- A pair of Top 25 ranked teams, one struggling and the other red-hot, will meet Saturday as Delaware and Towson continue their rivalry at Johnny Unitas Stadium
- The No. 21/20 ranked Blue Hens (4-4, 2-3 CAA), coming off a 38-34 road loss at Rhode Island last Saturday, will be looking to snap a two-game losing streak
- No. 13/14 ranked Towson (6-1, 4-0 CAA) is one of the nation's most improved teams as the Tigers, who upped their winning streak to three games with a 38-27 win at William & Mary Saturday, are tied for the CAA lead with Maine after going winless in league play a year ago (0-8) as part of a 1-10 season
- Towson's six wins already matches their win total of the last three seasons combined (6-28)
- The two teams meet for the 13th time with Delaware owning an 8-4 advantage, including four straight wins in the series. The streak includes two straight wins at Towson
- Officials at Towson are expecting a capacity crowd this week in a game that will also be televised throughout the region on The Comcast Network

#5 Delaware 48, Towson 0

NEWARK, Del. (Nov. 5, 2010) -- Delaware could do little wrong on both sides of the ball as the No. 5 ranked Blue Hens piled up 589 yards of total offense and held Towson to just eight first downs on the way to a 48-0 Colonial Athletic Association rout before an appreciative Homecoming crowd of 21,603 at Delaware Stadium.

The Blue Hens (8-1, 6-0 CAA), playing for the first time since suffering their first loss of the season in a 17-16 setback to William & Mary two weeks ago, stormed back in stunning fashion as Walter Payton Award candidate Pat Devlin completed 29 of 38 passes for 318 yards and one touchdown while running for another score.

Nihja White finished with nine receptions for 108 yards and one touchdown, Leon Jackson scored on a 63-yard run and finished with a game-high 88 yards on the ground, and Andrew Pierce scored two touchdowns and went over 1,000 yards for the season with 79 rushing yards.

Towson (1-8, 0-6 CAA), which lost its seventh straight game, played without dual-threat quarterback Chris Hart, who was suspended due to a violation of team rules.

With Hart gone, the Tigers managed just 158 total yards and eight first downs and punted 10 times - one shy of the school record of 11 set vs. Delaware in 2004.

The Tigers crossed midfield just twice the entire day, never got closer than the Delaware 34-yard line, and had just one play go for 10 yards.

scores, but three turnovers of their own and two big mental mistakes in the final quarter proved to be Delaware's undoing.

Delaware dropped its second straight game and remained winless in three road games this season. Rhode Island, which has endured several tough-luck losses throughout the season, losing four games by nine points or less, put an end to its three-game losing streak and improved to 2-5 (1-3 CAA), sending its Homecoming crowd away happy.

A game that featured three ties and four lead changes typically wasn't decided until late as Delaware rallied from a two-touchdown deficit in the final quarter but couldn't complete the deal.

Rhode Island broke a 21-21 tie with two scores in the first five minutes of the final quarter as Brandon Johnson-Farrell hauled in a 13-yard scoring pass from Bob Bentsen on the second play of the final quarter and De'antray Johnson followed three minutes later with a 12-yard burst to give Rhody a 35-21 lead with 11:21 remaining. Johnson's touchdown was set up when Ram linebacker Dave Zocco intercepted a pass at the URI 40-yard line.

The Blue Hens cut the gap to 35-28 on a two-yard scoring run by sophomore All-American **Andrew Pierce**, his second of the day, with 8:06 left, and the Hens had a chance to even things but couldn't get it done.

Delaware quarterback **Tim Donnelly**, who replaced injured starter **Trevor Sasek** (knee) in the first half, hit on 16 of 27 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns. **Nihja White** caught six passes for 90 yards and a score and Pierce finished the day with 22 carries for 80 yards and two touchdowns.

LAST TIME OUT FOR TOWSON

#15 Towson 38, #14 William & Mary 27

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Oct. 22, 2011) -- Facing the top-ranked defense in the Colonial Athletic Association, Towson (6-1, 4-0) scored on its first four possessions and built a 28-10 second quarter lead en route to a 38-27 CAA victory over No. 14 William & Mary (4-4, 2-3) before a Homecoming crowd of 12,259 at Zable Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The victory continued the Tigers' amazing turnaround as they beat a nationally-ranked opponent for the fourth time this season. The win also enabled the Tigers to remain tied for first place in the CAA with No. 9 Maine (6-1, 4-0).

It was also the Tigers' first win over William & Mary in eight meetings. The Tigers, who were 1-10 last season, have a 6-1 record for their best start as an NCAA Division I-AA (FCS) program. This is the Tigers' best seven-game record since 1986, their final season as an NCAA Division II team.

William & Mary came into the game allowing only 17.7 points per contest, a total the Tigers surpassed early in the second quarter. Although the Tigers never trailed after the first eight minutes, they weren't assured of a victory until linebacker Alexander DiSanzo intercepted a pass at the Tigers' three-yard line with 15 seconds remaining. The Tribe had cut its deficit to 35-27 with 8:08 left when Drake Kuhn booted a 30-yard field goal.

Towson gained 427 yards of total offense as quarterback Grant Enders completed 15 of 21 passes for 203 yards and two touchdowns and rookie running back sensation Terrance West ran for 144 yards and three scores.

**BLUE HEN QUARTERBACK TREVOR SASEK
OUT FOR THE SEASON**

The season is over for University of Delaware sophomore quarterback **Trevor Sasek**, who injured his knee for the second time this year during the second quarter of the Blue Hens' 38-34 setback at Rhode Island Saturday.

Sasek was making his first start since that Navy game but didn't make it through the contest as he went down late in the second quarter when he was knocked to the ground under pressure after throwing an incomplete pass.

Sasek had won the battle for the starting spot with junior **Tim Donnelly** late in pre-season drills and started the game vs. Navy before going down twice with knee injuries.

He will undergo surgery sometime in the near future and is expected to miss spring drills.

He battled back and finally returned to the field, seeing fourth quarter action vs. William & Mary on Oct. 8 and vs. Massachusetts on Oct. 15.

Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler** announced on Oct. 17 that Sasek had regained the starting spot from Donnelly.

Donnelly went 4-2 as a starter before giving way this past week to Sasek. The junior completed 16 of 27 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns against Rhode Island.

Redshirt freshman **Justin Burns**, who has seen action in just one game this year, will move up to the No. 2 spot.

STARTERS NAUGLE, HARDISON ALSO DOWN WITH INJURIES

Delaware suffered two big losses back on Oct. 15 against Massachusetts when starting tight end **Colin Naugle** and starting defensive **Matt Hardison** both went down with significant injuries.

Naugle, a senior, injured his knee early in the first quarter and missed the rest of the game. The All-CAA tight end is expected to miss the remainder of the regular season but could return if the Hens make a playoff run.

Hardison, also a senior, suffered a high ankle sprain in the second quarter that put him out of action for the rest of the game. He too is expected to miss the remainder of the regular season.

Freshman **Nick Boyle** took over the starting tight end spot for Naugle while regular tackles **Irv Titre**, **Demetrius Hester**, and **Laith Wallschleger** will fill in the gaps while Hardison is out.

