KEELER-BLOUNT SQUARE OFF AGAIN

Tonight will not be the first time that Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler** and rookie Delaware State head coach **Kermit Blount** square off here at Delaware Stadium. Keeler was a sophomore linebacker and Blount was a junior quarterback in 1978 when the Blue Hens posted a dominating 41-0 victory over Winston-Salem State in the NCAA Division II semifinals. Blount threw for 126 yards while Keeler posted six tackles, including one on Blount. Delaware held Winston-Salem to just 11 first downs and 162 total yards to advance to the national title game.

NEWARK, Del. -- The University of Delaware held football bragging rights in the state after posting a 27-17 victory over Delaware State in the inaugural First State Cup matchup at sun-splashed Delaware Stadium.

But it wasn't easy.

Delaware junior quarterback **Pat Devlin** ran for two scores and threw for 227 yards, including a fourth quarter touchdown to freshman **Rob Jones**, and the stingy Blue Hen defense held the Delaware State offense to just one touchdown on the day as the Hens (2-1) outlasted the Hornets (0-2) in the first-ever regular season matchup between the two teams. The game drew a spirited crowd of 20,585.

Dubbed The First State Cup in a state-wide naming contest, the games featured the state's only NCAA Division I football programs. The team met for only the second time following Delaware's 44-7 NCAA first round playoff win over Delaware State in 2007. Delaware was awarded the trophy in a post-game ceremony.

This time the game was much closer as the Hens came away with a hard-earned win against the Hornets. Delaware increased its lead to 21-3 after Devlin's 17-yard scoring strike to Jones with 10:56 left to play, but the Hornets kept it close by scoring two touchdowns in the final 5:01. A three-yard touchdown run by **Leon Jackson** with 3:36 left gave the Blue Hens some insurance.

"This was a great football game," said Delaware head coach **K.C. Keeler**. "We have so much respect for Delaware State and this was a hard-fought win for our team. We were out of sync offensively in the first half but we came out and did a great job in the second half. There could have been some panic in our team because everyone was telling them all week that they should win this game. But we knew we were playing a good football team."

Devlin completed 19 of 29 passes for 227 yards and scored on one-yard sneaks with 7:41 left in the first quarter to open the scoring and again with 1:26 left in the third quarter to increase the lead to 14-3.

He completed all five of his pass attempts for 47 yards in leading a 59-yard march that culminated with his 17-yard scoring toss to Jones in the back of the left end zone early in the fourth quarter to increase the lead to 21-7.

FIRST STATE CUP

The University of Delaware and Delaware State University, the only NCAA Division I programs in the state of Delaware, will faceoff on the gridiron for only the third time in history and the second time during the regular season as they square off in the officially named: The First State Cup.

The First State Cup was adopted as the official name of the game after a name-it promotion was conducted by The News Journal and delawareonline.com during the summer of 2009.

The First State Cup Trophy will be presented to the winning team following the contest.

Delaware vs. Delaware State contests are scheduled to take place each year into the future.

Currently scheduled dates are Sept. 8, 2012, Sept. 7, 2013, and Sept. 6, 2014, all at Delaware Stadium. Specific dates for games after 2014 will be announced at a later date.

NATE BEASLEY GAME MVP AWARD

For the first time, the most outstanding player in this year's Delaware-Delaware State matchup will receive the Nate Beasley MVP Award.

Media members who cover the game will have the opportunity to place their vote for the game Most Valuable Player Award and select the winner.

The MVP award will now be presented each year as part of the post-game ceremonies that will also include the presentation of the First State Cup Trophy to the head coach and captains of the winning team.

The award is named in honor of the late **Nate Beasley**, a standout running back for the Blue Hens in 1973-75 who started his playing career at Delaware State.

A native of Dover, Del., Beasley will be inducted into the University of Delaware Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 23. He was previously inducted into the Delaware Afro-American Hall of Fame in 2009. He passed away in 2011.

Beasley's punishing running helped him rank No. 2 all-time at Delaware with 2,697 career rushing yards. The 1976 Delaware graduate was a two-time All-East selection and earned third team All-American honors in 1974.

