they are not talking about the temperature. Last year when the Hens could keep an opponent under 70 points in a game, the team boasted a record of 19-4. If Delaware scored less than 70 points in a game, the team recorded a mark of 17-8. This year's team has kept 13 of its 14 opponents under 70 points for a mark of 13-2 in those games.

Night is Alright

After playing the first two games of the year during the day, the Blue Hens opened the night time part of their schedule with a huge 83-58 win over Stony Brook. In the past two seasons the Blue Hens have compiled a mark of 23-14 in night games. Delaware has a slightly better mark in games played during the day at 18-6 over the last two years. This year's squad is 7-0 at night and 7-2 during the day.

Defense, Defense, and More Defense

The 25 points that Loyola scored against Delaware last year were the lowest opponent point total in the CAA in the last five years. The Blue Hens held the Greyhounds to just seven points in the first half, which was one of the lowest halftime scores in all of Division I women's basketball last season. Following back to back double digit losses to William & Mary and Old Dominion last year, the Blue Hen defense made a statement vs. Hofstra by holding the Pride to 15 points in the first half and without a field goal in the first 12 minutes of the contest.

Twin Factor

Experience and excellent credentials may not be the only requirement to be a coach at Delaware. Having a twin in the family may also be a prerequisite. Head coach **Tina**

Martin and Associate head coach **Jeanine Radice** are both twins -- Martin is an identical twin, Teresa while Radice has a fraternal twin sister.

Sophomore **Alena Koshansky** is hoping to have something extra special to celebrate on her 20th birthday. Koshansky's birthday will fall the day after the CAA Championships March 13. **Melissa Czorniewy** (12/2), **Geneva Livingston** (1/1), **Arek Deng** (1/13), **Aminata Dieye** (1/21), and **Tiara Malcom** (1/24) also have birthdays during the season.