DELAWARE VS. TOP 25 OPPONENTS

Delaware is facing its second Top 25 opponent of the season this week when the Hens travel to Towson.

The Tigers are ranked No. 13 in The Sports Network Top 25 poll and No. 14 in the FCS Coaches poll this week.

The Blue Hens defeated their only other Top 25 opponent back on Oct. 8 when Delaware handled then No. 9 ranked William & Mary 21-0 at home.

Although 2011 opponents Maine and Old Dominion are currently ranked in the Top 25, neither was ranked at the time they played Delaware.

Delaware, which posted a record of 7-3 vs. Top 25 teams last season, is 28-19 (.596) vs. Top 25 teams in 10 seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, including an 19-7 (.731) mark at Delaware Stadium and a 9-12 on the road or on neutral fields.

Against Top 10 teams, the Hens are 17-12 (.586) since Keeler took over in 2002, including a mark of 10-5 (.667) at Delaware Stadium and a record of 7-7 on the road or on neutral fields.

SIXTH ANNUAL PIGSKIN PASS SET FOR THIS WEEK VS. TOWSON

The sixth annual Pigskin Pass is a joint effort between University of Delaware and Towson University student-athletes to raise awareness and financial support for each state's Special Olympics organization.

On Saturday, Oct. 29, student-athletes from each school will run a 58-mile relay run from the 50-yard line of Delaware Stadium to the 50-yard line of Johnny Unitas Stadium, where a special game ball will be delivered during an on-field ceremony during the first half of the annual Delaware-Towson football game.

The Pigskin Pass is a joint community service initiative sponsored by the Student-Athlete Advisory Councils at both schools. Student-athletes raise money by registering to run in the event, and then getting additional sponsors to support their efforts. It is a visible example of athletes supporting athletes.

Last year over \$12,000 was raised by the two competing schools.

LONG TIME AWAY FROM HOME

After playing five of its last six games in the friendly confines of Delaware Stadium, the Blue Hens hit the road last week for Rhode Island.

They will be on the road again this week too as they take the short, one-hour trip south to Towson, Md. That game will be followed by a bye week on Nov. 5.

The Hens will not return home until Nov. 12 when they host Richmond for Homecoming and the final regular season home game of the regular season.

The 27-day gap between home games at Delaware Stadium will be Delaware's longest length of time between home contests during the regular season since 2004 when Delaware went 27 days between home games after three straight road games vs. Navy, James Madison, and Richmond.

That streak marked the first time since 1992 that Delaware played three straight regular season road games.

HENS LOOKING TO AVOID RARE STREAK

Delaware will enter this week's Colonial Athletic Association game at Towson looking to snap a streak of two straight losses as the Blue Hens have dropped consecutive decisions of 21-10 to Massachusetts on Oct. 8 and 38-34 to Rhode Island this past Saturday.

This week the Hens will be looking to avoid their first three-game losing streak since 2008 when they fell to Massachusetts, Maine, and William & Mary on consecutive weeks.

Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler** has endured just two three-game losing streaks during his entire coaching career. The only other three-game losing skein during his 19-year head coaching career came in 2005 when the Hens dropped three straight to Towson, Hofstra, and Richmond.

BLUE HENS IN LEAGUE PLAY

Delaware has enjoyed great success in conference play since joining the Yankee Conference (which became the Atlantic 10 Conference in 1997 and then the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007) back in 1986.

The Hens, who have won outright or shared nine league titles during that time over 26 seasons (1986-88-91-92-95-2000-2003-2004-2010), own the best record in league play among all current CAA teams, posting a record of 133-73, good for a 64.6 winning percentage.

Massachusetts (235-136-4, .632) and league newcomer Old Dominion (3-2, .600) are the only other CAA teams that have won 60 percent of their league games.

Since **K.C. Keeler** took over as head coach of the Blue Hens in 2002, Delaware has posted a league record of 44-35 (.557) and captured three league crowns. Delaware is also 6-4 in CAA openers under Keeler.

Delaware has been the pride of the CAA since joining the league in 1986, capturing its 100th conference victory in 2003 with a 51-45 overtime win over UMass.

HOME WIN STREAK COMES TO AN END

Delaware owned the nation's fourth longest home win streak in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision entering an Oct. 15 game vs. Massachusetts.

But that seven-game skein came to an end as the Hens dropped a 21-10 decision to the Minutemen at Delaware Stadium.

The Hens, who still have won 14 of their 16 home games since 2009, had owned the nation's fourth longest streak before the loss.

The longest current home winning streak in NCAA Division I FCS now belongs to Jacksonville (Fla.) with 13 straight home wins.

Among CAA schools, Towson's four-game home win streak is currently the longest among the 11 schools.

**COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION
MAKES HISTORY WITH 9 TOP 25 TEAMS**

The Colonial Athletic Association made a little history on Oct. 3 when, for the first time since weekly polls were kept for the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision, eight teams from the same conference were ranked in The Sports Network Top 25 poll.

The CAA equaled the mark on Oct. 10, but set another record on Oct. 17 when **NINE** CAA members were ranked in the Top 25 with all listed among the top 22.

This week's Sports Network poll features seven CAA teams led by No. 8 Maine, No. 9 James Madison, No. 10 New Hampshire, No. 13 Towson, No. 15 Old Dominion, No. 18 William & Mary, and No. 21 Delaware.

HENS FALL FROM LAMBERT EASTERN CUP

Delaware earned votes but dropped out of the fourth weekly Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Lambert Meadowlands Eastern poll announced Tuesday, Oct. 25.

The Hens, who won the Lambert Cup last season and have earned the award a record 20 times, had been ranked No. 4 in the first poll of the season on Oct. 11 and No. 7 last week.

Maine holds the top spot this week followed by Lehigh, Towson, James Madison, New Hampshire, Old Dominion, Harvard, Massachusetts, Wm. & Mary, Albany, and Brown.

Also receiving votes were Brown, Delaware, Holy Cross, Colgate, Richmond, and Penn.

Penn State holds the top spot in NCAA Division I FBS while Bloomsburg is at No. 1 in the NCAA Division II poll, and Salisbury (Md.) State is atop the NCAA Division III rankings.

HOME SWEET HOME

Delaware boasts one of the top home-field advantages in all of college football. Not only do Blue Hen fans pack Delaware Stadium each week - helping UD become the only NCAA FCS team in the nation to average 20,000 or more fans per regular season home game each of the last 12 seasons -

they see consistently winning football.

The season-high attendance of 21,902 for Parents & Family Weekend Oct. 15 vs. Massachusetts was the fourth highest attended game in the nation at the FCS level.

Delaware has posted an impressive record of 54-17 (.760) in 10 seasons under **K.C. Keeler** at Delaware Stadium - among the top marks at any division.

The Blue Hens had a seven-game home win streak snapped in that 21-10 loss to Massachusetts Saturday, suffering their first setback in front of the home crowd since a 28-21 overtime loss to Villanova on Nov. 20, 2010. That loss to Villanova snapped a seven-game win streak as well.

The Hens have still won 14 of their last 16 home games since a 20-8 setback to James Madison on Oct. 31, 2009.