Beasley's wife, Romaine, will help present the award on the field following the game.

LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE

NEWARK, Del. (Sept. 10) -- All-American RB **Andrew Pierce** needed just two plays to cover 56 yards and his 44-yard touchdown vault early in the final stanza was just what the No. 8 Hens needed to pull away for a hard-fought 28-17 victory over West Chestere in the home opener Saturday night at Delaware Stadium.

The Blue Hens (1-1) jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead after scoring two touchdowns in a span of just 17 seconds and held off the Golden Ram comeback. The Hens upended their nearby NCAA Division II rivals for the 17th straight time since 1993 but the margin of victory was the smallest since a 24-17 triumph in 1996.

Pierce (**above**), the 2010 CAA Rookie of the Year, ran 25 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns to lead the attack. He also caught a career-high seven passes for 32 yards during the game.

The game looked like it would be a blowout early on as the Hens scored three touchdowns in the first stanza to take a 21-0 lead. Sophomore LB **Jessel Curry**, a first-year transfer from Auburn, made his Delaware Stadium debut memorable as

he rambled 34 yards with an interception return to open the scoring just over six minutes into the contest.

Pierce scored his first touchdown of the night when he ran seven yards and leaped into the end zone with 34 seconds left in the stanza for a 14-0 lead. Just 17 seconds later, the lead was up to 21-0 as Irv Titre recovered a bad snap at the West Chester 28-yard line to set up Donnelly's first career touchdown pass, a 28-yarder to a wide-open **Mark Schenauer**.

However, the Rams held tough and never let the Hens pull away. Rondell White got the Rams on the board with a two-yard scoring run just under two minutes into the second stanza, ending a streak of nine quarters and 143 minutes that Delaware had held West Chester without a point in the series. The Rams (0-2) pulled to within 21-10 on 27-yard field goal by Shawn Leo.

Following a scoreless third quarter, West Chester pulled to within 21-17 with 10:56 left in the final quarter as backup QB Matt Carroll scrambled out of the pocket and hit LaRonn Lee with a 14-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone.

But the Hens quickly but a damper on the Rams' upset plans. After Travis Hawkins returned the kickoff 38 yards to the Delaware 44-yard line, Pierce took over. He ran for 12 yards on first down and then broke loose on his pivotal 44-yard scoring run down the right side on the next play to give Delaware some breathing room with 10:10 remaining.

Delaware locked up the win as they burned 5:15 off the clock with an 11-play drive and then got the ball back when Leon Jackson intercepted a with 3:13 left.

LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE STATE

DOVER, Del. (Sept. 10) -- Delaware State appeared headed for defeat against Shaw University, but a generous play call by the Bears, a big defensive play, and a touchdown pass in a driving rain storm with 35 seconds left resulted in a stunning 31-27 victory for the Hornets in a wild contest at Alumni Stadium Saturday evening.

Shaw (0-2) led by as many as 18 points in the second half before the Hornets stormed back to improve to 2-0.

Delaware State trailed 27-24 when freshman Mitchell Ward missed a potential game-tying 33-yard field goal attempt in a downpour with 1:01 left to play, setting off a jubilant celebration along the Shaw sideline.

With just one timeout remaining, the Hornets needed a miracle to avoid a home loss to the Division II Bears. After a delay of game penalty against Shaw, the Bears attempted a running play on their next snap.

Delaware State defensive end Olusegun Ayanbiola stripped the wet ball from Shaw running back James Langford, and recovered the fumble at the Bears' 13-yard line with 49 seconds left in the game.

Two plays later, Nick Elko connected with wide receiver Darius Jackson on a 13-yard touchdown pass to give the Hornets a 30-27 lead with 35 seconds left. Ward's extra point kick gave DSU a four-point lead.

Shaw was hit with a holding penalty, and threw an incomplete pass on its final possession.

Jackson had career-highs in receiving yards (127) and touchdown grabs (2), while tying his career mark with 11 receptions, which also ties a team record for catches in a game.

Elko shook off a shaky first half to complete 25-of-46 passes for 238 yards, each a career-high. He threw three touchdowns for the second straight game, including two in the last 5:10 of the contest. The redshirt junior was 10-for-18 with three interceptions in the first half.