Of Keeler's 17 home losses, seven have come by six points or less or in overtime. The Hens have scored more than 20 points in all but nine of those 71 games.

Delaware has also won 25 of its last 33 home games and is 282-88-4 (.766) in 60 seasons all-time at Delaware Stadium, including a mark of 20-5 with eighth straight wins in the post-season.

DRIVE FOR FIVE

Delaware brings a record of 4-4 into this week's game at CAA foe Towson.

Should the Blue Hens pick up a win this week, they would reach the five-win mark for the third straight season and for the 25th time in 27 seasons since 1985.

Delaware football has enjoyed remarkable success over the years, including winning six national titles. But even more so, the Hens have been consistent.

Delaware has a milestone that few teams in college football can match as the Hens have won at least four games every season since 1968.

Every team in the CAA (other than Old Dominion, which resumed football 2009) has won fewer than four games in a season at least once since 1995.

**DELAWARE SCORING STREAK REACHES 194...
AND COUNTING**

Delaware extended its streak of scoring a point to 194 straight games in the 38-34 loss at Rhode Island this past Saturday in Kingston, R.I.

Delaware has not been shutout in any game since falling at Villanova 27-0 back on Sept. 14, 1996 and have not been held off the scoreboard at home at Delaware Stadium since suffering a 24-0 setback to Holy Cross way back on Nov. 12, 1983 (a streak of 189 straight games).

The current scoring streak breaks the previous UD record of consecutive game scoring a point of 154 set in 1983-98. Delaware's streak of consecutive road games scoring a point now stands at 87 games.

During the streak, the Hens have scored 30 or more points 84 times (40 percent of the time).

The current streak ranks No. 2 among Colonial Athletic Association teams, trailing only Massachusetts - at 194.

DRIVE FOR THE PAYTON AWARD: ANDREW PIERCE POSTINGS

There has been no sophomore slump for star University of Delaware running back **Andrew Pierce** in 2011.

The Walter Payton National Player of the Year Award candidate was hampered by a knee injury in the 27-17 win over Old Dominion Sept., carrying 14 times for a career-low 21 yards. He missed the final quarter due to the injury. His previous career low was 55 yards vs. James Madison and William & Mary last season.

But Pierce returned to action vs. Maine and was impressive again, rushing 24 times for 120 yards and a 13-yard touchdown that put the Hens ahead 17-14 late in the third quarter.

He was even better in the 21-0 win over William & Mary Oct. 8, carrying 28 times for a season-high 143 yards and one touchdown. He also caught seven passes for 26 yards.

In the loss to UMass on Oct. 15, Pierce led all ground-gainers with 85 yards on 23 carries. He then added 80 yards and two touchdowns in the loss at Rhode Island this past week.

Pierce, the 2010 Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year and this year's CAA pre-season Co-Player of the Year, has already rushed for 797 yards and 10 touchdowns in just eight games, surpassing the 100-yard mark five times. His streak of five straight 100-yard games, one shy of the UD record of six straight, was snapped vs. ODU on Sept. 24.

Pierce currently ranks No. 2 in the CAA and 20th nationally in rushing (99.6 yards per game) and ranks No. 4 in the league and No. 39 nationally in scoring at 7.5 points per game.

He ran for 106 yards and three touchdowns in the win over Delaware State Sept. 17 and became the first sophomore in school history to surpass the 2,000-yard mark, upping his total to 2,003 yards on a third quarter touchdown run.

In just two seasons, the All-American already ranks No. 3 among active NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision players in rushing yards per game (106.6), No. 9 in rushing yards (2,452), No. 10 in carries (500), and No. 12 in touchdowns (24).

He reached the 500 mark for career carries on his final carry vs. Rhode Island last week, becoming just the seventh player in UD history to reach that mark.

With 2,452 career yards, Pierce already ranks No. 7 all-time at Delaware in that category.

HENS ARE ONLY FCS PROGRAM TO POST TWO SHUTOUTS IN 2011; ONE OF ONLY THREE IN NCAA DIVISION I WITH TWO

The University of Delaware defense, which led all NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision teams in scoring defense a year ago (12.1 points per game) on the way to the national championship game, is at it again.

This year's Blue Hen unit posted its second shutout of the young season Oct. 8 as the crew held William & Mary to just 11 first downs and 210 total yards in a 21-0 blanking at Delaware Stadium.

William & Mary was shutout for the first time in 154 games since the 1997 season - also against Delaware.

The Hens also shutout Delaware State 45-0 back on Sept. 17 at Delaware Stadium.

Delaware, which now ranks No. 22 in the FCS in scoring defense at 20.5 points per game, is the only team in the FCS that has posted two shutouts so far this season and one of only three NCAA Division I teams to turn the trick.

FBS members Alabama and Temple have also each blanked two teams this season.

Delaware, which also posted two shutouts during the 2010 season, has not posted three shutouts in the same season since the 2000 campaign when the Hens blanked three of their first opponents as part of a 12-2 campaign that saw Delaware advance to the NCAA semifinals for head coach **Tubby Raymond**.

BLUE HENS STILL TERRORS ON THIRD DOWN

Delaware has been impressive on both sides of the ball on third down situations this season.

The Blue Hens, who held William & Mary to a paltry 1 of 13 success rate on third down in a 21-0 victory on Oct. 8, enter this week ranked No. 2 in the nation in the FCS in third down defense percentage, allowing opponents to succeed just 25.5 percent of the time (27 of 106).

Only Texas Southern (21.69 percent) does a better job on third down than the Hens.

Over the last six games, Delaware opponents have converted on third down just 20 times in 93 attempts (21.5 percent). Rhode Island was 5 of 14 on third down attempts this past week in a 38-34 win over the Hens.

On the flipside, Delaware's offense has been successful on third down 57 times in 127 attempts, this season, a success rate of 44.1 percent that ranks No. 15 in the FCS.

Something will have to give this week as Towson enters the game leading all NCAA FCS programs in third down conversion offense, succeeding 53.2 percent of the time (50 of 94).

HENS NEAR TOP IN TIME OF POSSESSION

The Blue Hens also rank among the national leaders in time of possession, holding on to the ball for an average of 32:17 minutes per game to rank No. 15 nationally.

Texas Southern leads the nation in time of possession at 36:31 while this week's opponent Towson leads all CAA teams with an average of 32:51 per game.

NIHJA WHITE CONTINUES TO PUT UP BIG RECEIVING NUMBERS

University of Delaware junior wide receiver **Nihja White** has been impressive throughout the season and ranks among the top receivers in the CAA.

White, who led the team in receiving a year ago when he hauled in 60 passes for 752 yards and six touchdowns, caught seven passes for 122 yards and a touchdown vs. Delaware State on Sept. 17 and snared seven passes for 117 yards and a touchdown to go with a two-point conversion catch vs. Old Dominion on Sept. 24.

Against Maine on Oct. 1, White pulled down seven passes for 52 yards - giving him three straight games with seven receptions each. He caught two passes for 20 yards, including an 11-yard touchdown catch, vs. William & Mary and snared a team-high six passes for 85 yards against UMass. He also added six catches for 90 yards and a touchdown in the 38-34 loss at Rhode Island Saturday.

The Wayne, Pa. native ranks No. 2 on the team in receptions with 37 catches for a team-high 502 yards (13.6 avg.) and four touchdowns with a long gain of 59 yards.

He ranks No. 4 in the CAA and 37th nationally in receptions (5.29 per game) and ranks No. 4 in the CAA and No. 38 in the nation in receiving yards per game (71.7).

White has now caught at least one pass in 30 straight games in which he has played. The streak is the third longest in UD history, trailing only No. 2 **Mark Duncan**, who put together a streak of 35 games in 2007-09 and Blue Hen record-holder **Eddie Conti** (38 in 1996-98)

White has gone over the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career with 1,492 (No. 12 all-time at UD) and his 118 career receptions ranks him No. 11 all-time at Delaware.

MILESTONES & STREAKS

- Senior C **Rob McDowell** and senior LB **Andrew Harrison** own the team's longest current starting streaks entering the Towson game.

McDowell, who has started every game of his career for the Blue Hens, will start his 47th straight game while Harrison will earn his 35th straight starting nod vs. Towson.

Back in September, McDowell was named one of 16 semi-finalists from the NCAA Division I FCS classification for a National Football Foundation Post-Graduate Scholarship.

Harrison, who coordinates Delaware's Fellowship of Christian Athletes group, ranks No. 15 among active NCAA FCS tacklers with 272 for his career, including a career-high tying 14 vs. Maine on Oct. 1.

- Junior RB **David Hayes** rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries vs. West Chester and reached the 1,000-yard mark for his career on his first carry of the night. He now has 1,219 career yards and is the 55th player in UD history to reach the

1,000-yard mark.

- Senior WR **Mark Schenauer** enters this week's game vs. Towson with career statistics of 74 receptions for 965 yards and four touchdowns. He needs just 35 yards to join current teammate **Nihja White** on the 1,000-yard receiving club. He would be just the 26th UD player to reach that mark.

- Delaware sophomore **Travis Hawkins**, who is questionable this week after suffering a concussion in last week's loss to Rhode Island, leads the CAA and ranks No. 10 nationally in passes defended with 1.50 per game. The first-year Maryland transfer leads the Blue Hens with three interceptions and with nine pass breakups.

HENS STINGY ON KICKOFF RETURNS

Delaware moved up to No. 3 in the nation and remained No. 1 in the Colonial Athletic Association in kickoff return defense this week as the Hens have allowed opponents to average just 16.66 yards on 38 returns this season.

Thanks to the leg of kickoff specialist **Sean Baner** and an inspired coverage team, no opponent has returned a kickoff longer than 44 yards this season.

Sacred Heart leads the nation in the category, allowing opponents just 15.81 yards per kickoff return while Morgan State is second at 16.63 yards per return.

Towson ranks No. 31 in the nation and No. 4 in the CAA on kickoff returns, averaging 22.3 yards per return.

HENS HAVE ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULES YET AGAIN

Year in and year out, the University of Delaware football squad always has one of the toughest rated scheduled in the nation at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision level.

Delaware dropped to No. 41 in strength of schedule this week after ranking in the top five the first five weeks of the season.

Heading into this week's game vs. Towson, Delaware's opponents have a cumulative winning pct. of .468.

Villanova and Rhode Island are tied for the most difficult schedule with opponents putting together a combined winning pct. of .628. Lafayette is at No. 3 at .623 followed by Holy Cross (.600) and Chattanooga (.600) in the top five.

Towson's schedule is ranked No. 24 at .520.

But Donnelly accomplished a feat that those six NFL players were unable to accomplish.

Donnelly joined a short list that includes **Rick Scully** (3-0 start in 1980), **Bill Vergantino** (3-0 in 1989), and **Dale Fry** (5-0 in 1991 and 1993) among Blue Hen quarterbacks who have won their first three starts.

Since taking over the starting quarterback spot from **Trevor Sasek**, Donnelly has been solid.

A former walk-on, Donnelly is 4-2 as a starter, having led the Hens to wins of 28-17 over West Chester, 45-0 over Delaware State, and 27-17 over Old Dominion before falling for the first time on Oct. 1 vs. Maine. He rebounded, leading the Hens to a 21-0 win over William & Mary thanks to two his scoring passes. The Hens then dropped a 21-10 decision to UMass on Oct. 15.

Donnelly gave up his starting spot to Sasek this past week vs. Rhode Island but still played most of the game when Sasek went down with a season-ending knee injury in the first half. That injury puts Donnelly back into the starting lineup.

Donnelly has completed 137 of 215 passes for 1,394 yards and 11 touchdowns this season with nine interceptions. He ranks No. 5 in the CAA in passing rating (126.70).

He had thrown 55 straight passes without an interception before being picked off in the first quarter vs. Maine on Oct. 1.

BLUE HENS RANK IN TOP 10 NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

Delaware's average attendance at Delaware Stadium has taken a slight dip from previous seasons after five games this season, but the Blue Hens are still the envy of most every NCAA Division I FCS program in the nation.

Delaware's home game average attendance now stands at 18,821 after five games, ranking the Blue Hens No. 9 nationally among 116 schools in average attendance.

Appalachian State leads the nation with an average home attendance of 26,687 while James Madison leads the CAA with an average of 24,979 fans per game (No. 3 nationally).

Delaware is the only school in the nation at the FCS level that has averaged over 20,000 fans per regular season home game each of the last 12 seasons.

The Blue Hens drew a Parents & Family Weekend crowd of 21,902 on Oct. 15, a season-high and the fourth largest FCS crowd in the nation for the week.

BLUE HENS GETTING THEIR KICKS FROM FIRST-YEAR SPECIALISTS

The Blue Hen kicking game has been solid this season behind a pair of first-year regulars in sophomore kicker **Sean Baner** and junior punter **Rauley Zaragoza**.

Although he handled only kickoff chores last season as a true freshman, Baner added placements duties to his repertoire this fall after beating out second team All-CAA selection **Mike Perry** for those duties.

Baner has been impressive, converting all 21 of his extra point attempts and hitting 10 of his 14 field goal attempts. He ranks second on the team in scoring with 51 points and is No. 3 in the CAA and No. 28 nationally in field goals per game (1.25).

He also serves as the backup punter and saw his first

action of the season there vs. UMass on Oct. 15, getting off a 38-yarder from the end zone on his only attempt.

Baner enjoyed his biggest game vs. Old Dominion on Sept. 24 when he tied a school record with four field goals on a school-record six attempts. He converted kicks from 40, 39, 20, and 43 yards on the day with his final 43-yard boot with 42 seconds left icing the win.

His four field goals tied the UD record set by All-American **Jon Striefsky** vs. Navy in 2009 and his six attempts broke the previous mark of five by **Brad Shushman** vs. New Hampshire in 2003.

Baner converted both of his field goal attempts last week vs. Rhode Island, including a career-high tying 47-yarder.

Zaragoza, a first-year team member who played at Citrus (Calif.) College the last two seasons, has averaged 39.4 yards per punt on 37 attempts this season and ranks No. 5 in the CAA in that category.