Delaware State led 6-0 after a five-yard touchdown pass from Elko to Justin Wilson with 11:41 left in the first quarter. Wilson, the 2011 MEAC Preseason Player-of-the-Year, had six catches for 32 yards before leaving the game for good in the third quarter with an ankle injury.

Shaw responded by scoring 17 unanswered points to take a 17-6 lead at halftime. The Bears opened up a 24-6 lead when Langford returned the second half kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown.

Delaware State began its comeback when Ward hit a 35-yard field goal to pull the Hornets to within 24-9 with 10:58 left in the third quarter.

DSU moved closer when Jaashawn Jones capped off an 11-play, 64-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter. Ward's extra point kick cut Shaw's lead to 24-16 with 14:57 left to play.

The Bears stretched their lead to 27-16 when Lyncon Shepherd hit a 32-yard field goal with 9:23 left to play.

Delaware State answered with an eight-play, 80-yard touchdown drive to pull to within a field goal. Elko and Jackson capped off the drive with an eight-yard scoring pass to cut Shaw's lead to 27-24 with 5:10 remaining in the game.

The Hornets outscored the Bears 22-3 in the fourth quarter. DSU's 15-point fourth-quarter deficit was its largest in a victory since overcoming an 18-point hole to defeat Norfolk State 28-21 in OT to capture the MEAC title in 2007.

BLUE HEN TOUCHDOWN CLUB AWARD WINNERS

Sophomore RB **Andrew Pierce** and junior LB **Leon Jackson** are the Blue Hen Touchdown Most Valuable Players for the West Chester game Saturday night.

Pierce won the Offensive MVP Award while Jackson won the Special Teams MVP Award for the second straight week. No Defensive MVP Award was selected.

The two players are scheduled to receive their awards at the Blue Hen Touchdown Club Luncheon this Friday, Sept. 16, at the Bob Carpenter Center Lounge at 12 noon.

Pierce (Bridgeton, N.J.) ran 25 times for 123 yards and scored two touchdowns, including a 44-yard scamper with 10:10 left to play that gave the Hens some breathing room and extended the lead to 28-17. He also caught a career-high seven passes for 32 yards. The MVP award is his fourth in just two seasons at Delaware.

Jackson (Gainesville, Fla.) was all over the field on Saturday night, seeing action at a slot back on offense, playing linebacker on defense, and taking part in special teams.

He finished the night with four tackles and his first career interception ended a West Chester drive with 3:13 left to play and helped preserve the win.

QUICK SEASON PREVIEW

The Blue Hens look primed for another NCAA playoff run in 2011 as head coach **K.C. Keeler** welcomes back 11 starters and 44 letterwinners from a squad that went 12-3 and advanced to the national championship game in 2010.

Offensively, the Hens must replace All-American quarterback **Pat Devlin**, who earned CAA Offensive Player of the Year laurels and is currently with the Miami Dolphins.

But the losses on the offensive side of the ball don't go much further than that as the Hens return four starting offensive linemen - including three pre-season All-Americans in guard **Gino Gradkowski**, **Shea Allard**, and **Rob McDowell**.

Sophomore **Andrew Pierce**, the 2010 CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year who compiled 1,655 yards on the ground, is back to lead a run game that returns the top three rushers while All-CAA tight end **Colin Naugle** and top returning receiver, **Nihja White** (60 receptions) are also back.

Things are not quite as bright on the defensive side of the ball where Keeler returns just three full-time starters from a squad that was the top unit in the country, leading the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game and ranking No. 4 in total defense (280.7 yards per game).

The Hens must replace four All-CAA defensive backs, including All-Americans **Anthony Walters** and **Anthony Bratton**, but do welcome back a pair of All-CAA performers in DE **Michael Atunrase** and LB **Paul Worrirow**. Also returning to the starting lineup is OLB **Andrew Harrison**.

DELAWARE, DELAWARE STATE ROSTERS TOTAL 17 STATE RESIDENTS THIS YEAR

A total of 17 Delaware residents appear on the rosters for Delaware and Delaware State, including three - Delaware LB **Paul Worrirow** and DB **Brandon Cheaton** and Delaware State FS **Matt Scott** - who are scheduled to start Saturday's game.