The rugby style kicker who punts with either foot, enjoyed an outstanding game vs. ODU, averaging 43.6 yards on five punts and placing three punts inside the opponent 20-yard line. He also had a career-long 60-yard punt. He averaged 44.8 yards per punt on four attempts vs. William & Mary on Oct. 8, bouncing back from a blocked punt on his first attempt of the night.

For the season, he has placed 13 of his 37 punts (35.1 percent) inside the opponent 20-yard line and owns five punts of 50 or more yards.

FIVE TRUE FRESHMEN SEE TIME

Five true freshmen have seen action for the Blue Hens so far this season, including middle linebacker **Patrick Callaway**, who started his sixth straight game last week vs. Rhode Island.

He collected a career-high 10 tackles to rank second on the team in the 27-17 win over Old Dominion on Sept. 24.

Callaway got the start when outside linebacker **Jessel Curry** suffered a concussion vs. West Chester Sept. 10. That moved regular MLB **Paul Worriow** to the outside and Callaway has stayed in the middle. Callaway now has 26 stops on the season to rank No. 8 on the team.

WR/KR **Michael Johnson** has seen backup action in seven games and saw his most extensive action last week vs. Rhode Island when he caught two passes for five yards, returned seven kickoffs for 141 yards with a long return of 29 yards, posted a tackle, recovered a fumble on a kickoff, and ran once for a six-yard loss.

Johnson has now ran four times for 24 yards (6.0 avg.), caught two passes for five yards, and averaged 20.8 yards on nine kickoff returns. His long return this season is a 31-yarder against Massachusetts.

Tight end **Nick Boyle** has played in four games with two starts this season, getting his first career start vs. UMass on Oct. 15 and starting again this past week vs. Rhode Island due to the injury to starter Colin Naugle. Boyle caught an 11-yard pass vs. Maine in his collegiate debut on Oct. 1 and hauled in his first career touchdown catch vs. UMass with an 14-yard catch from **Tim Donnelly** in the second quarter.

Also for the Hens, LB **Derek Battle** has seen action on special teams in all eight games and has three tackles on the season and backup defensive tackle **Logan Shultz** has played in two games.

SCORE FIRST AND THINGS WILL BE FINE.....

That has usually been the case for the Blue Hens of late. Delaware was a dominant team early on last season, outscoring opponent 94-34 in the first quarter and 242-80 in the first half. The Hens scored first in 12 of the team's 15 games.

Delaware had won 12 straight games when scoring first before the NCAA championship game loss to Eastern Washington last January.

Still the Hens have won 19 of their last 21 games since 2009 when getting on the board first. Delaware teams are 57-14 (.803) when they score first in head coach **K.C. Keeler's** 10 seasons at the helm.

This season, Delaware is 3-0 when scoring first and have outscored opponents 128-82 in the first half.

At home this season, the Hens have outscored opponents 45-28 in the opening stanza and 93-38 in the first half.

IMPRESSIVE PUNT STREAK ENDS

Delaware is breaking in a new punter this season after the graduation of two-year regular and 2010 All-CAA selection **Ed Wagner**. Also gone is four-year deep snapper **Zack Reed**.

Junior **Rauley Zaragoza** has handled all the punting chores with junior tight end **Corey Olsen** handling the deep snapping chores.

Delaware had gone 301 straight punt attempts without having a kick blocked since the 2005 season vs. William & Mary. However, the streak, which covered 70 games, was snapped vs. William & Mary back on Oct. 8 when the Tribe blocked Zaragoza's first attempt of the game in the first quarter.

YET ANOTHER WINNING RECORD; HENS REACH 12-WIN MARK...AGAIN

The Blue Hens have posted a winning record seven times in nine seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, failing to reach the .500 mark just twice when the team went 5-6 in 2006 and 4-8 in 2008.

But the Hens have more than made up for those two down years, advancing to the NCAA Tournament four times under Keeler, winning the national title in 2003 and finishing as national runner-up in both 2007 and 2010.

Along the way, the Hens have also captured three conference titles, earning the Lambert Cup Trophy three times, and the ECAC Team of the Year three times.

Delaware has not suffered back-to-back losing seasons since 1938-39, a milestone that few college teams in the nation at any level - and none in the CAA - can match. The Hens have reached 12 wins seven times in school history, most recently in 2010.

Delaware posted a 7-0 start for the ninth time in school history last season and for the second time under Keeler. The Hens started out 9-0 on the way to the 2003 national championship campaign.

QUICK SEASON PREVIEW

The Blue Hens look primed for another NCAA playoff run in 2011 as head coach **K.C. Keeler** welcomes back 11 starters and 44 letterwinners from a squad that went 12-3 and advanced to the national championship game in 2010.

Offensively, the Hens must replace All-American quarterback **Pat Devlin**, who earned CAA Offensive Player of the Year laurels and is currently with the Miami Dolphins.

But the loses on the offensive side of the ball don't go much further than that as the Hens return four starting offensive linemen - including three pre-season All-Americans in guard **Gino Gradkowski**, **Shea Allard**, and **Rob McDowell**.

Sophomore **Andrew Pierce**, the 2010 CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year who compiled 1,655 yards on the ground, is back to lead a run game that returns the top three rushers while All-CAA tight end **Colin Naugle** and top returning receiver, **Nihja White** (60 receptions) are also back.

Things are not quite as bright on the defensive side of the ball where Keeler returns just three full-time starters from a squad that was the top unit in the country, leading the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game and ranking No. 4 in total defense (280.7 yards per game).

The Hens must replace four All-CAA defensive backs, including All-Americans **Anthony Walters** and **Anthony Bratton**, but do welcome back a pair of All-CAA performers in DE **Michael Atunrase** and LB **Paul Worriflow**. Also returning to the starting lineup is OLB **Andrew Harrison**.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Thanks to last season's national runner-up finish and the return of 11 starters, including seven on offense, the Blue Hens have earned some impressive pre-season accolades. The Hens appear in the Top 10 in virtually every pre-season Top 25 poll and have been picked No. 3 in the pre-season Colonial Athletic Association poll.

Blue Hen defensive leader **Nick Rapone** and third-year offensive head man **Jim Hoffer** have combined for an incredible 60 years of college coaching experience - each with 30 campaigns under their belts - including 24 years as coordinators.

Hoffer served as head coach at his alma mater, Cornell, in 1990-97 and at Buffalo in 2001-05. Together they have coached over 620 games on the college level.

Rapone, whose 2010 defensive led the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game, earned an impressive honor in 2010 when he was selected NCAA Division I FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com.

HOW ABOUT THAT '10 DEFENSE

The 2010 season was quite a campaign, especially for the Blue Hen defense that ranked among the top units in the country.

Delaware led the nation in scoring defense (12.1 points per game) and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in turnover margin (4th/+1.13), total defense (5th, 280.7), passing efficiency (9th/148.49), and passing efficiency defense (9th/102.7).

Delaware's scoring defense of 12.1 points per game was the best mark by a UD defense since 1982 when opponents averaged just 11.6 points per game.

A BLUE HEN IN THE WHITE HOUSE...AND AT DELAWARE STADIUM

When U.S. President **Barack Obama** and running mate, former Delaware Senator **Joe Biden**, won the 2008 presidential election, it was big news. And even bigger news for the citizens of Delaware and those affiliated with UD.

A 1965 graduate of the University of Delaware with degrees in history and political science, Biden played on the Blue Hen freshman football team in 1961 under head coach **Scotty Duncan**. Biden, a member of the UD Wall of Fame and an ardent Delaware football fan, considered himself "a half-baked halfback" during his brief UD football career.

Biden made his first visit to Delaware Stadium as Vice-President on Saturday, Oct. 9, 2009 as he attended the Maine game and sat with UD President **Patrick Harker** and current New Jersey Governor **Chris Christie** (also a UD graduate) throughout the entire contest.

He made another visit to Delaware Stadium in 2010 when he attended Delaware's 16-3 NCAA quarterfinal win over New Hampshire on Dec. 10. He also attended the Hens' 2010 national championship game in Frisco, Tex. with Christie and Delaware Gov. **Jack Markell**.

Biden met with head coach **K.C. Keeler** and members of the team on Sept. 19, 2008 when Biden's plane was parked on the same tarmac as the Delaware charter at New Castle County (Del.) prior to its trip to Furman.

Biden later made an appearance at the Blue Hens' game vs. Maine at Delaware Stadium on Oct. 11, 2008 and received a rousing applause while being mobbed by well-wishers.

VERY PRESIDENTIAL...

No less than six members of the University of Delaware football team have the same surnames as former U.S. Presidents, including the Hens' top two running backs - **Andrew Pierce** and **Dave Hayes**.

Other Blue Hens with presidential surnames are **Andrew Harrison**, **Leon Jackson**, **Bobby Kennedy**, and **Michael Johnson**.

ALL-TIME HIGH 11 BLUE HENS IN NFL CAMPS THIS SUMMER:

An all-time high of 11 former Blue Hen football players took part in National Football League camps this summer.

In addition to established veterans **Joe Flacco** (Baltimore) and **Mike Adams** (Cleveland), also in camps were free agents **Brandon Gilbeaux** (Tampa Bay), **Ronald Talley** (Arizona), **Matt Marcorelle** (Houston), **Anthony Walters** (Chicago), **Anthony Bratton** (Green Bay), **Pat Devlin** (Miami), **Tyrone Grant** (Washington), and **Josh Baker** (N.Y. Jets).

In addition, **Ben Patrick**, who played the last three seasons with Arizona, signed with the New York Giants this summer but has since retired.

All but Flacco and Adams were released by their teams but Devlin, Walters, Talley, and Baker have each signed on with their respective team's taxi squads.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. -- Navy quarterbacks have a history of big games against the University of Delaware. Senior Kriss Proctor added to that legacy as he ran for 176 yards and three touchdowns and passed for another score as the Mids spoiled the season opener for the Blue Hens.

The No. 5 ranked Blue Hens, last year's NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision national runner-up, were able to pile up 363 yards of offense but too many missed opportunities proved to be Delaware's undoing.

Sophomore All-American running back Andrew Pierce, the 2011 Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Year, led the way for the Hens, rushing for 119 yards and capping the scoring with a one-yard burst with 2:54 left that capped a 78-yard drive. The 100-yard effort was the eighth of Pierce's young career as a Blue Hen.

Quarterbacks Trevor Sasek and Tim Donnelly also showed signs of good things to come. Sasek, who started the game after winning a battle with Donnelly, completed 9 of 19 passes for 82 yards and scored the Hens' first touchdown on a 21-yard run before leaving the game in the second half with a knee contusion. Donnelly hit on 7 of 9 passes for 60 yards.

Proctor, a first-year starter for the Mids, broke away on a 75-yard scoring jaunt on just the fourth play of the game and later scored on runs of 27 yards in the third quarter and one-yard early in the final stanza. He also hit Aaron Santiago on a 12-yard scoring toss midway through the final stanza to push the Navy lead to 40-10.

Delaware's defense, which lost eight starters and three All-Americans from a unit that led the nation in scoring defense a year ago when it gave up just 12.1 points per game, allowed its highest point total since a 41-7 setback to CAA foe James Madison in 2008.

Navy, which went 9-4 a year ago and advanced to the Poinsettia Bowl, always features one of the most explosive running attacks in NCAA Division I football and this year will be no different. The Mids' triple-option attack piled up 391 yards rushing and 437 yards total.

NEWARK, Del. -- All-American RB Andrew Pierce needed just two plays to cover 56 yards and his 44-yard touchdown vault early in the final stanza was just what the No. 8 Hens needed to pull away for a hard-fought victory in the home opener.

The Blue Hens (1-1) jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead after scoring two touchdowns in a span of just 17 seconds and held off the Golden Ram comeback. The Hens upended their nearby NCAA Division II rivals for the 17th straight time since 1993 but the margin of victory was the smallest since a 24-17 triumph in 1996.

Pierce, the 2010 CAA Rookie of the Year, ran 25 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns to lead the attack. He also caught a career-high seven passes for 32 yards during the game.

The game looked like it would be a blowout early on as the Hens scored three touchdowns in the first stanza to take a 21-0 lead. Sophomore LB Jessel Curry, a first-year transfer from Auburn, made his Delaware Stadium debut memorable as he rambled 34 yards with an interception return to open the scoring just over six minutes into the contest.

Pierce scored his first touchdown of the night when he ran seven yards and leaped into the end zone with 34 seconds left in the stanza for a 14-0 lead. Just 17 seconds later, the lead was up to 21-0 as Irv Titre recovered a bad snap at the West Chester 28-yard line to set up Donnelly's first career touchdown pass, a 28-yarder to a wide-open Mark Schenauer.

However, the Rams held tough and never let the Hens pull away. Rondell White got the Rams on the board with a two-yard scoring run just under two minutes into the second stanza, ending a streak of nine quarters and 143 minutes that Delaware had held West Chester without a point in the series. The Rams (0-2) pulled to within 21-10 on 27-yard field goal by Shawn Leo.

Following a scoreless third quarter, West Chester pulled to within 21-17 with 10:56 left in the final quarter as backup QB Matt Carroll scrambled out of the pocket and hit LaRonn Lee with a 14-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone.

But the Hens quickly put a damper on the Rams' upset plans. After Travis Hawkins returned the kickoff 38 yards to the Delaware 44-yard line, Pierce took over. He ran for 12 yards on first down and then broke loose on his pivotal 44-yard scoring run down the right side on the next play to give Delaware some breathing room with 10:10 remaining.

Delaware locked up the win as they burned 5:15 off the clock with an 11-play drive and then got the ball back when Leon Jackson intercepted a with 3:13 left.

NEWARK, Del. -- This rivalry game was over early as No. 7 Delaware clicked on every cylinder, jumping out to a 35-0 halftime lead and posting a big victory over in-state foe Delaware State.

Tim Donnelly was nearly flawless, completing 13 of 14 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns, backs Andrew Pierce and Walter Davis each went over the 100-yard mark, and Nihja White caught seven passes for 122 yards to lead an offense that piled up 512 yards of total offense. Davis (108 yards) surpassed the mark for the first time.