Delaware's roster includes 10 Delaware natives in LB Paul Worrirow (Concord High), DB Blair Menefee (Hodgson), DB Josh Morris (Concord), RB Julian Laing (Timber Cree, NJ), DB Brandon Cheaton (Caravel), WR Rick Bell (Salesianum), OL Justin Glenn (A.I. duPont), OL Chad Davis (Newark), TE Corey Olsen (St. Mark's), and TE Bobby Kennedy (Caravel).

Delaware State's roster includes Delawareans in DB Matt Scott (Lake Forest), FB Jamar Beckett (Sussex Tech), LB Stewart Carey (Newark), DL Justin Benson-Reid (Cape Henlopen), OL Tyler Loomis (Lake Forest), WR Morris Frasier (Lake Forest), and DL Marklyn Bowe (Concord).

MILESTONES & STREAKS

- Senior C **Rob McDowell** and senior LB **Andrew Harrison** own the team's longest current starting streaks entering the Delaware State game. McDowell, who has started every game of his career for the Blue Hens, will start his 41st straight game while Harrison will earn his 29th straight starting nod vs. Delaware State.

- Sophomore RB **Andrew Pierce** upped his career rushing yardage total to 1,897 with a 123-yard effort vs. West Chester on Saturday night. He now needs just 103 yards to surpass the 2,000-yard mark that has been reached by only 15 other players in Delaware history.

- Senior RB **David Hayes** rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries Saturday vs. West Chester and reached the 1,000-yard mark for his career on his first carry of the night. He now has 1,049 career yards to become the 55th player in UD history to reach the mark.

- Junior WR **Nihja White** hauled in two passes vs. Navy and now has caught at least one pass in 24 straight games, the team's longest current pass reception streak and the eighth longest in school history. He also went over the 1,000-yard receiving yardage mark for his career and now has 1,004, becoming the 25th player in UD history to reach that impressive plateau. His 83 career receptions make him the team's active leader and he needs 17 catches to become the 15th Blue Hen to reach 100 for a career. White's streak was put on

hold last week as he missed the West Chester game with a hand injury but he is expected to return this week vs. Delaware State.

DELAWARE TOUGH IN HOME OPENERS

After Saturday night's 28-17 win over West Chester, Delaware is now 48-11 (.813) in home openers since Delaware Stadium opened in 1952 with the Blue Hens having won seven straight and 20 of their last 22 home debuts in these friendly confines.

Delaware is 9-1 in home openers under **K.C. Keeler** with the lone loss a 24-21 setback to New Hampshire in 2004.

DONNELLY TO START AGAIN AT QUARTERBACK:

Junior **Tim Donnelly** looked sharp in his first career start at quarterback Saturday night, leading the Hens to the 28-17 win over West Chester.

He completed 21 of 28 passes for 173 yards and tossed his first career touchdown pass to **Mark Schenauer**, a 28-yarder with 17 seconds left in the second quarter to give the Hens a 21-0 lead.

Donnelly will return to the starting spot this week with sophomore **Trevor Sasek** (knee injury) not expected to return until at least next week. Redshirt freshman **Justin Burns** will be Donnelly's backup.

Donnelly, who went 7 of 9 for 60 yards in relief of Sasek vs. Navy in the season opener, is the first former walk-on to start at quarterback for the Blue Hens since **Dale Fry** got the nod in the season opener vs. Lehigh in 1993.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION:

Thanks to last season's national runner-up finish and the return of 11 starters, including seven on offense, the Blue Hens have earned some impressive pre-season accolades. The Hens appear in the Top 10 in virtually every pre-season Top 25 poll and have been picked No. 3 in the pre-season Colonial Athletic Association poll.

SCORE FIRST AND THINGS WILL BE FINE.....