Donnelly, who completed his first seven passes, was selected as the Nate Beasley MVP for the game. Donnelly's .928 passing percentage was the second best in school history, trailing only an 11 for 11 performance by Bill Vergantino vs. Towson in 1992. His 272.6 passing rating was the sixth best mark in UD history.

The two schools, the state's only NCAA Division I institutions and located 45 miles apart, never met on the football field until a 44-7 NCAA playoff win by the Blue Hens in 2007. The teams met again in 2009 with Delaware claiming a hard-fought 27-17 victory.

The Delaware defense was just as dominating as the Blue Hens held the Hornets (2-1) to just four first downs and 112 total yards while forcing three turnovers, including a 32-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jake Giusti that extended the lead to 28-0 in the second quarter. The Hornets produced -3 yard rushing for the night and were 0 for 10 on third downs.

Pierce carried 15 times for 106 yards and scored three touchdowns, including a seven-yard scamper with 11:25 left in the third quarter that pushed him over 100 yards for the game and over 2,000 for his career. He is the first Blue Hen runner to pass the 2,000-yard mark as a sophomore.

In addition to his 11-yard touchdown reception, White set up Pierce's one-yard scoring dive midway through the second quarter with a nifty career-long 59-yard grab off a perfect pass from Donnelly to the Delaware State one-yard line.

Delaware got things going early as Donnelly hit TE Colin Naugle all alone over the middle for a 43-yard scoring toss on the Hens' first possession and Pierce capped a season-long 96-yard march on the second drive of the game with a three-yard dive for a 14-0 lead first-quarter lead. The Hens controlled the ball for nearly 12 minutes in the opening stanza.

White hauled in an 11-yard touchdown pass from Donnelly just over a minute into the second stanza and Giusti followed with his fumble return for a score just three minutes later. A one-yard burst by Pierce with 7:58 left in the second quarter gave the Hens a 35-0 cushion at the break.

Unlike last week when the Hens let a 21-0 first quarter lead against West Chester vanish before holding off the Rams for a 28-17 victory, Delaware did not let up this time. Pierce's seven-yard scoring run with 11:25 left in the third quarter pushed the lead to 42-0 and Sean Baner's career-long 47-yard field goal with 4:44 left capped the scoring.

NEWARK, Del. -- Delaware overcame some early miscues to post the victory over league newcomer Old Dominion as Tim Donnelly's 32-yard touchdown pass to Rob Jones early in the final stanza put the No. 7 Blue Hens up for good.

ODU (3-1, 0-1 CAA), a first-year member of the CAA in only its third season of football, lost for the first time this season while the Hens (3-1, 1-0 CAA) won their third straight.

Donnelly, the national leader with an 80 percent pass completion mark, continued his hot play as he completed 26 of 39 passes for 304 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winning toss to Jones with 9:29 left to play to help the Hens overcome a 17-16 deficit.

Delaware gave up a touchdown off a bad punt snap, had a field goal blocked, and fumbled the ball away deep inside ODU territory in the first quarter to go down early.

Donnelly hooked up with Jones on the first play from scrimmage after Travis Hawkins had returned a kickoff 60 yards to ODU 32-yard line. Donnelly found Jones across the middle and junior receiver just barely got into the end zone for the score. Donnelly then connected with Nihja White on the two-point conversion to give Delaware some breathing room at 24-17.

Delaware then put the final touches on the win as kicker Sean Baner booted his school-record tying fourth field goal of the game with 42 seconds left from 43 yard out to push the margin to 27-17. Baner, who tied the UD record of four field goals in a game set by Jon Striefsky vs. Navy in 2009, earlier had converted kicks from 20, 39, and 40 yards.

The Monarchs, who were held under 40 points for the first time this season and to 24 points under their scoring average, had taken the lead when QB Thomas DeMarco hit Antonio Vaughan on a nine-yard scoring strike with 9:50 left in the game to complete an 81-yard drive that was highlighted by a 15-yard run by punter Jonathan Plisco off a fake on fourth down play at their own 23-yard line. Plisco, an All-American, also averaged 48.6 yards on seven punts on the day.

Delaware, however, came right back with Hawkins' 60-yard kickoff return, Donnelly's scoring toss to Jones, and Baner's record-tying field goal to put the game away.

ODU took the early lead when Chris Lovitt recovered a bad snap on a punt by Delaware and returned the fumble 18 yards for a 7-0 lead. But Delaware came back, using two Baner field goals, including a 40-yarder that was set up by a Marcus Burley interception, and a seven-yard scoring strike from Donnelly to White 42 seconds before halftime to take a 13-7 into the break.

ORONO, Maine -- Delaware took a three-point lead late in the third quarter on a 13-yard touchdown run by Andrew Pierce, but host Maine scored the final 17 points of the game as the Black Bears won their CAA opener at rain-soaked Alford Stadium.

No. 6 ranked Delaware (3-2, 1-1 CAA) had its three-game winning streak snapped and lost for just the fourth time in 14 trips to Orono. The Blue Hens had won two straight over Maine, and had taken three of their last four trips to Alford Stadium.

The Black Bears (3-1, 1-0 CAA), whose only loss this season came by six points to Big East opponent Pittsburgh, gave head coach Jack Cosgrove his 100th career victory in his 19th season at Maine with their second straight victory.

Maine enjoyed a big 477-278 advantage in total offense as running back Pushaun James ran for 193 yards and three touchdowns, including two scores in the final stanza as the Black Bears pulled away. Maine quarterback Warren Smith was equally adept, completing 18 of 27 passes for 264 yards and a touchdown. The Black Bears had four plays go for 37 or more yards from scrimmage, including a 70-yard jaunt by Jones that set up a fourth quarter score.

Delaware quarterback Tim Donnelly lost for the first time in four career starts as he was intercepted four times on the day, including twice in the final stanza as the Hens were thwarted in their final quarter comeback attempt.

Pierce rushed for 120 yards and a touchdown to lead the Blue Hen running game and also caught eight passes for 34 yards on the day.

In a game that featured four lead changes, Maine struck first as Brown scored his first touchdown of the day on a 26-yard romp with 6:31 left in the opening stanza. But Delaware came back to take a 10-7 lead into intermission as Donnelly hit tight end Colin Naugle with a 16-yard over-the-shoulder catch in the end zone just over a minute into the second quarter and Sean Baner connected on a 46-yard field goal just over two minutes later.

Maine regained the lead on a 37-yard scoring pass over the middle from Smith to Damarr Aultman with 8:58 left in the third stanza, but Delaware answered again as Pierce scored on a 13-yard burst around the right side with 3:40 left in the third quarter for a 17-14 UD lead.

The rest of night belonged to the Black Bears as Brown scored on an 18-yard run on the first play of the fourth quarter to give Maine the lead for good at 21-17 and added a five-yard scoring run six minutes later.

NEWARK, Del. -- No. 13 Delaware bounced back in a big way as the Blue Hens held No. 9 William & Mary scoreless for the first time in 14 years and posted a rare CAA shutout.