That has usually been the case for the Blue Hens of late. Delaware was a dominant team early on last season, outscoring opponent 94-34 in the first quarter and 242-80 in the first half. The Hens scored first in 12 of the team's 15 games. Delaware had won 12 straight games when scoring first before the NCAA championship game loss to Eastern Washington last January. Still the Hens have won 17 of their last 19 games since 2009 when getting on the board first. Delaware teams are 59-14 (.808) when they score first in head coach **K.C. Keeler's** 10 seasons at the helm.

YET ANOTHER WINNING RECORD; HENS REACH 12-WIN MARK...AGAIN

The Blue Hens have posted a winning record seven times in nine seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, failing to reach the .500 mark just twice when the team went 5-6 in 2006 and 4-8 in 2008.

But the Hens have more than made up for those two down years, advancing to the NCAA Tournament four times under Keeler, winning the national title in 2003 and finishing as national runner-up in both 2007 and 2010. Along the way, the Hens have also captured three conference titles, earning the Lambert Cup Trophy three times, and the ECAC Team of the Year three times.

Delaware has not suffered back-to-back losing seasons since 1938-39, a milestone that few college teams in the nation

at any level - and none in the CAA - can match. The Hens have reached 12 wins seven times in school history, most recently in 2010.

Delaware posted a 7-0 start for the ninth time in school history last season and for the second time under Keeler. The Hens started out 9-0 on the way to the 2003 national championship campaign.

HOME SWEET HOME

Delaware boasts one of the top home-field advantages in all of college football. Not only do Blue Hen fans pack Delaware Stadium each week - helping UD become the only NCAA FCS team in the nation to average 20,000 or more fans per regular season home game each of the last 12 seasons - they see consistently winning football.

Delaware has posted an impressive record of 51-16 (.761) in 10 seasons under **K.C. Keeler** at Delaware Stadium - among the top marks at any division of college football.

Delaware had won seven straight at home - its longest home win skein since winning nine straight between 2004-05 - before falling to Villanova 28-21 in overtime in the regular season finale on Nov. 20.

Of the 16 losses, seven have come by six points or less or in overtime. The Hens have scored more than 20 points in all but nine of those 66 games.

Delaware has won 22 of its last 29 home games and is 279-87-4 (.764) in 60 seasons all-time at Delaware Stadium, including a mark of 20-5 with eighth straight wins in the post-season.

SCORING STREAK REACHES 188...AND COUNTING

Delaware extended its streak of scoring a point to 188 straight games in the 28-17 win over West Chester Saturday night.

Delaware has not been shutout in any game since falling at Villanova 27-0 back on Sept. 14, 1996 and have not been held off the scoreboard at home a Delaware Stadium since suffering a 24-0 setback to Holy Cross way back on Nov. 12, 1983 (a streak of 185 straight games).

The current scoring streak breaks the previous UD record of consecutive game scoring a point of 154 set in 1983-98. Delaware's streak of consecutive road games scoring a point now stands at 85 games.

During the streak, the Hens have scored 30 or more points 82 times (41 percent of the time). The current streak ranks No. 2 among Colonial Athletic Association teams, trailing only Massachusetts (189) and tying with New Hampshire.

POSITIVE PUNT PROTECTION

Delaware is breaking in a new punter this season after the graduation of two-year regular and 2010 All-CAA selection **Ed Wagner**. Also gone is four-year deep snapper **Zack Reed**.

Junior **Rauley Zaragoza** has handled all the punting chores in the first two games but Baner is still in the mix. Junior tight end **Corey Olsen** handled the deep snapping chores vs. Navy but senior wide receiver **Mark Schenauer** and freshman tight end **Nick Boyle** will also be expected to continue an impressive streak by the punt team.

Delaware has now gone 289 straight punt attempts without having a kick blocked since the 2005 season vs. William & Mary. The streak covers 67 games.

BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK A FEW TIMES

Few college teams in the country can boast the vast coaching experience of Delaware's offensive and defensive coordinators.

Blue Hen defensive leader **Nick Rapone** and third-year offensive head man **Jim Hoffer** have combined for an incredible 60 years of college coaching experience - each with 30 campaigns under their belts - including 24 years as coordinators.

Hoffer served as head coach at his alma mater, Cornell, in 1990-97 and at Buffalo in 2001-05. Together they have coached over 620 games on the college level.

Rapone, whose 2010 defensive led the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game, earned an impressive honor in 2010 when he was selected NCAA Division I FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com.

HOW ABOUT THAT '10 DEFENSE:

The 2010 season was quite a campaign, especially for the Blue Hen defense that ranked among the top units in the country.

Delaware led the nation in scoring defense (12.1 points per game) and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in turnover margin (4th/+1.13), total defense (5th, 280.7), passing efficiency (9th/148.49), and passing efficiency defense (9th/102.7).

Delaware's scoring defense of 12.1 points per game was the best mark by a UD defense since 1982 when opponents averaged just 11.6 points per game.

The Hens had to replace eight starters from that unit, including four All-Colonial Athletic Association defensive backs and three All-Americans in defensive backs **Anthony Walters** and **Anthony Bratton** and linebacker **Matt Marcorelle**.

The Hens will try to improve from a tough opener last week as Delaware dropped a 40-17 decision with the Mids piling up 437 total yards and 22 first downs.

A BLUE HEN IN THE WHITE HOUSE...AND AT DELAWARE STADIUM

When U.S. President **Barack Obama** and running mate, former Delaware Senator **Joe Biden**, won the 2008 presidential election, it was big news. And even bigger news for the citizens of Delaware and those affiliated with the University of Delaware.

A 1965 graduate of the University of Delaware with degrees in history and political science, Biden played on the Blue Hen freshman football team in 1961 under head coach **Scotty Duncan**. Biden, a member of the UD Wall of Fame and

an ardent Delaware football fan, considered himself "a half-baked halfback" during his brief UD football career.

Biden made his first visit to Delaware Stadium as Vice-President on Saturday, Oct. 9, 2009 as he attended the Maine game and sat with UD President **Patrick Harker** and current New Jersey Governor **Chris Christie** (also a UD graduate) throughout the entire contest.

He made another visit to Delaware Stadium in 2010 when he attended Delaware's 16-3 NCAA quarterfinal win over New Hampshire on Dec. 10.

He also attended the Hens' 2010 national championship game in Frisco, Tex. with Christie and Delaware Gov. Jack Markell.

Biden met with head coach **K.C. Keeler** and members of the team on Sept. 19, 2008 when Biden's plane was parked on the same tarmac as the Delaware charter at New Castle County (Del.) prior to its trip to Furman. Biden later made an appearance at the Blue Hens' game vs. Maine at Delaware Stadium on Oct. 11, 2008 and received a rousing applause while being mobbed by well-wishers.

VERY PRESIDENTIAL...

No less than six members of the University of Delaware football team have the same surnames as former U.S. Presidents, including the Hens' top two running backs - **Andrew Pierce** and **Dave Hayes**.

Other Blue Hens with presidential surnames are **Andrew Harrison**, **Leon Jackson**, **Bobby Kennedy**, and **Michael Johnson**.

ALL-TIME HIGH 11 BLUE HENS IN NFL CAMPS THIS SUMMER:

An all-time high of 11 former Blue Hen football players took part in National Football League camps this summer.

In addition to established veterans **Joe Flacco** (Baltimore) and **Mike Adams** (Cleveland), also in camps were free agents **Brandon Gilbeaux** (Tampa Bay), **Ronald Talley** (Arizona), **Matt Marcorelle** (Houston), **Anthony Walters** (Chicago), **Anthony Bratton** (Green Bay), **Pat Devlin** (Miami), **Tyrone Grant** (Washington), and **Josh Baker** (N.Y. Jets).

In addition, **Ben Patrick**, who played the last three seasons with Arizona, signed with the New York Giants this summer but has since retired.

All but Flacco and Adams were released by their teams but Devlin, Walters, Talley, and Baker have each signed on with their respective team's taxi squads.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

The name of the Blue Hens' conference affiliation changed to the Colonial Athletic Association from the Atlantic 10 prior to the 2007 season, but the 10 teams stayed the same.