The Blue Hens (4-2, 2-1 CAA), who extended their home winning streak to seven games and won for the 14th time in the last 15 outings at Delaware Stadium, held the Tribe (3-3, 1-2 CAA) to just 11 first downs and 210 total yards for the game. William & Mary, annually one of the league's top offensive teams, was shutout for the first time in 154 games since Delaware knocked off the Tribe 14-0 during the 1997 season at Delaware Stadium.

Delaware bounced back from a 31-17 loss at Maine the previous week, a game in which the Hens had a three-game win streak snapped as the Hens allowed 477 total yards and gave up numerous big plays to the Black Bears.

All-American RB Andrew Pierce led the Blue Hen offensive attack as he rushed 28 times for a season-high 143 yards and scored on a four-year burst early in the second quarter to give the Hens a 14-0 lead. He went over the 100-yard mark for the fifth time in six games this season and for the 12th time in 21 career games at Delaware. He also moved into ninth place on the all-time UD rushing list with 2,287 yards, passing Norman Coleman (2,215 yards in 1993-96). Pierce also caught a game-high seven passes for 26 yards.

QB Tim Donnelly, who had a rough outing last week vs. Maine when he threw four interceptions, also rebounded well for the Hens as he completed 16 of 24 passes for 124 yards and tossed scoring passes of 29 yards to senior Bobby Russo in the first quarter and 11 yards to Nihja White in the fourth quarter to put the game away. For Russo, it was his first career touchdown. Donnelly engineered two scoring drives that went for 90 or more yards.

Delaware's defense posted its second shutout of the season and its second in league play in the last two seasons. The Hens shutdown Delaware State 45-0 back on Sept. 17 of this season and downed league foe Towson 48-0 last November, both at Delaware Stadium. Junior linebacker Paul Worrielow paced the Hens defense with 11 tackles and Andrew Harrison and Travis Hawkins each intercepted a pass. The Tribe did not have a drive go longer than 49 yards and none lasted longer than 4:08. William & Mary had only five drives go past midfield and never got closer than the Delaware 17-yard line.

William & Mary's Michael Paulus got the start for the Tribe, filling in for starter Michael Graham, who missed the game with an illness. Paulus completed just 10 of 24 passes for 84 yards and two interceptions before being relieved by Brent Caprio, who was 5 of 8 for 50 yards. William & Mary senior RB Jonathan Grimes, who shared CAA Pre-Season Player of the Year honors with Pierce, was held to just 47 yards rushing on 15 carries.

NEWARK, Del. -- Delaware's largest first quarter deficit in over 30 years proved to be insurmountable as the No. 9 Hens allowed three first quarter touchdowns and dropped a 21-10 decision.

Massachusetts (4-2), a former Colonial Athletic Association member who is headed to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision level next year as a member of the Mid-American Conference, scored on its first three drives of the day.

UMass, which won its second straight game, got short scoring runs from Jonathan Hernandez and Julian Talley and a six-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kellen Pagel to Emil Igwenagu, all in the opening 13 minutes of action, and never looked back.

Delaware (4-3, 2-2 CAA), coming off a solid 21-0 victory over then No. 9 William & Mary a week earlier, lost the shutout in the first two minutes of the game this time and could never put together enough offense to catch up.

The 21-0 deficit was the largest margin the Hens have trailed by in the opening stanza since falling behind Temple 24-0 on the way to a 45-0 loss in 1975. Coming into the game, the Hens had allowed just 17 total first half points in four home contests this season.

The Blue Hens had six more first downs and just 13 less yards than the Minutemen, but were pinned back in their own territory almost the entire game and were hurt by three turnovers. All 15 of the Blue Hens' drives started inside their own territory, and thanks to well-placed punts by Massachusetts, had one drive start on the one-yard line and another on the two-yard line.

Pagel completed 20 of 39 passes for 245 yards and one touchdown while Hernandez rushed for a team-high 69 yards on 15 carries. The UMass defense, led by 2010 CAA Defensive Player of the Year Tyler Holmes at linebacker, recorded five sacks, broke up eight passes, collected two interceptions, and forced two fumbles. Holmes recorded a team-high 10 tackles while Darren Thellen had five tackles and intercepted two passes for the second straight week.

Delaware' seven-game win streak, the fourth longest current home win streak in the NCAA Division I FCS, came to an end as the Hens lost for the first time since a 28-21 overtime setback to CAA foe Villanova last Nov. 20. Delaware lost for just the second time in its last 16 home games dating back to 2009 and fell for just the fourth time in 16 meetings all-time vs. UMass in Newark.

Blue Hen quarterback Tim Donnelly completed 14 of 30 passes for 155 yards and a touchdown but threw two interceptions and was sacked twice. Nihja White caught six passes for 85 yards while running back Andrew Pierce picked up 85 yards on 23 carries.

Delaware scored its only points in the second quarter when Tim Donnelly hit freshman tight Nick Boyle on a 14-yard scoring pass with 9:34 left in the stanza and Sean Baner capped a 74-yard drive with a 27-yard field goal with 58 seconds left before intermission.

KINGSTON, R.I. -- Multiple mistakes by Delaware proved to be too much to overcome as the Blue Hens dropped a 38-34 Colonial Athletic Association football setback at Meade Stadium.

The No. 16 ranked Blue Hens (4-4, 2-3 CAA) did force four turnovers on the day, turning two of them into first half scores, but three turnovers of their own and two big mental mistakes in the final quarter proved to be Delaware's undoing.

Delaware dropped its second straight game and remained winless in three road games this season. Rhode Island, which has endured several tough-luck losses throughout the season, losing four games by nine points or less, put an end to its three-game losing streak and improved to 2-5 (1-3 CAA), sending its Homecoming crowd away happy.

A game that featured three ties and four lead changes typically wasn't decided until late as Delaware rallied from a two-touchdown deficit in the final quarter but couldn't complete the deal.

Rhode Island broke a 21-21 tie with two scores in the first five minutes of the final quarter as Brandon Johnson-Farrell hauled in a 13-yard scoring pass from Bob Bentsen on the second play of the final quarter and De'ontray Johnson followed three minutes later with a 12-yard burst to give Rhody a 35-21 lead with 11:21 remaining. Johnson's touchdown was set up when Ram linebacker Dave Zocco intercepted a pass at the URI 40-yard line.

The Blue Hens cut the gap to 35-28 on a two-yard scoring run by sophomore All-American Andrew Pierce, his second of the day, with 8:06 left, and the Hens had a chance to even things but couldn't get it done.

Rhode Island extended the same fourth quarter drive twice thanks to UD miscues, setting up a game-clinching 39-yard field goal by Louis Feinstein - his fourth of the day - with 1:19 left to play. Rob Jones fumbled a Feinstein punt on the URI 46-yard line with 5:56 left to play and Zocco recovered. Minutes later, the Hens were called for offsides on a fourth-and-one, extending a drive.

Delaware quarterback Tim Donnelly, who replaced injured starter Trevor Sasek (knee) in the first half, hit on 16 of 27 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns. Nihja White caught six passes for 90 yards and a score and Pierce finished the day with 22 carries for 80 yards and two touchdowns.