Delaware is maintaining its outstanding success in league play just the same. Delaware is currently playing its 26th season in the CAA (originally the Yankee Conference before becoming the Atlantic 10 in 1997) this fall.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. -- Navy quarterbacks have a history of big games against the University of Delaware. Senior Kriss Proctor added to that legacy as he ran for 176 yards and three touchdowns and passed for another score as the Mids spoiled the season opener for the Blue Hens.

The No. 5 ranked Blue Hens, last year's NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision national runner-up, were able to pile up 363 yards of offense but too many missed opportunities proved to be Delaware's undoing.

Sophomore All-American running back Andrew Pierce, the 2011 Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Year, led the way for the Hens, rushing for 119 yards and capping the scoring with a one-yard burst with 2:54 left that capped a 78-yard drive. The 100-yard effort was the eighth of Pierce's young career as a Blue Hen.

Quarterbacks Trevor Sasek and Tim Donnelly also showed signs of good things to come. Sasek, who started the game after winning a battle with Donnelly, completed 9 of 19 passes for 82 yards and scored the Hens' first touchdown on a 21-yard run before leaving the game in the second half with a knee contusion. Donnelly hit on 7 of 9 passes for 60 yards.

Proctor, a first-year starter for the Mids, broke away on a 75-yard scoring jaunt on just the fourth play of the game and later scored on runs of 27 yards in the third quarter and one-yard early in the final stanza. He also hit Aaron Santiago on a 12-yard scoring toss midway through the final stanza to push the Navy lead to 40-10.

Delaware's defense, which lost eight starters and three All-Americans from a unit that led the nation in scoring defense a year ago when it gave up just 12.1 points per game, allowed its highest point total since a 41-7 setback to CAA foe James Madison in 2008.

Navy, which went 9-4 a year ago and advanced to the Poinsettia Bowl, always features one of the most explosive running attacks in NCAA Division I football and this year will be no different. The Mids' triple-option attack piled up 391 yards rushing and 437 yards total.

NEWARK, Del. -- All-American RB Andrew Pierce needed just two plays to cover 56 yards and his 44-yard touchdown vault early in the final stanza was just what the No. 8 Hens needed to pull away for a hard-fought victory in the home opener.

The Blue Hens (1-1) jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead after scoring two touchdowns in a span of just 17 seconds and held off the Golden Ram comeback. The Hens upended their nearby NCAA Division II rivals for the 17th straight time since 1993 but the margin of victory was the smallest since a 24-17 triumph in 1996.

Pierce, the 2010 CAA Rookie of the Year, ran 25 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns to lead the attack. He also caught a career-high seven passes for 32 yards during the game.

The game looked like it would be a blowout early on as the Hens scored three touchdowns in the first stanza to take a 21-0 lead. Sophomore LB Jessel Curry, a first-year transfer from Auburn, made his Delaware Stadium debut memorable as he rambled 34 yards with an interception return to open the scoring just over six minutes into the contest.

Pierce scored his first touchdown of the night when he ran seven yards and leaped into the end zone with 34 seconds left in the stanza for a 14-0 lead. Just 17 seconds later, the lead was up to 21-0 as Irv Titre recovered a bad snap at the West Chester 28-yard line to set up Donnelly's first career touchdown pass, a 28-yarder to a wide-open Mark Schenauer.

However, the Rams held tough and never let the Hens pull away. Rondell White got the Rams on the board with a two-yard scoring run just under two minutes into the second stanza, ending a streak of nine quarters and 143 minutes that Delaware had held West Chester without a point in the series. The Rams (0-2) pulled to within 21-10 on 27-yard field goal by Shawn Leo.

Following a scoreless third quarter, West Chester pulled to within 21-17 with 10:56 left in the final quarter as backup QB Matt Carroll scrambled out of the pocket and hit LaRonn Lee with a 14-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone.

But the Hens quickly put a damper on the Rams' upset plans. After Travis Hawkins returned the kickoff 38 yards to the Delaware 44-yard line, Pierce took over. He ran for 12 yards on first down and then broke loose on his pivotal 44-yard scoring run down the right side on the next play to give Delaware some breathing room with 10:10 remaining.

Delaware locked up the win as they burned 5:15 off the clock with an 11-play drive and then got the ball back when Leon Jackson intercepted a with 3:13 left.
